1. Reference is made to the attached copy of a document emanating from the Industry & Commerce Sub-Commission, addressed to Regional Commissioners for the attention of Economics & Supply Divisions.

2. Paragraph 2 of the memorandum would seem to cut across the arrangements already in hand for the establishment of pools of civilian vehicles under Regional and Provincial Road Transport Commissioners, or at least to suggest absence of any knowledge of such a scheme.

3. Paragraph 4 of the memorandum suggests that some separate organisation is being considered for the servicing of civilian transport.

4. If it is the intention of ACMF Local Resources Section to classify details of civilian garages for uses other than by ACC/AMG in accordance with the intended pool system, the detailed planning schemes being prepared for the early use of Regional Transport may be jeopardised.

- 1. A request has been received from ACMF Local Resources Section for information on garages capable of handling repair of civilian vehicles. Such garages must employ upwards of 20 mechanics and be in a position to operate at the present time.
- 2. Will you please report to this sub-Commission, garages of this nature, with details as to location, ownership, and number of cars which can be serviced at one time. These Garages are required throughout 6ccupied Italy and it is suggested that at least one be located in every city of 25,000 population or over.
- 3. Information is also required concerning firms which are equipped to repair batteries (accumulators) used in civilian automobiles.
- 4. The servicing of civilian automobiles is becoming a matter of increasing importance to the civilian economy, and you are requested to forward your reports as promptly as possible.
