1. Reference is to your letter 51-2/36 Road of 17 February 45.
2. This siding has been inspected, and it is found that the points of the lead in are in good order, although grass grown and the matter of an hour or two's work would make them available for use.
3. ISK confirm that this siding is privately owned, and that they have no jurisdiction over it. To them the owner is Origoni, and if he sublets the siding to the Consorzi Agrari it has no difference in their relationship with the owner.
4. It is noted that you state the terms of the lease by the Consorzi provide for the use of the rail link to the warehouse. It would seem in such circumstances that the Consorzi can insist on the legal fulfilment of their agreement, although the lease would have to be studied by Legal Sub-Commission for a definite ruling thereon.
5. The ISK will continue to make enquiries, but in the meantime they recommend direct negotiations between Origoni and the Consorzi when we will do all we can to get the siding speedily into use.
6. At the moment a road haul is involved over a distance of about a mile, and in such circumstances every effort should be made to get a satisfactory settlement.

1. Reference your letter AC/318/3/Tn 4. this Warhouse and Siding have been visited today.

2. It is situated about 200 yards from Tuscolana Station (South side). The line runs into the warhouse and would take 2 wagons. The points of the lead in are in good order but the track is overgrown, which could be cleared in a matter of a few hours.

3. There seems to be no apparent reason why the siding should not be used. At the moment any traffic from the warhouse requiring despatch from by rail would have to be taken round by road to the main yard, a distance of about 1½ kilom-tras.

1. The Federazione Italiana dei Consorzi Agrari has occupied a warehouse located as follows under a rental contract with the owner, Sig. Origoni, since 1939. Via Rea Silvia 51 Rome.

2. The above warehouse has a rail siding known as the Raccordo Origoni a little south of Tuscolana station. The siding is not open but could be opened with little work, as apparently it merely needs to be cleaned up a little bit.

3. The Federazione reports that it requested the railroad to open the siding and received the reply that they would open it if the owner submitted a written request. The Federazione says the owner has refused to write the request in spite of the fact that the rental contract stipulates that the Federazione may use the siding.

4. The Federazione uses the warehouse for empty sacks and will dispatch from 8 to 15 rail cars weekly from the siding, thereby making a considerable saving in time and lorry transportation. We are much interested in facilitating the work of the Federazione which has the heavy responsibility of handling wheat movements all over liberated Italy.

5. Your efforts to secure the opening of the above siding will be appreciated.



Attach'd for your information is a statement compiled from information supplied by the Capo Compartimento with regard to Staffing and Loading facilities, and telephonic communication with the principal Stations in the Rome Division covered by Lines 50, 65, 87, 89, 90.

With regard to Column 2 I am not satisfied that the information supplied is wholly correct, for example Ceccano and Frosinone. Although the original sidings may have been destroyed emergency spurs may have been laid down such as has been done at Frosinone, which gives limited facilities for dealing with freight traffic.

I hope in time to have been able to check up personally.

1. In reply to your letters A.C.C.TN/218/30 of 21st October & letter RV VII/78/26/7 of 20th October.
2. Enclosed is a copy of a letter from the chief maintenance engineer in reply to letter A.C.C. Tn/R/I of Oct. 14th copy of which was sent you.
3. It will be seen that the Chief maintenance engineer is unwilling to authorize the work until such time as it is approved by the transportation section.
4. As the action of the commerce section in authorizing this work is in direct contravention of para 2 of R.C. & MG. 91/87/ CA of Aug 29. I shall be glad if this question can be taken up very strongly with region VIII to prevent a recurrence, & consequent difficulties with the M.R.S.
5. I also consider that the Director General Italian State Railways should be asked to circularize all concerned that work of this nature must not be put in hand until approved either by D.M.R.S. or Transportation Subcommission.
6. The use of points and crossings for this work, may seriously delay the rehabilitation of lines of military importance.



1. It would facilitate a great deal our moving the Sulphur from SASSOFERRATO (Prov.Ancona) to TORRENIERI for the firm of Ulisse Crocchi & Figli to make Carbon Bisulphide, if there was a siding at Chiusi to unload from R/R cars.

2. We understand that the siding could be repaired without a great deal of difficulty. The head of the Ferrovie dello Stato, 7° Reparto - Siena has submitted to us a plan for this work which we have requested that he take it up with the Ministry of Railroads in Rome for their approval and for them to take it up with the appropriate Sub-Commission of A.C.C.

For your information you will find enclosed a copy of this program of work dated Siena, 27.9.944 and translation of some and list of materials required and plans of the siding.

3. This siding is needed also for the movement and export of the grain of which we understand this Province has a surplus, and other materials.

Siena 27/9/44

To link up the siding and loading railway of the "Consorzio Agrario" of Siena with the main line railway at Chiusi Station.

- 1) The repairs of the siding railway which is damaged in some short lengths, will be done by the Works Section of Siena.
- 2) The tg.12 junction of light type, to join the siding railway with the main railway will be furnished by the Works Section of Siena. (para.4 of the attached design)
- 3) Two junctions (a-c and b-c of the attached) must be made between the first and the second railway (actual main railway).

These two junctions are wanted for shunting's reasons, because the work of discarding the trucks for the trains in both directions is difficult and embarrasses the military traffic.

For the a/m communications the Works Section of Siena can furnish a junction R.A. tg.10 (e of the attached design.) For lack of material for the junctions FS 46tg.10 (a-b-c) it is impossible to proceed with the work.

The lines for all the a/m junctions will be furnished by the Works Section of Siena, but the special timber (sleepers?) is missing.

To do this work it is essential to send to the spot the tools, which we lack completely.

The particularised list of the materials and tools wanted is on the attached N.1

Twelve days are necessary to complete this work.

SUBJECT : Carbon Bisulphide Plant  
TO : Transportation Sub-Commission

1. The establishment of Ulisse Crocchi at Torrenieri (Siena) is of extreme importance in the provision of carbon bisulphide for the refining of edible oil oil. There are only two such plants in the whole of liberated Italy. Crocchi can recommence activities on being provided with the necessary raw material, sulphur, which must be transported from Sassoferato (Ancona) to Torrenieri.
2. Attached is copy of a letter from Toscana Region (with enclosures) on the subject of the proposed repair of the railway siding at Chiusi, which is the unloading point for Torrenieri.
3. It would be appreciated if action could be taken with D.G., M.R.S., H.Q. A.A.I. (Colonel Campbell in the absence of Gen. Gray) in order to have this work undertaken. Information on steps taken in this respect would be gratefully received by this Sub-Commission.
