MEMORANDUM

TO : Lt. Col. O.H. Lindberg

Following is Report of Stores Officer for Month of May:

- (a) With effect from 1 June 1945 the control of all stores at the I.S.R. Stores Depots at Naples and Rome will revert to the H.Q. of the I.S.R., subject to meeting any M.R.S. requirements. This relaxation of M.R.S. control of I.S.R. Stores was made possible by the ending of the European War.
- (b) The Rewinding Creosoting Plant at Naples will be ready to impregnate ties for the Italian State Railways in about two months. Sufficient space for tie storage is now assured and the Tank Company which occupied the plant, will withdraw all of their property within 60 days. This Division has been instrumental in the reactivation of this plant.
- (c) The cement position is improving. It is expected that with the reduction of Military Railway requirements this Sub-Commission will receive all the cement required for rehabilitation work.
- (d) The tire situation is still serious. Assistance has been given to I.S.R. and their contractors to help them obtain salvage tires from Salvage Depots.
- (e) The I.S.R. has received 5 trucks from the British Army out of a quota of 40 and 10 from the American Army out of a quota of 40. The remainder of the trucks are expected during June, those from the U.S. Army to be delivered by the 10th of June.
- (f) The Termi Steelworks is now under the control of ~~the AC~~ ¹²²⁴. The Italian State Railways will receive the major part of their requirements from this plant, bidding through the Trans. S/C. The contracts and detail of requirements will be made directly with the Termi Works by the I.S.R.
- (g) During the month the Stores Officer attended a supply conference of G-4 ETOUSA.

1. Following is monthly report of Stores Branch - April 1945.
2. Part III Rail, item 5:
 - (a) The position of cement is improving. Releases for all cement requested have been received and bids placed for movement to projects.
 - (b) The directive for issuing of supplies to the Italian State Railways has been published and distributed. This directive defines the responsibilities as between M.R.S. and Tn. Sub-Commission A.C.
 - (c) It is expected that with the end of hostilities, the Military requirements will ease and it will be possible for the railways to get larger quantities of materials needed in repairs to rolling stock and rehabilitation.

Stores Officer's Report

Lt-Col Lundberg:

The Stores Officer has been compiling the requirements
of supplies and materials, ^{urgently} needed for the next six months
by the Italian State Railways. This request is now ready
for the A.C. Requisitioning Officer.

The assigning of the reconstruction of several railway
^{Trans Sub Comm} lines to A.C. has required that large amounts of
cement be obtained for this work.

The Stores Officer has obtained circulating permits
and fuel allowance for the contractors who have
been awarded contracts on the various lines.

Information has been supplied to Industry & Commerce
Sub Commissions, who are endeavoring to
deregistration a battery factory near Naples and also
to get one opened at Florence.

The Industry Sub-Commission is also working on the
deregistration of the Reiping Timber Treating Plant
at Naples which is necessary for the treatment of
ties for the Railway. The Stores Officer has furnished
information on this plant and it is hoped that ^{it} ~~this~~
~~plant~~ will soon be returned to the Reiping Co.

The question of tires for Railway cars & trucks also ^{over}

for Contractors has been handled with AMG. Lazio-Umbria Region but due to lack of raw rubber for the repairs there has been no improvement in the tire situation. A. shipment of ~~to~~ raw rubber is expected in the latter part of January.

Requests for ~~to~~ machine tools and supplies have been received from various divisions and all sources are being exploited to furnish the requests.

SUBJECT: Monthly Report.

TO : Director Transportation Sub-Commission AC
APO 394 U.S. Army.

1. The Stores Officer has been engaged in the duties of supervision and procurement of railway stores and supplies, also engineer materials for re-construction work of the railways.

2. The development of sources of supply has been exploited and the securing of releases of material from various branches of the Military Services, A.C. and other control agencies. Excellent cooperation has been received from the Commerce, Industry, Food, and Mining Sub-Commissions of A.C., also from P.B.S., AFLR (Italian) Board, Tn. (Br), A.D.O.S., and Stores Section of M.R.S.

3. The rehabilitation of several factories for the manufacturing of Railway supplies is in progress also the repair of a tie and timber treating plant.

4. The requirement of supplies and material needed for the next six (6) months is being compiled. These supplies are only those which cannot be independently procured from local resources in Free Italy and in the port have always been secured from outside sources.
