After careful examination it now appears that receiving reports furnished by ICE cannot be used as basis for billing the Italian Government. This is partly due to inefficiency of ICE and partly to inherent difficulties in tallying miscellaneous technical supplies under conditions which do not permit opening cases at times of tally. Unlikely counter tally by WSA/MWT Italian Agents on behalf of ship will be of much greater value.

2. A LAG 1275 foreshadows this in pointing out that WSA/MWT cannot allow such tallies to be used as a claim against the ship.

Earnestly, therefore, repeat recommendation previously made in para 3 C TAM 650 that TAM 28 procedure should continue to be used throughout period of military responsibility. Up to date list of losses and diversions now in active preparation as indicated our F34536 of 11 presents no compilation difficulties.



1. Ref. your S-33 dated 13th June and our 13/A/Tn.1, dated 18th June.
2. The great majority of the delinquent Warehouses are occupied by Federazione dei Consorzi Agrari and the remainder by other organisations.
3. We have pursued this matter strongly with all concerned and impressed upon them the seriousness of non-compliance with instructions. Further, copies of extracts of PBS Cargo Movement Orders have been sent to all organisations involved.
4. Having examined specimen M/T Truck Dispatch Orders it appears that one cause of delay is the non-appreciation by some parties that the day is considered as being from 1800 hrs. to 1800 hrs.. The example quoted in Annexure "A" is a case in point.
5. Both Federations and I.C.E. are fully aware of PBS instructions and are making an honest-attempt to implement these instructions. However so far as the Federazione is concerned, a hindering factor is the distance between their many Warehouses and lack of transportation. This matter is being taken up with Federazione Head Office.
6. With reference to para 4 of your letter A.C. now has no Warehouse at Naples.

1 You would draw your attention to Finance Sub-Commission letter ref.  
19657/F/A dated 9th March 1945 which sets out clearly the correct procedure to be  
adopted in respect of Motor Transport Dispatch Orders.

2 A strong complaint has reached us from M.P.Q. to the effect that your  
warehouses at Naples did not turn in the triplicate copy of the M.T. Dispatch Orders  
to the Port Highway office on the dates quoted in para 1 of the attached Appendix 2A.

3 Further para. 2 of appendix 2A quotes dates on which the same warehouses  
did not use stamps completely or only partially stamped.

4 The importance of returning to the port through official channels the  
triplicate copy properly signed, and stamped with the appropriate stamp, cannot be  
overemphasized. The primary purpose of these M.T. Dispatch Orders is to ensure the  
safe delivery of the load.

This is a most serious matter and we shall be obliged if you will  
(a) Institute an immediate enquiry and let us have a report on your  
findings and action taken, as soon as possible.

(b) Vigorously pursue this matter and ensure complete compliance with  
regulations in future.

1 Attention of this Section has again been drawn to the failure of Depots receiving civil supplies through the Port of Naples to comply with the instructions on Supply Security issued by this Headquarters. Letter AG 400.73/087 GDS-O of 19th February 1945 refers.

2 Provision by the port military authorities for the safe-guarding of cargo from port to warehouses is dependent on the prompt and correct handling of the triplicate (green) copy of the M/T Truck Dispatch Orders. These are to be properly received and stamped by the receiving depots and returned to the Port Highway Office within twenty-four hours.

3 It is requested that this matter be vigorously pursued and complete compliance to the regulations be assured.

4 The attached schedule indicates the delinquent depots during the period 21-29 May 1945. Individual corrective action should be taken. It is noted that depots operated by both the AC and Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari are included.

5 A report of your findings and action taken is requested.

U R G E N T

1. We refer to our even No. and subject dated 3rd May, para 1 (b) of which lays down that discrepancies between ship's documents and quantities actually unloaded must be investigated on the spot and that Receiving Reports must be obtained and forwarded to this H.Q..

2. The instructions are not in general being observed. In particular, Receiving Reports are not being obtained promptly and rendered to this H.Q. and are frequently only obtained at a later date as a result of action by this S/C or Finance S/C. Discrepancies are not as a general rule rescertained and investigated at the time of off-loading but are only picked up when reported by this S/C or Finance S/C when the receiving Report is ultimately received.

3. This is a most unsatisfactory state of affairs which not only adversely affects our accounting but adds to the danger of supplies re-coming the black market.

4. At this stage of events when the importation of civilian supplies from extra Mediterranean Sources is on the up grade, it cannot be too strongly emphasised that thorough and conscientious implementation of instructions from this H.Q. is of paramount importance.

