SUBJECT: Civilian Travel to Destinations Outside Italy

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394

Reference to your letter AC/612A/102/Tn.3.

1. Very little progress has been made in this matter since it was first raised in August 1945. The reason for this is that there is no military interest in the movement of the type of travellers concerned.

2. It is now considered desirable that the whole question should cease to be one for consideration by the military authorities. Civilian travel facilities are being slowly revived and civilian travel agencies are now in a position to resume their normal functions to some degree.

3. Civilians wishing to travel to destinations outside of Italy and who are in a position to pay their fares must seek the advice of the appropriate consulate.

4. It is highly desirable that some agency such as Cooks should take over the mechanics of this travel and it is suggested that ECITO might be in a position to assist with the necessary initial coordination.

5. The provisions of this letter do not, of course, apply to civilians employed or sponsored by the Allied Military Authorities.

It is noted that the question of civil passengers for the U.K. was discussed at the Mediterranean Shipping Board Meeting held on 30 October (see Minute 2483).

3.

The immediate prospects of shipping being available to U.K. from this theatre are not good. Further, it has not been possible to evacuate any civilians to U.K. since the original request was made. The proposed to return civilians by air did not materialize.

4.

Arrangements are now being made to re-institute a modified Siamon-Orient-Express Train Service. This will run from Milan to Paris with through connection in Italy from Rome and Venice and with connection from Paris to England. It is suggested that this service could be used to repatriate civilians on a limited scale from Italy to England.

5.

Any repatriation by these means would have to be closely controlled and it is proposed that a civilian agency such as Wagon-Lite-Cook would be suitable for making the routine arrangements. In this connection a copy is attached of a letter received from the Chief of the Italian Agency of the Wagon-Lite-Cook Company, indicating their willingness to undertake the arrangements for repatriation by rail.

It is considered that priorities would have to be established for various categories of passengers and it is suggested that the British Legacies or Consulates could allot these priorities.

The introduction of services to England by rail or sea for the numerous English and other civilians now in Italy is important and your views on the above proposals are requested in order that an organized system for dealing with application for repatriation can be introduced as early as possible.

Subject: Repatriation of civilians
=====

Through the courtesy of Major Laraman (A.C.) we have received the August 1945 summary of civilians here in Italy awaiting embarkation and upon going thoroughly into the possibilities of effecting, on a commercial basis, this repatriation work, Major Laraman suggested that I report to you and take your instructions on the matter.

Following up my visit of this morning and taking your advice I beg to submit for your kind consideration some indications connected with this repatriation work and I trust that same may be found helpful in relation with the commercial side of the problem.

1) On the assumption that when a repatriating person is known to have sufficient funds either here or elsewhere, to pay for his trip back home, such a person should be called to pay for same and not charge it to his Government;

2) It would then be up to those people who can afford to pay their journey back home to arrange that such payment to be made in advance;

3) Messrs. C.ie Int.le des Wagons-Lits, 40, Rue de l'Arcade - Paris and Messrs. Thos. Cook & Son, Ltd. Berkeley St. London would appear to be the ones which could centralise all these payments and then pass on word to the offices concerned so that the persons whose fare back home has been paid may be entered in the awaiting list for them to take the next available boat or train to reach final destination;

4) From the repatriating list, as mentioned on the first para of this letter and of which a copy is attached hereto

the number of civilians U.K. bound appears prominent. It is thought, therefore, that special departures, as may be warranted, may be arranged every now and then, to start alternately say from Rome and Milan for London. It may also be advisable to run a special train once a month with one or two sleeping cars, for those who can afford the expense, and a dining car throughout between Italy and London;

5) For those, South America bound, the Royal Mail boats either from England or Lisbon could be made use of; there would be in addition the services of the Aznar, Ybarra, Colonial Transatlantica, all either Spanish or Portuguese ports and South America bound which could be taken into consideration particularly in the case of those who would pay their fares personally;

6) then there are those who could avail themselves of the A.E.L. services from the Mediterraneo to North America as well as Central America, via New York, and finally allied ships calling at Italian ports en route to the East could be made use of for repatriating those civilians directed to Indian, Egyptian etc. destinations;

7) ordinary rail passengers services to be considered for the repatriation of people returning to Spain, France, Sweden and other European destinations;

8) the whole question of "priority" would have to be gone into particularly in the case of persons making use of Allied ships;

9) all applications of return passages back home to be sent direct by the interested parties to our organisation and it would be left to us to approach the appropriate Allied Quarter for instructions re. priority and particularly in those cases when the return passage may represent a charge to a Government;

10) our chain of Offices in Italy as well as abroad would be placed at the disposal of repatriating civilians for information and assistance. Here in Italy we have Offices open to the public at: Genoa, Turin, Milan, Venice, Trieste, Florence and Rome (2) and we await to re-enter at any moment into our Naples premises which were and are still requisitioned by the R.N.

On the other hand I would keep in close contact with the Allied Offices here in Rome so as to receive and pass on your instructions on this repatriation work.

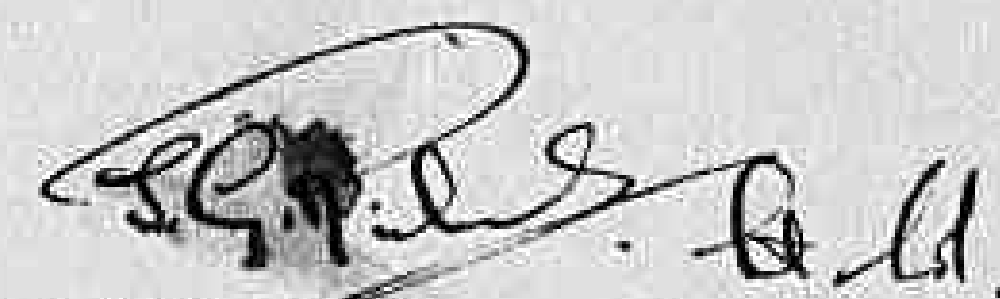

SUBJECT: Civilian travel to destinations outside Italy.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission,
APO 394.

1. Reference your AC/612A/55/Tn.3 of 20 August and G-5: 300.4-7 of 30 August.

2. It is considered that Embassies and Consulates are sufficiently aware of the necessity for travel orders for civilian travel on military transport and that additional instructions on this point are unnecessary.

3. This Headquarters does not approve, for the time being at least, the delegation of responsibility for making bookings for civilian travel on military transport to a civilian agency such as Cooks or American Express Company. It is admitted, however, that procedures for arranging civilian travel are in need of streamlining and it is hoped that new instructions will be issued in the near future. In the meantime it is desired that present methods be continued.
