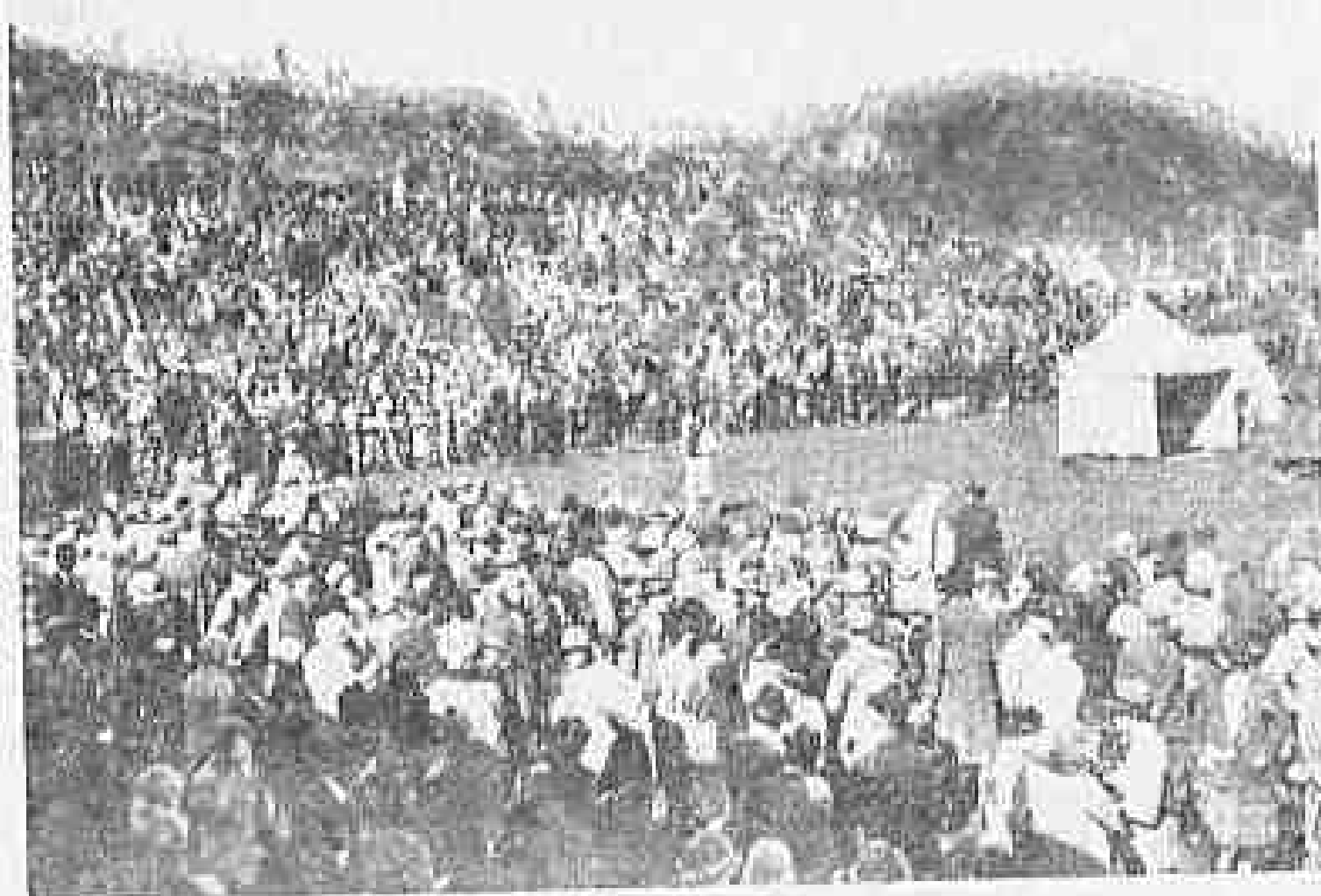

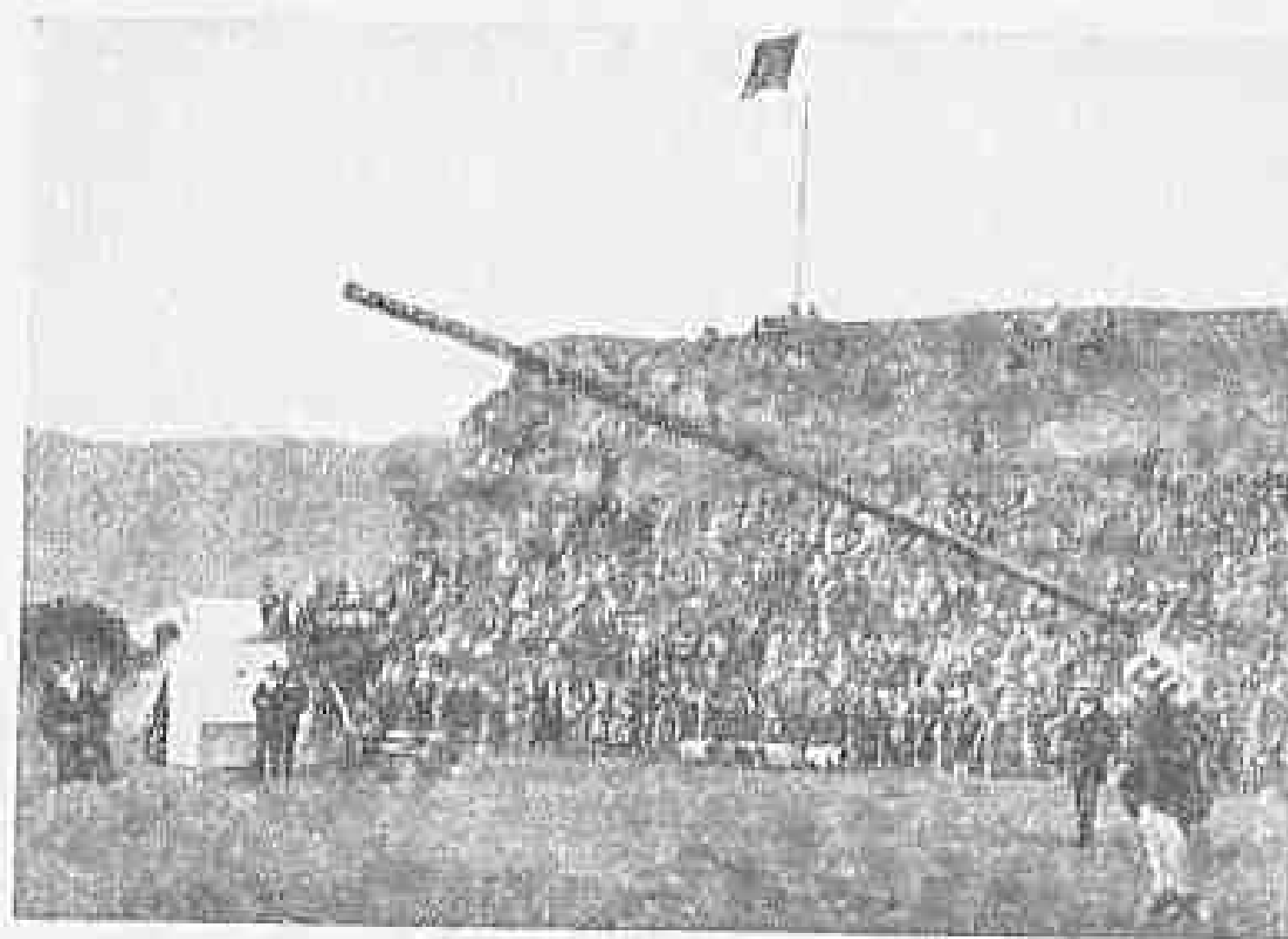

These sports festivals preserve their ancient character in form and costume and express the atmosphere of olden times in the Highlands in a way mere pageantry has never succeeded in expressing. To the arena are drawn brawny champions from all parts of the country. Piping and Dancing Competitions, important racing and jumping events vie with tossing the caber, putting the shot, and tug of war, as delightful attractions in natural surroundings of characteristic beauty. These meetings are patronised by Royalty and are regarded as County and Social Events; and those at Inverness, Braemar and Oban are the nucleus of House Parties and Balls in the height of the country season.

