Repatriated POW's arriving in Italy are civilians and are therefore not a concern of MMIA nor the Italian Army in accordance with Par 6 of AFHQ letter, file AG 091.711/169 GCT-O of 16 November 1944, subject: "Command and Administration of the Italian Army". The responsibility for handling these repatriated POW's is that of the Italian Civil Government, and it appears that any trucks needed must be furnished from their civilian pools. As this is civil work, no POL can be provided from Army allotments, as it is not possible for the Italian Army to requisition POL for civilian work.

SUBJECT : Transport for Displaced Persons

TO : Roads Division

1. Reference your AC/24/60/Tn.5., dated 5 Sept. '45 to Displaced Persons Sub-Commission.
2. The decision by Lombardia Region to use local transport rather than the transport allocated to Displaced Persons Sub-Commission under the terms of the Verona Conference on 11 July '45, is not appreciated by this Branch.
3. It is agreed that Lombardia Region, being on the spot, are more familiar with local conditions and requirements than this Branch, but it is felt that an explanation for this reversal of policy without prior reference to, or consent of this B.R. should be furnished.
4. It is assumed that the term "local transport" refers to various types of civilian vehicles which have been hired through Ufficio Autotrasporti, and it would seem that the employment of such vehicles, instead of vehicles in an organised Truck Pool definitely allocated for the movement of Displaced Persons is not altogether satisfactory.

1. Enclosed please find copy of letter ref. IRW/1/161-62, dated 27th Aug. '45 which is self-explanatory.
2. This question was taken up with Lt. Col. J.A. Regis in the presence of General A. Mannerini and it was agreed the Italian Government are responsible for providing transport. However, their present allocation of vehicles is insufficient to enable them to meet additional commitments.
3. As the volume of repatriated Italian Soldiers is scheduled to be appreciable and regular, it is considered the M.T. situation should be reviewed and further vehicles be put at the disposal of the Italian Military in the ports where the ships are due to arrive, in order that they meet their obligations.
4. In the event that an increase in M.T. cannot be granted the only solution to the problem would be for the Italian Authorities to bid on ENAC for use of civilian trucks. As this type of work is outside their normal activities it would be necessary for the Italian Military to provide P.O.L. This is an important point as ENAC's P.O.L. allotment is based on the needs to meet civilian requirements only.

1. In reply to a request that MT be made available to lift disembarking repatriates the several kilometres from NAPLES docks to the lodging centres at S.MARTINO(Vomero), and DUGENTA, 05 AFM, HQ stated that such is an A.C.-Italian Government responsibility which should be taken up with your b/c.

2. Allied military transport commitments at Naples are at present so heavy due to redeployment and repatriation of Allied personnel that Italian repatriates, often in very poor health, have had to march, and difficulty has been experienced in transporting baggage.

3. Will you please state whether transport could be made available to deal with future arrivals at NAPLES, and if so who should HQ movement NAPLES, and the Italian Liaison Officer who is to work with that HQ, contact when shipments are notified.

(For Transportation Sub-Commission).1. Answers to paragraph 5 of your letter AC/64/24/TNS dated 27 June 45
are as follows:-

- (a) Information already provided.
- (b) Albergo Maranotte, TAORMINA, Sicily.
- (c) The destination of the aircraft will be BOLOGNA Airport where your responsibility ends, as from that point they will be taken over by Fifth Army.
- (d) Movement has been cleared with Fifth Army.
- (e) An escort officer is being arranged by AC LO CATANIA. There will be one officer.
- (f) 900 Kilos. Total number of pieces 50.
- (g) As far as is known Nil.
- (h) 1st July 1945. This date may be varied forward or backward due to transportation arrangements. You are, however, required to give 24 hours notice of arrival to AC Fifth Army in order that arrangements may be made to collect and transport the party from BOLOGNA. In order that the party can be ready for collection at TAORMINA please also give 24 hours notice to AC LO CATANIA of date and time.
- (i) The party on arrival at BOLOGNA Airport will be handed over to an officer of Fifth Army.

2. We have just been instructed by AFHQ that one member of the party, Georg Elling, is required for interrogation by G-2, RAAC in ROME. Please confirm that the plane can touch down at ROME to drop off this individual, who will continue the journey at a later date. It will be necessary for you to give RAAC 24 hours notice of the arrival of the plane and the name of the airport in order that RAAC can arrange to take Elling into custody. When notifying RAAC you should refer to AFHQ signal FA17387 of 4 July.

