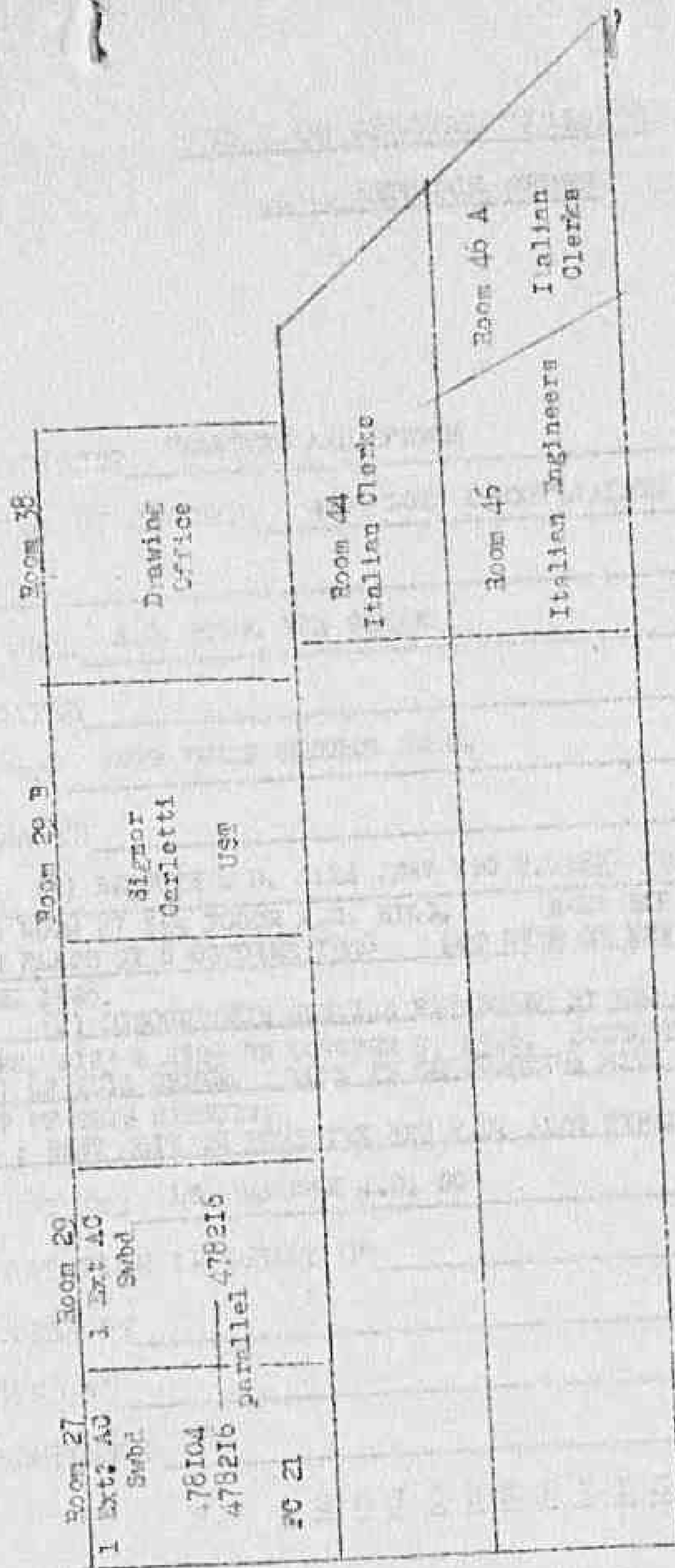

2. Referring to enclosure 1, it will be noticed that on first glance there seems to be an inordinate number of civilian employees. However, the number of switchboard personnel is the minimum necessary to maintain 24 hour service at a standard demanded by ALCOM officers. The number of maintenance personnel can be reduced to three, and if large work orders are encountered, additional personnel can be obtained from TETI for the extra work at an hourly basis. The executive and secretary are necessary to coordinate the various phases of operation, and keep the records and accounts.

