1. Re our conversation of the night before last and Mr. Bazzanella's memorandum to you of 29 September.

2. Mr. Crooks has taken over the duties of Chief of the Port & Warehouse Division effective 24 September. Mr. Bazzanella has worked with him since that date in bringing him up to date on all matters which Mr. Crooks was not previously familiar with. On the basis that Mr. Crooks was former Chief of the division and is quite familiar with all port operations, there is no further need for Mr. Bazzanella's services as far as this Sub-Commission is concerned. The turn-back of numerous ports to the Italian Government as Category "A" has made it possible to curtail personnel within this Division.

3. I would recommend therefore that the request as presented by Mr. Bazzanella in his memorandum of 29 September be favorably considered.

1. I wish to request that arrangements be made for my return to the States as soon as it can be done.
2. In accordance with instructions received from Mr. Upman, Director of Transportation Sub Commission, effective 25 September, I turned over all of my duties to Mr. Crooks. Therefore, my mission has been completed.
3. Further in connection with this request, I wish to call your attention to the fact that last June a cable was sent to Washington approving my return to the States and requesting confirmation. SUBJECT: Amplification of Circular Cable Dated August 29, 1945 on
40 Hour Workweek and Holidays

Effective the week beginning September 9, 1945, the workweek for domestic and Class I FEA and USCC foreign field employees has been shortened to 40 hours. This is in accord with the government wide policy suggested by President Truman. In other words, the administrative workweek has been shortened to 40 hours and now is identical with the basic workweek.

In the Washington office, the workweek has been set as eight hours each day, Monday through Friday. The offices are closed all day Saturday and Sunday. If at all possible, it is desirable that a similar practice be followed in the foreign field offices.

However, if it is found necessary to maintain a skeleton force on Saturday, the Special Representative has the authority to spread the 40 hours in the workweek over six days. The limitation is on the number of hours that may be worked regularly each week, not on the number of days in which it can be worked, although the 40 hours cannot, under the Pay Act, be more than six out of any consecutive seven days.

Overtime work, in excess of the 40 hour week, may still be ordered for individual employees by the Special Representative. While it is not expected that this authority will be abused, Special Representatives should use this authority only when exceptional circumstances absolutely require it. It is expected that it will rarely ever be necessary to use the authority to order overtime for employees above grades CAF-9 or P-3.

President Truman has also restored eight national holidays. These are:

New Years Day, January 1
Washington's Birthday, February 22
Memorial Day, May 30
Independence Day, July 4
Labor Day, first Monday in September
Armistice Day, November 11
Thanksgiving, fourth Thursday in November
Christmas, December 25

The FEA offices will remain closed on these holidays. Employees nevertheless will receive their regular daily salary for these non-work days.

It is recognized that it may be necessary to keep one or two employees on duty on a holiday. The Special Representative has authority to do this provided that work on a holiday is ordered in writing in advance of the holiday. The written order should state why it is necessary for the employee to work on the holiday. One signed copy of the order should be attached to the payroll for the pay period in which the holiday occurs.

Any employee who works on a holiday pursuant to orders of the Special Representative shall be paid $1\frac{1}{2}$ times his regular rate regardless of his regular salary. Holiday pay differs from overtime pay in that respect since the overtime rate for employees earning a base annual salary greater than \$2980 is less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the regular rate.

Finally, in accordance with President Truman's suggestions, the war time restrictions on the taking of annual leave have been removed. As did all other federal agencies, the FEA had limited its employees to 12 days continuous leave for vacation purposes during the war. Effective immediately, employees may be granted within the limits of the annual leave to their credit, a vacation for as long a period as they can be spared without hindrance to the work of the agency.

These changes in personnel policy are being incorporated in Manual 21, Personnel Management and will be sent you when released.

