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Subject: monthly Report - November 44.

1. Emergency demands during the month were met. Release of material based on the 3 monthly demands submitted by I.S.R. for Oct.-Dec. have not yet commenced, and this was discussed with Lieut.-Col. R.E. Coward R.E. A.D. Tn. (Stores) when it was found that I.S.R. H.Q. had not yet passed on demands for material which could not be supplied from its own resources and the necessity for speedier action was pointed out to the Stores Supt. I.S.R.

2. The information regarding stocks held by the Private Railways required in connection with their stored demands was received only from the Bari-Barletta. The Sud-Est and Calabro-Lucane have been pressed to forward it so that proper consideration can be given to their demands.

3. During a visit to H.Q. A.C. the whole question of stores demands for I.S.R. and private railways was discussed fully at a meeting called by Lieut.-Col. R.E. Coward R.E. and attended by representatives of the Stores department I.S.R. and of the department of the Ministry of Communications dealing with the private railways (Ispettorato Generale delle Motorizzazioni Civile e dei Trasporti in Concessione). A draft directive covering the Supply of Stores and materials ¹²³⁰ to the concession railways has been submitted ~~for~~ your approval.

4. Some supplies including part worn tyres were secured during the month for W.D. vehicles operated by I.S.R. and an indent submitted for additional requirements which it is hoped may be obtained. The

responsibility for supervision of the maintenance of these vehicles by A.C. read Section of some local military unit has not yet been decided.

5. The I.S.R. received during November several tenders for iron and brass castings including one from the firm of Biallo, which was under requisition by D.L. Tn.. The Biallo prices were satisfactory and I.S.R. propose to continue placing the bulk of their local work with this firm after de-requisitioning which may now be effected.

6. When at H.Q. contact was made with A.R.S. Officers and with the acting Chief of the Traction Dept. I.S.R., Ing. Palmerio and his assistant Ing. De Martine with whom locomotive and wagon problems were discussed. They proposed to initiate actions on suggestions made to them in connection with provision of locomotive spare parts by stripping down war damaged engines in the Reggio Division, and also on regard to the heavy repair of boilers recovered from such engines being carried out by the contract firm of Tesi, at Taranto in order to provide spare boilers for changing over to expedite locomotive repairs. These suggestions have been the subject of separate communications to you.

7. A requisition in favour of the I.S.R. on the small engineering shop of Candelucci at Taranto has been cancelled at the request of I.S.R., the output of this firm being no longer essential because of contracts made with the Tesi engineering works, Taranto.

SUBJECT : Notes for Monthly Report, May 1945. Mechanical Section.TO : Chief,
Rail Division.1. Rail Car Recovery & Repair:

(a) Cecchetti Works, at Civitanova Marche, have experienced difficulties due to material shortages and lack of finance. Financial aid is being given through Intendenzi di Finanza, Macerata and fair supplies of material arranged. Repair work proceeds slowly, and final figures for the month are not yet to hand.

(b) Rome Smistamento repaired 71, (27 recovered).

(c) Bombrini-Parodi-Delfino have improved output to:
70 heavy repaired (all recovered).

(d) Wagons Lits, Rome turned out 8 passenger coaches (all recovered) and 6 freight cars (3 recovered) and are now engaged on reconversion to ordinary passenger stock of "lying" coaches and office and Dispensary cars from ambulance trains now being split up.

2. Inspection Tours:

In conjunction with MRS an inspection tour of Locomotives and Rolling Stock Depots and Workshops was carried out at Genoa, Milan, Turin and Bologna. A separate report has been rendered.

3. Rail Car Reconnaissance:

Results of rail car reconnaissance carried by MRS and ISR have been co-ordinated up to 28 May and circulated.

1. RAIL CAR RECOVERY.

(a) Cecchetti Works at Civitanova Marche carried on during the month with repairs to cars in their works, and completed 16 in the period.

(b) Rome Smistamento carried out 28 medium and 35 light

repairs.

(c) Bombrini Baroldi Delfino turned out 71 heavy repairs, the slight drop in output being due to shortage of materials.

(d) Wagon Lits, Rome had an output of 8 passenger coaches.

(e) Recovery of cars from lines 256 and 257 over the Rome Nord route continued during the month.

