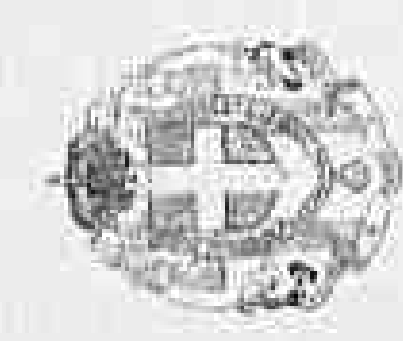

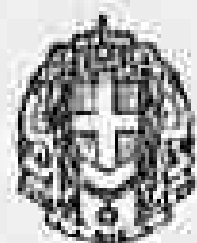

SUBJECT: Free conveyance of civilians
working on behalf of the Allies.

1. Reference is made to your 2 April 1945 ref. AC/95/Tn 4
2. The procedure suggested in above letter, according which a free travel ticket should be issued by the stations on delivery of the pass issued by the Allied Authority, is not suitable on account of following reasons:
 - a) It makes it necessary to enter into the station books the failed collection of the price of the free tickets.
 - b) It involves much work for issue of many hundreds of free tickets daily.
 - c) It involves much work also in the controlling offices for the careful investigation of all freely issued tickets.
3. We therefore suggest that, as is already being done for similar movements, tickets as per enclosed specimen be issued, each ticket consisting of three parts: first part (counterfolio), to remain with the Office which issues the ticket; second and third part to be surrendered to the booking office at the departing station. The departing station keeps the second part (second counterfolio) which is filed, while the third part, actual ticket, is duly endorsed with the special date stamp and returned to the traveller.
4. That S/Commission's comments on above proposal will be appreciated.

SUBJECT: Free Travel

TO: The Transportation Sub-Committee, U.S.
 Army Transportation Department, C.S.P.

1. The free travel scheme put into force by A.T.M.C. last July, for civil employees of Allied Forces is working far from well, especially as far as the private railways are concerned.

2. Information received from U.S.A. and Circumlocution railways reveals that this scheme intended to transport workers to and from their home districts and places of business, has gone the way of many other concessions made by the Allies to Italian civilians, and it is being flagrantly abused.

Some of the abuses are as follows:

- (A) Permits which are "non-transferable" are being passed to and used by other members of the family, relations and friends, for use at occasion.
- (B) Permits are used between any stations and at any time, for pleasure trips as well as business.
- (C) Workers crowd into the first class accommodation first, and insist on their right to do so, to the detriment and annoyance of the first class revenue paying passengers.
- (D) The railway authorities are so inundated with free travel workers that they are unable to collect or inspect tickets of all other passengers, and therefore suffer from loss of revenue from them.
- (E) The equipment which would in any case be overcrowded, is filled to absolute capacity in many cases, by the free riders, resulting in accidents, injuries and death almost every day.
- (F) The crowds are completely uncontrollable at times. If the free travel scheme were abolished many of the workers would not be travelling by train.
- (G) The average daily cost per worker does not exceed 1332 lire, therefore the workers who now receive on the average between 200 and 250 lire per day would not be harshly treated if they had to pay their fare.
- (H) The Government has not yet received one penny remuneration from the Ministry of Communications for carrying free passengers. Their bill is now approximately four million lire. The same applies to the Circumlocution and their outstanding claim.

(I) It is not possible to check the validity of all permits on account of the crowds. Many have been dismissed from Allied employment but are still using out of date permits.

3. The number of free passengers transported in one week is approximately 750,000 and both private electric railways are very much in favour of the free scheme being reactivated, with which I am in agreement after having seen the chaotic state of the trains during peak hours.

It is understood that the review of the advisability of continuing this scheme was contemplated some time ago and it is hoped that the matter of recompense to the German and Circumvesuviana railways for service given since last July will also be considered and an early decision on both matters will be given.

1. As you are aware for some considerable time past, 75 civilian workers have been working for Rail Govt. on charge, and it is understood that this policy has now been cancelled by AGM.
2. At present the type of combined travel permit and rail ticket used is considerably in excess of what is required in Italy, and further employing units have a considerable amount of unused permits. It is suggested that the necessary statistical information should be supplied to the Railway Company in support of their claims for payment by the Italian Ministry of Communications.
3. A small sub-committee was formed at this Headquarters to discuss the matter and lay down a standard procedure. Copy of the minutes of this meeting is attached.
4. Since the meeting was held, AG In. sub-committee have discussed the matter with the I.R. to ascertain whether they are in a position to implement the scheme as outlined in the minutes. They have welcomed the suggestion, but propose that the type of voucher used should be in accordance with the attached Appendix 'B'.
5. The use of such a voucher would take away from employing units the necessity of rendering by statistical information whatsoever, and further it is felt that the fact that workers would have to present themselves at the Railway Company's Booking Office in the same way as ordinary civilian passenger, will help the I.R. to control the present heavy abuse of unauthorized people travelling without paying fares.
6. Will you please consider this matter and advise your comments on the proposed revised arrangements.

