SUBJECT: Registration numbers for civilian type vehicles

TO : See Distribution

1. Prior to 31 March 1944 all civilian type vehicles in hands of units attached or assigned to PBS, including those held by staff sections of PBS Headquarters, will be marked with official V.D. registration numbers. This order applies to all passenger cars.

2. Assignment of registration numbers and marking on vehicles will be performed by Ord. MM Shop #2 (Depot #467 - Civilian Cars, 3rd Echelon Garage, "Auto Palace", 43 Via Galileo Ferraris), for all PBS automobiles and those processed by O.O., PBS for other sections and headquarters.

3. Registration numbers will be assigned to civilian type cars in possession of other headquarters (ACC, AAF, AMG, 12 AFSC, etc.) upon written request to Ori. O., PBS, signed by competent officers of those headquarters and containing following data for each car to be registered:

- a. Italian license number
- b. Engine number
- c. Chassis, or serial number
- d. Make, model and body type
- e. From whom vehicle obtained
- f. Manner in which vehicle was secured such as requisition, purchase or shipment on ST. If purchased, show price paid.
- g. Tire size and no., of tires.

Marking of numbers on the vehicles will be performed by the Headquarters concerned.

4. Ordnance Officer, PBS, will register all vehicles to whom numbers have been assigned by him in accordance with Change No. 1, 3 November 1942, AR 850-10.



SUBJECT: Insurance of Vehicles in Road Haulage Scheme (Civilian)

TO : Allied Claims Commission (Lt. Col. Macqueston)

1. Reference conversation (Lt. Col. Macqueston - Captain Hay) on 1 May 44, the following is the situation as regards insuring the V.L. vehicles in the Road Haulage Scheme:

a. A total of 1120 British and U.S. W.D. trucks will ultimately be employed, made up as follows:-

- 420 British 3 ton trucks.
- 300 U.S. 2 1/2 ton trucks (for insurance purposes these are rated at 3 tons).
- 150 Captured Italian Army 10 ton FIAT trucks.
- 250 Trucks not yet allocated.

These will be distributed as follows:-

2. A copy of the original Road Haulage Scheme is attached. This has now been modified, however, and Regional Civilian Schemes are now on the following lines:-

a. The trucks are being leased to Italian Public Utility Coys which, however, are completely controlled by the Regional Transportation Officers. In each case there are Italian Managers or Supervisors and all will also be Italian. They will, of course,

be employed, made up as follows:-

- 420 British 3 ton trucks.
- 300 U.S. 2 1/2 ton trucks (for insurance purposes these are rated at 3 tons).
- 150 Captured Italian Army 10 ton FIAT trucks.
- 250 Trucks not yet allocated.

2. A copy of the original Road Haulage Scheme is attached. This has now been modified, however, and Regional Civilian Schemes are now on the following lines:-

a. The trucks are being leased to Italian Public Utility Coys which, however, are completely controlled by the Regional Transportation Officers. In each case there are Italian Managers or Supervisors and all maintenance and driver personnel will also be Italian. They will, of course, work under the supervision of U.S. or U.K. personnel but naturally Italian drivers will be on the road frequently on their own.

b. These vehicles are operating on a tariff which has been agreed Italian Government and allows .550 lira per vehicle/kilometer run and under the lease agreement, the P.U. Coys must insure the for Third Party Risks. The exact wording is as follows:-

"8. You will indemnify and save harmless the Allied Control Commission from all claims of any kind and description asserted against the Allied Control Commission arising or growing out of the use or operation of said vehicles.

"9. You will take out such insurance policies and in the amounts, as shall be specified by the Regional Transportation Officer (Roads), insuring the vehicle against property damage, theft and fire and insuring the Allied Control Commission against liability for damage to persons or property, third party and employee risks."

c. Finance and Legal Sub-commissions were consulted and copies of their letters are attached. All three Coys have now been advised to take out policies with the Assicurazione d'Italia for the full amount of Lire 500,000 per vehicle and they are now in process of doing so.

d. In the event of damage to the vehicles, they will be repaired either in the workshops of the P.U. Coys or in RMR workshops where the P.U. Coys will be charged up with the cost of repairs and spare parts. Total loss of a vehicle, as long as the vehicles are leased, will be written off by W.D.

3. The scheme for which authority has been asked from AFHQ is to sell the vehicles outright to the Italian Government for cash or at least what amounts to cash at the present moment. The Italian Government will at once resell the vehicles to various haulage contractors who have the necessary financial backing, garage space and repair facilities. This resale will probably be on a 50% cash down and 50% over three years basis, sale price averaging Lit. 250,000 per vehicle.

4. As regards identification of the vehicles, it is proposed that all trucks will be specially and distinctively painted so as to become familiar on the roads as those sold by the Allied Government to assist the transportation of Italian Civilian Supplies.

EXTRACT FROM AAI ROUTINE ORDERS SERIAL NO. 8 dtd 28 April 44.

86. Transport - Control of

1. Load-carrying vehicles of all units operating in rear of Eighth Army boundary and 5 Corps rear boundary will carry Work Tickets (AF G 3518) at all times unless covered by a convoy Note. AB 412 will be carried also.
2. All Work Tickets will give specific details for each journey. Column 2 of the Work Ticket will show the actual details of the service performed and such items as "Camp Details" or "Company Duties" will not be used.
3. Work Tickets will not be signed by any individual below the rank of Serjeant, or NCO IC section of an MASC Unit. They will be examined weekly, under Unit arrangements, by an officer, who will sign a certificate to the effect that they are satisfactory.
4. Instructions will be issued at all PPs that POL will only be issued to drivers of load-carrying vehicles who produce a properly completed Work Ticket or special pass (see para 5). Details of POL issued will be entered on the reverse of the Work Ticket by the patrol issuer. Such entries will be transferred to AB 412.
5. All load-carrying vehicles passing out of the Eighth Army or 5 Corps areas, as referred to in para 1, will be in possession of a special pass authorising them to do so, stating route to be taken, destination, and, where possible, date of return. This pass will be signed by the CO of the Unit, the Adjutant or a Grade II Staff Officer.
