With reference to your letter No. DOC 210.31 dated 26th May, I regret that the release of Captain Carlo Martinato cannot at present be agreed to.

2. It is observed that for some time past facilities have been given to ITALCABLES to consult Captain Martinato about the particular matter mentioned in para. 5 of your letter and I have been informed that all available information in this connection has now been given to the Company.

3. He states that the Italcable Co. should now be able to deal with the question and that there is no immediate need for his return to them.

4. He further states that the requirement for his services appears to arise on Minister of Communications staff, not the Cable Company's staff, and he himself does not wish to be transferred to the former.

SUBJECT: Captain Carlo Martinato

TO : F.O.W.I.T., Navy House, Naples

1. Captain Martinato was requested by the Ministry of Communications, and the release from his Naval employment at Naples asked for in a letter to the Navy Sub-Commission of A.C.C. (X/5/3) dated 3 December 1943).
2. The reply (Telegram No. 404 dated 14 December 1943) stated that he would be released as soon as his present duty was completed, and subsequently (letter FOWIT dated 24 December 1943) it was stated that this release could be expected at the end of February 1944.
3. The matter was taken up again at that time, and subsequently at frequent intervals verbally, but no date or condition of his release has been given.
4. The employment of this officer with the Minister of Communications has now become of greater importance, due to the increased technical responsibilities that it now has in respect of radio - broadcasting, maintenance of the main underground State cables in Italy and Sicily, etc.
5. Captain Martinato in civil life is an official of Italcable, with which company the A.C.C. is arranging on behalf of the Allied authorities the transfer of cable terminal equipment, the property of Italcable, from Malaga to Gibraltar. His assistance in effecting this transfer will be of particular help.
6. In view of the importance attached to the employment of this officer by the Ministry of Communications and considering that he is specially qualified for and has long civil experience in telecommunication engineering, prompt release from his employment with the Allied Navy at Naples is requested.

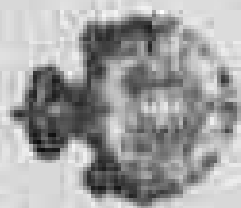

I am pleased to be able to let you know that at the 58th Meeting of the War Establishments Committee the whole question of the WE of Allied Military Government and Armistice Control Commission was settled by the approval of a comprehensive new WE which was submitted by Allied Military Government Section of this HQ.

This new WE will cover the whole of the functions of AMG and also those of Armistice Control Commission (for which War Office promulgated WE VIII/540/1 for the Allied Telecommunication Sub-Committee, on which WE you were formerly held.)

In short, the decisions of the Establishments Committee regarding the new WE, so far as they affect you, are:

- (i) WE VIII/540/1 to be superseded.
- (ii) All appointments are staff appointments.
- (iii) R. Signals officers, in common with all other staff officers, will have their present appt published waf the dates on which they assumed their duties and not waf the date of the new WE.

In the case of (iii) Allied Military Government Section here will make all necessary adjustments through their own administrative channels.

I hope this will clear the matter as I am sure you have had reason to doubt where you stood in the past.

GENERAL

1. On 14 Dec. 1943, at 0730 hours HEADQUARTERS ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT will be moved from present station to New stations, "X", and "Y".

2. Postal address for both U.S. and British Officers will remain unchanged until further instructions are issued.

3. It is the responsibility of individual officers to have all required inoculations and vaccinations before departure. The 10th Port of Subversion is necessary, 52 Via Roma, will serve AMG medical needs. Officers are reminded that typhoid inoculations are effective for 6 months.

4. Officers will not remove any cots which have not been specifically issued to them, from their billets. Electric light bulbs will not under any circumstances be removed from billets. Officers will turn over keys to their billets to office of Headquarters Commandant.

5. After 0730 hours 14 Dec. 1943, no officer not previously ordered to new station "M" on convenient change of station, will be designated on permanent transfer to "M" without prior published memoranda from HQ, AMG, Naples.

II. TRANSPORTATION

1. All officers M/G's designated to change station and moved in par. 2 and 3, S.O. No. 31, or any movement thereof will move overland by motor vehicle convey, which will depart from convey assembly point at Officer's Mess on Via Stabile 14 December 1943 at 0730 hours.

2. Lt. Col. R.H. CRIPS is designated as CONVOY COMMANDER. He will immediately prepare convey march order, (obtaining details from G-4 Branch) and will designate subordinate commanders, police, supply and security officers. All officers other than those designated as convey officers will be considered as passengers and will not take orders or take part in the operation thereof, except under emergency conditions.

3. All personnel designated by par. 2 and 3, S.O. No. 31 will be considered alerted immediately on publication of this order and shall prepare baggage: (a) baggage shall be clearly marked with point, on each piece, with name and serial number of owner and "AMG-Italy". EXTRACTS OF DRAFT OF ARMISTICE

Dated July 26, 1943

8. All immovable property used or controlled by the Italian forces, including lands, buildings, installations, and radio location and other technical observing stations, will forthwith be placed undamaged at the disposal and direction of the Allied Commander in Chief.

15. The Italian authorities will disclose all available information about naval, military and air devices, installations, and defenses; about all telecommunication services established by Italy or its Allies on Italian territory or in the land and sea approaches thereto, or in any other place occupied by Italian forces, and such other particulars as the opposing commander in chief may require in connection with the use of Italian bases, or with the operations, security or welfare of the naval, military or air forces of the Allied Nations or of any of their belligerents.