5. Extremely large sums in dollars and sterling are involved in the present programme for importing civil supplies into Italy, and the Receiving Reports obtained at ship-side are used by the Allied Treasuries as the direct basis for raising charges against the Italian Government.

6. This is a responsible job and you are charged with ensuring that it is carried out properly. Will you please give the closest attention to this matter.

1. Ref. your 13/A/Tw dated 13 June 1945 and our 13/A/Tw.1.dated 15 June 1945.

2. The great majority of the delinquent warehouses are occupied by Federazione dei Consorzi Agrari and the remainder by other organisations.

3. We have pursued this matter strongly with all concerned and impressed upon them the seriousness of non-compliance with instructions. Further, copies of extracts of PBS Cargo Movement Orders have been sent to all organisations involved.

4. Having examined specimen M/T Truck Dispatch orders it appears that one cause of delay is the non-appreciation by some parties that the day is considered as being from 1800 hrs. to 1800 hrs. The example quoted in Annexure "A" is a case in point.

5. Both Federazione and I.C.N. are fully aware of PBS instructions and are making an honest attempt to implement these instructions. However so far as the Federazione is concerned, a hindering factor is the distance between their many warehouses and lack of Transportation. This matter is being taken up with Federazione Head Office.

6. With reference to para. 4 of your letter, A.G. now has no warehouse at Naples.

1. Our letter of June 14 on a/m subject, copy of which was sent to you, instructs agencies of the Italian Government to agree their tallies at ship-side with those of your ships' agent. This seems to have been done only for ships berthed in the Italian port area.

2. Allied Commission Headquarters has requested that arrangements be made through your ships' agents to tally all imported civilian supplies entering Port of Naples, including military port areas, and that your tallies be regarded as the official record of ships' discharge for purposes of transferring ownership to the Italian Government.

3. It is suggested that checkers of your ships' agents and those of receiving agents should reach an accord on each sling load and that at the end of each day should sign each others tally.

4. Upon completion of discharge of the ship, please have your agents furnish this office with two certified copies of the outturn of civil supplies according to their tally record together with any explanation they may have for discrepancies with manifest of ship or damage to cargo.

PROVISIONAL OUTLINE OF PROPOSED RESPONSIBILITIES OF AMERICAN AGENTS

1. The Allied Commission will appoint a delivery agent or agents for checking, receiving and certifying deliveries of imported civilian supplies. Such agents may be called upon to perform these services in any port in Italy. The delivery agent will provide at his own expense all personnel, equipment, supplies and facilities for such work.
2. The AG delivery agent will operate under the direct supervision of an AG Officer or W/CN, and will receive compensation in line for his services at agreed rates. So far as practicable, the rates shall be on a basis of tonnage handled for each class of commodities. A scheme of graduated charges shall also be established for other work to be performed at the request of AG. Payment for the delivery agents services will be made monthly by AG upon a certified payment voucher prepared by the port liaison officer, and approved by the head of the appropriate AG organization.
3. In accordance with existing practice AG receives preliminary notices of abhesited vessel arrivals. These notices and related AG papers will be made available to the port liaison officer prior to the arrival of the ship so that appropriate arrangements can be effected for disposition of the cargo. Ordinarily the information will consist of notice of anticipated date of ship arrival, ship name, shipping documents, and circumstances pertaining thereto specifying certain items shipped. Complete information will be promptly forwarded to the port liaison officer by \_\_\_\_\_.
4. AG will prescribe all operations, procedures, forms, and records

2. The AC delivery agent will operate under the direct supervision of an officer or MGR, and will receive compensation in lire for his services at agreed rates. So far as practicable, the rates shall be on a basis of tonnage handled for each class of commodities. A schedule of predetermined charges shall also be established for other work to be performed at the request of AC. Payment for the delivery agents services will be made monthly by AMM upon a certified payment voucher prepared by the port liaison officer, and approved by the head of the appropriate AC organization.

3. In accordance with existing practice AC receives preliminary notices of scheduled vessel arrivals. These notices and related messages will be made available to the port liaison officer prior to the arrival of the ship so that arrangements can be effected for disposition of the cargo. Ordinarily the information will consist of notice of anticipated date of ship arrival, ship manifest, shipping documents, and instances packing lists specifying detail items shipped. Complete information will be promptly forwarded to the port liaison officer by \_\_\_\_\_.

4. AC will prescribe all operations, procedures, forms, and records essential to the agent's handling of incoming supplies (including book lists, sheets, load tickets, register of supplies delivered, and certificate of unloading). All forms shall be printed both in English and Italian.

