Subject : Transport by Coastwise Shipping of Civilian cargo in the month of January 1946.

1. As it is known to the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, the insufficient tonnage at disposal of coastwise shipping renders impossible the movements of cargo as scheduled, and brings about cuts and delays in the movements in consequence to the difference between the huge amount of requests and the scarce tonnage at disposal.
2. This Ministry, upon request of the Allied Commission, has many times exposed the a/m situation to the Presidency of the Consiglio dei Ministri, prospecting the need of creating a Commission to coordinate the means at disposal with the requests for transportation, make the necessary cuts, and grant priorities in relation to the present needs of the Nation.
3. In the meantime the Allied Commission, in agreement with the United Maritime Authority, has provided, concerning the movements for the coming month of January, to issue instructions with letter addressed to this Ministry dated 20 Dec.
4. We attach copy of the a/m letter and for greater evidence point out the following:

- a - All the bids in schedul for December and preceding months, that have not taken place by the end of December, must be considered cancelled.
- b - Having examined the situation of the Transportation means available it has been found necessary to limit the bids for the month of January 1946 at the maximum following tonnage:

8. It should be noted that certain cargoes have been reduced in ports where loading is likely to be hindered due to weather conditions or the size of the port. This policy is dictated by the need to utilize the available ships to the maximum and delays to shipping must be avoided.

9. As regards the shipping programme for December, as it will be impracticable to carry forward any bids not fulfilled, it must be clearly understood that if shipment has not been possible the bid will be considered as cancelled. Every effort is being made to complete as much of the December programme as possible and most of the bids should be completed in part or in full.

SUBJECT :- Salt shipments from Trapani.

TO :- COMNA - Via Cestari Rome.

1. It is noticed that the proposed shipments for January made by State monopoly include 3000 tons from Trapani to Civitavecchia & Castellammare. Before these bids are accepted it will be necessary for a satisfactory assurance to be given that a reasonable rate of loading can be carried out in this port, and the cargo must be ready for shipment.

2. The experience gained from recent delays to the "Arsia" point to this necessity. Therefore it is recommended that shipments from Trapani, except for schooners, should be on a reduced scale.

3. The trend within recent months is for bids far in excess of shipping availabilities to be made convenient and quick loading ports should be used whenever possible and always in preference to ports where ships have been delayed.

SUBJECT: January Loadings of Supplies for Italy

TO : Chief Commissioner

1. This will confirm what I have already told you orally with regard to January loadings for supplies for Italy.

2. In a phone conversation on Friday, 7 December 1945, Mr. E. E. Hunt (Chief of the Italian Division of Office of Foreign Liquidation, U. S. State Department) gave me the following information:

(a) The 550-million-dollar appropriation has not yet gone through, but it is hoped that it will be law by next Tuesday, 12 December.

(b) The appropriation of the additional one per cent for UNRRA has gone through the House, but the general expectation is that it will not clear the Senate before the Christmas recess, now scheduled for 20 December.

(c) UNRRA Washington has agreed to assume responsibility for the January loadings of supplies for Italy. This is definite, and no longer contingent upon the passage of the one per cent appropriation before the end of the year.

(d) January loadings will, however, be limited as here indicated in paragraph 3. below.

(e) Loadings of supplies in February are still, of course, contingent upon the action on the one per cent appropriation.

(f) Generally speaking, we had better consider the matter in terms of January and February being pretty bad months from the standpoint of loadings for civilian supplies for Italy.

3. While UNRRA is now responsible for January loadings, those loadings will not meet the quantities set forth in MOC 383. It is expected that UNRRA will send coal, POL, wheat and such miscellaneous supplies as have already been secured and can be spared from other programs. The amounts of basic supplies which were mentioned, but which are still tentative allocations, were the following:

1. Demands for loadings for VENICE and TRIESTE and tonnage allocations acceptable by HQ LF GREECE at ports in GREECE for the maintenance period 1 - 30 JAN 46 are set out in Appendices A, B, C and D attached.

2. Firm bids by ports against tonnages should be submitted on the appropriate specimen proforma attached at Appendices E & F by Main Users to G-4(Mov & Tn) and by British Services to Q(Maint), not later than 1800 hours 5 Dec 45. 1. Information has been received from Washington that it is proposed to load 43 ships in USA ports in December with bulk grain. This will mean a total of 165,000 tons of bulk grain. In addition it is expected several wheat cargoes will be loaded in the River Plate, assuming loading commences during the first days of the month, vessels should arrive in Italian ports from the latter part of December onwards.

2. The choice of ports and the possibility of accepting this grain programme in full is now being considered. Owing, however, to the heavy tonnages of coal for the same month (700,000 tons is planned) clearance by rail is bound to present a problem.

3. It is certain that bids made for port tonnage allocations for December and January, which have already been submitted to Import Programming & Port Reception Committee, will have to be amended in view of the information just received.