3. The other large expense, rent on equipment, is an estimate. The equipment is the property of the Italian Government. It has been assumed that it would charge the same as TETI, and the figure here was obtained from TETI engineers.

SUBJECT: Security of Telephone Conversation

TO : Chiefs of all Staff Sections
Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations

1. Recent monitoring of telephone conversations has shown that there is a considerable lack of security on the part of all ranks.

2. It should be noted that due to the release of personnel, civilian operators and installations are being increasingly utilized. It is, therefore, the duty of all personnel to observe all the security precautions and to be just as security minded now as they were during the actual operations.

3. All personnel must realize that the telephone is definitely an unclassified means of communication. An indiscreet telephone conversation in any part of this theater might give rise to unfounded rumors.

4. Unit commanders will include telephone security in the normal security indoctrination of personnel in their units. Special attention will be given to personnel recently arrived in this theater.

5. Disciplinary action will be taken against offenders when a breach of security of this nature is reported in the future.

1. Letter AG 311.3/47, this Headquarters, 3 July 1946, subject "Telephone Service", is hereby revoked and will be withdrawn from all files and destroyed.

2. In accordance with current directives, drastic reductions in existing telephone services will be affected. Most important amongst these are outlined hereunder for the information of all concerned:

a. Military-requisitioned Hotels to have one (1) military telephone, to be located in the Hotel Manager's Office to be used by military personnel for transaction of Official Business, both local and long distance. Each person using telephone for outgoing calls will be required to sign roster maintained by Hotel Manager, listing name and telephone number of person called. Personal calls made by residents of Hotels from room-extension telephones, will be furnished by the Civil Management of the Hotel, through their regular civilian facilities. Any charge for these calls will be by agreement between the civilian management and individual subscribers, based upon standard rates.

b. Discontinuance of the following services:

(1) Billet telephones, except as authorized, in accordance with paragraph 3, page 111, current RAAC Telephone Directory.

(2) Telephones in Officers', E1's, Sgts' or OR's messes.

(3) Access of press correspondents to military long distance service.

3. Under provisions of existing directives and in accordance with above instructions, all unauthorized billet telephones are being disconnected by Signal Officer, this Headquarters.

4. In order to clarify the present situation, the following rules will govern the authorization of billet telephone service.

R-E-S-T-R-I-C-T-E-D

Billet phones will not be installed except for:

- a. General Officers
- b. Chiefs of Sections
- c. Key personnel requiring 24 hour contact

5. Each unit will immediately forward to this Headquarters a roster personally signed by the Commanding Officer, specifying who of their personnel should be authorized service as outlined in paragraph 4 above. Unit Commanders are reminded that service should not be recommended indiscriminately and that they will be held strictly accountable for unnecessary expenditures from Government budgets for above services.

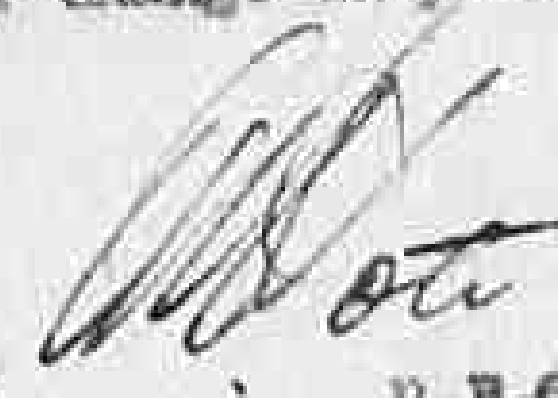

1. In order to comply with current directives regarding military telephone facilities authorized UNRRA, it will be necessary to make changes in the type of service now provided UNRRA personnel located in the Allied Commission Building.

