SUBJECT : Customs Control Genoa.

TO : Direzione Generale della Marina Mercantile
Ministero Marina - Roma

1. The following is an extract of letter dated 24 Oct. from Circonscrizione Dogana di Genoa which has been addressed to Allied Shipping Representatives : -

"CUSTOMS CONTROL"

Following verbal agreements taken time ago, Customs has been exercising prescript control, since a few months ago, on all Italian ships coming in this port.

Everything is going on practically pretty well.

On the contrary, things are not going forward as they should when foreign ships come in loaded with goods for civilians or for Switzerland - the above mentioned ships haven't, till now, delivered up the charge declaration fixed by the Italian Customs Law, in order to be sure that all goods may be declared to customs instead of being smuggled in.

I sincerely hope you will understand the good reason of my request and will kindly give the necessary orders to all foreign ships coming in to deliver the charge declaration especially for those loaded with goods in transit for Switzerland."

2. The MMT Naples have forwarded this communication and state they are taking this matter with London. It is requested that you will advise foreign countries, such as Switzerland, who are importing cargoes through Italian ports here or for transit through Italy, of these
