SUBJECT: Request for Release from Transportation Sub-Commission Duties and Travel Orders to Washington.

TO : Director,
Transportation Sub-Commission.

1. The work of screening requirements of the transportation facilities of Italy on bases of immediate necessity and long term rehabilitation has reached a point where continued coordination of Italian Government requests and Transportation Sub-Commission Divisional operations is unnecessary. Original programs were based on indefinite duration of military activities; the tendency of current directives is to turn back to the Italian Government major phases of operation: import programs will depend more and more on availability of purchasing Government credits rather than availability of materials and shipping; all the foregoing factors will combine to restore some semblance of normal trade channels to replace the machinery of military requisitions. In addition programs both static and transitional reflect the approximate needs of Italian transport and are filed with the proper approving and procuring agencies of the supplying nations.

2. Planning Staff was created as an emergency organ whose chief function was the insurance that (a) supplies necessary to achieve and maintain adequate national transport economy were determined and requisitioned; (b) that the effect of changing conditions should be reflected in modification of requirements and (c) that such items, when possible should be obtained without recourse to import ton-

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3. I feel constrained to add that as I approach the end of my third year in foreign service, and as the need for my operational ability lessens I have a hearty desire to resume my life within the boundaries of my country. 4015

4. I therefore request that I be released from my position as Chief of the Planning Staff and that you endorse my application for travel orders to Washington.

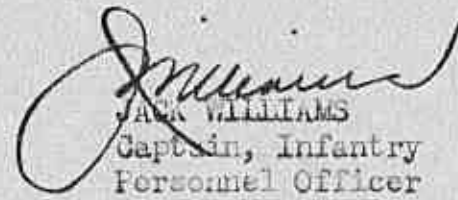
