" New shipping procedure under UMA comes into force shortly.
 MYT representative leaving now for Zone 3 of U.M.A. meeting
 in Caserta. Please contact him for Algiers Naples shipment.

Today we have received from Washington cable N. 457 repeated
 Caserta N. 356:

" Intermediterranean shipping now arranged through MEDCO ask
 Caserta bid for tonnage for movement from Algiers to ITY adding
 about 100 tons now on route S/S JOHN VINING" total appears about
 500 tons. If necessary Caserta will ask ERC for space from
 BOWT "

The steps we have already taken to get the Philippeville stock
 moved to Naples have been as follows:

- A) On or about 12 June I informed A.C. Transportation Sub Commission
 that we were going to place bid for transshipment of 400 tons of
 supplies from Algiers to Italy, and was told to submit freight-
 forms "B" to A.F.H.C. for this movement.
- B) This was then amended by A.C. , who told me that A.F.H.C. no
 longer was responsible for transshipment from North Africa, and
 that the bid had to be placed in Algiers.
- C) We then sent cable N.131 to Algiers telling them it was now
 necessary for them to bid for shipment and ask them to confirm
 when they had made the bid.
- D) We have since heard from the Washington Cable N. 434 that
 S/S "JOHN VINING" with approximately 100 tons for U.N.R.R.A

- 2 -

Philippeville was expected in Algiers early in July.
No action has yet been taken to bid for a transshipment of
this tonnage.

In view of the conflicting instructions received regarding
transshipment of these goods (now totalling 500 tons) from Algiers
to Italy, would you please advise us what procedure we should
follow and tell us if we should take any further action or if this
is now being handled through you.

The UNRRA Italian Mission has a Photofluorographic Unit which will probably have to be moved to Cairo during the month of June. This Unit consists of a 30 cwt. truck, apparatus weighing approximately 3 tons and measuring 362 cubic feet. The tonnage to be moved would thus be about 5 tons. It is very valuable cargo and would have to be handled with care. UNRRA would provide supervisory personnel both for the loading and discharging of the Unit. It could be shipped from Naples, Bari or Taranto, whichever port would be most suitable.

Please consider this as a provisional Bid for movement in the appropriate maintenance period. We will confirm at the earliest possible moment if it is firm or must be cancelled. The reason we cannot make a firm Bid now is that the policy is not yet quite clearly decided as to whether the Unit will move to Cairo or not.

THE LETTER FROM MAJOR CARVER, 3-5, REGARDING THE DISPOSAL OF UNRRA WHEAT WAS DISCUSSED, AND THE FOLLOWING DECISIONS WERE MADE:-

1. THAT UNRRA WHEAT OFF S.S. NATHAN HALE SHOULD BE UNLOADED AT TORRE ANNUNZIATA, WHERE IT WOULD BE STORED IN THE SILOS. UNRRA IS PROPOSING TO THE GOVERNMENT THAT IT TAKE TITLE TO THE WHEAT AT TORRE ANNUNZIATA AND IN RETURN WOULD DELIVER TO UNRRA A CORRESPONDING AMOUNT OF FLOUR OR PASTA WHEREVER UNRRA REQUIRED IT. COL. IMRIE INDICATED THAT AS LONG AS UNRRA WAS MAKING DEALS WITH THE GOVERNMENT WHICH DID NOT INVOLVE A SHIFT IN COMMODITIES, A.C. WOULD HAVE NO OBJECTION, BECAUSE THIS WOULD NOT DISTURB A.C.'S IMPORT PLANS. MR. HACKMAN SAID THAT UNRRA WOULD NOT MAKE ANY DEALS WITH THE GOVERNMENT WITHOUT CONSULTING OR INFORMING A.C.

NO PROBLEM AT PRESENT ARISES OVER TRANSFER OF SACKS BETWEEN UNRRA AND A.C.

2. IT WAS AGREED THAT THE NATHAN HALE SHOULD BE DISCHARGED FIRST AT LEGHORN, WHERE THE 5000 TONS OF MISCELLANEOUS UNRRA CARGO WOULD BE STORED IN THE A.C. WAREHOUSE. THE SHIP WOULD THEN PROCEED TO TORRE ANNUNZIATA WHERE IT WOULD DISCHARGE THE 3000 TONS OF BULK WHEAT.

THIS ARRANGEMENT WOULD EASE THE POSITION IN NAPLES WHERE MAJOR KLEIN REPORTED THAT HIS WAREHOUSES WERE MORE THAN FILLED WITH A.C. SUPPLIES, IN ADDITION TO THE UNRRA SUPPLIES NOW THERE, AND WHERE PERISHABLES, LIKE DRIED CODFISH, ARE NOW BEING STORED EXPOSED TO THE WEATHER. THE HIGH COMMISSIONER'S OFFICE AND THE FEDERAZIONE HAVE SENT SEVERAL COMPLAINTS ABOUT THIS SITUATION TO THE FOOD SUBCOMMISSION OF A.C. AND TO UNRRA.

