SUBJECT : Coastwise Shipping for Italian Industrial needs.

TO : Ministero dell'Industria e del Commercio.

1. Reference your letter ~~680808~~ ²⁶ of 1 February, which has been studied carefully.

2. The following observations are made on the list of raw materials in your paragraph 2.

- (a) 10,000 tons of bauxite from Manfredonia : It is questionable if speedy loadings can be assured in Manfredonia and part of this tonnage might have to be moved by rail.
- (b) 5,000 tons of rock salt and 10,000 tons of sulphur from Porto Empedocle : This port usually averages 250 tons daily per ship. Economical use of shipping would be difficult using this port to this extent. There are certain to be delays in smaller ports without good facilities and often liable to indifferent weather conditions.
- (c) 10,000 tons of salt from Trapani : The use of large vessels in Trapani would involve delays, as 250 tons is the normal daily average. It might be more profitable to use schooners for this cargo, as they will be free to trade without restrictions in the near future.
- (d) 5,000 tons of pitprops from S. Antiooco : Within recent months no more than 1,500-2,000 tons have been available for shipment.

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- (c) 10,000 tons of salt from Trapani: The use of large vessels in Trapani would involve delays, as 250 tons is the normal daily average. It might be more profitable to use schooners for this cargo, as they will be free to trade without restrictions in the near future.
- (d) 5,000 tons of pitprops from S. Antiocho: Within recent months no more than 1,500-2,000 tons have been available for shipment.

In view of the above comments, this Sub-Commission is of opinion that the tonnage figures given by you are considerably on the high side.

3. With regard to the general question raised

the Ministry of Merchant Marine should press the claims of Italian domestic shipping needs as their representatives attend meetings of Allied Shipping Authorities in Rome, and also send observers to conferences of the United Maritime Authority, which controls the pool of Allied shipping in this theatre.

This Sub-Commission has now almost completed its functions and, whilst it will support during the two or three weeks left before we wind up any requests made by the Ministry of Marine to the Allied Shipping Authorities, we are not aware of any special request having been made except for additional coal shipments from Sardinia.

4. This Sub-Commission takes this opportunity of emphasising once more the need for an early establishment by the Italian Government of a Priority Board to consider priorities of Italian essential needs and also the best means - by rail, road and sea - of transport. The Allied Commission has during recent months repeatedly advocated the early formation of this Board, which could support the requests made by the Ministry of Merchant Marine to the Allied Shipping Authorities. These requests would be confirmed by the technical opinions of the Ministry of Transport and Marine.

5. The Priorities Board would have to take into consideration availabilities of commodities, the justification for increased tonnages being moved, capacities of ports etc. The considered opinions of this impartial Board would certainly receive sympathetic consideration from the Allied Shipping authorities.

6. A speedier turn-round of ships is anticipated during future months, with a consequent increase in the tonnages shipped monthly. This Sub-Commission considers that the need for greater utilization of available shipping is just as important as the need for increasing the number of ships being used for coastwise traffic. The Ministry of Merchant Marine has been asked to study the possibility of increasing demurrage rates in Italian ports in order to ensure ships being worked to their maximum capacities. For instance, it has been noticed recently that colliers carrying Sardinian coal have not always been worked as speedily as is desirable in view of the urgent need for coal in this country. Other commodities have also suffered in this way.

7. Your Ministry should not overlook the fact that as military needs decrease, additional railway capacities will

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7. Your Ministry should not overlook the fact that as military needs decrease, additional railway capacities will become available for civilian needs and this should ease the shipping position.

1. The notable sea distances which separate the sources of raw material from the manufacturing centers in comparison with the scarce sea tonnage at disposal, have in the past few months greatly increased the distress of the problem of coastwise transports which, if not readily taken care of, threatens to hinder the economical rehabilitation of the country.

2. For the present use it can be figured that only for the movement of raw materials for industry, excluding national coal and Tunisian phosphates, for the months of March/April a coastwise tonnage of ~~18000~~ ⁸⁵⁰⁰⁰ tons are essential subdivided as following:

Firm resting the tonnage in program of 60000 tons monthly for the movement of national coal from Sardinia, the total sum would be of 145,000 tons of tonnage for the monthly needs.

