

SUBJECT: Haulage Priorities - No 1 Truck Battalion.

TO : Movements Division (Roads).
(Att: ~~Major Sowers, AMG-5 Army~~
Captain Brown)

1. Arising from a tour by Capt. Ainsworth of this Division, in which he contacted Capt. Brown, AMG - 5 Army and Major Sowers, Toscana Region, who submit haulage bids to Major Harmon, Transport Truck Battalion, it appears that these officers are not clear upon priorities generally. They are not sure whether the priority should be (1) AMG-5 Army, (2) Warehouses, (3) Toscana Region or (1) AMG-5 Army, (2) Toscana Region and (3) Warehouses. It is also left to the officers concerned in the three above mentioned units to decide what commodities are to receive top priority.

2. Will you please advise the correct order of priority as between the three above broad groups of users in order that necessary instructions may be issued by this division.
