SHIPPING SUB-COMMISSION.

Schooner Traffic.

Consideration has been given to the question of the manner in which the best use of the Italian schooner fleet may be accomplished and the Shipping Sub-Commission are of the opinion that the following scheme is one by which the potential carrying power of the vessel may be placed quickly at the disposal of the Allied Authorities.

1. The Italian schooner fleet is broadly divided into three distinct classes:-
 - (a) vessels with a deadweight capacity of 250-500 tons capable of Mediterranean trading;
 - (b) vessels with a capacity of 60-150 tons deadweight for general Italian coastwise traffic;
 - (c) vessels for local traffic carrying from 10-60 tons deadweight.

For the most part the fleet is fitted with auxiliary motors.

2. It is considered that to obtain the maximum use of these vessels a uniform system of control must be established throughout the whole of liberated Italy, Sicily and Sardinia. It is, therefore, proposed that these schooners not required for purely operational purposes, e.g. minesweepers, are withdrawn from their present operators and placed under the control of MEDSO or its nominees.

3. The principle that all demands for shipping space must be channelled through G.4 (Shipping) Branch, A.F.H.Q., Advanced Echelon, has already been accepted. In this manner the major movements in schooner traffic across the Italian coast have been entered for, and known procedures of military and civil supplies can be carried under efficient control.

It must, however, be acknowledged that large quantities of cargo originating in the various districts and provinces of Italy, which are consumed relatively locally, will make demands for carriage in vessels as in paras. 1(b) and 1(c) above.

4. Experience in Sicily and adjacent ports in Calabria has shown that it is a misuse of schooners to endeavour to supply densely populated areas from long distances with these craft. It is for this reason that a system of Central Control with regional representation, which should incorporate the existing Italian Governmental and civilian agencies together with the competent local Allied Authority, is desirable. At the same time every endeavour should be made to deliver ocean borne traffic as near to its ultimate destination as possible. SUBJECT: Precautions in Handling Dangerous Cargo.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Supply of this theater involves the discharge, loading, moving and storing of vast quantities of explosives, chemicals and other inflammable cargo. War conditions preclude the full enforcement of normal peace-time safety precautions in the handling of these supplies, while at the same time the danger of explosion and fire is increased. To meet this situation it is essential that every individual and agency involved be constantly on the alert to insure that this very real menace be reduced to a minimum. To this end all commanders will take steps to insure that the following general rules are rigidly observed:

- a. Handling of dangerous types of supplies will be under the constant supervision of technically qualified personnel.
- b. Every possible action will be taken to prevent the accumulation of dangerous types of supplies at ports, freight yards, etc.
- c. Dispersion and segregation of ships, rail cars and motor transport containing dangerous cargo, will be habitually practiced within the physical limitation of each particular installation.
- d. All concerned with the handling of dangerous supplies will be advised as to the existence of such cargo prior to its arrival.

2. In future chemical warfare ammunition, etc., will not be imported direct to ITALY from United Kingdom or United States. When chemical warfare ammunition, liquids, or stores are shipped to ITALY from NORTH AFRICA, SICILY or LIBYIA, special notification will be sent by this headquarters. Sailing advices will include a full description of these stores and full details of stowage will be given.

Memorandum for: Colonel E. H. Foley.

1. In the attached memorandum of the Secretary-General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, it is revealed that Colonel Foley of the Finance Control Commission proposes to substitute vessels of small tonnage for the large American ships in North African ports. These small vessels would be able to disembark their cargoes of food for the Italian population in secondary ports. Thus they would not interfere with and crowd the large ports which are needed for the unloading of supplies for the Allied troops in Italy.

2. According to the articles of the armistice, all the Italian mercantile units of gross tonnage greater than 300 tons have in large part been consigned to the North African Shipping Board. There are remaining only a small number which are undergoing repairs before they can be activated.

We retain few vessels of the type smaller than 300 gross tonnage, and even they have small cargo capacity. Moreover, they would not be able to effect the crossing from North Africa easily, even considering apart their minimum cargo facility.

3. The proposed use of auxiliary sailing vessels as supply ships is prohibitive for the following reasons:

a. These auxiliary sailing vessels possess a cargo capacity generally less than 100 tons.

b. They are slow-sailing and would take a long time to cover the long routes to and from the North African ports.

c. They are not even sufficient to take care of the coastal supply lines (a situation which gravely affects the railway and motor vehicle transport facilities), since the British Military Authority have chartered and requisitioned the great majority of these auxiliary sailing vessels.

4. The only solution that the Allied Nations should choose, if they wish to ship supplies to the population of unoccupied Italy is that which will restore to us at least those ships of gross tonnage inferior to 1500 tons which we have ceded to the North African Shipping Board and which appear on the attached list.

With these ships it would be possible to take over the cargo from the large freighters that arrive in the North African ports from America. They would then unload them in the small ports of Southern Italy and of the islands without interfering in any way with the flow of supplies to the Allied troops in the major ports.
