THE ARMY AREA PAGED 20 IS IN POSITION TO PURCHASE FIVE ARMY ONE TWO TWO TWO
TRUCKS FOR CIVILIAN DRIVER TO PURCHASE FIVE FOUR EIGHT O T COY BASE
WHERE CAN NOT IN THAT COUNTRY BE USED IN ARMY AREA 24 AGC IS NOT IN

Subject : Lost and stolen trucks of Italian Co's 1004-6 Q.M.

I. Seven of the 6x6 Am. Army trucks operated by above Co's were lost or stolen during move into Rome 28 May to 19 June 44.

2. Immediately proceeding and following the capture of Rome the trucks operated by above companies were in constant use 24 Hrs a day in hauling Carabinieri food, supplies and equipment under direction of RAC G.4 Fifth Army. Officers of RAC and Ennas region picked up empty trucks at will on the roads and sent them on necessary but unrecorded missions. In several instances American and British soldiers took trucks from the Italian soldier drivers and drove the trucks away. In one known instance one truck was captured by the Germans. Several of the ~~missed~~ truck we later found and returned. The available information is given in attached letter dated 7/7 44 from the Co's Commander.

The list of the lost trucks was sent to Prov. Marshall Rome by ex Officer ACC. but no reports have been received to date.

3. During the above operation of moving into Rome immediately behind the combat troops I was in charge of the operations of the above Co's. Every effort was made to keep the trucks under control and located. The Italian soldiers drivers did a splendid job, especially considering that they had never driven in

convey, nor driven in convoy or alone under army black-out regulations. The Italian soldier drivers were not trained in the ways of the Am. Army regarding the safeguarding and reporting of injured trucks.

4. The loss of above trucks was unavoidable in such a large movement and in combat areas.
