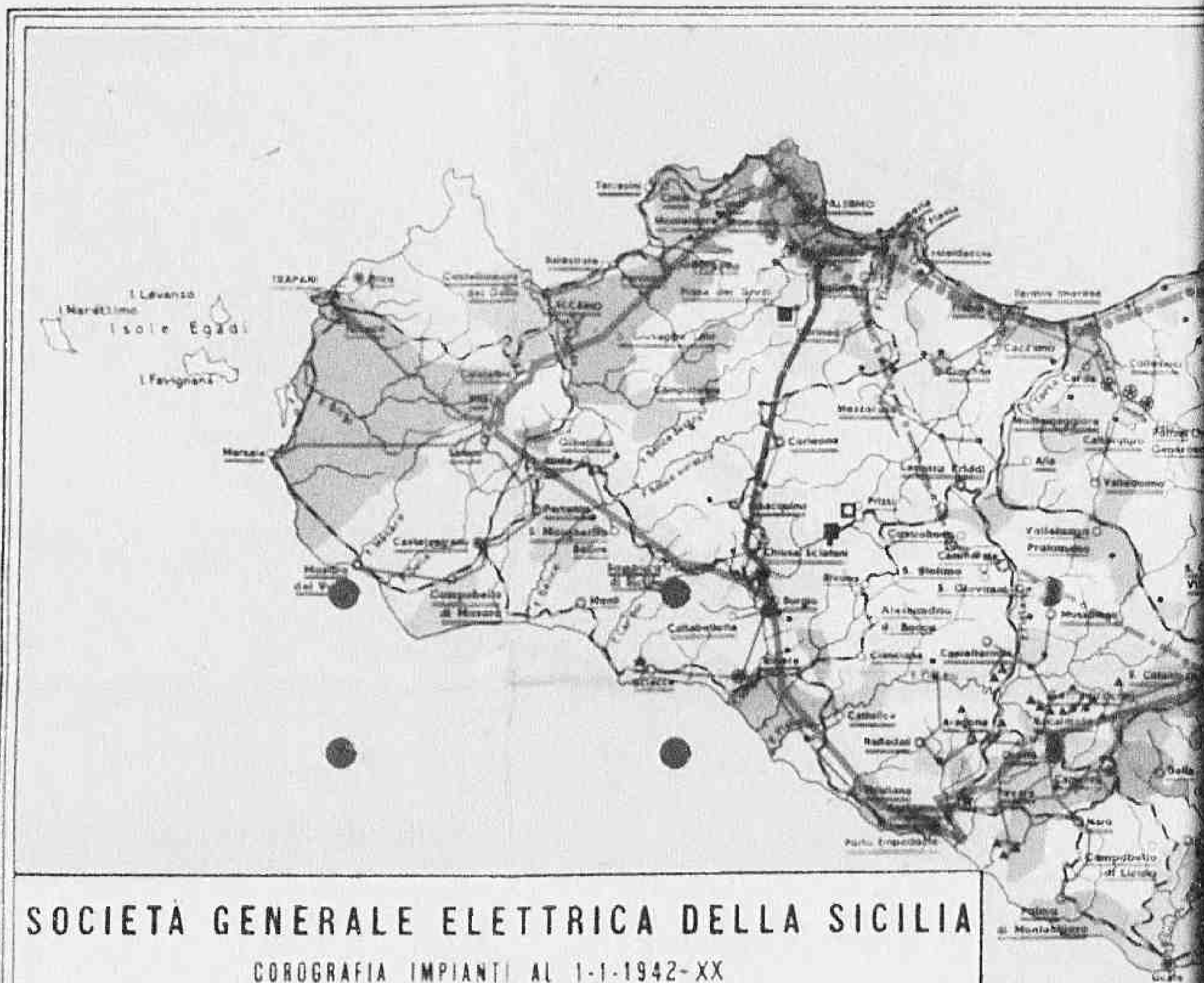

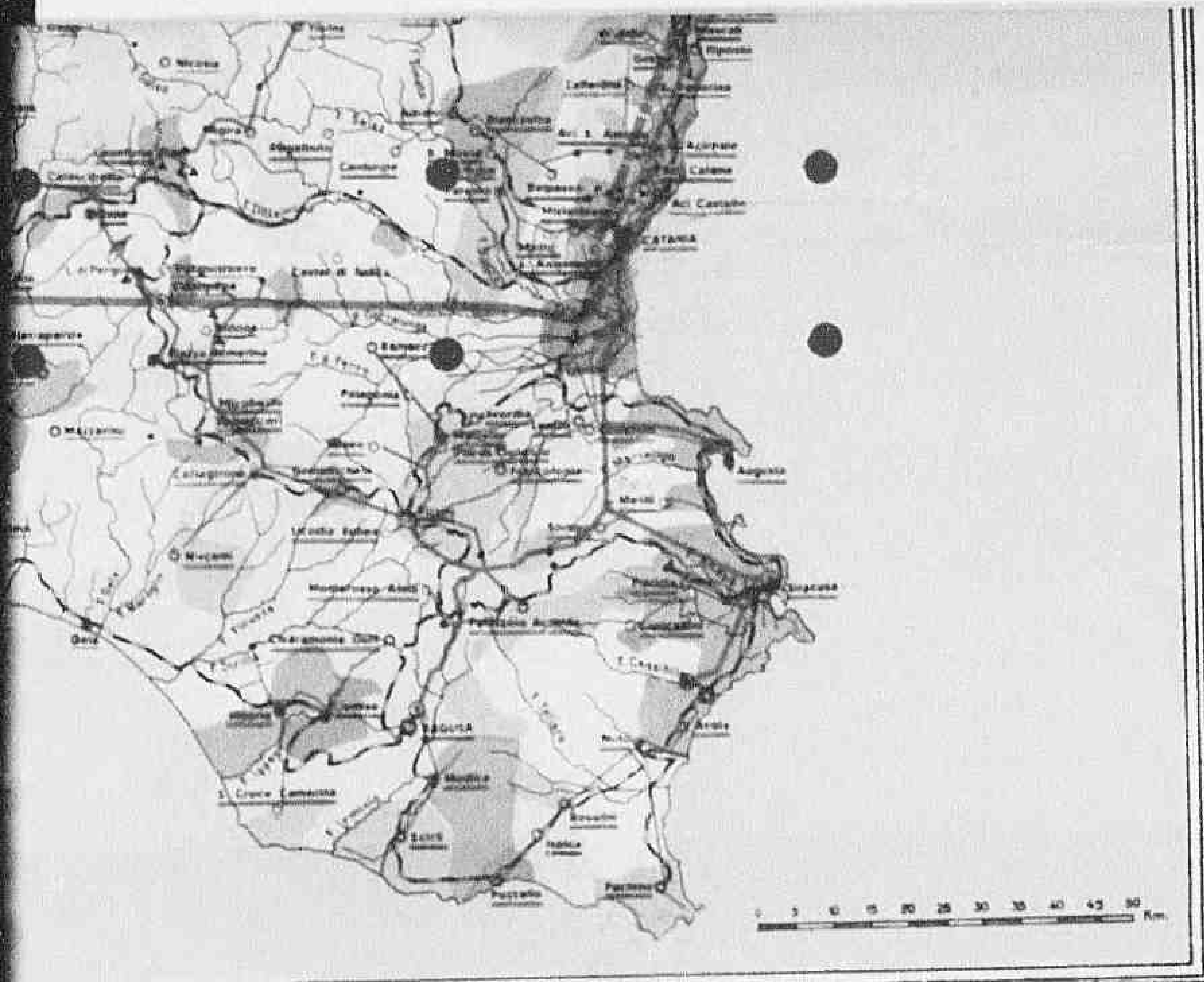

A G R E E M E N T

between

ALLIED MILITARY GOVERNMENT - SICILY REGION HEADQUARTERS

relative to

Electric Power Generation, Transmission, and Distribution.