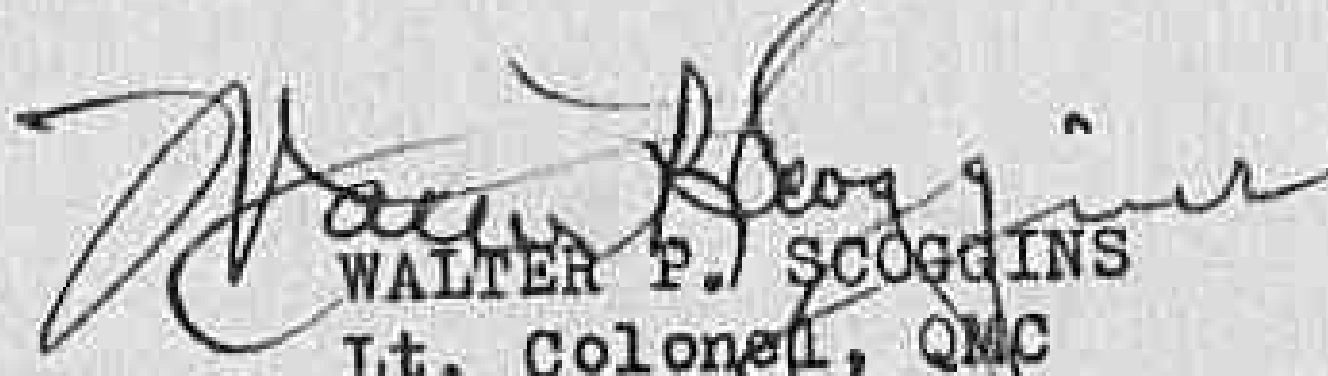

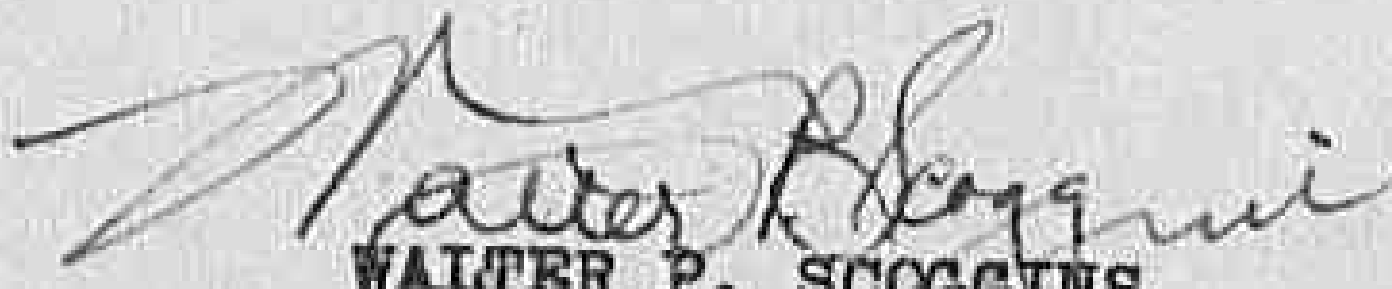

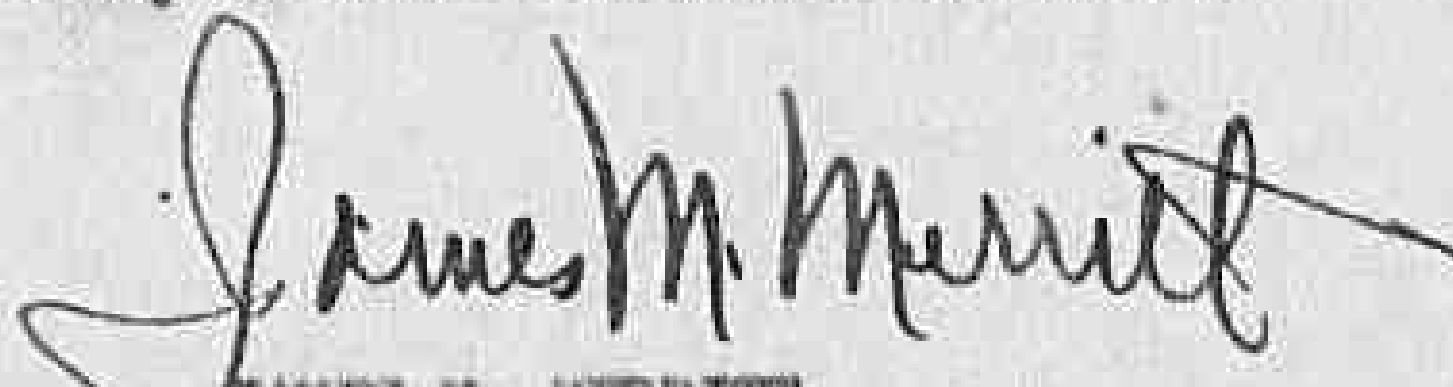

1. By letter dated 16 July 1945, the Chief Commissioner has authorized the establishment of a direct channel of communication for the U.S. civilian element of the Allied Commission, through the American Embassy to the State Department, subject to certain specific limitations. 3. Note that no policy decisions or changes will be communicated through this channel. The use of the transatlantic radio-telephone for the civilian element of the Allied Commission is not authorized for official business or for personal calls relating to the activities of the Commission, and incoming calls will not be accepted without the advance approval of the Office of the Chief Commissioner.