2. It is suggested that the present UNRRA extensions from the A.C. Switchboard be discontinued, replaced by direct civilian dial lines, or be replaced by extensions directly from the UNRRA Switchboard. It has been confirmed that cable facilities are available to accomplish either of the latter possibilities.

3. Request necessary changes be accomplished before 1 June 1946.

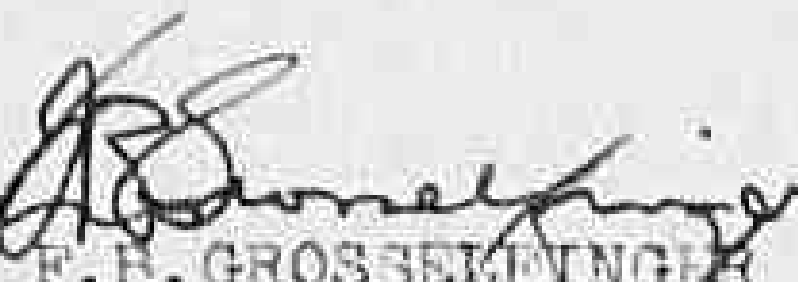
1. The civilian organizations operating as "American Joint Distribution Committee" and "Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees" do not appear to be sub-commissions or sections of Allied Commission, and therefore no military responsibility with regard to military long distance service should be undertaken on the basis that these organizations already have extension service from the AC switchboard. It was confirmed with Signal Section, AFHQ that the above named organizations are not entitled to military service and are required to pay their own bills.

2. UNRRA subscribers may use the military LD network in Rome,

a. When the called party is a military number

b. When in exceptional instances chief operators of military LD exchanges sanction individual calls. Such exceptional calls may be caused by non-existence, interruption or congestion of civil routes.

To implement the above AFHQ directive, arrangements have been made by this Office with UNRRA to the effect that UNRRA calls will be accepted on demand but will all be booked with LD. Consequently all UNRRA personnel with extensions from the AC switchboard should be so advised.

In reference to Rome Area Command letter, ^{ref} 483.2, Military Long Distance, 15 May 1946, the following action is recommended by the AC Signal Officer.

a. Unrestricted extensions on the AC switchboard held by American Joint Distribution Committee and Inter-governmental Committee on Refugees be replaced by civilian dial lines to be obtained from the Italian telephone agency WET by these organizations. If they wish intra-building communication, it can be made on restricted extensions from AC switchboard. The change, once dial lines are obtained, can be made in 15 minutes.

b. UNRRA subscribers on AC switchboard should be advised that no direct long distance calls will be made from AC extensions, but that all long distance calls will be booked with the booking office as UNRRA calls.

1. Congestion on telephone lines within the AC building has become serious and is hampering communications from headquarters. This has been brought to the attention of most subscribers by their inability to get an outside line when dialing "0".

2. There are two reasons for this congestion. One is the large number of unofficial calls, particularly by civilians. The other, and most important, is the excessive number of lines on the AC exchange. A reduction of 20 percent of lines now operating is necessary for proper traffic load.

3. The AC telephone exchange has two blocks of lines. One, the unrestricted (200 - 599), the subscriber can call all numbers in the building, and he can also call all numbers available to the Rome Exchange by dialing "0". The other block, the restricted (600 - 799), can call all three digit numbers in the building, but cannot call outside.

4. It is requested that you release unrestricted numbers in your section least urgently needed, and have telephones carrying a high percentage of intra-building traffic changed to restricted numbers.

2. When an AC operator reports no response from a number, she received no response. If there were a response, the person calling would hear it. It is possible to have a faulty ringing circuit, either in the instrument or the switchboard which will be unknown to the operator. In this case, the instrument was not at fault. No repair request was made to this office for 495, but upon checking it today, it was found to function properly.

3. 495 is a "one plus one" installation with two telephones on the same line in different rooms. The ringing circuit of the master telephone can be switched off. It is possible that in the instances cited the master ringing circuit was switched off, and no one was present at the extension.