It is agreed that:-

a . Effective 0001 hours, 3 December 1943, the control, supervision and direction of electric power generation, transmission and distribution in central and western Sicily, i.e. that area formerly under the jurisdiction of the Island Base Section including the provinces of Palermo, Trapani, Agrigento, Caltanissetta and the western portion of Enna province, are transferred to Allied Military Government Headquarters.

b . All orders regarding operations of the Soc. Gen. Elettrica di Sicilia and interconnected companies, including direction for furnishing of electric service, use of employees, etc., will, effective the date of this agreement be given only by Allied Military Government Headquarters.

c . All military requirements for electric power will be given first priority. Commanders of military units will submit their requirements to the Engr. Section IBS who after approval of same, will present those requirements to Allied Military Government Headquarters.

d . The Engr. Section IBS will keep Allied Military Government Headquarters currently informed of any expected changes in military power requirements and will also recommend whenever it appears advisable, changes in power operations necessary to guarantee meeting of military power requirements.

Subject: Electric Power control

I acknowledge the receipt of your letter dated December the 4th 1943 U.T.C. 675, from which it is understood that starting from 1 o' clock of the 5th inst., the General Electric Society of Sicily, of which I am the Managing Director, by availing itself of its own organizations, has assumed the full responsibility of electric power production and distribution, observing the following order of priority: first, supply for needs of the Allied Military Forces; second supply for community needs; third supply for individual needs.

The Allied Military Command has informed that it will continue, just the same, to render every possible assistance to the Society, so that the Society may meet power requirements according to the needs of the Island.

While, I take notice, fully satisfied, of the above resolution, that I deem as a mark of trust given to the Society, I beg to bring to the attention of the Command for its examination some important considerations:

In the Island, electric power is produced through hydric and thermic central stations. Hydroelectric production bears between 90 and 120 millions of kWh a year, as production depends upon rains, while electric requirements confined to essential needs are estimated for the year 1944 about 160.000.000 kWh (in 1942 production was 230 millions of kWh.) Based on this, it will be necessary to produce in 1944 about 65.000.000 of thermic kWh, for which production there is needed a coal allotment (7500 calories) of about 91.000 Tons. (in the semester July-December only 17.000 Tons have been delivered against 74.000 Tons consumed in the same semester 1942).

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Moreover, noticeable is the fact that for about a year the Society has not received any working materials and its stocks without further additions are now almost entirely exhausted.

Owing to such conditions, in order to make the Society able to continue conveniently the fulfillment of the task allotted to it, it is necessary that the Allied Command does not discontinue to render its assistance, so as to make easier the supply of the most important working materials, since the Society is to-day quite unable to get them through direct actions, on account of the present state of the country.

The following are the most important materials which are needed with the utmost possible urgency, since the corresponding stocks are entirely at an end: coal, lubricating materials, oils, carburetors, electro-mechanical machinery, insulating materials, locomotion means, fittings, etc.

Separately, by enclosure, I take the liberty to submit a detailed list, so that the Allied Command may make its pertinent decisions.

I put myself at the Superior Allied Command's disposal for whatever eventual explanations it may deem necessary.

SUBJECT : Financing of SGES

TO : Instr. R/ Tricomi
Managing Director SGES.

1. Arrangements have been completed by the Allied commission for the essential financing of SGES to be handled by Italian authorities.

2. For repairs to the physical plant, up to a total of 50,000,000 lire will be available from the Bank of Sicily under the following conditions:

a. The money is advanced by the bank to the SGES under the guarantee of the Italian Government.

b. The SGES will submit to the Region Utilities Officer (RUO) proposals for repair projects. Each project will be designated by a number, and there will be included an estimate of the cost; and a description of the project sufficiently complete to indicate the reasonableness of the cost estimate will be given, and also an estimated date of completion.

c. Based on these estimates the RUO will authorize the Bank of Sicily to establish the necessary credit to the account of the SGES.

d. Not later than the 10th of each month the SGES will deliver to the RUO an accounting for expenditures for the previous month.

(1) For each project completed during the month an accounting will be made. Supporting vouchers will be retained by the SGES pending final accounting.

(2) For continuing projects, approximate figures will be given for.

- (a) Original estimate for cost.
 - (b) Expense incurred
 - (c) Percentage completed
 - (d) Estimated time of completion.
 - (e) Current revised estimate of total cost.

