Subject : Inspection of Sicilian Railways and Issuance of Travel Orders.

1. At meeting held at HQ. Transportation Sub-Commission, ACC today there were present General di Reimondo, Undersecretary of State and Ing.Dr. Tuccio, Capo Compartimento of Sicilian railways as well as officers of this Sub-Commission.

2. Decision was reached that it would be highly desirable that field inspection be made of principal portions of Sicilian railways by General di Reimondo, Deputy Director, Lieut-Colonel C.G. Brown (A) 0529611, and Mechanical Engineer, Major S.L. Baister (B) 33318, to determine present condition and formulate plan for future rehabilitation work. In Sicily party would be accompanied by Lieut-Colonel O.H. Lindberg (B) 43443, Captains C.M. Long (A) 0350502 and P.C. Matson (A) 0516750, as well as representatives of the railways. Travel will normally be by diesel rail car, when on railway lines in Sicily.

3. It is desired that Gen. di Reimondo, Lieut-Colonel Brown and Major Baister, go to and return from Palermo by air. Journey to commence on or about 21 May and to require approximately 10 days. No rations can be carried by air but it is desired that rations for 5 ACC officers for seven days be issued, to be placed on the diesel car, which will normally form quarters for party while on rail lines.

4. It is felt that proposed inspection is highly desirable in order that an accurate picture of Sicilian railway situation may be had and determination made of supply and equipment which must be requested from abroad, at an early date.

5. Because of complexity of arrangements resort is not being had to usual form request for travel orders. However, it is requested that, in receipt of this letter, necessary orders be issued and plane accommodations arranged in order that this Sub-Commission may advise General di Reimondo.

SUBJECT : Report on Bufola Plant - Naples.

1. Reference your letter 27 April 1944, ACC/5076/1C.

2. The most comprehensive report of Captains Mydens and Elliott was very useful. Some information already duplicated on that known to D.G.M.R.S. whose forces already occupy part of plant. Notations of stocks of raw materials were particularly helpful to this Sub-Commission, which will investigate possibility of obtaining some much needed materials for Sicilian railways.

3. In report, under "General Information", para 4, refers to 7 completed and 12 partially completed threshing machines. Realising potential need of such machines, D.G.M.R.S. has made notation, from which is paraphrased - the Director General has no objection to allocating portion of shop to ACC for placing machines in production - however it will necessarily be on smaller scale than prior to Allied occupation and it will be necessary that mechanics or other labour necessary be recruited by ACC as there are not sufficient workmen available in railway side of shop to present any transfers.

4. Transportation Sub-Commission realises potential need of farm machinery and will be ready to co-operate in any liaison with Military Railway Service which may appear desirable. However, as D.G.M.R.S. states, Bufola Plant has a potential capacity greater than is being produced at present time but production cannot be increased due to lack of available manpower. The manpower now available is at present fully occupied by Military Railways and will be required until Allied Armies release control of railroad.

5. Will you please advise this Sub-Commission your further ~~WFO2500~~ in connection with Bufola plant?

1. The Buffalo Plant of Sta' Industrie Mechaniche Meridonale, Naples, is being used by the Mil Ry Serv for a freight and passenger car repair shop and for the manufacture of certain railway car parts and other materials, forgings and castings, for other branches of the Allied Armies. The Plant has a potential capacity greater than is being produced at the present time but production cannot be increased due to the lack of available manpower. The manpower now available is, at the present time, fully occupied in the production above referred to and it is expected that the necessity for the continued operation by the Mil Ry Serv will be required until such time as the Allied Armies release control of the railroads.

2. With reference to Par. 3 of your letter, regarding stocks of raw materials. If you will arrange to present to this Headquarters a list of requirements of ferrous products in Sicily, we will arrange to have the list checked against the quantities on hand and will release for use by the Sicilian Railways whatever portion, if any, that can be spared.

3. Report received with your letter makes reference to the Buffalo Plant having previously manufactured farm machinery. There are several farm machines partially finished in the shop at the present time, and, if necessity for this type of farm machinery is now present, the Director General has no objections to allocating a portion of the Buffalo Shop to you to be used for placing into production this type of machine; however, it should be understood that it will, of necessity, be on a smaller scale than it was prior to Allied occupation. Also, it will be necessary that the mechanics and other labor required for the manufacture of these machines will have to be recruited by you, as it is not possible, nor are there sufficient workmen at present employed under the jurisdiction of the Mil Ry Serv, to take over any additional work.

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

REPORT ON THE STA. IN INDUSTRIE MECCANICHE MERTIGONALI -  
BUFOLA PLANT - NAPLES.

SUBMITTED BY: - CAPT. W. E. MYDANS & CAPT. T. G. ELLIOTT

DATE:- 21 APRIL 1944

GENERAL: The above plant was visited. It is a self contained works for the construction and repair of railway coaches and trucks and is part of the EREDA Group. The Capacity was given to us as 200/300 wagons repaired per month.

The original number employed was in the region of 600 hands, the present number employed is 380. The area of the plant is 38,000 square metres of which 24,275 are covered.

The plant has not suffered any serious or irreparable damage from either aerial bombing or demolition by the Germans. A considerable quantity of the roof covering has been stripped by bomb-blast, but the main structures of the buildings are intact.

