1. In your request of fuel and lubricating oil for motor schooners for october I see that CO-GE-NA need 720 tons of gasoil and 44 tons of lubricating oil.
2. In my letter dated 16 July 1944 - Ref. Tn/51/3 - para 3. it is understood that the lubricating oil should be estimated at about 3% of the fuel oil used.
3. Consequently instead of 44 tons lubr.oil (as per your request lubr.oil for motor schooners october) I have asked 23 tons of oil.

SUBJECT: Matches.

TO : Transportation Sub-Commission.

1. Attached is translation copy of telegram from the Naples office of the Consorzio Industrie Fiammiferi, C.I.F., showing payment of 160,000 Lire as freight guarantee of a total of 800,000 booklets and boxes of matches, amounting to 12 Tons.

a. This averages a cost of 20 centesimi per unit. The price established for the sale of these matches to the public as established by the ACC Price Committee allowed for a transportation cost of 3 centesimi.

b. The average cost of freight on the basis of 160,000 Lire charge is 12 1/2% of selling price. The previous estimate at 3 centesimi was approximately 2%. This does not include cost of rail, loading, and other charges. 2916

2. This freight charge for sea movement is excessive and may require a change of prices to the islands of Sicily and Sardinia. C.I.F. is an independent monopoly under the supervision of the State and is not subject to direct subsidy.

3. Investigation of these charges would be appreciated and a reduction in these guarantees and/or freight charges reduced.

4. Please consider this matter urgent as regular sea movements will be required for the distribution of matches.

SUBJECT: Supply of P.O.L. for Schooners.

TO : All Regional Headquarters.

1. Arrangements for refuelling schooners are made by Co-ge-na from their Headquarters in Naples, and allotment of P.O.L. is arranged for them by Transportation Sub-Commission through A.F.H.Q.
2. This allotment is not normally included in the Regional allotment, although the amount of it may be notified to Regions by Pet. Section for information.
3. Co-ge-na, from their allotment, sets up refuelling points, and schooners are supplied with sufficient fuel to reach the next refuelling point.
4. Schooner captains requiring fuel should be therefore directed to apply to Co-ge-na Agents, and should not receive P.O.L. from any other source, unless in very exceptional cases. Such exceptional cases should be reported to Transportation Sub-Commission, HQ. ACC.

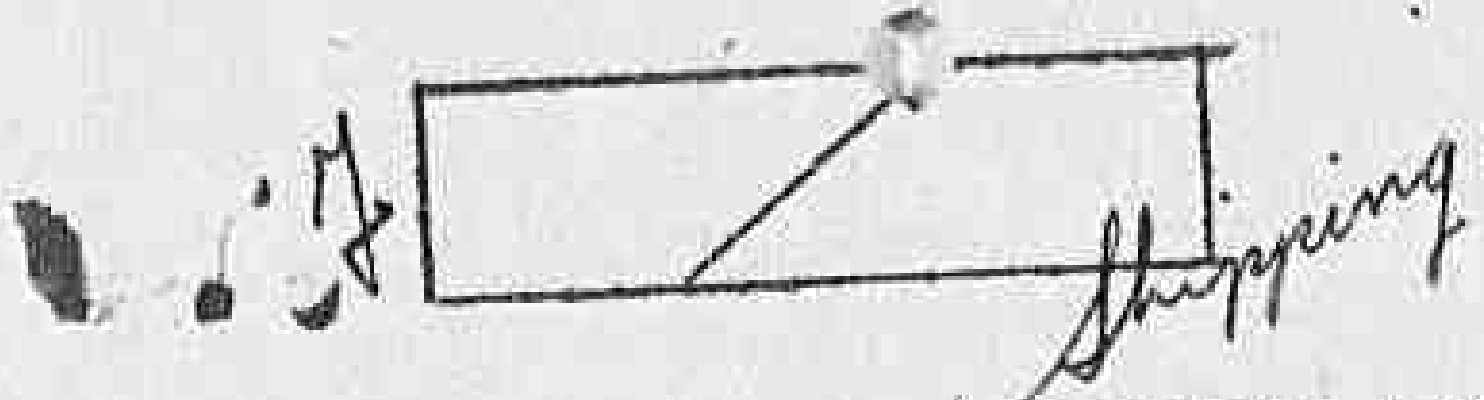

SUBJECT: Salted Fish Imports from Sicily

To : U.O. Region IV (ATT. Alimentation Section)

1. On August 31, our Fisheries Division received the following telegram from the Fisheries representative of the Minister of Agriculture in Palermo:

" Motor schooner Garibaldi loaded with 592 quintals of salted fish. Permit to depart (Palermo for Anzio) obtained by declaring merchandize directed to Ancona Rome stop Request control destination of load at its arrival."