3. For meeting the monthly operating deficit, incurred after 10 November 1943, up to a total of 25,000,000 lire will be available from the Bank of Sicily under the following conditions :

a. My money is advanced by the Bank to the SGES under the guarantee of the Italian government.

b. The SGES will submit to the RUO by the 10th of each month a report covering expenditures and revenue for the previous month.

Supporting vouchers will be retained by the SGES for final accounting when required.

c. Based on this accounting, the RUO will authorize the Bank of Sicily to establish the necessary credit to the account of the SGES.

d. No expenditures are to be made for the following purposes:

- (1) Dividends on stocks maturing after 30 June 1943
- (2) Interest on bonds " " " "
- (3) Interest on unsecured debt " " " "
- (4) Taxes levied on the company its property,

operations, or income. (The company will continue to collect taxes for governmental agencies, and pay the amounts collected to the proper agencies.)

(5) No floating debt nor maturing securities will be retired. (This does not prohibit settling accounts which are normally paid at intervals of one month or less; nor does it prohibit paying a bill for labor.)

e. No penalties of attachment, of fine, or any other sort will be permitted to be levied against company or any of its employees or officials because of failure to make the payments forbidden by paragraph 3d.

The following orders and statements of ACC policy were given by Col. Crowden for enforcement by the Region Utilities Officer:

1. Financing of repairs -

 - b. Each project and the amount to be made available is to be approved by the RUO.
 - c. No payments are to be made to refinance floating debt.
2. Financing of operating deficit.
 - a. A statement is to be made to give the operating deficit for each month to the RUO/ The RUO will order the Bank of Sicily to make the advance to cover the deficit.
 - b. There is to be included nothing for
 - (1) Taxes
 - (2) Interest or dividends.
 - (3) Payment of debts.
 - c. Order are to be issued by RANG to protect the Co. against penalties which might be incurred because of such defaulting.
3. a. All repairs will be made as far as possible with local materials.
 - b. Order of priority of repairs to be specified by RANG.
 - c. Frozen materials needed will be released through the RUO
 - d. A procedure to permit the release of essential allied government materials available (Army, Navy or requisitioned stocks) is to be arranged by the ACC.
 - e. All steam plants are to be cleaned up. (Porto Empedocle is now in good shape.)
 - f. Transport required is to be requisitioned through

civilian channels.

G. Petrol is to be obtained through normal provincial supply channels.

4. No increase in rates will be allowed by the AMG, but the study of the rate situation is to be continued by RAMG. This question will be left for the Italian Government.

5. Fuel problems are to be handled through RAMG/

a. Only Sardinian Coal can be expected.

b. Continuation of supplies to be insured by RAMG clearing again with Region Economics Supply and ACC Fuel Subcommittee for supplies for Catania, Palermo, and Porto Empedocle electric plants and the Palermo and Trapani gas plants.

c. The questions of price and delivery points are to be clarified by RAMG.

6. It was directed by Col. Growden that

a. The SGXS was to receive all orders as to policy through the RUO.

b. The SGXS would make all requests for supplies or instructions from allied ~~Services~~ through the RUO.

1. Under present conditions the operating revenue of the Società Generale Elettrica della Sicilia is inadequate to meet operating expenses. The company has no reserve funds available with which to meet this deficit.

2. The continued operating of the company's system and a supply of electric power are essential both for military requirements and civilian needs.

3. The company must be subsidized by a grant of funds to meet its operating deficit.

4. Operating revenue and operating expense will vary widely from month to month with consequent variation in the deficit.

5. A fund of 25,000,000 lire is required from which the monthly deficit can be paid to the company. Payment of the amount of the monthly deficit will be made to the company upon presentation of a properly prepared and authenticated statement showing the operating income and the operating expense for the preceding month.

6. Operating practices will be supervised by officers of the Allied Military Government or by officers of the Italian Government.

To : Brigadier A. A. Mamiya, Economic Director

1. The Island of Sicily is served with electric power with minor exceptions, by the Societa Generale Elettrica della Sicilia. The power system consists of three steam generating stations and seven hydroelectric stations interconnected by a transmission grid.

2. Certain parts of the physical plant have suffered severe war damage, amounting to approximately 200 million lire.

3. Repair of some parts of the war damage is essential to permit the supply of electric power to essential military and civilian loads and to prevent waste of hydroelectric power. Some of the repairs should be temporary but should be completed as promptly as possible.

