I am compelled to write you once more because I must close all the work-rooms of my firm Erica Dei & Gugliotta owing to lack of railway wagons which have not been assigned to us since July 1944.

The closing and the leaving off of the operation of the most important Italian firm of pipe industry is real disaster for all those workmen who are employed in it, but this fact is provoked by lack of rail cars. We beg to assign us only those which are necessary to save all the stuff which has already been produced. And we need five rail-cars at Ascea and three at Catanzaro Sala for Villa San Giovanni where we have drying up rooms, the necessary space factories.

Each day empty rail-cars for the Calabria are passing at Ascea (Salerno) and it would be so easy to un-hitch one rail car per week and hitch it again on the same time. So we will be able to save all our material the roughly cutted pipes and avoid all our wood from being spoiled.

SUBJECT: Preparation of the Port of Civitavecchia
by Acting Deputy Chief of Staff, War Cabinet Section

1. A short-time number of motor lorries will be available in Civitavecchia by civil authorities for the movement of materials, etc., in the port area of construction. It has been suggested by the War Cabinet that it would be sufficient civil transport in the port area to meet early demands without having to divert all road-calls available to Civitavecchia.

2. Arrangements are to be made with the Ministry of Public Works so that the Minister has available full transport from the Ministry of Transport. In this, the equivalent of 1000 vehicles, 60 3-ton lorries, are likely to be required. So far the Minister of Public Works has requested 20 vehicles from the Ministry of Transport. It is however good for the co-ordinating arrangement to give warning that some of these vehicles may not arrive.

3. My third letter is taken as above. If the Minister approves I will early writing to you the arrangements necessary to follow.

1. Reference is made to Ministry of Marine letter OM/47648
of 30 November 1944.

2. The Navy Sub-Commission has investigated thoroughly the possibility of obtaining the transfer of an Italian Army Port Party to CIVITAVECCHIA, but has been informed by the Land Forces Sub-Commission, A.G. (ROMIA), that it is not presently possible for the Italian War Ministry to assist in the operation of ports with troops at its disposal. It appears, therefore, that it will be necessary to utilize civilian labor for the operation of ports under Italian control until the commitments of Italian Army units are reduced.

1. The Italian War Ministry has been allowed a small number of troops for administration, services, hospitals, etc. No labor units are available in this category. Therefore it is not possible for the War Ministry to assist in the operation of ports with troops at its disposal.

2. All Italian Army labor units are in either the British or US categories, both of which are under Allied command, fully employed, and are a national commitment of the Government concerned. Therefore these units are available for only such duty as is assigned by the Government concerned. Both the British and US armies are employing such units in the operation of British and US ports. The British Army is also employing some Italian Naval personnel in port operations; these are included in the Italian Army (British) ceiling; and the Italian Navy is maintained wholly by the British Government.

3. It is believed that it will be necessary for the Italian Government to utilize civilian labor for operation of ports under Italian control.

Subject: Proposal to Transfer an Italian Port Labor Party
to CIVITAVECCHIA.

1. The proximate arrival at Civitavecchia of several Allied U/Ts carrying supplies for the Italian civil population is foreseen. The number of civil stevedores there is less than will be required to unload the U/Ts. In question, nor is it possible to increase it by employing labour from the surrounding district, as workers do not want to go to Civitavecchia where they could not find food and lodgings.
2. To increase the ports' unloading capacity, it would be very useful to transfer to Civitavecchia a Company of Lt. Auxiliary Troops engaged under "Land Forces Sub-Commission, A.C."

3. We request therefore that you kindly obtain above Sub-commission's approval to the transfer to Civitavecchia of a Company of the Auxiliary Troops already mentioned. Italian Army Authorities concerned have been informed of this request and are favourable to its acceptance.







AS BASED TODAY (1 JAN 67) THE BRITISH AND ITALIAN
CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS HAVE TAKEN AND ARE DOING THE
THE FOLLOWING WORKS, PERTAINING TO THE PORT OF ALICE, AND 310:

1. A British representative from the contractors informed the
COAST GUARD THAT AT DIPLOMATIC & 20 JANUARY AND AGAIN ON 26 JANUARY
1967, HE ADVISED THE COAST GUARD OF THE TRANSACTION OF SUBMARINE
CLUSTERS, WHICH CONSISTED OF TWO CLUSTERS.

2. The following recommendations were made to the COAST GUARD
CONCERNING RECOMMENDATIONS:

3. Initiate general pier maintenance using Italian civilians.
4. Require all sail pier to have 2 x floating mooring posts. Clusters
were installed by persons in such a manner as to allow maximum strain on pier.
Since these ships are not using lines to hold any ship away from pier, the clusters
have been taking an excessive load.
5. Remove clusters from pier.
6. Install one (1) concrete sinker with a floating mooring post
about 30 feet off end of pier at a low perpendicular to pier to aid in
harbor operations and for stern off-pier mooring lines.
7. Direct 2 x clusters to carry mooring lines at each ship over water
and each a floating mooring.
8. The above work, as well as other port construction, has been initiated
by all Italian labor and starting using Italian contractors.
