1. Reference is made to your communication of 26th May addressed to the Chairman, MEDBO, in connection with the above meeting.
2. Arrangements have been made for Members of the Mediterranean Shipping Board to meet the Italian Minister of Marine supported by a representation of the Italian Shipowning Industry. The Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean Station, under whose direct control the Italian Merchant Fleet has been placed by the Cunningham-De Courten agreement, will explain the necessity of the continuance of co-ordinated control of Merchant Shipping as outlined by the principles established by the United Maritime Authority.
3. The Minister of Marine is expected to reply to the speech by the Commander-in-Chief, and it is hoped that I shall be able to forward to you tomorrow afternoon an outline of the speeches to be made by both of these Officers.
4. The Chairman of the Mediterranean Shipping Board will announce details of the immediate future control of Italian ships, which will include the handing back to the Minister of Marine the supervision of the Italian Schooner Fleet. This hand back will entail the Italian Authorities remaining responsible for the carriage of some 30,000 tons per month required by the civil programme.
5. Apart from those vessels allocated to the Italians to perform agreed coastwise liner services, the remainder of the coasting and deep sea fleet will remain at the disposal of the United Maritime Authority.
6. A suggested schedule showing the programme for the morning of 30th May is attached. Approval is requested. Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean Station has concurred.

1. Reference Item 11 of Agenda for the Ministerial Meeting, may it be stressed with the Minister for passing on to those present at the meeting that:-

- a) A larger proportion of available transportation resources is now being allocated for the movement of civilian supplies, etc.
- b) That there are still shortages of transportation occurring in different areas from time to time.
- c) That despite this greater allocation of capacity, much is being wasted because irresponsible bids are being placed for movement which cannot be filled, once the railway wagons are allocated. This is sometimes due to lack of road transport for taking available supplies to railhead, but is often due to the non-availability of supplies. The remedy for preventing this waste lies in the hands of the Italians themselves.
- d) With regard to sea transport, there is considerable waste due to lack of coordination between the Italian Government and the large industrial firms, e. g., Montecatini, and because of the inability of the French and Italians to agree on a price for phosphate rock. If these differences are not settled soon, shipping will be lost from this theater to other theaters where it is urgently required. The Allied authorities are not able to keep shipping in the theater waiting for disputes of this kind to be settled.

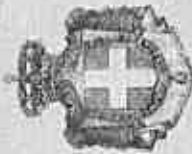
