Ing. Rossini informs me that in spite of the request made by Capt. Johnson (Jonston?) to the C.I.P. of Leghorn, the workers on strike there refused to supply Naptha to the I.S.R. which we need for railway operation.

It has been explained to them that the operation of Military trains must be continued, but in spite of that, the workers have not shown any desire to change their attitude.

I send you the above information, in case you may be able to provide the fuel through the Allied Military Authority in Leghorn, this in order to prevent the stoppage of the trains.
