SUBJECT : Long Term Tonnage Allocation

TO Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394
(Attn: Transportation Sub-Commission)

1. At the September Long Term meeting held at AFHQ on 24 May certain alterations were made to the bids previously accepted for July and August and allocations for port capacity were made for September.

2. In order to clarify the position there is attached at Appendix A a schedule showing total capacities allotted for civil supplies for the three months in question. It is not considered necessary to reallocate individual commodities to ports.

3. It was decided that the needs of redeployment would considerably restrict the capacity available to other uses at Leghorn, Naples and in the Heel and the following adjustments were made:-

a. Leghorn. Civil bids transferred to Piombino, an undertaking being given that sufficient rail tonnage would be made available for movement of goods further north.

b. Naples. Part of civil bid transferred to Satellite ports in September.

c. Heel Ports. In view of the decision that from 1 July 1945 Ancona is to be closed for all imports except civil account, it was necessary to transfer to the Heel a certain army tonnage. This required a small reduction in civil bids in the Heel but this should cause no difficulty.

2. Col. Sieff stated that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the September Tonnage Allocation and to review June, July and August allocations in the light of information to be given by Major Carver.

3. Major Carver stated that June tonnage allocations would remain unchanged, but that increased capacities would be available in Northern ports for July and August.

4. Col. Sieff asked if any Sub-Commission wished to amend their July and August bids.

(a) July

Food Sub-Commission stated that they wished to submit a bid for 20,000 tons intra and extra Med. foodstuffs for Venice. Industry Sub-Commission stated at this juncture that a large proportion of bids for phosphates already submitted probably have to be cancelled, as it was understood that Combined Chiefs of Staff Washington had allocated only 8,200 tons phosphates per month for the period July/December '45 to Italian Industry.

2. Col. Sieff stated that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss the September Tonnage Allocation and to review June, July and August allocations in the light of information to be given by Major Carver.

3. Major Carver stated that June tonnage allocations would remain unchanged, but that increased capacities would be available in Northern ports for July and August.

4. Col. Sieff asked if any Sub-Commission wished to amend their July and August bids.

(a) July

Food Sub-Commission stated that they wished to submit a bid for 20,000 tons intra and extra Med. foodstuffs for Venice. Industry Sub-Commission states that this juncture that a large proportion of bids for phosphates already submitted probably have to be cancelled, as it was understood that Combined Chiefs of Staff Washington had allocated only 2,200 tons phosphates per month for the period July/September '45 to Italian Industry, whereas bids for July, August and September had been based on requirements for Northern Ports being 232,000 tons for 7 months from VL day, and 220,000 tons for Liberated Italy to the end of year. Industry Sub-Commission promised to clarify the position as soon as possible.

(b) August

Action Industry S/C

U.N.R.R.A. requested that one U.N.R.R.A. ship be

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diverted to a Northern Port instead of Civitavecchia as bid for. No difficulty foreseen. Food Sub-Commission stated that they wished to confirm that the required distribution of 12,000 tons food bid for Ports North of Ancona was 1/6 Trieste, 5/6 Venice.

5. Colonel Sieff then reviewed the September bids. Major Carver stated that tonnages submitted attached Appendix 'A' would be accepted with the possible exception of Trieste. Food Sub-Commission Representative agreed that food bid for Trieste could be taken through Venice should that prove necessary. Col. Sieff stated that it was reported that the port of Savona was in good condition and should be capable of accepting all tonnage required for local distribution, when opened.
6. Colonel Sieff. stated that as future port capacities were likely to be in excess of demands, meetings would not be required to be held in future. Any problems arising would be dealt with by direct communication with Sub-Commissions concerned by Transportation Sub-Commission.