This would also be labour saving, and the matter has been talked over with AFHQ Mov. and Tn. whilst awaiting official communication from I.S.R. The General Inspectorate are ready to comply with any arrangements made with I.S.R.

Chief, Rail Division

A difficulty has risen in the past by non-payment in spite of undertaking by the General Inspectorate that this would be done, Finance Sub Commission AG will ensure that funds are set aside by the Treasury to cover this.

5. Issue of permits for free travel.

We are of the opinion that the existing method is undesirable, and lends itself to abuse. We feel that the simplest plan, and one which would enable the railway to stand on its own feet, would be for the DART to supply to employing units a form of work permit/ticket pass, similar to the card pass used in the Bari area at the present time. A replica is attached hereto, ^{together with the original} Instead of using the permit-pass for travel, the employee to whom it is issued should present it at his local railway station ^{per week} or headquarters of the transport organisation, either weekly or monthly, and the stamped portion would be removed in exchange for a railway company's ticket or pass between the points named thereon.

The stamped portions would be retained by the railway as their credit for the ticket issued, and as support for payment from the Government. It might be mentioned that the Cumana Company in Naples is anxious to introduce a scheme of this kind to prevent the continued abuse.

It is realised that in Ancona, on the ISR line, some difficulty exists in the issue of railway tickets, but it is emphasised that the ISR is ready and willing to set up in Ancona a ticket issuing office which could be used for the purpose.

The procedure for transport in concession will be for the transport agency confirmed to supply figures and data to the General Inspectorate, who will check the figures and rates, and pass to the appropriate department of the Treasury for payment.

