M E M O R A N D U M

On 8th August 1946 I was advised by 10th Port of Embarkation located in Via del Commercio that a consignment of wire had arrived for Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications. I arranged with BOFFI of Circolo Costruzioni to collect on 12th August 1946.

Meantime administration of 10 Port Embarkation informed me ^{they} could not hold railway wagon in their yard as it was an encumbrance so I arranged for it to be shunted to civilian station Stazione Ostiense.

On Monday 12 August at the unloading the station-master indicated to me that the wagon was delivered to him minus a seal on one of the doors and there were 30 coils less than the figure given on the Bill of Lading.

After weighing the wire there was approximately 3000 pounds more than weight shown on Bill of Lading, which is obviously calculated on the basis of 100 lbs per coil.

My personal opinion is that the stationmaster is trustworthy and that the difference of 30 coils is probably a mistake on part of consigner, 454 being easilymistakable for 484.

1. (a) If the W.D. has been committed to allow the Italian Government 6/24 off the value of Maintenance Stores for the period of military requirement it would be difficult at this stage to raise any financial objection.
- (b) While there is no direct suggestion in the Armistice Term that the Italian Government should pay for the maintenance of British Lines I cannot at this stage agree to the overhaul cost of such maintenance being excluded from the general costs of occupation. However this latter aspect is one that can be settled independently and need not cause us concern at this stage.
2. Your comments are agreed. I agree that the method of adjustment at (b) would be most satisfactory.

SUBJECT : Testing Instruments on Loan to MAESPE
TO : G.S.O., A.P.H.Q.

1. In order to supply all MAESPE Fault and Maintenance Controls with adequate equipment to enable them to carry out their work efficiently and to regularise the position of Army Stores on loan to civilians, you are asked to make surplus for purchasing by the Italian Government the attached list of essential test equipment not obtainable immediately from either the Ministry stocks or factory production which has been drawn up and is hereby enclosed.
2. The original list submitted by the Ministry has been drastically cut down and only equipment non-obtainable from Italian sources within a reasonable period has been included.
3. In order to avoid withdrawal and reissue of this equipment, which is at present where it is most needed, it is suggested that it be made surplus and turned over on paper, the equipment itself to remain on location.
4. If this is not possible the lengthier process of turnover of similar equipment in bulk to the Ministry for onward distribution by them would have to be considered.
5. It is felt that unless this equipment is made surplus as suggested, very long delays will occur before the Ministry would be able to replace from current Italian production of specialised precision instruments.
6. The Ministry has stated that it will make every effort to replace all test equipment on loan to MAESPE by Signals other than the equipment listed on the attached list within 30 days of even date.







SUBJECT: Allied Stores Supplied for Maintenance of

TO : Under-Secretary of State for E.P. & TT. (MARSHPE)

1. A summary is given below of the present position regarding the stores supplied under projects CMP9, CMP10, MTOUSA111, and MTOUSA112.

2. By agreement with your Ministry it was arranged that you be supplied free of cost with 1/24 of the value of the stores on the projects for each month of military circuit requirements.

3. This was governed also, as mentioned to Dr. Fano at the meeting of 7 Sept. 1945, by the fact that the free supply of stores would have to terminate as soon as the fixed plant was sold to the Italian Govt., becoming Italian property.

4. The fixed plant has been sold, and the free periods for maintenance stores appear to be as follows:

- (a) CMP/9: 1st Dec. 1945 until end Feb. 1946
(British plant having been sold early March 1946) Free supply 3/24 of project.
- (b) CMP/10: 1st Sept. 1945 until end Feb. 1946.
Free supply 6/24 of project.
- (c) MTOUSA/111: 1st Dec. 1945 until end March 1946
(American plant having been sold April) Free supply 4/24 of project.

(d) WTCUSA/112: 1st Sept. 1945 until end March 1946.
Free supply 7/24 of project.

5. These projected stores were included under items 112, 252, and 253 in the sale of fixed plant.

6. As the American fixed plant was sold at a 60% reduction, the free supply mentioned in items 4 (c) and 4 (d) has already been in effect provided under items 112 (American section) and 253 of the fixed plant schedule.

7. As regards British stores, the British Financial Adviser has been asked to make the necessary credit for that part of the projected stores which should be free of cost, as mentioned in items 4 (a) and 4 (b). The matter is still under correspondence.

8. The above would represent the exact position if all stores on the projects had been provided. Since the date of your letter no. 931107/GEN2 (17 Jan. 1946), in which you showed discrepancies between stores delivered and those projected, additional stores have been sent.

9. The position now is that, although all items and quantities of stores supplied are not identical with those on the projects, suitable substitutes have been supplied in sufficient quantity to replace items not available, in order to save time.

10. The only exception is item 8 of the project WTCUSA 112, which has neither been provided nor substituted. Incidentally the cost of the item was omitted from the scheduled charge for the fixed plant (i.e. it was not included under item 112 in the sale of fixed plant schedule).

11. For accounting reasons, this wire will now be dealt with in the following way:

The free supply of 7/24 of the item will be provided shortly without cost to the Italian Government.

The rest can be obtained, either as itemised or in the form of suitable substitutes, by purchase through normal Allied surplus material channels (ARAR). ⁹⁵ 5

11. To conclude, it can therefore be stated that to complete the whole transaction, two points remain to be covered i.e.

- (a) Free supply of American wire as in para 10.
- (b) Credit for part of items 112 and 252 to be arranged.



TO : Financial Adviser (Br), GHQ CTF.

Ref: Your D/52/6/PA of 11 June.

1. In the above reference there appears to be a misunderstanding on two points.

(a) The rebate due to the Italian Govt. is 1/24 of the value of the two years supply of stores, for each month of military requirements, not merely 1/24 in all i.e. if the Allies required the lines for 6 months, the Italian Govt. would be due a rebate of 6/24 of the total value.