3. From the above figure the tonnage for the phosphates from Tunisia has been excluded.

It is known that for these products, of which at first an import of 700,000 tons had been foreseen, then reduced to 500,000, a contract of exchange with pyrites had been made which provided for a first income of 100,000 tons. About six months from date of contract it has been possible to bring into Italy about 20,000 tons while the whole quantity should be moved in by the month of March. This should be done in consideration of the contract, and also to avoid that no fertilizers be available for the coming forming season, especially that of wheat. The fertilizer Firms both in Southern and Northern Italy are inactive because of lack of raw material.

Serious thought ^{showed} be given to the question of phosphates which can not be examined together with coastwise shipping since for this latter is scheduled monthly.

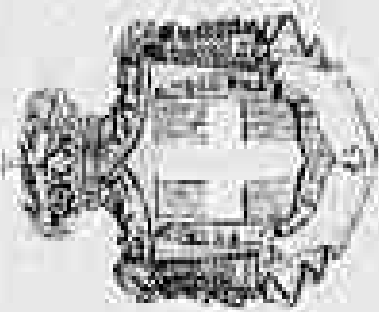
4. In consideration of the above, this Ministry, preoccupied by the situation of the supply of raw materials in connection to the scarce amount of sea transport, vividly begs the authorities to whom the present is addressed, to:

a) make available in the shortest time an amount of shipping adequate to the needs of Italian Industry which is calculated at 140,000 tons per month;

b) to urgently provide, apart from the shipping needed for coastwise transport, for the transfer into Italy of the 100,000 tons of Tunisian phosphates, purchased, and for other quantities which may be acquired from France.

A reply to the above will be greatly appreciated.

Oggetto Trasporti costieri.-

- 1) Le notevoli distanze marittime che si interpongono tra le fonti di rifornimento di talune materie prime e le industrie consumatrici, in confronto alla scarsa disponibilità di naviglio, hanno reso particolarmente acuto in questi ultimi mesi il problema dei trasporti costieri, che, qualora non fosse avviato a rapide soluzioni, minaccia di intralciare la ripresa economica ed industriale del Paese.
- 2) Allo scopo attuale, si può calcolare che il fabbisogno mensile minimo di tonnellaggio per i mesi di marzo-aprile per i soli trasporti costieri di materie prime industriali, escluso il carbone nazionale ed i fosfati tunisini, possa essere valutato intorno alle 85.000 tonn., così costituite:

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Mantenendo fermo il tonnellaggio programmato, per il trasporto dei carboni nazionali dalla Sardegna in 60.000 tonn. Mensili, si perviene ad un fabbisogno mensile di 145.000 tonnellate, necessario per il trasporto di materie prime.

3) Nel calcolo sommario testè effettuato, non è stato compreso il tonnellaggio relativo ai fosfati dalla Tunisia.

E' noto che per questi prodotti, per i quali era prevista, in un primo tempo, l'importazione di 700.000 tonnellate, ridotte poi a 500.000, è stato concluso a suo tempo un accordo di cambio con pirite per un primo afflusso di 100.000 tonnellate. A distanza di circa 6 mesi dall'accordo, si è riusciti a trasportare in Italia circa 20.000 tonnellate, mentre l'intero quantitativo dovrebbe essere trasportato entro il mese di marzo. Ciò sia per gli impegni assunti, sia per la necessità di evitare che la campagna agraria, ed in particolare quella granaria, si svolga quasi totalmente senza il sussidio dei fertilizzanti, i cui stabilimenti di produzione, sia nell'Italia meridionale che in quella settentrionale, sono inattivi per deficienza di materia prima.

Il rifornimento, quindi, dei fosfati merita un particolare trattamento e non può essere considerato e risolto nel piano dei trasporti costieri che viene esaminato mensilmente.

4) In considerazione di quanto sopra esposto, questo Ministero, preoccupato della situazione dei rifornimenti delle materie prime più sopra indicate, in relazione alla scarsa disponibilità di navigli rivolge viva preghiera alle Amministrazioni cui la presente è rivolta affinché:

a) si ottenga il più rapidamente possibile una disponibilità di naviglio adeguata alle reali necessità dei trasporti dell'industria italiana, valutate in circa 145.000 tonn. al mese;

b) si provveda con urgenza, indipendentemente dal naviglio per trasporti costieri, al trasferimento in Italia delle 100.000 tonn. di fosfati tunisini già acquistati e di quegli altri quantitativi che saranno successivamente acquistati dalla Francia.

Si gradirà un cortese cenno di riscontro.