2. RECONNAISSANCE OF ROLLING STOCK RECOVERY.

During the month, reconnaissances were carried out at the Solvay Plant, Rossignano, and over lines 259, 255, and the private line Cancelllo-Benevento, resulting as under:

NOTE: + All these cars are in use for internal service.

SUBJECT : Monthly Report on Activities connected with the repair
of freight and passenger cars.

1. December has not been an outstanding month for freight and passenger car repairs, due mainly to difficulties in getting the necessary materials.

The Wagon Lits Company have repaired 34 freight cars during December, but have since been turned over almost entirely to the repair of passenger coaches. The repairs on these coaches is of a very heavy nature, and ten (10) of the thirty one (31) coaches brought to Rome, were found to be beyond repair, after a detailed inspection. Some spares may be had from the ten (10) coaches classed as SCRAP.

Some materials have been made available at PORTA MAGGIORE WORKSHOPS, SANT'APIRELLA WORKSHOPS and TIBURTINA STORES, however there is still a long list of materials not available, and every effort is being made to obtain these so that work may proceed. A 1,000 (one thousand) carriage seats are in transit to Rome, and of this number nearly 200 (two hundred) have already arrived.

2. The firm BONBERTI PARODI DELFINO at Colleferro have nearly completed their programme of reconstructing a part of plant to carry out heavy repairs to freight cars. D.M.R.S. has had 200 (two hundred) wagons sent to Colleferro, and repair work on these cars should start before the end of January 45.

The firm have now completed the construction of a transfer-table, and this will be installed as soon as the earth-works have been finished, which should be during the second week of January 45. When the work is completed, car repair will be carried on in 3 (three) sheds, 80 metres in length, each having double tracks, which should allow enough room for the suggested repair of 250 (two hundred and fifty) freight cars per month. Their machine and wood-working shops have the equipment to deal with an even larger number than mentioned.

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2. The firm BOMBARDI PARODI DELLINO at Colleferro have nearly completed their programme of reconstructing a part of plant to carry out heavy repairs to freight cars. D.M.R.S. has bid 200 (two hundred) wagons sent to Colleferro, and repair work on these cars should start before the end of January 45. The firm have now completed the construction of a transfer-table, and this will be installed as soon as the earth-works have been finished, which should be during the second week of January 45. When the work is completed, car repair will be carried on in 3 (three) sheds, 80 metres in length, each having double tracks, which should allow enough room for the suggested repair of 250 (two hundred and fifty) freight cars per month. Their machine and wood-working shops have the equipment to deal with an even larger number than mentioned.

3. The recovery of wagons on the ROME/VITERBO -PRIVATE RAILWAY (S.P.R.N.) is going on slowly, but when completed, will release a further 135 freight car for general use.

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4. The release of seasoned timber at Cirella, Calabria for freight car repair, has now been obtained, and movement will start as soon as 4 (four) lorries, which are being supplied by Transportation Sub-Commission (Roads) arrive at Cirella.

to following stock etc.

1. During the month of November a contract was signed by U.S.A.
and BOUGAINVILLE TRADING, whereby railway wagons are to be
required at the firms works at GOLIATH during the first of November
period covering a period of one year, and are continuing
out siteation to their plant, so as to be able to deal with up
to 250 heavy wagons per month. In the meantime the firms are
repairing cars on two open tracks, situated near their wood
working shop.

2. A contract was signed by L.C.C. and BOUGAINVILLE CO.
to have freight & passenger trains at their port at
long. a certain number of trains have already been
agreed by this firm, but at present work is being held up
for lack of materials; this matter is now in the hands of
THE STORES BRITISH, who have been supplied with a list of
material required.

3. On 17th Nov. 44 an inspection was made of the plant
at GOLIATH and followed up to GOLIATH and a detailed report
of this inspection was given to D.M.S. & P.T.S.C. (A.I.LS.)
from CHIEF LIVING SUB COMMISSION (RAILS).

4. Action on instructions I carried out an inspection of a
plant belonging to THE GOVERNMENT MINTON NATIONAL SUPPLY.
to D.M.S. & P.T.S.C. (A.I.LS.)
The stores, BRITISH, are now dealing with this report,
hoping to obtain some useful stores for wagon repair on the
existing under instruction of D.M.S.

5. A visit to Bougainville (collected) revealed quantities of
timber which it is hoped can be secured for the repair of
bridges and freight carts.
