SUBJECT: Wheat import program for December loadings

TO : Federconsorzi, Sezione Distribuzione Cereali,
Farina e Pasta.

1. Please refer to your letter dated 22 Nov 45 including a schedule of your maximum ability to receive wheat and proposing a distribution for 298000 tons to be loaded in December and to arrive in January.

2. We have been advised that December loadings will amount to about 43 ships or about 344000 tons. The above tonnage will probably be received in the latter part of December and in January. We show below a distribution of the tonnage among the various ports which represents approximately how the tonnage will be handled. The program for handling the tonnage may, of course, be altered through diversions.

3. These tonnages are proposed in view of known priorities, and every effort will have to be made to ship these commodities during this month, in order to avoid a backlog for the month.

4. Where there is no likelihood of bids received being shipped, the interested Ministry should be informed. This is necessary, as bids not fulfilled cannot be carried forward into January.

5. The urgent need for a Committee, to establish ³⁷⁰ priorities for all shipments requested, is again emphasized. When bids submitted are far in excess of shipping available, it is futile for large tonnages to be forwarded for shipping allocation to UMA when it is obvious the programme cannot be carried out.

6. As regards the bids for the month of January, these will be considered when the Representative of UMA comes to Rome on Monday, 17 December. A considered opinion of the total tonnage which can be shipped during January will then be given

./.

and it will be necessary for bids to be submitted which do not exceed the estimated total. Alternatively the bids should be grouped to indicate priorities. It is suggested that the programme should be given three priorities for the guidance of the shipping authorities who will allocate the ships needed.

They are : -

- First priority : essential commodities which must be shipped during the month.
- Second priority : cargoes which will be moved if shipping is available and after completion of all bids given first priority.
- Third priority : remaining cargoes; if not shipped, bids will be automatically cancelled at the end of the month.

7. If all bids are so divided, the task of USA will be simplified when arranging for shipping or endeavouring to provide additional shipping. Further, essential commodities will be given shipping in preference to all other bids.

2. It is understood this signal indicates that the November grain programme will total 170,000 tons. It also states that it is proposed to load 41 ships in December with a list of 365,000 tons. These cargoes will be bulk ones and in addition several cargoes will be loaded in the River Plate.

3. The possibility of these cargoes being cleared through Italian ports is now being gone into.

4. It is requested that you give immediate consideration to the provision of bays in all ports likely to receive cargoes of bulk grain, and to the question of warehouse accommodation. 1. Information has been received from Washington that it is proposed to load 43 ships in USA ports in December with bulk grain. This will mean a total of 355,000 tons of bulk grain. In addition it is expected several wheat cargoes will be loaded in the River Plate, assuming loading commences during the first days of the month, vessels should arrive in Italian ports from the latter part of December onwards.

2. The choice of ports and the possibility of accepting this grain programme in full is now being considered. Owing, however, to the heavy tonnages of coal for the same month (700,000 tons is planned) clearance by rail is bound to present a problem.

3. It is certain that bids made for port tonnage allocations for December and January, which have already been submitted to Import Programming & Port Reception Committee, will have to be amended in view of the information just received.

To this total should be added 24,000 tons of phosphate rock required from Sfax; this bid has just been accepted and is the tonnage required during the current month, but it clearly cannot be moved until December. The grand total is therefore 204,240 tons.

2. Due to a variety of reasons, including ships being delayed or unavailable on account of repairs, the programme for October will be carried out almost in full, but deliveries will be late. 3. A further difficulty is the recent order regarding degaussing and wiping of vessels engaged on this programme. This is likely to reduce the lifting capacity of the vessels at present allocated for Coastwise-trade, as there may be considerable loss of time, we understand, while this operation is being carried out.

4. The need for reducing bids made is therefore important. As regards the month of November, all bids already accepted should be carefully examined and if reductions are possible, they should be carried into effect 31st Oct

Reference Co-go-ns letter 6114 of 14 November in which total cargoes of 100,240 tons for shipment during the month of December are given in details. To this total should be added 24,000 tons of phosphate rock required from Alex; this bid has just been accepted and is the tonnage required during the current month, but it clearly cannot be moved until December. The need for reducing bids made is therefore important. As regards the month of November, all bids already accepted should be carefully examined and if reductions are possible they should be carried into effect without delay. Due regard must, however, be paid to priorities for essential commodities and urgent shipments.

The Coasters and Schooners must be used as efficiently and as economically as possible and vessels must be turned round expeditiously. There must be no wastage of the available shipping and Italian port authorities should be instructed to avoid delays wherever possible.

The bids for December will need to be cut to a level which the shipping which can be allocated will be able to lift in the time available, bearing in mind that the programme for November will continue into the middle of December. There is no immediate prospect of additional shipping being available to U.S.A..

10. Your views on this suggestion are awaited. Any possibility of increased movement by rail to relieve coastwise shipping during the coming weeks should be investigated. It is requested that modified tonnage bids should be prepared and sent to United Maritime Authority, who will give a ratio consideration to your amended requirements. It might also be useful if priorities were established for bids submitted each month. This would enable U.M.A., when allocating ships, to ensure early delivery of the more urgent cargoes. Certain

commodities must have a higher priority and if these are shown at the outset they can be dealt with in the order shown by you.