1. Attached is a copy of a signal received by UNRRA Rome from Washington. It is understood that the 1300 tons bulk wheat referred to in para 1 is loaded on the WILLIS VANDEVANTER in UGS 80 and that UNRRA have arranged to bag this in the hold.

2. It is presumed in addition that the item of 3,000 tons bulk wheat mentioned will be on the NATHAN HALE in UGS 84. This convoy includes two bagged and three bulk wheat ships on A.C. account and one bagged wheat ship for Balkans to lighten in Italy. While your plans for arranging destinations for these ships are not yet known here it seems possible that you may decide to take one bulk ship only at CASTELLAMARE. If this is the case it is suggested that in order to save the necessity of bagging in the hold on the NATHAN HALE and to obtain a quicker turnaround of the vessel that this ship might discharge its general UNRRA cargo in Naples and complete at TORRE ANNUNZIATA while the A.C. ship does a complete discharge at CASTELLAMARE.

3. This would involve arrangements between the Allied Commission and UNRRA in the matter of the provision of necessary bags and the transfer to UNRRA of an equivalent quantity of bagged wheat in exchange for the bulk wheat taken into A.C. silos from the NATHAN HALE.

4. There may be objections to this proposal from your point of view but it would appear to be somewhat of a wasted effort to bag in the hold at Naples if elevators nearby are standing idle and it is suggested that you might examine the question in view of the fact that similar opportunities of discharging UNRRA bulk wheat at CASTELLAMARE or TORRE ANNUNZIATA may occur again in the future.

Dominick advises Hackman rear 189, Athens 174, Caserta we have shipped approximately 1300 tons bulk wheat on first full vessel are shipping shortly approximately 3000 tons in second full vessel plan to ship approximately 9000 tons on next two full vessels loading in April. Bagging facilities here greatly overtaxed and delays obtaining bagged wheat might endanger whole shipping program. Doing our best get share bagged wheat for subsequent shipments.

2. Have shipped you 10,000 bags of wheat on first full vessel which bags should be returnable for your use. Have previously shipped you 155,500 burlap bags on part loaders. Now loading additional 116,200 bags. Plan to ship soonest additional 25,000 bags with needles twine scoops. Agrahab here figures this total amount of bags should be sufficient to handle total bulk wheat which we have shipped or are planning to ship until end of April. If you do not agree please advise promptly and we shall endeavor to load additional bags on second April ship.

3. We have also shipped you several thousand other bags containing flour beans peas, etc., which could be reused in emergency for wheat.

4. We trust it will not be necessary for you to bag this grain in ship. We understand reasons which might cause such operation stated Caserta's 174 but urge you use every effort to arrange elevator space. Quick turnaround of UNRRA allocated vessels highly essential for further allocations for Italian program.

Dear Avv. Montini,

I discussed with Dotteressa Cao-Pinna Friday evening the problem of assuring the arrival in Italy of 2 Liberty type vessels for UNRRA each month, with some filler cargo space in addition, as outlined in Washington cable 174, which is summarized in my letter of yesterday to Dotteressa Cao-Pinna, of which I am sending you a copy.

As you can see from our memorandum of 17 March to G.5, AFHQ, port acceptance for this tonnage of approximately 15,000 tons monthly is dependant on assurance from the Italian Government that warehouse space will be made available by the Government in the Civitavecchia-Rome Area sufficient to care for approximately 6,000 tons monthly, including bulk wheat and flour.

I am sending you this letter, therefore to request that such assurance be communicated to us, so that we in turn can communicate it to G.5., AFHQ and the Transportation Subcommittee, A.C.

SUBJECT: UNRRA Shipping Program.

Further to the A.C. Tonnage Allocation Meeting presided over by Colonel Sieff, Transportation Sub-Commission, A.C., yesterday 16 March, the following is UNRRA's Shipping Program:-

1. In the light of cable from Washington to Caserta No. 103, Rome No. 174, dated 14 March, the shipping program for UNRRA has been planned by Washington to include 2 Liberty type vessels fully loaded for Naples each month, this ship to include bulk wheat, plus such filler cargo as space may permit, all from U.S.A.
2. 1 vessel carrying full cargo to Naples to load in mid-March.
3. 2 additional full vessels to load in March (probably to arrive in April).
4. 2 full vessels to load for April carrying principally bulk wheat and flour, *probably arriving in May.*
5. Thereafter, 2 vessels per month.