18. All telegraph, telephone and wireless services, and all telecommunication services of any other form whatsoever, civil, naval, military and airforce, will be closed down. The resumption of any such services will be subject to the consent and control of the Allied Commander in Chief. All meteorological stations; all telegraph, telephone and wireless installations; all wireless navigational and radio location installations; and all other telecommunication installations of any form whatsoever, civil, naval, military and airforce, with all connected plant and records, will be maintained in good order and will be placed undamaged at the disposal of the Allied Commander in Chief.

24. No radio or telecommunication installations or other forms of intercommunication, ashore or afloat, under Italian control, whether belonging to Italy or to any other nation not at war with Italy, will transmit except as authorized by the Allied Commander in Chief. All such communication will remain subject to Allied control.

41. The Italian public and administrative services will continue to operate subject to the direction of the Allied authorities and the appropriate authorities will take such measures as the Allied authorities may require of them to maintain the security of the Allied forces and law, order and peaceable civil government throughout Italian territory. Any services which the Allied Commander in Chief may deem to be public utility services will continue to operate subject to the direction of the Allied authorities.

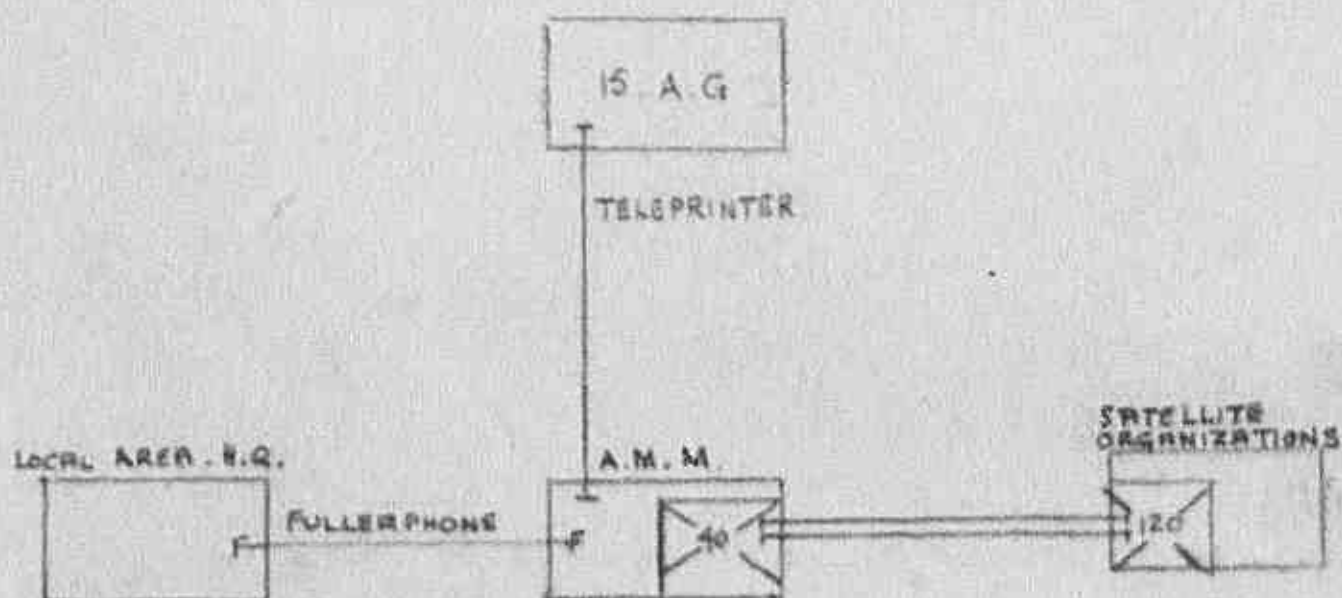
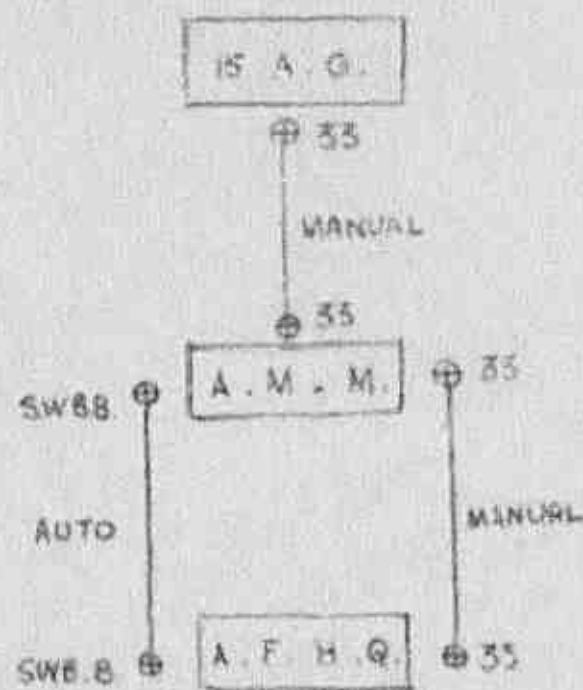