ANGLING

There is no area in Great Britain where such variety of water is available. The rivers and lakes, which are mostly free to the Angler, teem with Trout and Salmon. In no case where fees are charged are these anything but modest. It may be taken that on the case of Salmon fishing, a daily or weekly ticket must not be taken out. These are generally obtainable from Hotelkeepers and Estate Officers, but excellent sport may be had free of charge on all full streams and lesser waters. Splendid catches are common, for in no case are the waters over-fished. Dry fly and wet and ordinary baits are the lure commonly used on these waters, but the angler of ordinary merit need fear no comparison with his more skilful brother, as fish are plentiful. Sea-loch fishing from boat offers fine sport. Catches are mainly haddock, whiting, mackerel, cod, haddock and herring. Boats can be hired by hour, day, week or month, and tackle and bait are usually supplied free. The lines are commonly musket or lug, and the red and white fly for trolling. It is hoped that the following list will be of use and interest:

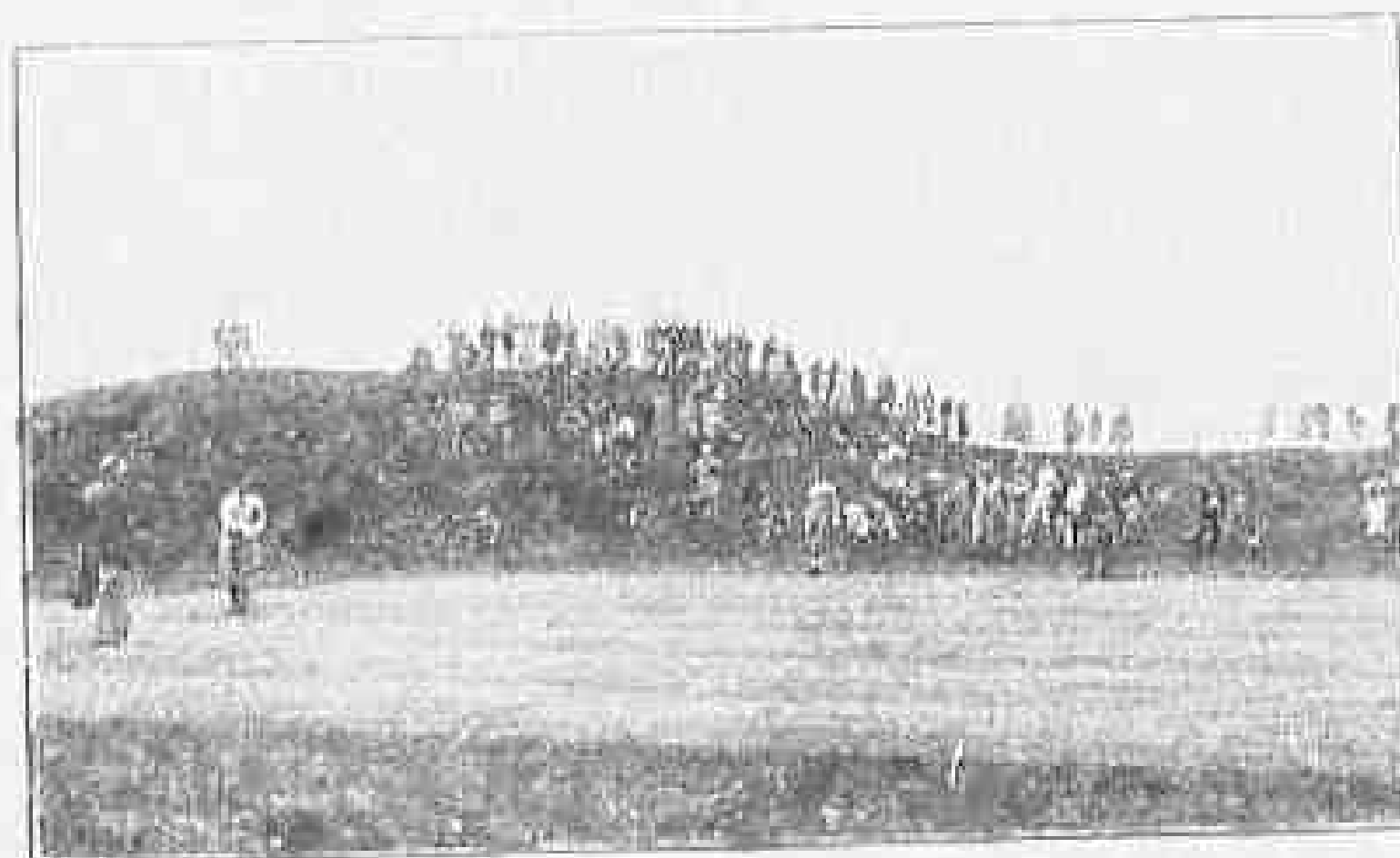

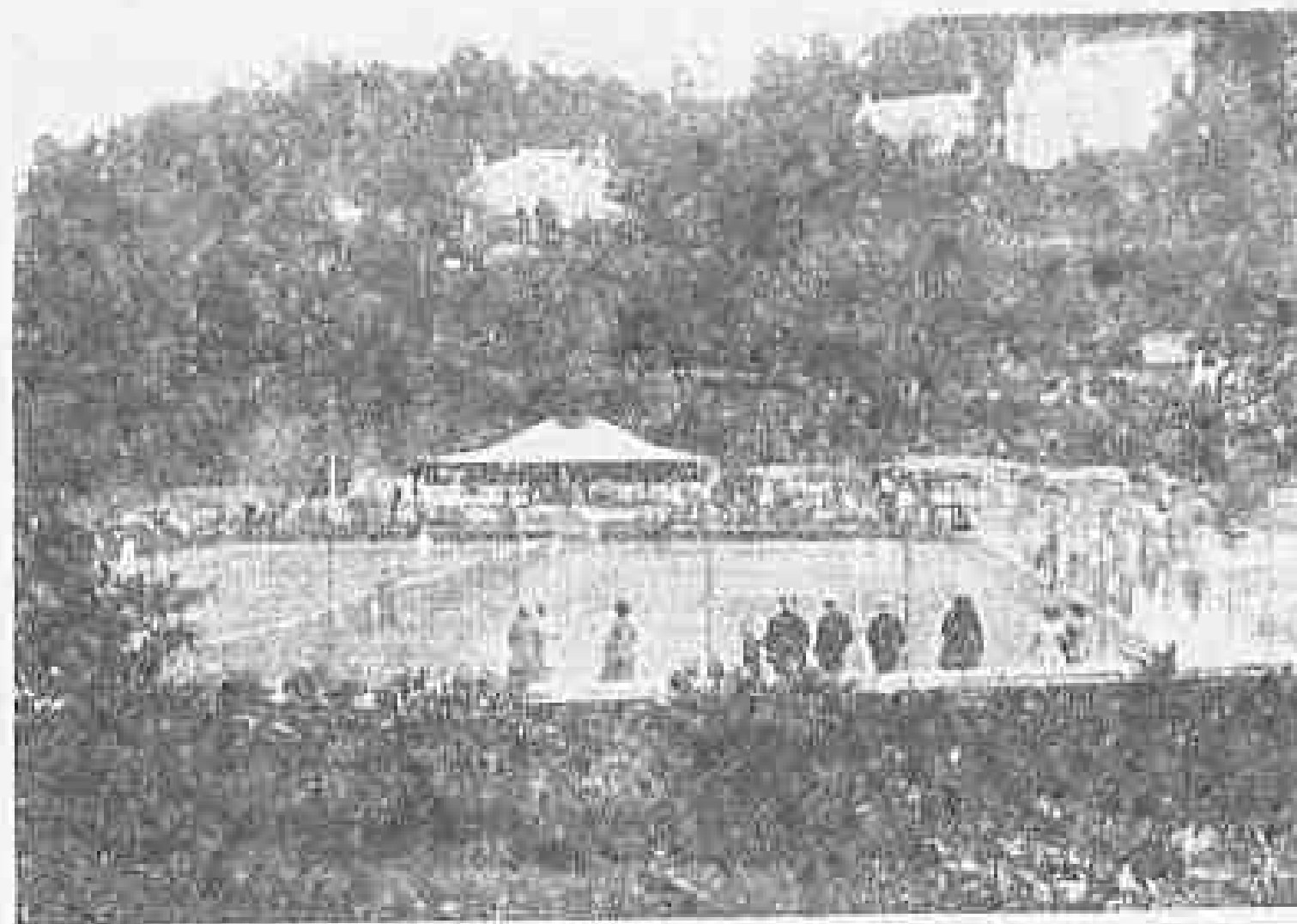

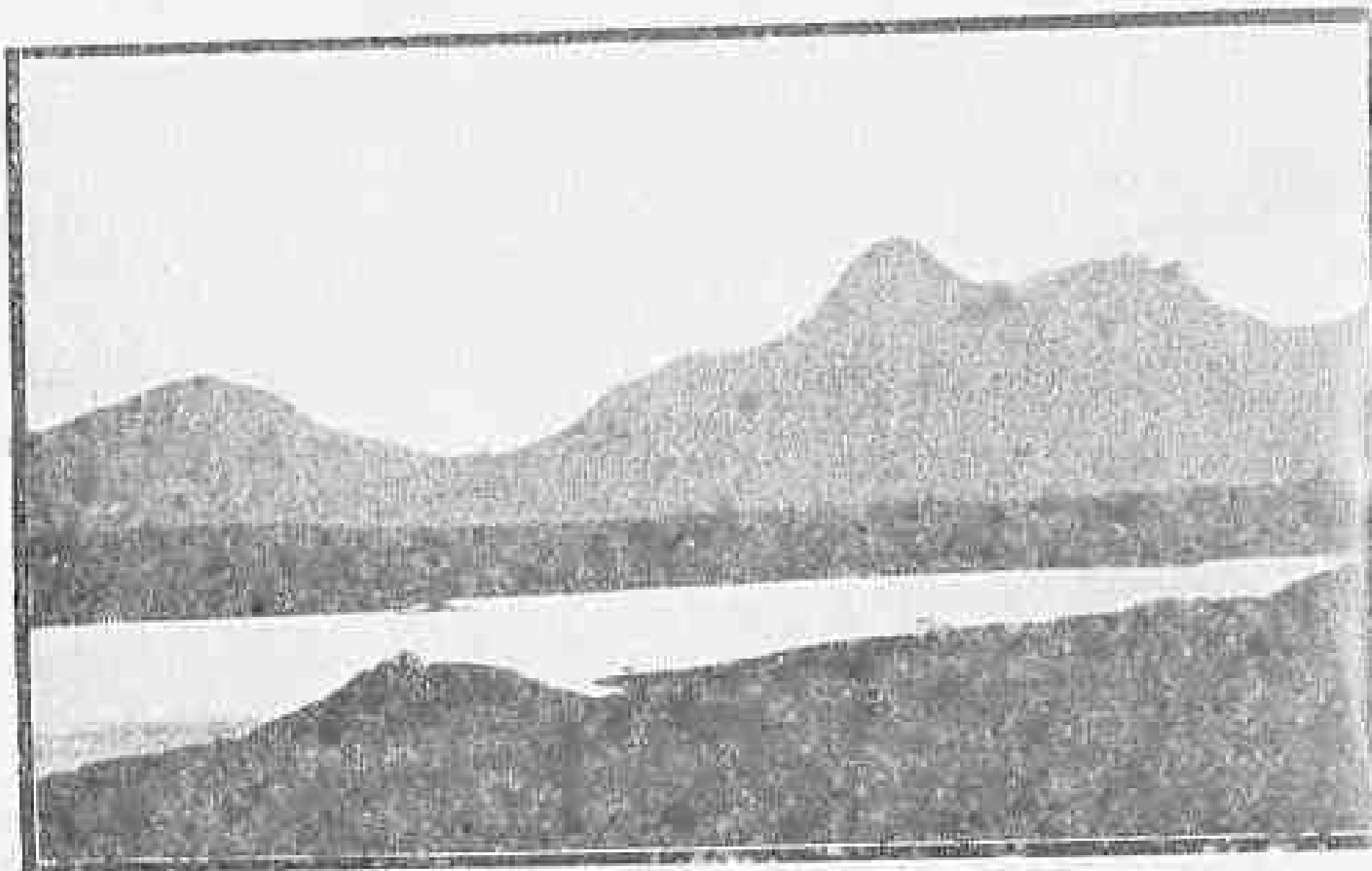

SUBJECT : Movement and Distribution of Essential Raw Materials for the Italian Chemical Industry.