In order to receive these vessels, the proposed tonnage allocations for UNRRA were amended at the meeting so that 1 vessel would be acceptable in Naples and 1 in Civitavecchia each month from May onwards. This is subject to UNRRA arranging with the Italian authorities for warehouse accommodation in Rome. In addition, it is likely that other vessels may carry some UNRRA cargo to make up the balance of 15,000 tons per month that has been planned.

To summarize the above, UNRRA's shipping program will consist of 1 ship to Naples and also 1 ship to Civitavecchia, plus some additional tonnage in ships for miscellaneous ports, until further notice. G.S. and Transportation Sub-Commission A.C. will be kept informed of any alterations in this program.

1. Details of the first shipment of UNRRA supplies to Italy were given in our ten-day report for maintenance period 6 - 15 January 1945 under reference MGS/C-7 dated 31 December 1944.

2. Details of future shipments will be shown as separate appendices to the ten-day report, and it is requested that you make such information available to the UNRRA representative in ROME.

3. It is not yet clear whether consignments of UNRRA supplies are to be marked with green dots, or how they will otherwise be identified. A.C. personnel at Ports and Warehouses should be instructed to watch carefully for UNRRA items, to obviate confusion with A.C. supplies and consequent absorption into A.C. stocks.

1. Reference your letter of 29 December 1944. I am most anxious to help you by releasing Jr.Com.Fearnside as soon as possible; at the same time, this Sub-Commission is undergoing considerable reorganization, which is entailing an increase in my headquarters staff.

However, if, as we hope, this will not be the case, some of the Leghorn and Ancona tonnages may be diverted to these ports.

UNRRA is taking over the southern Italian camps of AC as of 1 January, with full supply responsibility as of 1 April. These camps are best served by the East Coast heel ports. The bulk of UNRRA's operation during April 1945 will probably still be in the Rome-Naples Area, which requires that about 40% of our total tonnage be accepted in the Naples Area. A good part of the tonnage may be sent to Civitavecchia as conditions require.

1 UNRRA's ITALIAN RELIEF PROGRAMME is directed primarily to affording medical and nutritional assistance to nursing mothers, infants and the lower age groups of school children. It is supplementary to any A.C. relief measures and should not be confused with the programme for D.P. Refugees Camps in Italy which UNRRA will assume responsibility for in due course.

2 UNRRA is anxious to start its Italian Relief programme as early as possible in November and tentative plans are to open in NAPLES and ROME.

by 1 Feb. 45, further provision will be required from indigenous stocks at a rate of approx 5,000 tons monthly.

5. It will be appreciated that UNRRA needs to have a firm commitment in respect of these supplies and it is requested that A.C. please advise this H.Q. what they can provide against requirements at para 4 above.

6. To the extent that A.C. cannot provide, the only other possible source of supply is from military stocks, but it is most unlikely that much assistance will be possible from that source in view of the heavy demands which have been made on military stocks for civil account during recent months - and which are still being made.

It is therefore emphasised that UNRRA operations Nov. thru Jan. will be limited almost entirely to the extent that A.C. can assist them, and although it may strain A.C. resources, it is desired that every effort be made to provide UNRRA supply requirements in full from A.C. resources.

7. Payment by UNRRA will be repayment in kind of all A.C. stocks loaned, but such repayment cannot be counted on before direct UNRRA shipments are flowing regularly - probably April/May at the earliest.

8. Warehousing. It is considered preferable that UNRRA should hold and control the warehousing and distribution of its supplies from the beginning of operations, and that bulk deliveries be made to them - say, a month's requirements at a time. This requires that a small warehouse or section of an A.C. warehouse be made available to them. Request that arrangements giving effect to this be negotiated direct with UNRRA reps.

9. Transportation. Earliest possible shipment from U.S. is being requested of the following UNRRA transport: 138 x $1\frac{1}{2}$ ton trucks; 25 passenger cars or weapons carriers; 25 motor cycles and 100 bicycles. Action G-5, AFHQ. 6647

Arrangements for the assembly of a/m vehicles will be advised by G-5, AFHQ in due course.

The provision of driver and mechanic personnel, and the maintenance and garaging of this transport will be the responsibility of UNRRA. Request that A.C. assist in the recruitment of Italian drivers, mechanics etc as may be required by UNRRA.

10. Pending the delivery of UNRRA trucks it is requested that A.C. assist to the extent possible with truck transport as required for UNRRA operations. As however UNRRA will be operating to a very limited extent and only within the areas of NAPLES and ROME it is anticipated that their requirements in this connection will be small.

It is therefore emphasized that UNRRA operations Nov. thru Jan. will be limited almost entirely to the extent that A.C. can assist them, and although it may strain A.C. resources, it is desired that every effort be made to provide UNRRA supply requirements in full from A.C. resources.

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10.
