SUBJECT : Use of returning supply transport.

TO : Chief, Movements Division.

Reference is made to G.H.Q. 415 published 3 Apr. '45
para 5, sub-paras 3 (attached).

It is considered that the sentence :

"In cases also where the number of vehicles involved
is less than 5, and thus no movement order is necessary"

is misleading. A British convoy commander, on reading this, would be justified in starting my journey immediately with, say, 2½ vehicles without applying for movement instructions. In any part of the theatre which is under American jurisdiction movement of 10 or more vehicles requires permission and movement instructions. Convoys of more than 10 vehicles covering such roads without American clearance are stopped and invariably turned back. This applies on Route 7 (NAPLES-SALERNO), which is largely used by AR. convoys. It does NOT apply on Route 6 (NAPLES-FROME) which is under British Control. It applies on Route 1 (ROTA-LEGHORN) but NOT on Route 2, the alternative road to LEGHORN.

As the position is not made clear in this G.H.Q. it is felt that delays and wastage of fuel may result. This may discourage drivers whose cooperation is necessary in a scheme of this nature.

Do you wish this matter to be taken up with AFHQ?

para 5, sub-para (i) attached).

It is considered that the sentence :

"In cases where the number of vehicles involved
is less than 5, and thus no movement order is necessary"

is misleading. A British convoy commander, on reading this, would be justified in starting my journey immediately with, say, 4 vehicles without applying for movement instructions. In any part of the theatre which is under American jurisdiction, movement of 5 or more vehicles requires permission and movement instructions. Convoys of more than 10 vehicles moving on such roads without American clearance are stopped and invariably turned back. This applies on Route 7 (MAPLES-ROSE), which is largely used by Ar. convoys. It does NOT apply on Route 6 (MAPLES-ROSE) which is under British control. It applies on Route 1 (ROSE-BUSHWICK) but NOT on Route 2, the alternative road to Leghorn.

As the position is not made clear in this G.H.Q. 45, it is felt that deletion and use of fuel may result. This may discourage drivers whose cooperation is necessary in a scheme of this nature.

SUBJECT : Movement of Cement.

TO : Roads Division (2).

1. Reference is made to conversations Lt.Col. Fernyough-Mej. Stait-Gardner concerning 90 tons of cement to be moved from CIVITAVECCHIA to ARCONA.

2. In an endeavour to find a load for the vehicles moving from CIVITAVECCHIA to the VACERATI area various Sub-Commissions were contacted. Industry Sub-Commission stated that it was hoped that arrangements could be made for the allocation of 90 tons of cement ex CIVITAVECCHIA to ARCONA.

At the request of Industry Sub-Commission arrangements were accordingly made with you for the vehicles to report to the cement works this afternoon for loading.

Industry Sub-Commission were unable to issue release note during the morning but arranged to phone CIVITAVECCHIA as soon as the release was effected. It is now stated that it was not possible to reallocate the cement and it is therefore regretted that no load can be found for the trucks.