2. Several checks were made, after the receipt of this telegram, with the Schooner Section, Transportation Sub-Commission to learn of the whereabouts of the Garibaldi but without results. On September 13, 1944 Lt. Comdr. Bulieri in company with His Excellency Borgesi, Under Secretary of Agriculture, visited Anzio and found the Garibaldi in port along with a score or more of other schooners from Sicily. 2904

3. The Captain of the Garibaldi told the two officials that he had turned the salted fish over to a Signor Palmisano, representative of a firm by the same name.

4. From Vecchiarelli Torquato, an Italian employee of the Regatta at Anzio, it was learned that the salted fish brought by the Garibaldi, was transported to Rome by the ROMANIAN transport people to a warehouse at Via Pietro Papa for SEPRAL's account.

5. This Sub-Commission is desirous to know what happened to the salted fish brought by the Garibaldi, and specifically if the SEPRAL was informed of the shipment by the purchaser, or consignee Palmisano. It would like to know at what price the fish was sold. The price for salted anchovies agreed upon at Palermo with the representative of the Ministry of Agriculture was 75 lire per kilo, for salted sardines 55 lire per kilo, for salted mackerel 75 lire and for salted Saeri, 30 lire per kilo all prices FOB schooner, port of embarkation, Sicily.

6. For your information the following schooners now at Anzio have salted fish on board:

Intrepido, Garibaldi (which has already discharged it) San Giuseppe, San Francesco di Paola and the Fides.

The schooners have the following licences:

Intrepido	Catania 179	<i>Copied License</i>
Garibaldi	Trapani 647	CH 91
San Giuseppe	Trapani (Provisory permit)	301
San Francesco	Siracusa 106	1067
Fides	Siracusa 429	769

All the vessels had a COSENTI member except the San Francesco. The above mentioned craft like the rest of the schooners still at Anzio were all loaded with wine. 2933

An additional 56 grams of canned meat is granted in place of the preserved fish whenever the latter is not available locally.

In supplying the above-mentioned rations the individual ships will be considered as special groups and the crew-members-before sailing-must consign their ration cards to the Harbour Office. The latter will forward them to the Commune that has issued them, at the same time giving notice of the embarkation of the crew member, so as to avoid the issue of other ration cards.

Should the crew-member lack the ration cards, the Harbour's Offices will likewise notify the Commune where the crew-member resides of his embarkation.

The above-mentioned provisions apply also to the crew-members who are at present already at sea.

In the same way the Communes concerned will be informed of the temporary or permanent disembarcations of the crew-members.

The application for the allocation of the food-rations referred to in the above list, after having been signed by the ship's Commander, will be counter-signed by the Harbour's Office after it has properly checked the following:

- a) the number of the members of the crew, according to the Roll Book
- b) If the requested rations are equal to those that are due.
- c) The estimated duration of the trip up to the terminal dock or the port where it is possible to supply more food rations.
- d) The rations left over on board, extracted from the "Book of the movement of rationed goods".

Will the Ministry and the Prefects kindly give the necessary instructions to the Harbour's Offices and to the Communal Rationing Offices so that this circular will be executed fully and to the letter.

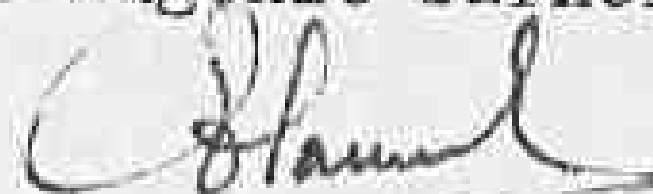

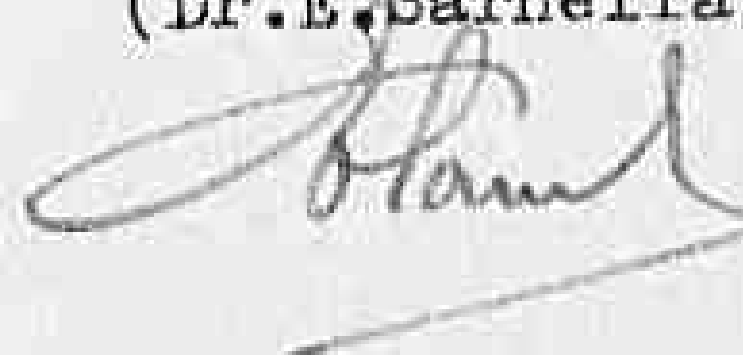

2. In order to obtain any oil it will be necessary for the applicant to have a release certificate from you or your agent. That certificate will specify whether it is to be charged to your account or paid for by the applicant. The name of the schooner for which the oil is required will be stated on the release certificate.

3. It is presumed that supplies will be required to be drawn from other places besides Naples. I have suggested Naples, Reggio, Bari, Catania, Palermo, and either Taranto, Brindisi, or Gallipoli. Will you therefore, after making your estimate on the system shown above, divide it up amongst these ports as you think you will require to have it drawn. A separate estimate is also required in regard to Sardinia where presumably you will require to draw the oil at Cagliari and Olbia.