The plant, which is, generally speaking, old and out of date has also escaped serious damage but is capable of a considerable amount of useful work. Large stocks of raw materials in the form of steel beams, angles, channels, flats, plates, and bars are available on the premises. Overhead cranes are in position and workable. This is one of the least damaged of the industrial plants, so far seen by these inspecting officers.

PLANT DETAILS: FORGE:

The forge is at present working, making, rivets and small forgings for railway work. The plant in this department is varied in its range and consists of:-

- a) 8 - Friction Screw Presses
- b) 2 - Air Drop Hammers
- c) 2 - Trimming Machines
- d) 2 - Power Driven Crank Presses
- e) 1 - 500 Kg. Air Hammer
- f) 5 - Smaller Air Hammers
- g) 1 - Hydraulic Forging Press
- h) 2 - Acme Type Upsetting Machines.

The equipment in this shop whilst old and out of date, is capable of producing a wide range of small and medium sized forgings.

MACHINE SHOP:

This shop contains a wide assortment of machines, i.e. Milling Machines, centre lathes (large and small), radial drills, grinding machines, wheel and axle lathes. Most of the plant is old, but one or two new tools were noticed. This plant is at present working on general machining work in connection with replacement parts for wagon repairs. Attached to this shop is a carpenters and woodworking plant fairly well equipped with machines and able to handle woodworking of any kind for the railway side.

WAGON MOUNTING SHOP:

This Plant consisted of

- 2 -

- a) Plate Bending Rolls
- b) Flattening Rolls
- c) A Large Bending Press.

together with multiple plate drilling machines, and the necessary overhead lifting cranes to handle the erection of the vehicles, and other ancillary equipment.

It was a large shop consisting of some 5 bays each with an overhead crane and is at present engaged on repair work for the Italian State Railways and on the erection and assembly of railway cars for imported American parts. This work was under the supervision of an American N.C.C., and it was understood from him that the output had now reached 5 wagons per day. The plant was also producing a number of large welded gasoline tanks, and appeared reasonably well equipped to undertake sheet metal work of this type.

#### SHELL MACHINING PLANT:

Also sit in the works, there is a fairly large and well laid out shell machining plant for the production of 105 m/m shells. It was noticed that most of the machine tools were of "Breda" manufacture and except for corrosion, was undamaged and could easily be put to work, if it is so desired. The output was given to us as 600 shells per day.

Large quantities of shell forgings and some finished machined shells were stacked up in this shop. The plant was modern and up to date. This building had suffered damage by bombing but the plant was intact, it was, however, suffering damage by corrosion and exposure to the elements and if possible this equipment should be stored under cover to prevent further deterioration.

#### GENERAL INFORMATION:

(1) This is a self contained plant for the production and assembly of railway cars and trucks.

(2) It is at present doing useful work for the Allied Cause on wagon repair and erection.

(3) This work could be expanded if more labour could be obtained.

(4) It was noticed on the tour of the plant that there were 7 completed "Threshing Machines", and about 12 others in varying stages of completion. It was understood that work had been stopped on these machines and the labour diverted to the railway side. These machines will no doubt be of use to the Agriculture Sub-Commission and have been reported to them.

(5) This plant would be able to construct agricultural machinery in addition to their ordinary work.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS & CONCLUSIONS:

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(1) It is considered that the useful work now being done by this plant could be expanded by the provision of more labour.

- 3 -

(2) This plant has experience in the construction of agricultural machinery and might with advantage, be encouraged to expand this part of their organization.

(3) Any shortages of plant or equipment could most probably be obtained from the firm's Vasto Plant which has now been requisitioned by the U.S.A.F. and used as a store. None of the plant at Vasto is being used.

(4) The Bufola Plant is recommended for:-

- a) Repair to railway rolling stock.
- b) Erection of railway wagons from imported parts.
- c) Production of agricultural machinery.
- d) Sheet Metal work, etc.

(5) It was understood from the American N.C.O. that the main difficulty in obtaining labour was the low rates of pay (max. 7½ lire per hour) and the small amount of food provided for the workers. Better pay and conditions could be obtained in work at the docks.

(6) This is a plant well able and in good position to do work for Military and Civilian requirements. The plant is reasonably intact, the technical direction is available and it is strongly urged that all efforts are made to expand this firm's activities.

(7) The detailed condition of the Vasto Plant will form the subject of a separate report.



Warehouse (AMG Region III).

1. The Soc. Meridionale di Marcinazione operated the largest flour mill in South Italy and is located at 17 Emanuele Granturco. This mill has undergone repairs and is now prepared to produce 3000 to 4000 quintals of flour daily. It is imperative that the side tracks to this plant be made serviceable if wheat is to be hauled from the docks to the mill. Major Baister said that a grain ship is in the harbour waiting to be unloaded.

2. The tracks are in good working condition but at present are filled with 30 freight wagons (cars) in various stages of destruction. All however can be moved out on their own wheels. Cleaning of flangeways and oiling of switch pieces would comprise the necessary track repairs.

3. The Cirio Warehouse in San Giovanni (Naples) is used by AMG Region III as a food warehouse. It is necessary however to truck all goods to and from the site. There is a siding leading from the main line and the port to this warehouse.

4. Nine damaged wagons block the usage of this track. At present the upper end of the track is used as a storage track and is occupied by wagons loaded with war materials.

5. Cleaning of flangeways and greasing of the switch parts will put the track in serviceable condition. All damaged wagons can be removed on their own wheels.
