SUBJECT : Slow rate of loading of tobacco on "Rimucci"
at Gallipoli.

TO : Co-Ge-Na (Italico)
Via Venturi 3 - Roma

1. Attached is copy of report from Capitano di Porto
at Gallipoli.

2. The reasons for the slow rate of loading were due
to the entire cargo not being available at the port when the
vessel arrived and the shortage of transport to move the tobacco
already in warehouse to the ship's side. 8118

3. The port of Gallipoli is not entirely satisfactory
for certain cargoes and no action should be taken to move the
200 tons bid for month of November to Venice until improved
facilities are available. Failing this, an alternative port
will have to be considered, otherwise delays will occur and
heavy demurrage charges will have to be met in order to move
these cargoes.

SUBJECT : Loading of tobacco at Gallipoli.

TO : Transportation Sub-Commission

1. Reference your AC/670/20/Tn 3 dated 22 October 45.

2. Upon urgent request of this Sub-Commission the General Management of the State Monopoly sent an Inspector by air to Gallipoli in order to investigate the reasons for the slow loading of SS "Rinucci".

3. Attached is copy of a statement from the Ufficio Circondariale Marittimo of Gallipoli dated 27 October 45 and of a statement from the State Monopoly dated 29 October 45.

4. From these you will learn that the low daily loading rates were due to insufficient local loading facilities and to the failure to allocate 30 railtrucks by the Transportation Officer of Bari. The 30 wagons would have rendered possible the raising of the daily loading rate to 100 tons. The 3 trucks sent from Rome to Gallipoli improved the situation but were insufficient to solve the problem.

5. It can be stated that the reports from the Ministry of Marine saying that the slow loading was due to lack of tobacco were not correct, as 437 tons were available on the arrival of the ship and with the 30 trucks the stock would have reached about 650 tons. 8117

6. The foregoing reveals the necessity for smaller vessels of about 500-600 tons being allocated monthly for the

transportation of tobacco, which item is urgently needed by
the tobacco factories located in the North.

D'Ambrosio questi, ha fatto presente che non è stato possibile aumentare il numero dei carretti dato che i proprietari preferiscono l'ingaggio per trasporto vino in quanto più remunerativo. Una requisizione di tali mezzi sarebbe stata praticamente impossibile.
- 3° I vagoni ^{che} erano attesi, in numero di 30, da Lecce cosa che avrebbe risolto il problema della caricazione, non sono giunti tranne due carri arrivati il 26 corrente quando il carico era pressoché ultimato.

All'arrivo del P.fo "Rinucci" erano pronte a Gallipoli Tonn. 437 di tabacco.

La capacità di estrazione di quel Magazzino è normalmente di Tonn. 70 dato che il trasporto dal magazzino stesso a banchina può essere effettuato, sia per l'ubicazione dei locali, sia per l'impossibilità di adoperare automezzi, soltanto con carretti. Ma nelle attuali circostanze quel Magazzino non è riuscito ad ingaggiare un numero di carretti sufficiente per raggiungere il suddetto quantitativo poichè i proprietari hanno interesse di utilizzarli per trasporti del vino di produzione locale di gran lunga più remunerativi.

In previsione di ciò la Manifattura Tabacchi di Lecce, che amministra il suaccennato Magazzino, aveva preso precisi accordi con il Comando Alleato di Bari affinchè alla partenza del "Rinucci" da Palermo fossero assegnati a Lecce 30 vagoni di tubacchi coi quali la caricazione avrebbe raggiunto agevolmente la rata di 100 Tonn. al giorno. 811

Malgrado le continue pressanti insistenze della Manifattura e le assicurazioni date i vagoni non furono concessi, tranne due giunti a Gallipoli sul binario raccordato con la banchina il giorno 26 corr., quando l'imbarco era pressochè ultimato.

Il lavoro di trasporto dal Magazzino a banchina fu anticipato e posticipato rispetto all'orario normale di lavoro. Per quanto riguarda il lavoro notturno occorre tener presente che il porto è sprovvisto di luce e che la nave non aveva la possibilità di fornire l'energia di cui essa dispone perché non adatta al voltaggio delle lampade che la Manifattura avrebbe potuto fornire.

In ogni modo il lavoro dopo il tramonto (massimo 17,30) è stato, come si è detto, spinto al massimo sebbene si siano verificati tre incidenti di una certa gravità durante l'esecuzione delle operazioni di imbarco svoltesi al buio.

E' anche da tener presente che, per mancanza di involture, le ballette di tabacco debbono essere maneggiate con la massima cautela ad evitare dispersioni.

Il mancato arrivo dei 30 vagoni richiesti + giusta come dichiara la Capitaneria di Porto di Gallipoli - non ha consentito una caricazione corrispondente al programma già fissato da questa Amministrazione; tuttavia il giorno 21 fu disposto l'invio da Roma a Lecce di tre autotreni coi quali è stato possibile fornire altre 85 Tonn. circa di tabacco direttamente sottobordo.

A Lecce non si trovano automezzi da adibire a tali trasporti.

Comunque la nave non ha potuto negli ultimi giorni raggiungere la rata giornaliera di 100 Tonn. dato che le prime tre stive erano ormai già complete.

La capacità della nave ha consentito di caricare Tonn. 538,787. I tabacchi disponibili a Gallipoli hanno raggiunto il quantitativo complessivo di Tonn. 600 circa.

Si unisce la chiesta dichiarazione della Capitaneria di Porto di Gallipoli.

