SUBJECT: Captured Equipment.

TO : A.R.A.R. (Att: Ing. Valerio), Regina Hotel, ROME

1. Considerable quantities of telecommunications materials are lying in dumps round Verona and elsewhere in the North.

2. It is most important that much of this material should be handed over at once to the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications as the work of restoration of civil lines is being seriously held up by the lack of this material.

3. It is understood from Allied Commission officers as well as from Italian State engineers that A.R.A.R. in the North has refused to release certain materials, most urgently required, from dumps round Verona, even though the Allied Chief Signal Officer 2 District, supported the release.

4. Would you kindly investigate the matter, with a view to the release of the materials now. The Italian engineer most closely concerned is Ing. Dani, Azienda di Stato per Servizi Telefonici, Venezia, who can supply details.