TO : Distribution Below.

1. During the 11 months, 1 August 1945 - 30 June 1946 inclusive, approximately 700,000 tons of phosphate rock require to be moved from North Africa and over 500,000 tons of pyrites from various mines on Italy's mainland to plants throughout the country.

2. In view of the limited transportation facilities available to meet this program (to which must be added several tens of thousand tons of salt) and the need of expediting the work of the several agencies involved, it has been deemed advisable to set forth as a master plan for the guidance of all concerned the following: -

3. Phosphate Rock. The attached schedule "A" gives the monthly figures of importation required by ports of entry, which should be followed as closely as possible.

a) In Northern Italy (All territories), the North Italy Industrial Council (Chemicals and Rubber Committee) will be kept advised by Industry Sub-Commission well in advance of the estimated time of arrival of material, through that Sub-Commission's Northern Section in Milan, which will set up, in consultation with the A/2 IIC and AC HQ an equitable distribution for each consignments. The Northern Section will in turn notify the Port Liaison Officer concerned and arrange for dock clearance by Rail-way.

b) In Central and Southern Italy (Italian Government territories), the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, Directorate General of Industry and Mines, 4th Division, will be advised directly by Industry Sub-Commission of any vessel due. Thereupon the Ministry will make all the necessary arrangements for the delivery of the cargoes to their respective destination in accordance with such distribution plans as are or will be approved by the Allied Commission.

4. Pyrites by sea. The attached schedule "B.1" gives the monthly figures of pyrites movements required by sea from Portigliani, which also should be followed as closely as possible, subject to possible subsequent revisions to be made by Industry Sub-Commission.

It is understood that the coastwise shipping of this commodity will be supervised by the Italian Maritime Commission, which is hereby requested to notify in due time expected arrivals as follows: -

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1. During the 11 months, 1 August 1945 - 30 June 1946 inclusive, approximately 700,000 tons of phosphate rock require to be moved from North Africa and over 500,000 tons of phosphates from various mines on Italy's mainland (1) plants throughout the country.

2. In view of the limited transportation facilities available to meet this problem (to which must be added several tons of thousands tons of salt) and the need of expediting the work of the several agencies involved, it has been deemed advisable to set forth as a master plan for the guidance of all concerned the following:

3. Phosphate rock, the attached schedule "A" gives the monthly figures of transportation required by ports of entry, which should be followed as closely as possible.

a) In Northern Italy (all territories), the North Italy Industrial Council (Chemicals and Rubber Committee) will be kept advised by Industrial Sub-Commission well in advance of the estimated time of arrival of material, through that Sub-Commission's Northern Section in Milan, which will set up, in consultation with the a/m MIO and AC HQ an equitable distribution for each consignment. The Northern Section will in turn notify the Port Liaison Officer concerned and arrange for dock clearance by Rail-way.

b) In Central and Southern Italy (Italian Government territories), the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, Directorate General of Industry and Mines, 1st Division, will be advised directly by Industry Sub-Commission of any vessel due. Thereupon the Ministry will make all the necessary arrangements for the delivery of the cargoes to their respective destination in accordance with such distribution plans as are or will be approved by the Allied Commission.

