SUBJECT : Telephone Calls to Sardegna.
TO : Undersecretary of State for Posts and Telecomms

1. As you are aware a campaign for control of malaria in Sardegna is underway in which the Italian Government is actively participating.

2. The Headquarters of the Malaria Control Unit which represents the Allied participation in this campaign is in Rome and it is occasionally necessary for this Unit to telephone to Sardegna. Telephone facilities from the mainland are, however, very limited and are entirely under civilian control.

3. It would be appreciated if you would issue the necessary instructions so that calls for Sardegna from the Malaria Demonstration Unit in Rome, Telephone Number 490.028 are afforded the priority of Official Government calls. The number of calls will be limited to those essential to the service.

RAISING OF THE TELEPHONE BLOCKADE.

For the purpose of complying with the wishes of the Roman population, often expressed, the Allied Commission has consented to the removal of the restrictions on the urban telephone service of the city of Rome, taking effect immediately.

The decision of the Allied Commission will be greeted with satisfaction.

Not more than two days ago one of our head reporters brought the hardships of the communications, and the public services of the city in general, to the attention of the authorities, a situation which seriously hinders the resumption of the whole civilian life. The telephone restrictions especially did so, and with the raising of the blockade now deliberated, a step forward has been taken towards this new vitality which should stamped on a city which, besides numbering within its walls a million and a half of persons, is also the capital of a country with a population of 45 millions.

We only hope that the same comprehension and impetuosity, shown in this vital sector of the urban public services, will be extended also to the other and, in particular to that of the trams and buses, where the other day an incident as displeasing as clamorous took place.

SUBJECT: De-restriction of Civilian Telephones - Rome.
TO : Under Secretary of State for PP.TT.

1. In view of the more normal conditions now prevailing in the City of Rome, the Allied Military authorities agree to the relaxation of the restrictions imposed by the TETI Company authorised in the letter dated 30th June 1944 from the A.C. Regional Commissioner, Rome Region.

2. If, as a result of the foregoing, undue interference is caused to the Allied Military service, the Allied Military authorities reserve the right to order the disconnection of sufficient outlets from the civilian line finder units to first code selector units to restore the service at any exchange to normal.

3. In order that the position may be kept under review, the TETI Company will submit weekly reports to the Signal Officer RAAC in accordance with the following schedule:-

<u>Exchanges</u>	<u>Average No. of conversations per day</u>	<u>Power consumption in K.W.H. per day.</u>

This schedule is required only in respect of:
Prati, Viminale, S.Lorenzo, Corso Vitt.Emanuele, Colonna, Nomentana, Parioli.

4. In addition, the TETI Company will also maintain graphs in respect of the above mentioned exchanges showing the daily power consumption and will forward one copy of each graph to the Signal Officer RAAC at the beginning of each month.

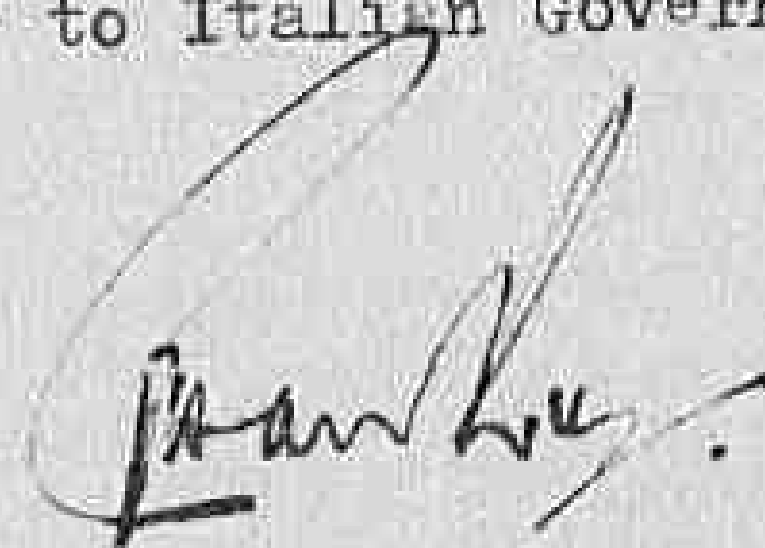

1. In view of the more normal conditions now prevailing in the City of Rome, the Allied Military authorities agree to the relaxation of the restrictions imposed by the TETI Company authorised in the letter dated 30 June 1944 from the A.C. Regional Commissioner, Rome Region.

2. If, as a result of the foregoing, undue interference is caused to the Allied Military service, the Allied Military authorities reserve the right to order the disconnection of sufficient outlets from the civilian line finder units to first code selector units to restore the service at any exchange to normal.

