1. Bids for port capacity for August and amended bids for July were submitted to the AFHQ Tonnage Allocation Meeting held on 26 April.

Accepted July file

2. Port capacities allotted to civilian supplies for July remain as given at Appendix "A" to this HQ letter G-2 dated 24 March except as follows:-

- ✓ (a) NAPLES. Reduced to 28,000 tons in view of the fact that dried vegetables for the South and meat, meat substitutes and milk for the whole of ITALY are not being shipped for July arrival.
- ✓ (b) INCHON. Capacity is now increased to 19,500 tons.
- ✓ (c) GENOA. Additional bids not accepted and in view of decision to plan on 4,000 tpd only for July the capacity allotted to civil supplies remains at 61,500 tons. If extra capacity becomes available endeavour will be made to add an extra cereal ship to this total, failing which capacity would have to be found at the expense of other miscellaneous food items.
- ✓ (d) TRIESTE. Bid of 12,000 tons accepted.
- ✓ (e) ANCONA. Capacity allotted increased to 24,000 tons.

3. Total allocations by ports for August are as shown at Appendix "A" to this letter. It will be observed that in general these tonnages are sufficient to cover all your bids with the exception of certain cases where bids for SAVONA and FIUME were cut out and the total allotted ANCONA does not completely cover your requests for capacity for this port and ports further North. It is pointed out, however, that the subsistence programme has yet to be approved by WASHINGTON and that the tonnages reserved for some items, particularly dried vegetables, and milk, are higher than those which will actually arrive.

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4. There is no advantage, therefore, in preparing the usual detailed breakdown of civil port capacity by commodities in that the figures contained in your AG/587/13/Tn 3 of 20 April give all the necessary detail for the purpose of calling forward the various items as and when they are approved.