(b) The plant at the date of the agreement was British not Italian. The third para. of the GHQ doc does not therefore appear to refer. As this Sub-Commission reads the Armistice Terms there is no direct suggestion that the Italian Govt. can be required to pay for the maintenance of British Lines, though probably this cost could be included in the general costs of occupation.

2. It was not suggested in the AG Memo of 3 May that the "Fano" agreement relieved the Italian Govt. of all charges for maintenance stores, the point was that, until the date of the end of the period of military circuit requirements could be specified, there were only two alternative ways of charging for the stores e.g.

(a) Charge immediately for all of the stores and give the Govt. later a rebate of X/24 when the date referred to could be specified, or

- 2 -

(b) Take no charge to the Govt. until the date could be specified when it would be then charged with the total value less $\frac{1}{24}$ of that value.

The AFHQ officer who dealt with the matters (Lt. Col. Jenkins) suggested the second alternative.

3. Since the Memo of 3 May was written however, this Sub-Commission has been informed that the fixed plant was sold to the Italian Govt. in the second week of March. This alters the position somewhat since the plant at that date became Italian and thereafter there was no Allied liability to pay for the maintenance stores after that date.

4. The CSD, AFHQ was therefore informed on 31 May that in the opinion of this HQ, the proportion of the British stores which should be supplied free to the Italian Govt. would be $\frac{6}{24}$ of the total value of the project (i.e. for the months Sept 1945 to Feb. 1946 inclusive). A copy of the Memo is attached (see para 8 of the "Resume" attached to that Memo).

5. For the above reasons, this HQ is unable to agree with the conclusions in the last paragraph of the GHQ letter and requests further consideration of the matter.

With reference to your T.14B.184.CS dated 3rd May 1946, addressed to C.S.O., G.H.Q., I have now seen a copy of the "Fano" agreement and there appears to be nothing in this except to relieve the Italian Government of 1/24 of the cost of maintenance stores provided under CIF/10.

I see no reason for assuming that the agreement relieves the Italian Government of all charges for maintenance stores. On the contrary it confirms the Italian Government's responsibility except for the 1/24 referred to above.

All stores issued for the purpose of rehabilitation or maintenance of Italian Communications, whether or not these are reserved for Allied use, are to be recorded as a charge to the Italian Government and included in ultimate financial settlement.

The stores under CIF/10 of 23rd April 1945 have therefore been correctly recorded and are included in the claim at present under discussion.






Subject: Allied stores for Italian Maintenance of Military Lines.

To : Allied Commission, Communications Sub-Commission, AFHQ 794.

1. Reference is made to letter file T.14B.122.CS, AC, 12 Mar. 46, and letter file T.14B.200.CS, 31 May 46, from same HQ, subject as above, To: CSO AFHQ. Other letters relating to this matter were written between the dates mentioned but were not conclusive.

2. With reference to T.14B.122.CS, 12 Mar 46, this letter and its inclosed list recommends a substantial upward revision of the amount of materials authorized under Signal Projects CMF/10 and MTOUSA/112. Further reference is made to paragraph 2, T.14B.200.CS, 31 May 46, which indicates that the requirements of CMF/10 have been substantially met. The requirements of MTOUSA/112 have, according to paragraph 7 of a resume' of events attached to T.14B.200.CS, also been substantially met, except for 1000 miles of .104 copper wire for which the Italian Government was not charged.

a. The upward revision is not favorably considered. Stores over and above that on the projects may be secured through civilian purchasing channels.

b. The resume' also states that there is an agreement to rebate to the Italian Government seven twenty fourths ($7/24$) of the cost of materials for maintenance items projected under MTOUSA/112, on the basis of credit to the Italians in the amount of one twenty fourth of the cost of the stores for each month of military use of the plant for two years or to date of sale, and that the plant has been used for 7 months between the date of the project and date of sale.

c. Under such conditions, the Italians would be entitled to 48,403 pounds of .104 copper wire without charge since the amount named in the original project was 165,951 pounds, or 1000 miles.

3. With regard to Signal Project MTOUSA/111, the amounts involved are insignificant and the question of sale or rebate should be given no further consideration.

4. The adjustment of rebate applicable to Signal Projects CMF/9 and CMF/10 have been referred to the Financial Advisor.

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5. The matter of adjusting the claim for seven twenty fourths of the amount of copper wire which was authorized under Signal Project MTOUSA/112 will be in accordance with agreement between authorities concerned.

NOTES ON SALE OF FIXED PLANT

1. Overhead and underground line plant and associated apparatus erected and installed by Allied Forces in this theatre has been sold to the Italian Govt. A copy of the schedule is held by this Sub-Commission.

2. The ~~UK~~ plant sale was signed by the Italian Govt. on 9 March 1946 with reservations regarding parts of the installation not transferred to the Italians (see letter from Director of Hirings to ARAR of 11 May 1946 - folio 189 in file T14B part III). The Italians have not yet replied to the D. of Hirings' letter.

3. The US plant sale was signed first week in April and included a statement that the Italians would carry out any inspection of the plant in their opinion necessary (or words to that effect) within 30 days of receipt of the shipping ticket which was sent on or about 23 April 1946.

This check has not yet been made, nor has ARAR therefore returned the shipping ticket signed, to AFHQ.

4. This Sub-Commission is not directly concerned in the above negotiations but has given AFHQ assistance and advice on occasion. A meeting with Col. Hawthorn and Maj. Clarke of AFHQ regarding the American plant was held on 6 June 1946 arrangements were made for Col. Hawthorn to see ARAR on 7 June, and for Col. Scudder to speak to Ing. Garrone to point out the 30 days clause mentioned.