SUBJECT: German and Japanese Diplomatic and Consular Officials
interned in MONTECATINI

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394

1. Reference is made to the previous correspondence herein culminating in your 6529/83/EC of 8 June.

2. For your information a cable has been received from OCS on the disposition of Axis diplomats found in Italy. The pertinent points are:-

- a. All Germans should be transferred to the custody of SHAEF.
- b. Hungarians, Roumanians, Croatians and Slovaks are to be retained in custody here and consultation is to take place with the political advisors on ultimate disposition of each individual.
- c. All Japanese and Thais are to be retained in custody until further instructions. In this connection it is stated that the question of their disposition is under consideration by the State Department and the Foreign Office.

3. In connection with the above the following action has been taken:-

- a. SHAEF has been asked when and where the German diplomats can be accepted by them.
- b. The Political Advisors have been asked to advise on 2(b) above.
- c. In view of 2(c) above the Japanese and Thais cannot be disposed of to the Italian Government.

4. Arising out of the above it appears that there will be an opportunity to dispose of the German diplomats in custody at TAO MINA at the same time as those at MONTECATINI are transferred to SHAEF custody. For this purpose it would appear desirable to concentrate these with those now at MONTECATINI. It is understood however that the diplomats at MONTECATINI are shortly to be moved to 5 Army custody near PARMA. It is suggested therefore that you arrange with 5 Army for those at TAO MINA to be moved to the location near PARMA to which those at MONTECATINI are to be moved and inform this Section when the move has taken place.

SUBJ: Movement of Axis Diplomats

No : 2nd, Movements Division

Reference is made to para 4 of Minutes of Economic Conference signed under Ref. ES/1.21 and dated 26 June 1943 and which is quoted below:-

Movement of Axis Diplomats

"There is a group of Axis diplomats (details available from Capt. Newberg, Liaison Branch, Tel. 653) at PACOMA, whose movement to HQHQDNCTD is advised. "Action: transmission S/C."

- The above was seen by Roads Branch on the morning of 27 June and Capt. Newberg was immediately contacted by phone. It was arranged that Capt. Cover would call on Liaison Division and discuss this move, obtaining, at the same time, all the information required before this branch could proceed with the movement arrangements. When Capt. Cover called on Liaison Division he was able to obtain only the names and destination of the diplomats as shown in list D/P at Flag A.
- On the afternoon of the 27 June a letter was sent by hand to Liaison Division as per copy at Flag B, and Capt. Newberg stated he would endeavor to obtain the information asked for.
4. On the morning of 28 June 3-4 (MOV & IN) Air were contacted and informed of this move. It was arranged that they would contact Maj. Miles of G-5 who is handling this matter and get more complete information concerning it.

TO : Chief, Movements Division

Reference is made to letter of instructions of Economic Section Staff Conference issued 2nd June, 1941 and tested 23 June, 1st and which is quoted below:-

Movement of Axis Diplomats

"There is a group of Axis Diplomats (certainly Newables from Cent. Museum, Liaison Branch, Tel. 653) at Malone, whose movement to Malakal is requested."

"Location: Transportation S/S."

2. The above was seen by Major Newberg on the morning of 27 June and Capt. Newberg was immediately contacted by phone. It was arranged that Capt. Newer would call on Liaison Division and discuss this move, retaining, at the same time, all the information required before this Branch could proceed with the necessary arrangements. When Capt. Newberg stated he would endeavour to obtain only liaison called on Liaison Division he was able to obtain only the names and destination of the diplomats as shown in List 74P at class A.
3. On the afternoon of the 27 June a letter was sent by hand to Liaison Division as per copy of class 3, and Capt. Newberg stated he would endeavour to obtain the information requested for.
4. On the morning of 28 June 0-4 (09 & 2n) 44 were contacted and informed of this move. It was arranged that they would contact Maj. Roles of S-5 also handling traffic? Major and get more complete information and, at the same time, ascertain if this move is an A.C. commitment or if A.M. is handling it. 0-4 (09 & 2n) telephoned later to the effect that S-5 were unable to say who would be responsible for the move; A.M. or A.C.
5. In view of the foregoing Major Stett-Gardner called on Col. Walton (Economic Section) at 1400 hrs 28 June and outlined the situation. Col. Walton said that he had not seen any order to A.C. to carry out this movement. He then telephoned Capt. Newberg and instructed him to:-

(1) clear up the question of responsibility for arranging the movement (A.M. or A.C.)

(2) If A.C. is to be responsible, Capt. Newberg is to obtain information on the following:-

- (a) Escort arrangements
- (b) Who is to take over diplomatics at destination
- (c) Baggage limitations
- (d) Authority for the move.

It was arranged that Capt. Newberg would communicate with Roads Branch as soon as he had obtained the above information.

6. On 29 June Capt. Newberg phoned to say that G-5 had been asked by Liaison Division to issue the authority for the move and he would communicate again with this Branch when it had been received.

7. At 0930 30 June Capt. Newberg telephoned and said no further action is required from Th. S/O. as the movement is being arranged by AFHQ.
