SUBJECT : Metered telephone service.
TO : Director Communications S/C - Allied Commission
FROM : Communications Officer

1) - I have been approached by the Directors of the STIPEL Ing Galimberti and Ing. Oglietti who tell me that according to the Italian Press the Ministry proposes to amend the decree regarding metered call service so as to provide a larger number of free calls and also to reduce the cost of calls in excess of the free number.

2) - Ing Galimberti tells me, however, that when he was in Rome recently, he discussed the whole matter with the Ministry and was told that the Ministry's Inspectors would shortly consult with the Concessionary Companies with a view to deciding the details of a system using only two classes viz - business and residential and having no free calls.

3) - In view of the fact that - so Ing. Galimberti informs me - it is the intention to introduce this new system about January it seems very undesirable to have two interim systems.

4) - In the circumstances I should be glad of authority to suspend the actual operation of metered call service until the Italian Government has made up its mind.

2. It had been originally intended to assign Capt. Gigli to your office but when he and Lt. Col. Millar reached Milan it appeared to be necessary that he make his Headquarters there rather than in Turin as Milan was the hub and telegraph problems were going to be very large for many months.

3. It was agreed that Capt. Gigli should also assist on technical questions in Liguria and Piemonte. If you find it does not give satisfaction please discuss with Col. Cumming and if he still feels that Gigli should make his headquarters in Rome you should hire a technical assistant in Turin.

SUBJECT: COMMUNICATIONS PIEMONTE REGION.

TO : THE DIRECTOR COMMUNICATIONS SUBCOMMISSION A.C.

1. The enclosed letter is forwarded as requested by the Provincial Director. It is not clear whether the request of the Ministry for this information was made with A.C. approval but in any event the requirements of materials can no doubt be coordinated by A.C. for all Regions.

2. Damage to telephone and telegraph plant in Piemonte has been slight. The only important exchange not in service is Alesandria, but although the building in this case is severely damaged the auto plant has been salvaged and STIPEL are engaged on repairs to the building, after which the apparatus will be reinstalled.

3. Throughout the whole Region very much more than 20% restoration envisaged either exists or can be restored by local resources and on local initiative in a relatively short time.

The major shortage is transport, but this should improve when control has been effectively imposed on vehicles used by Partisans.

4. Until 25th. May I was without personal transport and had to do such travelling as was possible by means of trucks borrowed from the Telecommunications Board. It has not, therefore, been possible to visit many places in the Region. A more detailed report will be submitted however in the near future.

I should be glad to know when I may expect the arrival of Capitano Gigli as I have refrained from attempting to secure technical assistance pending his arrival.

SUBJECT: Circulation of Telegraph Traffic

TO: Regional Commissioner, Piemonte Region
Att: Telecomms Officer.

1. Reference is made to your letter of June 1st, 1945.
2. It is believed that the Provincial Director's explanation to you was not complete.
3. On May 7th service was authorised but a local A.M.G. Officer in Turin came into the Office of the Provincial Director a few days after and stopped all traffic west of Turin. Dr. Fano was in Turin after Colonel Millar's visit and called me on the phone. He told me that orders had been changed by A.M.G. to permit telephone and telegraph service as far west as Susa. I told Fano that A.M.G. was in control and that their orders should be followed. This is probably what the Provincial Director refers to. You were not to be reached on the phone at time and I presumed that you had been informed of any local restrictions by Army A.M.G.
4. I note that your instructions to Provincial Director have been to clear traffic throughout Piemonte etc. and trust that you have checked this with local military commanders. In our telegram to you of May 22nd you were informed that local Commanders were to be consulted as to any restrictions they may wish to impose on services to and from provinces of Aosta, Torino, Cuneo and Sondrio.

SUBJECT: Circulation of Telegraph Traffic -

TO : Director Communications Sub-Commission A.C. ✓

FROM : Communications Officer Piemonte Region -

On the 10th. May, following Col. Miller's visit to Torino, I issued to the Director of Telegraphs at Torino a written authority and order to circulate civilian telegraph traffic throughout Piemonte, Lombardia and Liguria, and provinces of Piacenza and Parma.

On the 30th. May Capt. Drummond discovered that telegrams for provinces adjacent to the French Border had been held back.

The Provincial Director of Posts and Telegraphs states that this was on orders given by Dr. Fano.

I have pointed out that the sole authority in North Italy is A M G, but the Provincial Director claims that Dr. Fano represented the countermanning order as coming from AC HQ.

I have made it clearly understood that in future no orders affecting civil Telecommunications are to be acted upon unless given by me, as in my absence, by a member of the Telecommunications Board, but I should be glad if enquiry could be made at the Rome, end as to the veracity of these allegations and if true the motive prompting them. No doubt any necessary action will be taken.

Notes on Certain Exchanges

1-2

1. Genova.

(a) Three sets of information regarding sizes of exchanges, situation etc. are enclosed as follows:

1. Information in typed form from TETI supposed to represent position last year.
2. Map drawn from army intelligence information.
3. Sketch of network deduced from directory of 1942-43.

(b) The three sources agree fairly well. The intelligence map shows an area (colored red) under a particular exchange, whereas the 1942-43 directory shows this area under a different exchange. This is made clear on the map.

The Genoa exchange capacities shown on the typed list are unlikely to be correct since the directory deductions agree pretty well with the intelligence report. For this reason capacities shown for TETI exchanges in other towns are open to suspicion.

(c) As the directory deductions are definitely only deductions there are probably minor discrepancies.

2. Inter-Urban Exchanges:

State interurban exchanges are situated at Bologna, Genova, Pisa, (for Royal use), Livorno, Milano, Venezia, Trieste, Torino, Padova. Most towns of any size including the above have inter-urban boards belonging to the Concessionary Company concerned with the area. The state boards take the long distance line, even in many cases the line belonging to the Companies. The typed statement concerning capacities of TINC, TILVE, and STIPER exchanges shows the numbers of positions of the companies inter-urban boards.

Damages. (Dec. 1943)Information supplied verbally by Prof. Angelini

1. Torino:
Vanchiglia (3400 lines) was completely destroyed. Scheme had been arranged to partly replace it.
2. Milano:
(a) State inter-urban operated State lines plus STIPEL Long Distance lines.
Stipel inter-urban took Provincial lines mainly.
These boards plus the Centro exchange plus a special service board (time, etc.) plus amplifier station in the same building which was severely damaged. All boards were badly damaged.
Auto plant OK.

(b) Volta exchange (5,900 lines) severely damaged but now almost OK.

(c) In Milano area, the Germans removed many of the amplifiers but the Italians tried to hide carrier equipment.
3. Treviso:
Town is almost flat - was German Hq. Exchange building and equipment badly damaged.
4. Rimini:
Exchange building and equipment, and amplifier equipment completely destroyed.
5. Bologna:
Exchange, inter-urban board, and amplifier station all badly damaged.
6. Parma and Piacenza:
No damage in Dec. 1943, but towns have been so much bombed that damage is expected.