4. It is also possible there was a failure in the switchboard ringing circuit. This circuit is maintained as well as possible without interrupting traffic, and such a failure is extremely rare.

5. To avoid further complaints of this kind, the operators have been instructed to ascertain from other Local Government extensions that no one is available at 495 before reporting no response.

TO : All Commands

1. During recent weeks a considerable number of "clear the line" and/or "urgent" telephone calls have been recorded.
2. "Clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls cause dislocation of the telephone service in that a demand for such a call constitutes authority to an operator to break down an existing connection and in that their setting up in any case interrupts the order of waiting calls and thereby causes additional delay to waiting subscribers. Further, the operator handling such a call has to devote his or her whole attention to it until the call is right through and can deal with no other calls while engaged in this manner; this again causes delay in answering subscribers and consequently in dealing with their calls.
3. Such calls will be placed only for the most urgent and immediate operational reasons. Every officer placing these calls must carefully weigh the necessity for immediate action against inconvenience and delay which is imposed on other important messages. Mere seniority of an officer is no justification for placing "clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls. However, officers other than General Officers will rarely have justification for placing such calls unless specifically so directed by those holding General Officer rank.
4. In the future when "clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls, except those made in person by officers of the grade of Major General or above, are made, the reasons for the urgency will be stated in general terms when the call is hooked, to the officer in charge of the switchboard concerned.
5. It is pointed out that the "priority" and "operational priority" degrees of urgency will nearly always insure the rapid connection of a call.

SUBJECT: Telephone Service

TO : All Commands

1. During recent weeks a considerable number of "clear the line" and/or "urgent" telephone calls have been recorded.
2. "Clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls cause dislocation of the telephone service in that a demand for such a call constitutes authority to an operator to break down an existing connection and in that their setting up in any case interrupts the order of waiting calls and thereby causes additional delay to waiting subscribers. Further, the operator handling such a call has to devote his or her whole attention to it until the call is right through and can deal with no other calls while engaged in this manner; this again causes delay in answering subscribers and consequently in dealing with their calls.
3. Such calls will be placed only for most urgent and immediate operational reasons. Every officer placing these calls must carefully weigh the necessity for immediate action against inconvenience and delay which is imposed on other important messages. Mere seniority of an officer is no justification for placing "clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls. However, officers other than General Officers will rarely have justification for placing such calls unless specifically so directed by those holding General Officer rank.
4. In the future when "clear the line" and/or "urgent" calls, except those made in person by officers of the grade of Major General or above, are made, the reasons for the urgency will be stated in general terms when the call is booked, to the officer in charge of the switchboard concerned.
5. It is pointed out that the "priority" and "operational priority" degrees of urgency will nearly always ensure the rapid connection of a call.

1. Reference basic letter attached, para 3 and 4, it is beyond the control of the Signal Office Allied Commission to rectify these faults in the telephone system. All outgoing calls from this building are placed through 23 outgoing trunk circuits which connect into the Viminale exchange in Rome. Faulty connections and engaged signals through dialing after acquiring the dial tone on an external instrument are caused directly by that exchange which is under the supervision of the TETI Telephone Company.

2. Reference para 5 of basic letter, when the receiver of an external dial telephone is lifted and an engaged signal is received, all 23 of our outgoing trunk circuits are loaded. This happens often during heavy periods of the day.

3. The telephone instrument and line in question has been checked and found in order by this office.

1. It has already been decided not to provide direct lines from
A.C.C. switchboard to other offices in Rome, or even to the long-distance
switchboard for several reasons:-

(a) No spare relay equipment is available, and it would have to be
manufactured.

(b) Non-standard operating is necessary, which involves reversing
the call, a process which renders it as quick to make dialled calls. The language
difficulty tends to accentuate the delay.

(c) Shortage of manual positions which makes it essential to reduce
the operators' loads as much as possible by confining their work to standard
operations.