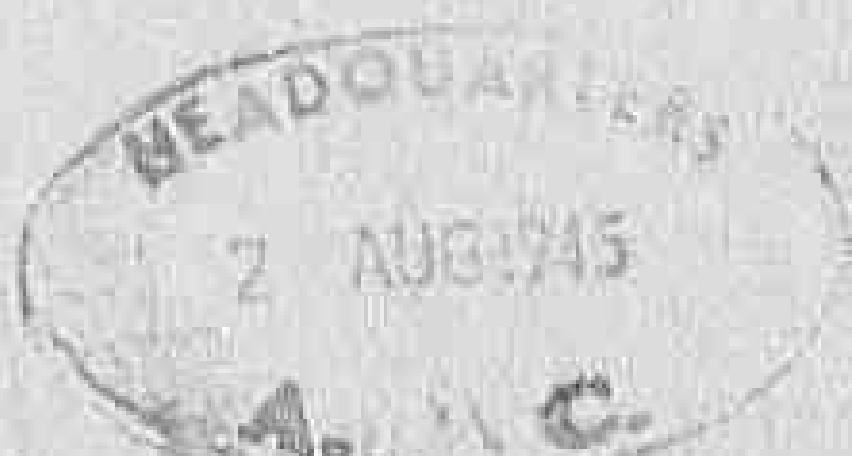

Immediately upon Colonel Frederick C. Horner's return from his trip to the West Coast, we arranged for discussions with him regarding his availability for appointment as Director of the Transportation Subcommittee. We found him generally responsive to accepting this position although he did qualify his firm answer by stating that he wanted about two weeks to look more carefully into other propositions which had been made him. During the course of our conversation, it developed that Col. Horner has since 1918 suffered to varying extents with stomach ulcers. He indicated, however, that this condition should not be troublesome to him in Italy, providing it were possible to obtain consistently a proper diet. He also indicated that unless he could be assured that he would be permitted to return to the States for at least a short period of time at the end of six months, he would be required to decline the position.

After carefully considering both of these two latter factors, it was decided that Col. Horner should not be sent to Italy. It would be difficult to make a firm commitment that he could be returned to the States in six months. More important, in the light of the experience which was recently had with Mr. Kugel who suffered from a physical difficulty similar to Col. Horner's and is now being returned to the States, it seems unwise to run a similar risk in this case. The Col. was advised that we did not find it possible to pursue his case further.

We have since, definitely selected Mr. Frank Upman who seems to be extremely well fitted as a successor to Mr. Taylor. According to well known people in Washington and elsewhere, his whole employment

experience represents a unique record of achievement and we are well satisfied that the important work in the Transportation Subcommission will be well placed in his hands.

In view of the cable which has just been received, we have discontinued momentarily our efforts to find a civilian here to fill the position as Head of the Rail Division, but are still working on the Planning Staff job. We shall keep you informed of developments as they occur.

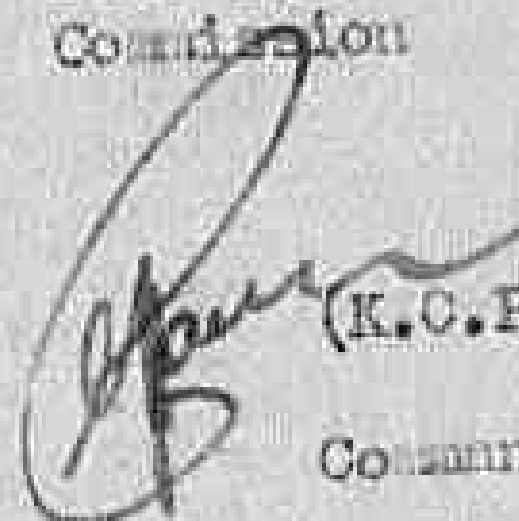

Gent,

I lived in Naples from 1906 until the outbreak of the war with Italy when I was arrested and, after 16 days in prison, was sent to a Concentration Camp until 6th November 1940, when I was authorised to live in a small village in the Province of Parma.

My wife and I were repatriated by H.M. Government in May 1943 and arrived in England on 15th July, 1943.

In Naples I had my own office as Shipping & Forwarding Agent and am exceptionally well known in the Port. I attended to the Forwarding business for most of the Embassies in Rome and also the H.M. Consul General and the U.S. Consul General in Naples. I attended to landing and clearing automobiles and furniture belonging to the various officials.

I was the representative of the Royal Automobile Club of London and acted as liquidator for the most important Insurance Companies in London, in connection with motor car accidents. I further represented many Automobile Clubs in U.S.A. and Mexico, such as the Auto Club of South California to the Sutherland International Despatch of New York, receiving and clearing large numbers of motor cars for their members. The Security Storage Co. of Washington, D.C. who handle the shipping of furniture for the Government Officials, sent me all their business passing through the Port of Naples.

I speak, read and write Italian fluently and know the Neapolitan dialect thoroughly. I am well known to the most important people in Rome and Naples.

It is my opinion therefore that my services and experience would be very useful to one of your Departments and trust you will give this matter your consideration. I have suffered considerable financial loss owing to the War and hope you will arrange for me to be authorised to return to Naples to a position where my ability can be exploited to advantage. I am strong, active and never ill.

For information concerning me I would refer to Mr. W. Backhouse (Temp Control) Capt. W.J. Fielding, Ministry of War Transport, c/o Fleet Mail Office, both in Naples. In general almost anybody in the port of Naples can inform you regarding my abilities, etc.