It is not expected that the vessel worked on Sunday, 21 Oct.

2. This vessel was allocated for 200 tons of tobacco and this rate of loading is not accepted. Please investigate the reasons for this, since, even allowing for the bulk of the cargo, at least 180 tons should be loaded daily. Unless there is an immediate improvement the vessel will have to be sailed light or given another suitable cargo.

3. A bid has been received for 200 tons of tobacco from Callipoli to Venice for November. Unless an assurance can be given of quicker loading this bid will have to be cancelled, as the United Maritime Authority would not accept such a delay to shipping.

left Gallipoli the 18th of April.


Having shipped the mentioned quantities of tobacco,

This tobacco is in the charge of the Italian Monopoly Agency at PLOVDIV. (Azienda Tabacchi Italiana-Agenzia d'Oriente del monopolio Italiano).

A portion of the tobacco is to be sold on the spot to defray all expenses. It is desired to bring the balance to Italy.

2. This is a preliminary inquiry to ascertain whether shipping space could be allotted for shipment of approximately 600 m. tons deadweight from either Salonic or Cavaillia to any port on the Italian mainland.
3. A formal bid cannot be put in until replies are received to enquiries now being made through diplomatic channels (Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Minister in Sofia) to ascertain precise information as to the gross weight, number and type of packages, port of loading and the date on which the tobacco can be assembled ready for shipment.
4. The Italian State Tobacco Monopoly produces a very substantial portion of the State Revenue. There is a serious shortage of raw leaf tobacco in Italy and a complete lack of the oriental types held in the Balkans. If the latter can be brought here the revenue would gain appreciably and the present acute shortage of cigarettes, which has resulted in a strong black market in Allied cigarettes, would be somewhat relieved.
5. The freight would be charged against the Italian Government.

This tobacco is in the charge of the Italian Monopoly Agency at PIODIV. (Azienda Tabacchi Italiana-Agenzia d'Oriente del Monopolio Italiano).

A portion of the tobacco is to be sold on the spot to defray all expenses. It is desired to bring the balance to Italy.

2. This is a preliminary inquiry to ascertain whether shipping space could be allotted for shipment of approximately 600 m. tons deadweight from either Salonic or Cavailla to any port on the Italian mainland.

3. A formal bid cannot be put in until replies are received to enquiries now being made through diplomatic channels (Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Minister in Sofia) to ascertain precise information as to the gross weight, number and type of packages, port of loading and the date on which the tobacco can be assembled ready for shipment.

4. The Italian State Tobacco Monopoly produces a very substantial portion of the State Revenue. There is a serious shortage of raw leaf tobacco in Italy and a complete lack of the oriental types held in the Balkans. If the latter can be brought here the revenue would gain appreciably and the present acute shortage of cigarettes, which has resulted in a strong black market in Allied cigarettes, would be somewhat relieved.

5. The freight would be charged against the Italian Government.
6. Correspondence relating to this matter is attached for information. It is pointed out that there is now no question of the use of existing Italian foreign assets as all expenses arising in Bulgaria and Greece will be met by the local sale of a portion of the tobacco. The only question for allied decision is that of the allocation of shipping space.

TOBACCO. On 4th Dec. Commerce S/C (Tobacco Div.) asked about the position of their bids, and were informed after telephoning Naples that the quantity bidden for on 22nd Nov., the date on which we received the bids and on which the bids were sent to Naples, was too much for the schooners according to Capt. Smith, and that the bids would have to go through AFHQ and it would take a month at least. The bids were accepted for the period 27 Dec.- 5 Jany.

It was arranged that Commerce S/C should put in an emergency bid Gallipoli to Palermo, to keep going till the larger quantities could arrive. The bid, dated 6th Dec. was put in unsigned; it was returned, and finally given back to us on 7 Dec., on which day it was sent to Naples with a covering letter indicating the emergency. We telephoned to Capt. Smith this morning, Thursday 14 Dec. and he tells us that he received the bid only yesterday Wednesday, 13th. Dec.

He has no schooners available, and anyhow it will take four or five small schooners to lift the tobacco. As soon as he has a schooner in position he will give absolute precedence to the tobacco co.

Capt. Smith desires to remind the Tobacco Div. about two months ago a schooner went to Gallipoli and found no tobacco.

TO: Transportation S/C Shipping Division
(Attn.: Mr. Crooks).

1. The Note of Transportation S/C, Shipping Division of 14/12/44 refers.

2. As the quantities bid on 22 Sept. were considered too large for available schooner capacity, it would have been reasonable to reduce the quantities to the half or even to less, instead of rejecting them at all.

3. Prior to 22 Sept., and exactly on 28 Sept., Monopoly requested shipment of following quantities during October:

from Naples to Cagliari 50 tons
" Gallipoli to Palermo 30 "
" " " Catania 60 "

8.93

Not one of these bids has been accepted.

4. The postponement of shipments to the period 27 December - 4 Jan. - the accepted quantities are thus far unknown by Commerce S/C - may result in the Palermo and Catania factories being obliged to cease work.

5. The emergency bid of 6 Dec. has been forwarded to Transportation S/C on 7 December and not on 10 December (see letter AC/5136/Commerce of 7 Dec.)

6. It is not understood why the schooner concerned did not find tobacco at Gallipoli for loading. Commerce S/C was not informed to this effect, but only that the master could not find the warehouse at Gallipoli. These two facts should not be confused.