4. The company is unable to pay for the necessary repairs from their own resources.

5. Funds to pay for essential repairs are urgently required.

6. Under present conditions, the operating revenue of the Societa Generale Elettrica della Sicilia is inadequate to pay operating expenses which have been met by subsidies in some form.

7. Funds to continue meeting the company's operating deficit are required.

OFFICIAL ORDER NO. 11

EMPLOYEES' WAGE ADJUSTMENT

Whereas by Decree No. 11 of the General Officer Commanding the Allied Forces in the Occupied Territory of Sicily, a general limitation on wages was declared, and the Allied Military Government was given power in Article II thereof to alter rates of wages;

Now, therefore, I FRANK J. McHEWITT, Brigadier General, Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officer, hereby order as follows:-

ARTICLE I

(a) Employees of permanent and temporary status of the State, Province, Communes, Public-Utilities, and Public Institutions and Agencies (Autonome) which are administered by any of the foregoing governmental units shall receive a temporary wage adjustment which shall be calculated on the basis of previous total and basic (base plus ordinary and extraordinary increments) which normally represent an integral part of their total salary as described in Article IV below.

(b) Increases in Article I, subdivision (a) above shall become effective on 1 November 1943.

ARTICLE II

(a) Private employees are permitted to grant increases in both salaries and wages, effective 1 November 1943, and shall not exceed the percentages described in Article IV below. Increases shall be applied to salaries and wages fixed by Collective Labor Contracts effective as of 1 September 1943. However, in the case of the contract of Palermo, Catania and Messina, the percentage increase shall be based upon the contract wage as fixed plus the index of Palermo. These increases shall in no way affect or be affected by the Assegno Familiare.

(1) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1943 shall be deducted from any increase granted as a result of this proposal.

(2) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1943 which exceed the amount of increase granted by this proposal shall not be affected thereby.

(3) Any dispute which arises between employer and employee or employees under this Article shall be adjusted in accordance with the machinery provided in the General Order No. 1 dated 24 September 1943.

ARTICLE III

1307

ARTICLE I

- (a) Employees of permanent and temporary status of the State, Province, Communes and Part-States, and Public Institutions and Agencies (Inclined) which are administered by any of the foregoing governmental units shall receive a "Temporary wage adjustment" which shall be calculated on the basis of present total pay plus ordinary and extraordinary increments, which normally represent an increased part of their total salary as described in Article IV below.
- (b) Increases in Article I, subdivision (a) above shall become effective as of 1 November 1943.

ARTICLE II

- (a) Private employers are permitted to grant increases in both salaries and wages, effective immediately, which shall not exceed the percentages described in Article IV below. Increases shall be applied to salaries and wages fixed by Government Labor Contracts effective as of 1 September 1942. As such, in the case of the cities of Palermo, Catania and Messina, the percentage increases shall be based upon the contract wage so fixed plus the index of Palermo. These increases shall in no way affect or be affected by the General Fair Labor Law.

- (1) Increases in salaries and wages provided by employees since 1 September 1942 shall be deducted from any increase granted as a **1307** proposal.

- (2) Increases in salaries and wages received by employees since 1 September 1942 which exceed the amount of increase granted by this proposal shall not be reflected thereby.

- (b) Any dispute which arises between employer and employee or employees under this Article shall be adjusted in accordance with the machinery provided in Law General Order No. 2 dated 24 September 1943.

ARTICLE III

This Order does not apply to persons directly employed by branches of the Police Armed Forces or by contractors rendering services to said forces.

ARTICLE IV

The foregoing provisions shall be applied in accordance with the following schedule:

(a) Schedule:

On 1st	1,000 per month (or fraction thereof)	70%
2nd	"	60%
3rd	"	50%
4th	"	40%
5th	"	30%
6th	"	20%
7th	"	10%

(b) There shall be no maximum limit of L. 1,000 per month for salaries or wages which exceed L. 5,000 per month.

This Order will become operative in each province or port of origin and occupied territory of Sicily on the day of its first publication therein.

1. In view of an appreciable increase in the amount of water in storage for the San Carlo group of generators and because of the probable loss of additional water at this source, authority is hereby given to increase the system power load effective this date.