3. In order that the position may be kept under review, the TETI Company will submit weekly reports to the Signal Officer R.A.A.C. in accordance with the following schedule:-

1. As requested by Director of Communications Sub-Commission, AC, investigations have been made into the possibility of de-restricting the number of telephone conversations allowed to civilian subscribers.
2. At a conference held in this office on 15 May 1945, at which both you and a TETI representative were present, proposals were made for the granting of unlimited calls to civilian subscribers, and technical details discussed for the control of the automatic exchanges to ensure against undue interference to military service. The TETI representative was of the opinion that, because of the new message rate system of accounting, undue congestion would not occur. It was made clear to the representative that if congestion did occur the military authorities would require that the number of outlets from the civilian line finder units to first code selectors be reduced.
3. These proposals have been agreed to by Signal Officer, RAAC, and will become effective as from 1 June 1945. It is requested that the necessary arrangements may now be made with the Italian authorities concerned.
4. In order that this office may be kept informed as to the traffic conditions resulting from this de-restriction, arrangements will be made for TETI to submit weekly reports in accordance with the following schedule:-

1. In reply to your undated letter signed E. Vitali requesting information on the present limitations imposed upon TETI by the Allies, the following information is furnished:

a. On 30 June 1944, the Regional Commissioner, Rome Region, Allied Commission Col Charles Poletti issued letter authority to TETI approving proposal of TETI for limiting civilian calling rate. The scheme as approved is as follows:

Cat. 1a Grandi Industrie, Banche e Banchieri
No. 15 conversations

Cat. 2a Commercianti, Professionisti etc.
No. 9 conversations

Cat. 3a Small merchants etc.
No. 6 conversations

Cat. 4a Private houses with one phone
No. 4 conversations

Cat. 5a Private houses with duplex
No. 2 conversations

Cat. 6a Public offices etc.
No. 9 conversations

b. The authority then to re-establish civilian telephone communications was given to TETI on 30 June 1944 with the clear understanding that military requirements might impose in specific circumstances on individual subscribers. The following provisions were included in the Regional order:

(1) That any subscriber's line may have to be

disconnected to meet the requirements of the Allied Military Authorities.

- (2) That if any congestion of telephone traffic caused by civilian usage interferes with military communications disconnection of civilian subscriber may be necessary.

2. In addition to the above authority of Rome Region A.C., Signal Officer RAAC extended authority to TETI on 23 March 1945 to increase Duplex calling rate from 2 calls/day to 4 calls per day and single line subscribers in category 5 from 4 calls/day to 5 calls/day.

3. Authority to TETI therefore is summarized above, with the exception to be noted that military necessity in Rome continues to represent highest priority over all civilian classification.

4. Your attention is invited to press notices of the Local Newspapers, which on or about 1 July 1944 and 25 March 1945 published the true picture of limitations although recently several notices appeared in these newspapers which were confusing to say the least.

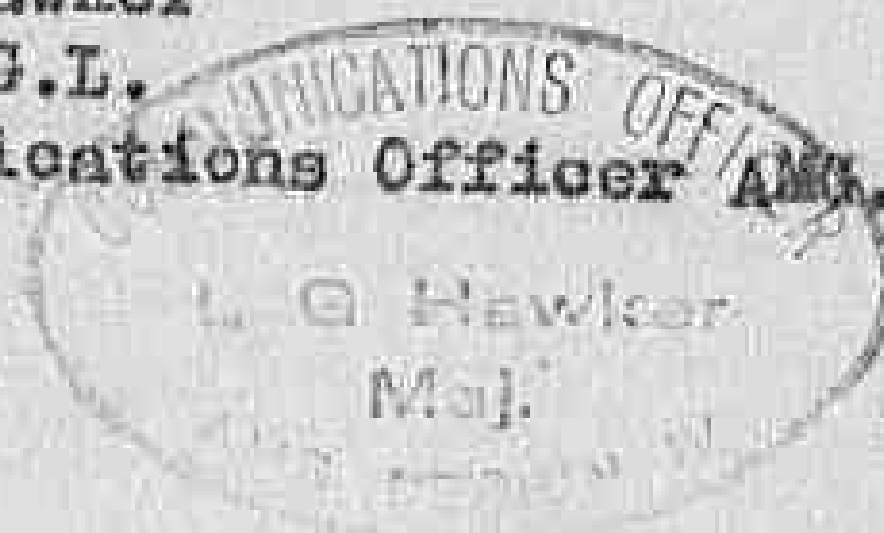