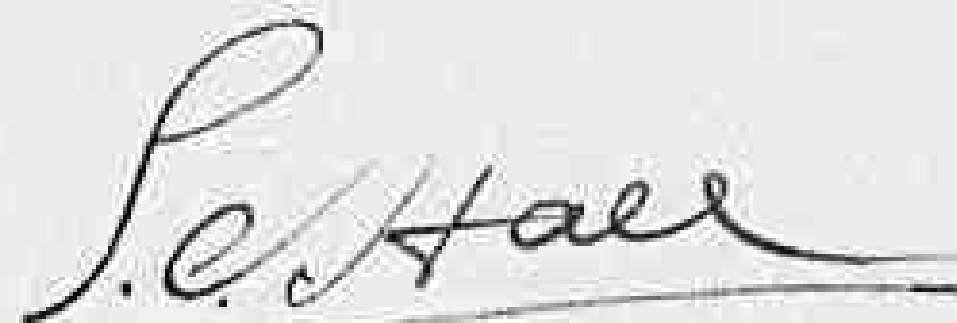

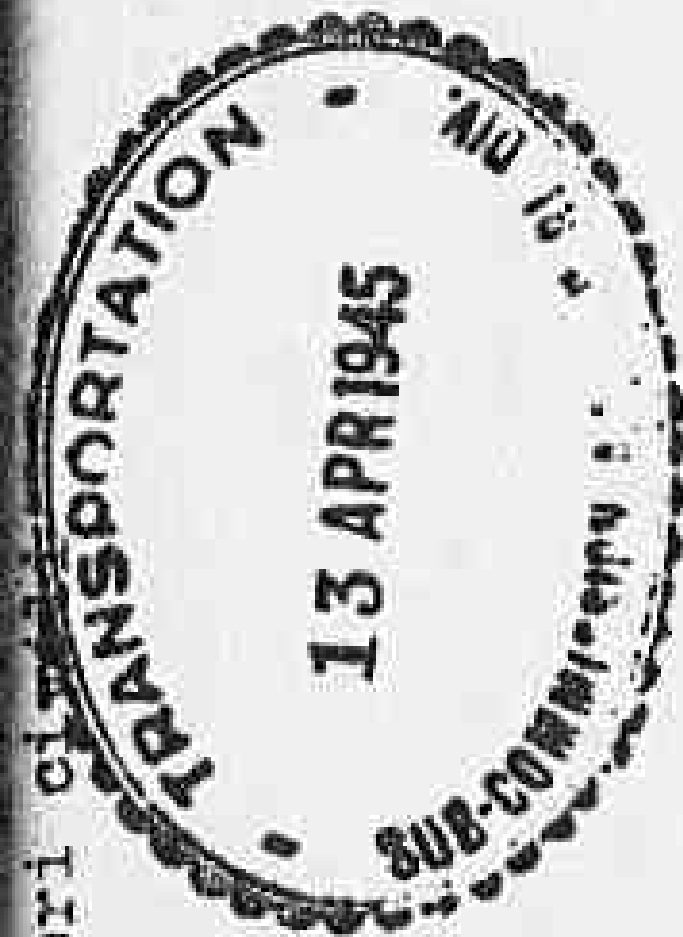

5. The very satisfactory increase in passenger facilities over long distances is appreciated, but within the locality of large cities there must always be some provision for suburban traffic which cannot be met by just stopping a long distance train at selected points in the metropolitan area. The demands of Frascati and Tivoli have been met in some measure in this respect, but some help in the other directions would be appreciated.

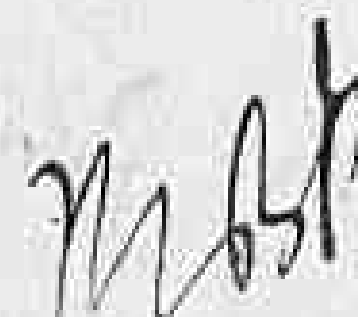

Numerous applications are received in respect of Italian civilians who for various reasons desire to reach a town served only by military railway. It is recommended that all such applications be declined.

(f) Movements of Workers by Military trains provided for the Purpose.

It is recommended that a standard card pass work permit be used where workers are conveyed free whilst working directly for allied forces. The use of paper passes is unsatisfactory. The form of permit already approved by Movements AFHQ to be adopted, and the card used in Bari District is recommended at the type to be used.

(g) Movement of Workers by Military trains when not falling under provision of paragraph 7, but sponsored by AC as essential to the maintenance of minimum needs of the area.

AC to agree with MRS the number of passengers to be carried by the military workers' train.

During the temporary period when the area is restricted for movement, AC officer to issue passes similar in character to that approved under para (f).

The Committee supports the contention for all civilian workers not coming within paragraph f, civilian passenger train facilities should be introduced at the earliest possible moment in order that the appropriate fares shall be paid by the travellers.

(h) Permits for being on Railway Company's premises.

Sole authority to permit civilians to be on railway company's premises to be vested in Director, Military Railway Services. MRS to advise the type of permit to be used for such purpose.

The Chairman was called to consider the matter of the free conveyance of civilians introduced directly by, and working for the Allied Armed Forces, and specifically to consider a proposal of A.C. as set out in Appendix 'A' to these minutes.

A representative of A.C. submitted reasons for the withdrawal of the present free transport concessions authorized in A.A.I. Letter 2059/5/42 dated 20 July, 1944 - Appendix 'B'. (as amended)

Transportation Sub-Commission, A.C. submitted :-

- (a) That in a country where currency is used and workers are paid wages, free conveyance is an undesirable method to introduce.
- (b) That it is not possible to limit such free transport to legitimate traffic.
- (c) Free transport causes many people to ride on overburdened public conveyances, who would otherwise walk, ride bicycles, or travel by other means of private conveyance.
- (d) Transporting workers free constitutes a serious financial burden on the transportation companies or the Italian Government, and no sensible system can effectively be put in operation, which will account for a low fare for transporting thousands of workers.
- (e) (Linked with (a)) Free transportation is a subterfuge to avoid payment of wages. An adjustment of wages or contract prices would accomplish the same objective.
- (f) That any scheme so introduced is open to uncheckable abuse by holders of free travel passes, and the cause of much discomfort and difficulty.

2. Conclusion.

It is called to consider the matter of the free conveyance of persons and things transported directly by, and working for the Allied Armed Forces, and specifically to consider a proposal of A.C. as set out in Appendix 'A' to these minutes.