12. Unless otherwise directed by AC the receiving agent of the Italian government (Federazione avv. or ICE) shall render receiving reports on the basis of commodity quantities unloaded from shipside. 15. Various miscellaneous services may be performed by the agent upon call of AC for which separate compensation shall be paid (actual costs to be approved by AC plus nominal charge for administrative expenses).  
In the case of goods arriving in spoiled or damaged condition by action of water, heat or other cause, the exact condition will be noted on the tally sheets and load tickets. Here any substantive quantities is involved, the delivery agent should immediately notify the port liaison officer so that appropriate action can be taken. In this connection it is to be understood that the provision does not relate to the original prohibition quality of goods. Under no circumstances will the quantity actually delivered be reduced because the quality or grade of the commodity does not meet the expectation of the receiving agent of the Italian Government.
16. All operations of the delivery agent shall be subject to supervision by AC. A representative of AC shall have access at times to all buildings, enclosures, offices and records of the delivery agent. Personnel employed by the delivery agent shall be subject to approval by AC. No collateral or extraneous work shall be undertaken by the delivery agent in respect to the handling of supplies other than those mentioned. The delivery agent shall be liable for the full value of supplies damaged, lost or stolen as a result of negligence, misconduct, theft or other contributor of AC employees.

1. We refer to our even No. and subject dated 3rd May, para 1 (v) of which lays down that discrepancies between ships documents and quantities actually unloaded must be investigated on the spot and that Receiving Reports must be obtained and forwarded to this H.Q..
2. The instructions are not in general being observed. In particular, Receiving Reports are not being obtained promptly and rendered to this H.Q. and are frequently only obtained at a later date, as a result of action by this S/C or Finance S/C. Discrepancies are not as a general ruleascertained and investigated at the time of off-loading but are only picked up when reported by this S/C or Finance S/C when the Receiving Report is ultimately received.
3. This is a most unsatisfactory state of affairs which not only adversely affects our accounting but adds to the danger of supplies reaching the black market.
4. At this stage of events when the importation of civilian supplies from extra Mediterranean Sources is on the up grade, it cannot be too strongly emphasised that thorough and conscientious implementation of instructions from this H.Q. is of paramount importance.
5. Extremely large sums in dollars and sterling are involved in the present programme for importing civil supplies into Italy, and the Receiving Reports obtained at ship-side are used by the Allied Treasurers as the direct basis for raising charges against the Italian Government.
6. This is a responsible job and you are charged with ensuring that it is carried out properly. Will you please give the closest attention to this matter.

We would refer to your instructions to all Port Liaison Officers, reference 13/A/Tn.1 of 3 May, 1945 which lay down that all major discrepancies between ships' documents and quantities actually unloaded must be investigated on the spot and that receiving reports must be obtained and forwarded to this Headquarters.

2. We wish to point out that these instructions are not in general being observed. In particular receiving reports are not being promptly obtained and rendered to this Headquarters and are frequently only obtained at a later date as a result of action by this Sub-Commission. Major discrepancies are not as a general rule ascertained and investigated at the time of off-loading but are only picked up when reported by this Sub-Commission when the receiving report is ultimately received.

3. The responsibility of this Sub-Commission extends only to reporting on and recording the results of the off-loadings. The work of investigating major discrepancies must be carried out by the Transportation Sub-Commission; this is well nigh impossible if attempted long after the date of the off loading. We should be obliged for any action you can take to improve this state of affairs which adversely affects our accounting and adds to the danger of supplies reaching the black market.

SUBJECT : Handling of Miscellaneous Supplies  
TO : Public Health Sub-Commission

1. By letter of 7 April 1945 from APHQ (ref. AG440/11100-9, paragraph 4), it is stated that, "It is therefore desired that all civilian medical shipments arriving in Italy be delivered to the nearest CGMD by the military port authorities. CGMD officers will work in close liaison with military port authorities and will assist in identification and assignment of shipments".

2. Despite the fact that this letter was written on 7 April 1945, this Headquarters and the Transportation officers in the field have continued to supervise the physical receipt and the forwarding of medical supplies received in the various Italian ports. They have entered rail bids, supervised rail loading, and signalled the various CGMD's of despatches of supplies. Contrary to instructions, they have used the agents both of ICE and Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari to assist in this supervision.

3. In conversation with Capt. Buhard today, he stated that at this moment CGMD is not in position to follow immediately the instructions contained in the above quoted letter, namely, to have CGMD officers do their own port liaison.

4. In order to cooperate, this Headquarters for the time being will continue to supervise the receipt and forwarding of medical supplies, but a firm statement on what CGMD can and will do toward handling their own supplies in the immediate future is requested.
