REMARKS:

Items requested in this requisition are for covering transportation requirements for Northeast Italy as defined in Appendices.

A. Nature of requirements - The vehicles are necessary for conveyance of essential supplies in Northeast Italy that come within the scope of the cessant and interest formula.

B. Basis for estimate of requirements.

1. Population -

a. The population is approximately 6,100,000. This figure includes 993,660 in VENETIA GIULIA sub-region.

2. Ports -

a. VENICE

b. TRIESTE (doubtful)

It is expected that the latter port will be used exclusively by 8th Army for military purposes and only limited facilities made available for AG/AFS supply purposes. Essential supplies for Austria and Yugoslavia will also be passed through Trieste, Fiume and Suda. It is therefore estimated that 3/5 of the essential requirements for this region will pass through TRIESTE and 1/5 through FUMES.

3. Railways -

- a. BOLZNA-TRIESTE line. It is anticipated this will be used exclusively for military traffic.
- b. TRIESTE-UDINE line. A non priority repair line.
- c. OTHERS. For an indefinite period following occupation all other lines in the Region are expected to be unusable.

My dear Admiral,

Since receiving your letter of the 29th December 1944, I have made enquiries into the requisitioning of transport for A. C. needs.

It is quite true that the demand for 1,700 vehicles made in LAC 51 of 20th August, 1944 was for the area North of the Pisa-Rimini line but the change from "South of the line" was occasioned by the fact that Washington had agreed to supply tyres and tubes for the 3,000 indigenous vehicles which have been found in Central Italy. I am informed that this change was agreed by Transportation Sub-Commission, A.C.

However, it appears to be well understood now that the 1,700 vehicles coming forward will be committed to North West Italy and that in addition a further 3,000 will be required, each capable of a 3 ton lift, or alternatively sufficient vehicles to ensure a 6,000 ton lift. You should bear in mind, however, that the precise area in which these vehicles will be used will depend on the operational picture at the time when they arrive.

Mr. Villa, as you know, has spent several days here and left for Washington on 5th January 1945. He has taken with him the necessary requisitions for:

- (a) 2,000 trucks $2\frac{1}{2}$ /3 tons)
200 Cars $\frac{1}{2}$ ton or 2 str) For North West Italy
- (b) 35 Cars $\frac{1}{2}$ ton or 2 str) For administration of
200 Motor-cycles) present AC Transport
- (c) Raw Materials for tyre repairs in existing plants
- (d) Raw materials for new Tyre Repair and Retreading Plant at Tivoli.

All action has, therefore, been taken by this Headquarters to place the demands for the supplies you need and a Staff Officer from G-5 Section is accompanying Mr. Villa to Washington.

Dear General:

I have received a cable from the U. S. Department of State in Washington requesting Mr. Anthony Villa of this Headquarters to proceed urgently there with a revised requisition of AC Transportation requirements in Northwest Italy.

Mr. Villa will go immediately to AFHQ to have the requisition for 2,000 3-ton vehicles concurred in by your Headquarters.

It would appear opportune for me to explain the AC position on transportation requirements in Italy.

In May of 1944 a requisition was submitted by this Headquarters for 2,000 3-ton vehicles to be used in Central Italy up to the Pisa-Rimini line.

6 August this requisition was revised downward to 1,700 3-ton trucks in view of the quantity of civilian vehicles found in Rome. In the same letter AC requested to be advised at the earliest if requisitions were to be submitted for the North.

20 August LAC airgram 51 was sent to the CCS requesting the 1,700 3-ton trucks be for north rather than south of Pisa-Rimini. AC did not receive a copy of the airgram until some time after it had been dispatched. 2101

You will note from the copy of the airgram that on the basis of the justification used by AC for south of the Gothic line it was deduced by AFHQ that 4,796 3-ton trucks would be required north of the line.

The airgram then states, however, that the Allied Commission "have taken rather an optimistic view on the quantity of transport required and have submitted a reasonable and conservative estimate (1,700 load carrying vehicles)". AC was not consulted on this and did not take an optimistic view, but rather had a completely different area under consideration.

In November 1944 a new requisition was submitted to AFHQ, this time for north of the Gothic line. The number of vehicles requested was reduced by AFHQ to two-thirds of what AC considered the requirements to be.

Operational Planning, GAE, G-4, and G-5 determined that an airgram should be dispatched to the CCS requesting 2,000 3-ton trucks. In effect, LAC airgram 907 was sent, stating that formal requisition would follow.

In the meanwhile, it will be necessary to commit the 1,700 vehicles which are understood to be coming forward to the Northwest rather than in Central Italy where they are still required. As you are aware, the 1,700 turned out to be 1½ instead of 3-toners.

I have wished to make this position clear, in the first place for your information, and secondly, in the hope that there may be no delay in your Headquarters in obtaining concurrence on the formal requisition so that representation may be made to CCS of the urgent need of 2,000 3-ton vehicles for Northwest Italy.

Subject :- Survey of A.C. Vehicle Maintenance and spare parts.