Representatives of A.C. submitted reasons for the withdrawal of the present free transport concessions authorized in A.A.I. letter 2059/5/62 dated 21 July, 1944 - Appendix 'B'. (as amended)

Transportation Sub-Commission, A.C. submitted :-

- (a) That in a country where currency is used and workers are paid wages, free conveyance is an undesirable method to introduce.
- (b) That it is not possible to limit such free transport to legitimate traffic.
- (c) Free transport causes many people to ride on overcrowded public conveyances, who would otherwise walk, ride bicycles, or travel by other means of private transport.
- (d) Transporting workers free constitutes a serious financial burden on the transportation companies or the Italian Government, and no sensible system can effectively be put in operation, which will account for a few lire for transporting thousands of workers.
- (e) (Linked with (a)) Free transportation is a subterfuge to avoid payment of wages. In adjustment of wages or contract prices would accomplish the same objective.
- (f) That any scheme so introduced is open to uncheckable abuse by holders of free travel passes, and the cause of such discomfort and difficulty for those who pay their fares.
- (g) That the transition period when the scheme terminates is likely to cause considerable economic difficulty for those involved.
- (h) That when the industrial areas in the north are freed there would be no sensible method of introducing or safeguarding any scheme of this kind.

Finance Sub-Commission A.C. submitted :-

- (a) Whilst the Italian Government can be required to furnish free transport facilities on State Railways, it is doubtful if under present high policy, they can be required to reimburse private Companies for the cost of such services.

- 2 -

(b) no payments for free transport have as yet been made by the Italian Government to private Companies, nor have any such requests for payment been submitted. It is understood, however, that State subsidies have been granted to certain Companies to enable them to continue to operate.

(c) as a result of the present situation, private companies which have carried Allied workers without charge are now faced with serious financial difficulty, and are demanding some form of payment.

(d) should the responsibility for reimbursing the companies be assumed by the Allied Forces, settlements should be made in L.S. Lire.

It was unanimously agreed by the Committee that in the interests of military necessity, the principle of transport arrangements without cost to the worker must be continued.

The Committee considered that due to lack of control and supervision the same types of abuses which have existed under the present system will continue if workers are directly re-imbursed for the expenses of travel, and it is suggested that in many cases would actually be paid.

It would be extremely difficult to check entitlement of each individual worker to the exact amount of reimbursement, and considerable additional clerical staff would be necessary to establish even minimum safeguards.

The proposed change in the present system could not properly be decided upon until the more basic question of financial responsibility has been determined by competent authority. The Committee considered such a decision is not within its scope.

It was considered by the Committee that if the financial responsibility was to be assumed by the Armed Forces, payments for the services should be made direct to the carriers through central agencies, and not by way of allowances to individual workers. The details of such an arrangement must necessarily be decided upon and formulated by the Joint Military Finance Committee.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted by the Committee :-

It is reaffirmed that, where military necessity can be shown, there is need for free transport (without cost to the workers) for directly employed civilians working for the Allied Forces

It is recommended :

(a) that the responsibility of the Italian Government for the provision of such free travel be ascertained,

(b) that the responsibility of A.C. in this matter be ascertained,

 - (1) Italian State Railways,
 - (2) Private Railways,
 - (3) Other transport agencies such as trams, trolley buses, etc.

The recommendation outlined in Appendix 'A' to the Agenda of the Special Meeting of the Sub-Committee on 5th March, 1945, was, after considerable discussions and presentations by the Financial and Transportation Sub-Committees of A.C., rejected.

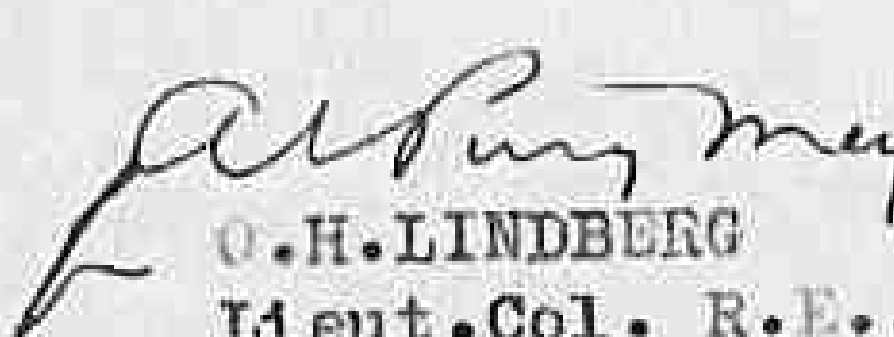

Reference specimen permits as supplied by Naples Representative

The system of a printed permit is obviously preferable to the roneo form as issued in connection with the Civitavecchia Train.

It has its disadvantages

- (a) It has to be filled in by hand
- (b) The completion of the reverse side (unless this is conveniently overlooked)
- (c) The size of the permit

With regard to (c) the passengers of the "official" type, teachers etc., would no doubt keep it in a wallet. Dock labourers or other manual workers would, I am afraid, have some difficulty in keeping the permit in a condition of legibility long before the time of renewal had arrived.