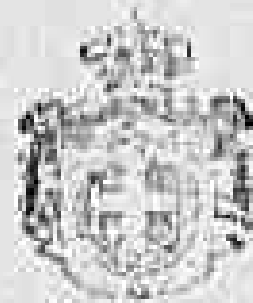

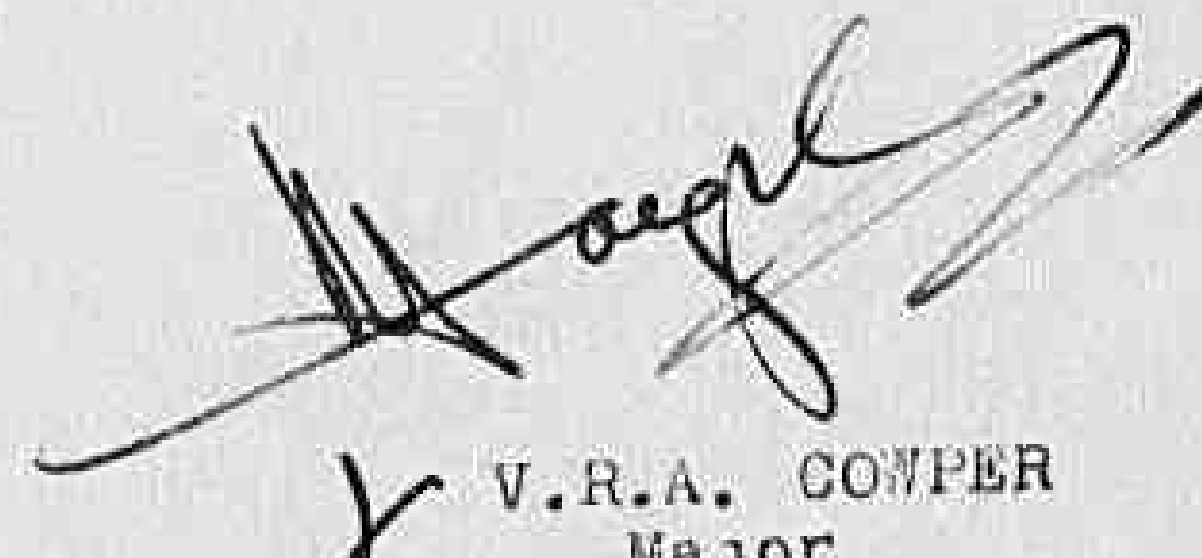

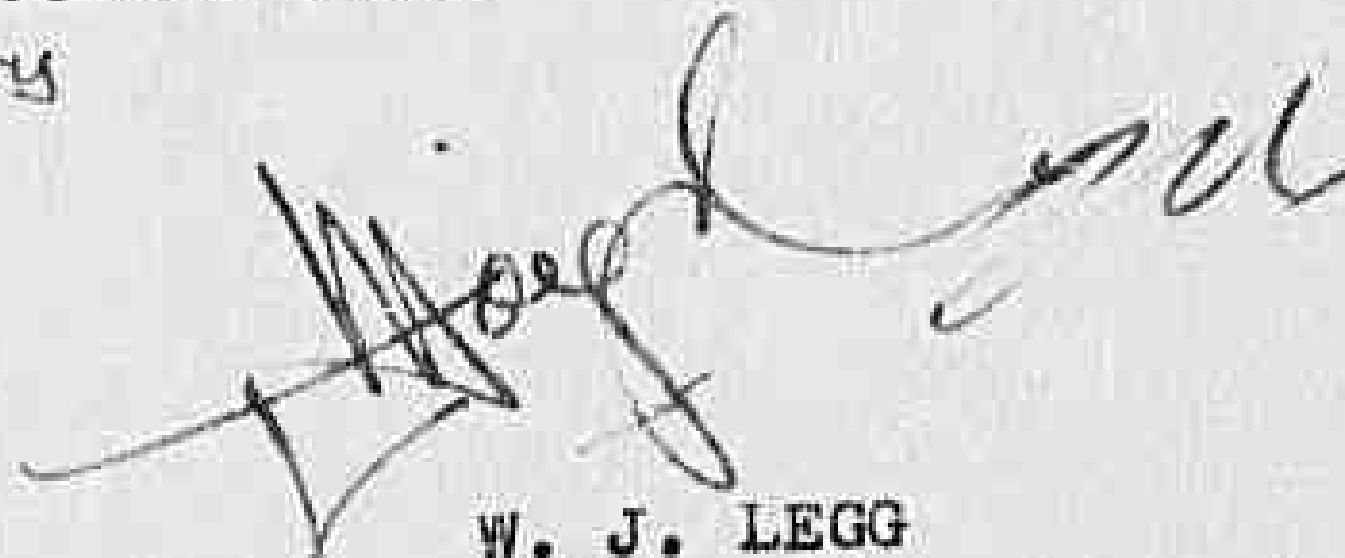
