

These sports festivals preserve their ancient character in form and costume and express the atmosphere of older times in the Highlands in a way mere pageantry has never succeeded in expressing. To the arena are drawn brawny champions from all parts of the country. Piping and Dancing Competitions, important racing and jumping events vie with tossing the caber, putting the shot, and tug of war, as delightful attractions in natural surroundings of characteristic beauty. These meetings are patronised by Royalty and are regarded as County and Social Events, and those at Inverness, Dingwall and Oban are the nucleus of House Parties and balls in the height of the country season.

For the convenience of tourists, some of the more important gatherings are tabulated here. All are easy of access from the Western and Highland towns, and these colourful ancient festivals are recommended to visitors who have not yet experienced their varied charm.

ANGLING.



Angling A.A. is in progress.
The angler is in a boat.
"Falls Sack," and "Hartree," Lancashire,
England, are the names of the lakes. The location
is Hartree.

There is no area in Great Britain where such variety of water is available. The rivers and brooks, which are mostly free to the Angler, teem with Trout and Salmon. In no case where fees are charged are these anything but modest. It may be taken that in the case of Salmon fishing, a daily or weekly ticket must next be taken out. These are generally obtainable from Hotelkeepers and Innkeepers, but excellent sport may be had free of charge on all full streams and lesser water. Specimen catches are common for in most cases the waters over-flow. Dry fly and wet and ordinary baits are the fares commonly paid on these waters, but the Angler of ordinary merit need fear no comparison with his more skilful brother as fish are plentiful. Seashore fishing from boat offers fine sport. Catches are mainly mackerel, whiting, mullet, cod, with and byts. Boats can be hired by hour, day, week or month, and tackle and bait are usually supplied free. The lines are commonly impaled or lug, and the red and white fly for trolling.



It may safely be said that no part of Great Britain offers such varied facilities to the Golfer as the West Highlands and Islands. All courses are well laid out on ground which is naturally adaptable. First-class greens and good sporting hazards amid beautiful surroundings, make all these courses ideal for the holiday Golfer. In the list given here, perhaps the two best known are Machrie (Isay), stated by Harry Vardon to be "one of the best in the world," and Glencruitten, Oban. Fees are extremely moderate and tickets may be obtained for day, week or month.





SUBJECT : Movement and Distribution of Essential Raw Materials for the Italian Chemical Industry.

To : Distribution below.

31 July 1945

During the 11 months, 1 August 1945 - 30 June 1946 inclusive, approximately 700,000 tons of coal will require to be moved from North Africa and over 500,000 tons of Petroleum from various mines on Italy's mainland to plants throughout the country.

In view of the limited transportation facilities available to cover this program (to date, there must be added several tens of thousand tons of grain) and the need of ensuring the work of the several agencies involved, it is so soon deemed necessary to set forth as a master plan for the Guidance of all concerned the following : -

3. 1. Provisions shall be made to attach schedule "A" giving the monthly averages of importation required to ports of entry, which should be followed as closely as possible.

a) To Northern Italy (the territories), the North Italy Industrial Council (Councillor and Sub-Councils) will be kept advised by Industrial Sub-Commission well in advance of the estimated time of arrival of each ship, through its Sub-Commissioner Northern Section in Milan, which will be responsible for making arrangements with the Northern Section of the Ministry of War and AC HQ an equitable distribution for each consignment. The Northern Section will in turn notify the Paris Liaison Officer concerned and arrange for took clearance by railway.

b) To Central and Southern Italy (Italian Government territories), the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, Directorate General of Industry and Mines, 4th Division, will be satisfied directly by Industry Sub-Commissioner of each port due. Thereupon to the Ministry will make all the necessary arrangements with the delivery of the consignees to their respective destination in accordance with such distribution plans as are or will be approved by the Allied Commission.

4. Notice of specific movements recorded by sea from portfolios, which also should be followed as closely as possible, subject to possible subsequent revisions to be made by Transport Sub-Commission.

5. It is requested that the coastwise shipping of this commodity will be supervised by the Italian Maritime Commission, which is hereby requested to notify in due time expected arrivals as follows : -

The general wagon position in Italian Government Territory is such, that to allocate specific types of wagons for certain commodities cannot be realised due to general wagon shortage.

At the present time it has become necessary to transport foodstuffs which includes flour, sugar and other highly perishable traffic, which is also liable to damage in bad weather, in open wagons, it being realised, that to await an allocation of box cars or even tarpaulins for open wagons would mean that no traffic would move.

It is regretted therefore, that at any rate for the time being, it is not possible to allocate box cars or tarpaulins in the case of open wagons for the movement of superphosphate, due to the very acute wagon shortage, and it is suggested that every advantage is taken to load all open cars allocated during the fine weather.

SUBJECT : Phosphate Rock Importation

TO : Economic Section
(Attn: Col. Gen. Anderson)

1. Economic Section will submit our estimates for Phosphate Rock requirements in Northern Italy for the first seven months after liberation.

2. The figures are based on the assumption that the entire super-phosphate industry of the North will operate on a 90% capacity for the 2nd month; 60% for the 3rd; and so on reaching 100% during the 7th; and an allowance of one month's supply (at 100% capacity rate) for the 2nd and 3rd months, for stock-piling purposes.

3. It should be borne in mind that these figures are to be considered the theoretical minimum, as not all of the plants are likely to be found in repairable condition, while transportation will certainly be a major obstacle.

4. The matter of placing orders for the huge tonnages involved (a possible total exceeding 250,000 tons for the North) has been discussed with Commerce Sub-Commission (as underlined), and we point out that they can only take action. Foreign Trade Section, via point out that they can only take action if the matter is that raw materials are bought against Category "B" credits. Otherwise the procurement must take place through the normal requisitioning channels as a Category "A" item, and be charged to the general peace settlement eventually to be

made between the Allies and the Italian Government.

5. When is taken into consideration the cost of supplying the whole of Italy's needs for the balance of this year may run between £ 8 to 10,000,000, which represents a substantial fraction of their present entire foreign credit, it will be soon decided as to how this material will be purchased, because a matter of life and death.

6. Foreign Trade Section advise us that as of today still no reply has been received either from the French Authorities or from AFIC to our airmail 5853 dated 21 April 1945.

7. An early decision is requested as to time it now at hand for procuring these raw materials for the manufacture of super-phosphate, a crop fertilizer which plays a fundamental part in the economy of Italy.


