PROGRAM OF BASIC SUPPLIES FOR ITALY
(September - December Loadings)

8 August 1945

The program summarized in the following pages is designed to initiate action in maintaining the flow of basic civilian supplies to Italy. The U.S. share is to be financed from the \$100,000,000 fund earmarked out of the 1946 Lend-Lease Appropriation for procurement of supplies to be transferred to the War Department and sent to Italy. The program is subject to revision in the light of further advice from the Allied Commission and the supply authorities.

4. (Cont'd.) Latest information indicates that 40,000 metric tons of coal which were expected to be supplied from the Area coal mines will not be available. (U. S. Embassy, Rome - 2092 July 25, 1945) The Italian import requirements may well have to be increased by 40,000 tons per month.
5. At least 1000 tons of extracite per month are essential for the manufacture of Soderberg paste for electrodes. More, if available, would be used for household heating in Northern Italy.
6. Pending actual allocation by type of the U. S. share, the average price of \$6.00 per metric ton is being used.
7. Requisition on the IT series for the U. S. share are being forwarded to the procurement agency.

- (1) Wheat. This monthly total program is based on an annual import requirement of some 1,700,000 metric tons of bread grains. The Allied Commission has been requested to explain the contradictory figure of 936,000 tons mentioned in MOC 253.
- (2) Sugar. The Office of Food Program requested the Combined Boards and the Agriculture to allocate only the amount needed for October loading, pending receipt of more precise statements on the Italian sugar production. It is expected however that the October figure will have to be increased since the estimated production (amounting to 40 or 50,000 metric tons) added to the above monthly import extended over one year would allow much less than the 50-55% of pre-war consumption, which is the accepted basis for allocation to liberated areas. The Allied Commission in cable MOC 253, 28 July 1945, has already indicated a monthly import requirement of 10,836 tons. Moreover, in MOC Airgram 77, 25,000 tons of sugar for food conservation have been requested. The consideration of this requirement has been postponed pending receipt of the full justification requested.
- (3) Fats. The indicated quantities are those for which request for allocation was made to the Combined Food Boards. At present, only 2000 tons are expected to be supplied ex U. S. during the fourth quarter. SUBJECT : October Shipment of Pyrites , Salt.

1. Enclosed is shipping program for October for wheat, salt and non-rationed foods.

2. Common wine has not been included in the program because a program for the movement of 90,000 tons of common wine in the two months period September and October was submitted to you some time ago. Most of the Sicilian wine in this program was to be moved by schooner in September. That part of the Sicilian common wine included in the 90,000 program which is not moved in September should be given priority for movement in October; i.e. it should have the same status as though it were included in the October program now submitted.

3. We have agreed that the Ministry of Food should include some special wines in the October program because certain parts of Sicily (Trapani Province) are economically dependent upon the production of special wines. The movement of the common wine in the 90,000 ton program, however, should take precedence over the movement of the special wines in the October program.

4. Please advise us whether the October program is accepted as submitted or whether and in what manner you have changed it. Information on changes is necessary for the Ministry of Food.

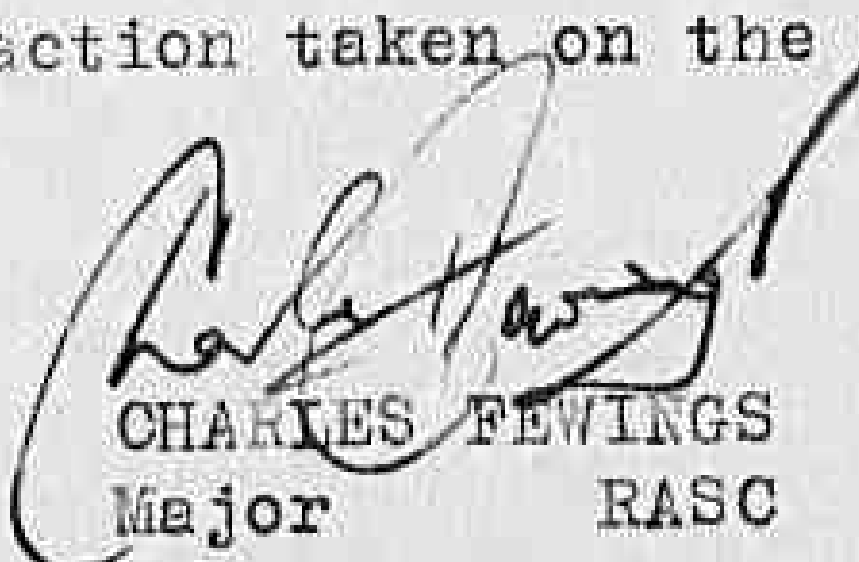
