TO : Transportation Sub-Commission

1. Reference your AC/587/42/Tn 3 of 3 September 1945.
2. Based on requisitions placed, our original estimated tonnage from extra-Mediterranean sources for the month of February called for a total of 2,355 metric tons to A.L.O.L., 4,170 metric tons to D.U.K.O. and 4,733 metric tons to U.R.I.F. However, inasmuch as none of the requisitions for agricultural requirements has been confirmed to date, it is impossible at this time to state a definite tonnage from extra-Mediterranean sources for February 1946.
3. Intra-Mediterranean tonnages for February will be composed largely of sulphur cargo. A yearly program of sulphur movements is presently being developed and will be forwarded to you upon completion. The preliminary destinations would involve a total of 3,000 to 4,000 tons of sulphur to move during the month of February.
