1. Reference recent conversation Major WHEELER-CARSON, subject requisition has been reviewed by services of this headquarters.
2. Items, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17 have been found to be available from theater stocks. Transportation Section advises that quantities of item 19, roller conveyors, are read as "foot running" and not "each" they may be considered as reasonable. They also state that stands should be provided for the rollers. No conveyors rollers surplus to US or UK military needs are available in this theater.
3. The need for item 9, Carpenter tool sets, is questioned on the grounds that if simple tools are not available at each location the need should not be for more than 10 hand saws and 10 hammers at each port. It is also considered that item 16, fire extinguishers, should be increased at each location up to 30 each.
4. It is suggested that this requirement be resubmitted in light of latest developments, actual port warehousing conditions and availabilities as in para 2 above.

STATIONER

- a) Supplies for Venice and Trieste - Make available at a point in, or close to Ancona, where it is intended that the materials will be stockpiled.
- b) Supplies for Genoa - Make available at a point in, or close to Leghorn, where it is intended that the materials will be stockpiled.
- c) Request material for Genoa be packed for shipment by water, if possible.
- d) Since damage is satisfactory for lumber requested, suggest it be made available in Venice, Trieste and Genoa respectively from first ships discharged.

It is suggested that Fort ex Warehouse Division, Transportation Sub-Commission (Major Klein) be advised of location of materials so that arrangements can be made with ABRL to decide how they will be assembled.

- **NOISE ATTENUATION**

1. A certain amount of difficulty has been encountered in the past in securing proper warehouse and storage space for imported civil supplies in the various ports following their liberation. In part, this has been the result of a failure in bringing forward the specific requirements in good time.

2. In the past, premises were frequently allotted to A.O. which were only useful after, considerable repairs to provide security as well as protection against the elements.

3. It is impossible to say what materials and what quantities will be required with any degree of accuracy. The above list of materials was prepared by Transportation Sub-Commission, AOC after careful study.

4. A number of the items originally requested by Transportation S/C have been found locally. If, for some reason Transportation S/C is unable to take possession of these items, a supplementary request will be submitted.