If, as it seems, the Military are continuing to insist on the permit system remaining in force, then may it be suggested that a card, on the lines of those issued to workers employed by the Allies for free travel, be issued to the Dock and Port Reconstruction workers travelling between S. Marinello & Civitavecchia - the responsibility for the issue of the cards to be with the Agency employing the labour.

The issue of permits for 250 Dock workers each month is no mean clerical task, and further, there is no check here in Rome that the man to whom a permit has been issued is still retaining his employment.

Under the present system I am under the impression that very few, if any of these workers, buy a railway ticket, but simply jump the train.

If the employing Agency issue a card permit, this could be accepted as a railway ticket and the employes could be made responsible for payment of the fares - either as their own liability or deducting the fares from their wages.

The undersigned Company manufacturing special charcoal for Motor Vehicles running in Rome on producer gas and placing it at the whole disposal of the Transportation Office, Rome, is under necessity to reestablish this production in its own forest centers at Tarquinia (Prov. of Viterbo) in order to secure the supply of charcoal for next year.

To this end the Company had already engaged 65 specialized wood-cutters in the Casentino Area, whence such workmen leave customarily for different countries.

After a supervision effected at this area it was ascertained that on account of the conditions of roads and the existing traffic it is impossible to go on the spot in order to take the workmen with motor vehicles. Therefore the Company would have decided to have the workmen come in at foot or by any other possible means of conveyance from the various places, where they are resident, viz. from Montemignano, Castel S. Nicolò-Strada, etc. (Prov. of Arezzo) *to Arezzo* and applies for the authorisation to get them prosecuted their travel from Arezzo to Rome by workmen's train making this track periodically.

In consideration of this purpose and the importance of the production to be reestablished by the 65 workmen engaged for this scope, what is controlled by the Transportation Office and Allied Authorities, the Company takes the liberty of begging to agree to its above stated application.

The authorisation to such a journey ought to be transmitted by wire to the station master and Allied Military Authorities at the Arezzo station in order to allow the workmen engaged by the Company, which total 65, to make the journey by said train at several times.

The Company will thus transport the workmen from Rome to the Production Centers by its own means of conveyance.

2. Rail Facilities -

(a) The following additional facilities were suggested:-

(i) NAPLES - FUSARO Several hundred workers, largely from the NAPLES area, would gradually be absorbed into a new REIE Wksp at FUSARO.

Tn AOC stated that there will be no difficulty in improving the rail service, provided the working hours are staggered, and those of POZZUOLA Wksp.

(ii) FRATTAMAGGIORE - CASORIA A special train between these points would relieve MT.

Mov IO said that a train could not be arranged on this section. 1238

(iii) TORRE ANNUNZIATA - NAFTA About 300 workers from the TORRE area travel by road to and from NAFTA each day.

Tn AOC thought that these could probably be absorbed into existing trains on the CIRCUMVESUVIANO Rly. Tn will investigate this, and also the possibility of providing an extra train. SICO 57 Area will supply full details.

(iv) SAN SEVERINO - PONTECAGNANO DADL 94 Sub Area asked whether approx. 200 workers from SAN SEVERINO Rota can be brought in by train to connect with the 0645 hrs workman's train to PONTECAGNANO.

(iv) SAN SEVERINO - PONTECAGNANO DADL 94 Sub Area asked whether approx. 200 workers from SAN SEVERINO Rota can be brought in by train to connect with the 0645 hrs workman's train to PONTECAGNANO.

Mov IO said the rly was only open from SALERNO to FISCIANO. There is already a workers' train between these points. Mov IO will find out if the timings are suitable (since found unsuitable both directions).

(v) Tn ACC stated that the CIRCUNVESUVIANO Rly is already operating its maximum service. Tn ACC will investigate the possibility of running an extra train between TORRE ANNUNZIATA and NAPLES, but it is unlikely that further improvements can be effected.

3. Contrary Movement - It was agreed that the transfer of workers to avoid contrary movement was not practicable.

4. Free Rail Travel - Free rail travel has been authorized by AAF but has not yet been generally adopted in 5 Dist as the Warrent Board has not agreed. Only special trains for WD workers are at present provided. It was considered that by virtue of providing WD rail trip, the principle of free travel was already established. Q will request authority from AAF for extension of free rail travel to all WD workers in 5 Dist.

5. Trams - Considerable use is already made of trams and, to a certain extent, trolley buses in 57 Area and further use of this sort will be made as and where possible. It was confirmed that further buses could not be requisitioned and that trolley buses could not be used in 94 Sub Area.

6. RE - The problem of CANCELLA would not cease to be a concern owing to the arrival of Italian Military lab.