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The attached schedule "B.1" gives the monthly figures of Phosphate rock movements required by sea from Portigliore, which also should be followed as closely as possible, subject to possible subsequent revisions to be made by Industry Sub-Commission.

It is understood that the coastwise shipping of this commodity will be supervised by the Italian Maritime Commission, which is hereby requested to notify in due time expected arrivals as follows:

a) For Northern Italy: To Industry Sub-Commission's Northern Section in Milan, with copy to that Sub-Commission at HQ AC. The Northern Section will confer the North Italy Industrial Council (Chemicals and Rubber Committee) in order to decide the distribution and will then take action as per para 2 a) above.

5) For Central and Southern Italy: To the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, Directorate General of Industry and Mines, 4th Division, which will act as per para 3 b) above.

5. Permitted by Railway. The individual consumers will arrange for the requirements given in the attached schedule "B.2" to be fulfilled, via Italian channels according to the procedure now established.

6. Salt. A schedule for Rock Salt and Solar Salt is being prepared and arrangements for the necessary monthly movements will be announced shortly. With regular Railway transportation of Rock Salt from the mines to Porto Empedocle (Sicily), it is hoped that 3,000 tons of Rock Salt will be available monthly.

It is also understood that Solar Salt is available in ample quantities at Cagliari (Sardinia) and Margherita di Savoia (Puglia).

ITWAVE will be advised each month by Transportation Sub-Commission this HQ of the tonnages of Rock and Solar Salt which are to be moved. At the same time the firm Saline Italiane and the Stato Monopolies (for Rock and Solar Salt respectively) will be advised of the distribution of these tonnages between consumers. Bids for movement will be placed with ITWAVE by the individual firms. Distribution will be made at the unloading ports accordingly.

1. Reference your letter dated 16 July '45.
2. The general wagon position in Italian Government Territory is such, that to allocate specific types of wagons for certain commodities cannot be realized due to general wagon shortage.
3. At the present time it has become necessary to transport foodstuffs which includes flour, sugar and other highly pilferable traffic, which is also liable to damage in bad weather, in open wagons. It being realized, that to await an allocation of box cars or even tarpaulins for open wagons would mean that no traffic would move.
4. It is regretted therefore, that at any rate for the time being, it is not possible to allocate box cars or tarpaulins in the case of open wagons for the movement of superphosphate, due to the very acute wagon shortage, and it is suggested that every advantage is taken to load all open cars allocated during the fine weather.

1. Herewith we submit our estimates for Phosphate Rock requirements in Northern Italy for the first seven months after liberation.

2. The figures are based on the assumption that the entire superphosphate industry of the North will operate on a 90% capacity for the 2nd month; 60% for the 3rd; and so on reaching 100% during the 7th, and an allowance of one month's supply (at 100% capacity rate) for the 2nd and 3rd months, for stock-piling purposes.

3. It should be borne in mind that these figures are to be considered the theoretical maximum, as not all of the plants are likely to be found in repairable condition, while transportation will certainly be a serious obstacle.

4. The matter of placing orders for the huge tonnages involved (a possible total approaching 288,000 tons for the North) alone is visualized, has been discussed with Commerce Sub-Commission, Foreign Trade Section, who point out that they can only take action in the matter if these raw materials are bought against Category "B" credits. Otherwise the procurement must take place through the normal requisitioning channels as a Category "A" item, and be charged to the general peace settlement eventually to be

made between the Allies and the Italian Government.

5. When it is taken into consideration that the cost of supplying the whole of Italy's needs for the balance of this year may run between \$ 8 to 10,000,000, which represents a substantial fraction of their present entire foreign credit, it will be seen that the decision as to how this material will be purchased, becomes a matter of high policy.

6. Foreign Trade Section advises us that as of today still no reply has been received either from the French Authorities or from AFN to our signal 5853 dated 21 April 1945.

7. An early decision is requested as the time is now at hand for procuring these raw materials for the manufacture of super-phosphate, a crop fertilizer which plays a fundamental part in the economy of Italy.