- a. Increase the allowance for sulphur mines to a total of 10,000 kwh. per day. None of this power is to be used between the hours of 1500 to 2300. In case of violation of this restriction you are directed to terminate power service to the mine or mines at once and report the matter promptly to this office.
- b. Make additional power available for flour mill operation only from the hours 2300 to 1500 subject to requests and approval of the respective S.C.A.O.
- c. Furnish power to the cement plant in Palermo during the off peak period stated above for a period of approximately ten (10) days.
- d. Maintain twenty-four (24) hour service on the 70 kv. line from Caltanissetta to Enna to facilitate the pumping of water, operation of flour mills, and processing of olives.
- e. Resume operation of electric trolley cars for public conveyance between Palermo and Monreale, Palermo and Mondello, under the supervision of AME. This power load is not to exceed 3500 kwh. per day.
- f. Make available to all civilians in Western Sicily electric energy for illumination purposes only, not to exceed three hours per day. It is understood that the same service is to be available through resale companies as that offered over S.S.E.S. distribution circuits. This is not to be construed as the authority to permit the use of electric heating units or industrial equipment and appliances unless specifically approved by this office.

2. These increases in the system power load are approved strictly on a temporary basis and will be rescinded immediately whenever conditions make it necessary that such action be taken. In order to continue this increased output certain conditions must be maintained as follows:

- a. A supply of water for the San Carlo group in excess of 500,000 m³.
- b. Continuous operation of the Palermo steam plant with one boiler on the line.
- c. Operation of the Cassina Hydro plant at the minimum required for peaking purposes only.

3. It is estimated that a total output of 180,000 kwh. per day will be required for the system. This is based on a total daily load of 40,000 kwh. in the Southern Area and 21,000 kwh. in the Trapani Province which are not to be exceeded.

Cent. 40 (forty) for each reading effected under the 2,000 monthly readings.

For the bill compilers

Cent. 7 (seven) for each bill compiled under the 12,000 monthly bills or for any corresponding minor rendering in other works.

Conventional retributions

When we do not verify on the part of the dependent the effective giving of work, namely during the annual holidays the eventual illness or accidents the recall to work and the annual gratification, the eventual indemnities in substitution of notice to leave "Fundi di Previdenza" for each dependent will be given a conventional monthly retribution of L. 1,300 for each collector or reader of L. 1,400 for each dependent addicted to the compiling of bills.

1. The firm of "Ing. Ernesto Marino De Giacomo" has, for the past ten years, contracted for construction and maintenance work with the "Societa Generale Elettrotecnica della Sicilia".

2. On 11 Sept. 43, the contract team's workers were engaged in repairing an underground cable which supplies a rather large area including the Villa Igea. Prior to completion of this job, (and with possible knowledge of the effect on the Villa Igea and other important military loads) seven key workers ("sine-bosses") refused to continue work unless their wages were immediately increased. This, the contractor refused, based (according to him) on the provisions of published proclamations. The seven workers have not returned to work.

3. The Societa Generale Elettrotecnica della Sicilia has been ordered to submit a study of wage adjustments commensurate with revenue, which will cover the above class of employees. When all the facts are available, wage adjustments can be made, if proper, in connection with any general revision of wage rates for Sicily, which is now under study by MTCR HQ Labor Office.

4. It is felt that these circumstances may establish a precedent, detrimental throughout the Island, unless corrective measures are applied as quickly as possible.

5. It is recommended that the striking workers be ordered back to work, under authority of Art. VI, Proclamation No. 1, at wages in effect 9 July 43, pending completion of the study mentioned in para. 3. Likewise that refusal to comply will result in trial before Allied Military Courts.

This company's financial problem could be solved if these communes (listed in the attached report) would pay their bills. We would propose to send out notices to F.O.'s in the provinces to request communes to pay their bills.

Meanwhile to meet the immediate need, we could ask Palermo Commune to pay its bill - listed herein at Lvs 2,650,000 at 30/4/43. Could you discuss this with Mr. Salza, ^{head of the Dept.} and Lt. Becker, F. 1275 Palermo, at the Refettorio?
