TO : Road Movements, Transportation Sub-Commission,
Hq. AC. (Alt. Maj. Strait-Gardiner).

for your information.

1. Six 2½ ton trucks were sent from Truck Pool # 3 (Chieti) to San Lorenzo Italian RC Warehouse, Rome, on 28 Feb. 1945. The trucks departed from Chieti at 0200 hours and should have arrived in Rome at about 1230 hours. The numbers of the trucks were 316 : 319 : 325 : 337 : 347 : 354.

2. Four 2½ ton trucks were sent from Truck Pool # 3 (Chieti) to Rome on 31 Jan. 1945. Two of these trucks were loaded at Via Toscana Italian RC Warehouse and two were loaded at San Lorenzo RC Warehouse. A further four 2½ ton trucks were sent on 4 Feb. 1945 and loaded as were the first four.

SUBJECT : Transportation for Devastated Areas

TO : Transportation Sub-Commission

1 The following stocks of blankets, clothing and canvas for use in repairing damaged dwellings in the Devastated Provinces of CHIETI (LANCIANO), FROSINONE and LITTORIA are now warehoused in ROME :-

Blankets	-5000 - 3,210
Shawls	-4,000 - 2,000
Scarves	-6,000 - 3,500
Canvas	42 truck loads - 20 tons.

An additional 9000 blankets will be ready for collection at PRATO (near FIRENZE) by 1 March.

2 The homeless and destitute people for whom the above mentioned articles of clothing etc have been collected are badly in need of them. Moreover many of the blankets, shawls and scarves have been in the warehouse for some little time. It would therefore be much appreciated if you could kindly make transport available so that distribution to the provinces named above could be commenced on Tuesday, 27 February.

SUBJECT: Clothing on hand at Rome for
Lanciano and Avezzano.

TO : Director,
Transportation S/C.

1. In November 1944 fifteen truck loads of clothing were allocated to Avezzano in the Abruzzi Marche Region. None of this clothing has yet been collected by the Regional Headquarters though it is understood that an urgent demand for this clothing was passed through Regional channels at the time.

2. Early in January a further allocation of clothing was made to the Abruzzi Marche Region. This consisted of eight truck loads. Again, Abruzzi Marche Region were asked to collect this consignment.

3. By the end of the month only four truck loads had been collected, and the clothing allocated and waiting collection had been increased by seven truck loads. It is understood that this clothing was urgently required at Lanciano.

4. Therefore the position at the end of January was 15 truck loads of clothing, allocated in November, waiting to be collected for Avezzano, and 11 truck loads of clothing, allocated in early and mid January, waiting to be collected for Lanciano.

5. As no action was taken by the Region signals were sent on the 1st, 8th, and 12th of February asking the Regional Commissioner to allocate M.T. to collect this clothing. No reply was received to any one of these three signals.

6. The Regional Transportation Officer has been contacted by post, but so far there has been no result.

7. The above position shows an apparently scandalous waste of clothing which must have been needed, especially during the cold period; the failure to reply to the signals despatched also shows a lack of organisation at the Regional Headquarters.

8. It is suggested that you may wish to raise these points at the Economic Section Staff Meeting.

1. About 26 January 1945 a telephone call was received at this office from Lt. Col. Bordass (Road Movements Hq. AC.) reference the movement of eight (8) truckloads of clothing from Rome to the Abruzzi Compartiment of this Region.
2. The first four trucks reported to Rome on 28 February 1945 (see attached dispatch record). The second four trucks reported to Rome on 3 Feb. 1945 (see attached dispatch record).
3. About 5 February 1945 Lt. Col. Bordass called me in regard to the movement. I told him the movement was completed after confirming with Lt. J. Howell (C.O. SUBJECT : Clothing on hand at Rome for Aveszano.

TO : Col. W.J. Sierz.

1. (a) Early in January an allocation of clothing was made by this HQ. to the Abruzzi Marche Region, who were asked to collect the consignment (consisting of eight truck loads) from Rome.
(b) At the end of the month only four truck loads had been collected. By now the clothing allocated and awaiting collection has been increased by seven truck loads, and consists of the following : -

4 trucks of blankets	1 truck sheets
3 " " clothes and shoes	3 trucks hospital sheeting