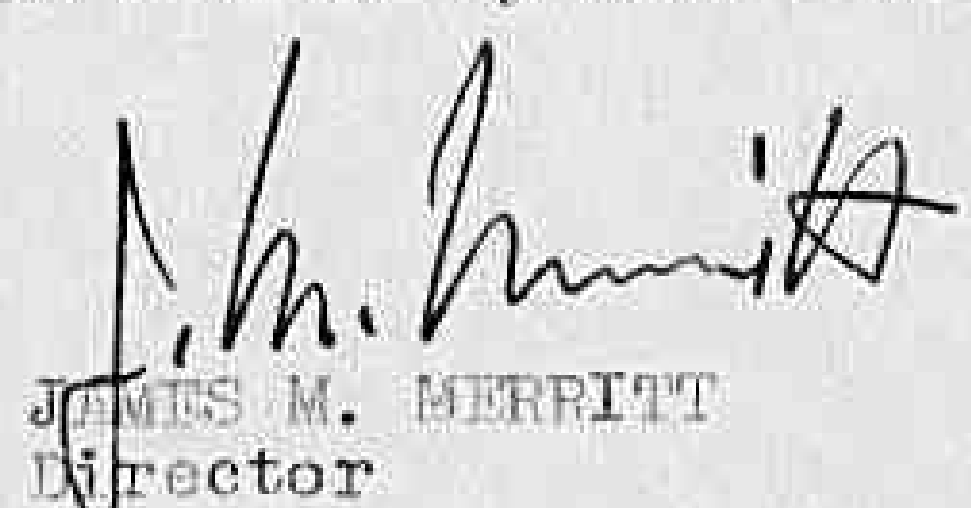

TO : Transportation Sub-Commission

1. Reference your AC/602A/11/Tn3 of 5 July 1945.
2. At this date it is impossible to do any more than to indicate commodities which may be moved in a coastwise shipping program. These commodities include sulphur approximately 2,000 tons per month, and there is a possibility that there will be a program for the movement of forage and livestock. This program will depend on the feed situation existing at that time.
3. Salt for agricultural purposes is another commodity that will be moving in limited quantities, but this item is usually taken care of by Food Sub-Commission.

2. The estimated requirements of this Division for Inter-Mediterranean movements for imports to Italian Territory during the next seven months, confined to orders being actually negotiated, are as follows :

a) 100,000 tons of Rock Phosphate from French North Africa for shipment April/June; at present being negotiated by the Italian Government with the French. Shipments of these goods may even take place after August. No reply has yet been obtained from the French.

b) Industry S/C has an import programme for 268,000 tons of Rock Phosphate from French North Africa for North Italy, which is still in the screening stage.

2. It is impossible at this time to give you a definite program on the above mentioned subject for the period September-December. The commodities for which programs may be developed for this period are sulphur from Sicily and livestock from Sardinia.
3. A total of around 35,000 tons of sulphur may have to be moved from Sicily to the Mainland. This depends on first, condition of mines on the Mainland and how quickly they can be reactivated and secondly, on the production program in Sicily. It may prove to be desirable to move end stockpile during the period September-December about 15,000 tons for Northern Italy, 20,000 tons for Southern Italy, for use in the spring of 1946.
4. No definite estimate can be given at this time as to the number of cattle that may be programmed for movement from Sardinia to the Mainland during the period September-December.
5. As soon as definite programs on movement of sulphur and cattle are worked out, they will be forwarded to you.

Addressees will realise that in order to assess the shipping requirements in the theatre it is necessary for the authorities concerned to have a reasonably long-term programme of probable shipping requirements.

2. It will be of great assistance to the shipping authorities if the addressees of this letter can give an estimated forward programme to cover the balance of 1945 for which programmes have not yet been prepared and submitted to the Transportation Sub-Commission. Demands for port allocation, based on estimated requirements, have been submitted to AFHQ up to, and including, August, 1945. These will act as a sufficient guide to the shipping authorities for the immediate future. The meantime will addressees please submit their anticipated future requirements to cover the period September to December, 1945, inclusive, in accordance with the attached pro forma, returns being submitted on a monthly basis.

3. Bids should be submitted on the basis that all the north has been liberated, and that the majority of ports in the north will be able to accept civilian cargoes. Industry Sub-Commission is requested to include an estimate for Sardinian coal in its programme. The programmes should cover all intra Mediterranean movement, that is not only movement from such areas as Sicily and Sardinia to the Mainland, and vice versa, but such movements as phosphate rock from North Africa to Italy, and anticipated imports and exports from and to other Mediterranean areas.