Capt W.F. Shinton and Capt. J.A. Stieber were assigned by A.F.H.O., W.I.C.U.S.A. to carry out a survey of requirements of maintenance equipment and spare parts for Allied Commission vehicles and make recommendations for their procurement.

At a conference held on 23rd October 1944 with the following present, Col. Carnes, Major D.I.D. Bruce, REME, Capt. W.H. Bauner, Capt. W.F. Shinton, Capt. J.A. Stieber, and Lieut. D.P. Moss, RMGC it was decided to form two teams, Major D.I.D. Bruce and Capt. W.F. Shinton to survey maintenance equipment requirements and Capt. J.A. Stieber and Lieut. D.P. Moss to survey the spare parts requirements.

A survey was first made of the Rome Area as to the maintenance facilities, the spare parts on hand and the installations which might be suitable for higher echelon maintenance and a central spare parts warehouse. On 28 Oct 44 it was recommended that the Fiat Garage in Rome was the most suitable for these purposes - it was also recommended that civilian tools and equipment be supplemented by additional W.D. tools and equipment. A survey of the Southern Region was begun on 30 Oct. The spare parts were found to be widely distributed and insufficient, and it was recommended that a completely new spare parts system be set up, with a central parts depot to regulate the flow of parts.

Higher Echelon Maintenance was found to be carried out mainly by American Ordnance and REME and it was recommended that lower echelon work be carried out in provincial garages and a shop be equipped at the U.I.C. Motor Pool Naples for third echelon repairs and "in vehicle overhaul".

On 17 Nov 44 the equipment deemed necessary for the Rome Area and the Southern Region was requisitioned.

On 20 Nov 44 a survey was begun of Regions V and VIII. Region V was found to be badly in need of 2nd Echelon Tools and some 3rd Echelon equipment to supplement the existing civilian equipment in the provincial garages. No recommendation was made at this time for this area as all existing facilities are at present being utilised by Army, however it was recommended that the Fiat Works at Florence be acquired as soon as possible. Equipment for establishing a 4th Echelon shop at this point will be needed and should be made available at once in order that A.C. can carry on its maintenance as Army moves out. The equipment necessary for Region V and the Provincial Garage at Siena was requisitioned on 6 Dec 44.

A complete set of requisitions were prepared, based on the requirements of a 90 day period for all American W.D. Vehicles now under the control of A.C. It has been assumed that the 1700 trucks now being turned over to the Allied Commission will be accompanied by sufficient spare parts to maintain them over a 90 day period. Requisitions for spare parts after the initial three months period should include these latter vehicles in the basis. Any salvage vehicles received for the purpose of supplementing the spare parts stock should be deducted from the future requisitions for spares.

The Pirelli Company which operates the Tivoli plant has indicated that the sizes indicated in Paragraph 10 can be produced if it were possible to send a representative to their plant located at Manresa, near Barcelona, Spain, for the purpose of obtaining drawings and technical data with respect to fabrication of moulds in Italy.

12. Application has been made for minimum essential electrical requirements. Assurance has been given that the necessary power will be made available.

13. It is estimated that 1,270 tons of coal will be required to carry on operations for six months. Sardinian coal is to be used for this purpose and arrangements are being made for transporting the necessary tonnage from Sardinia.

14. From the point of view of employment, reactivation of this plant will result in more than 600 people being gainfully employed. It is expected to have the plant operating on a 24 hour basis within two weeks of receipt of supplies.

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15. It is planned to have the Pirelli Company assume the responsibility for reactivation and production of the Tivoli plant. The Allied Commission will supervise the allocation and prices of tires and tubes; as well as the supply of controlled and imported materials.

With reference to letter from Lt.Col.G.S.Franklin, R.C.A.S.C., Economics and Supply Division, AFHQ to Col.Butterworth, re., requisition for tools, a consolidated report and requisition is now submitted. This includes tools necessary to maintain the 1,700 vehicles which are due to arrive in the next two or three months and those for the 3,000 vehicles which have been asked for, North Western Italy.

1. BASIC Items suggested on this requisition are based on the results of a survey of buildings and equipment suitable for higher echelon, maintenance in Southern, Rome and Northern Area.

2. FINDINGS OF SURVEY TEAM

(A) Vehicle Distribution

Southern Area H.Q. Naples

The approximate number of vehicles, American and British, at present employed in this Area is 600 but this number varies owing to several reasons, namely, seasonal requirements, crops, road construction etc., those vehicles being temporarily transferred from other regions.

Rome Area.

H.Q.Rome, Regions 4 and 5

The approximate number of British and American military vehicles in these Regions is 720. This number also varies as in the Southern Area.

Northern Area

Regions 8,9,11,12, Liguria, Piemonte

The number to date in these Regions of British and American military vehicles is 415. This number will be greatly increased by the 1,700 vehicles which are expected to arrive in the near future and again by the addition of 3,000 vehicles which have been requested for North Western Italy.

(B) Vehicle Maintenance

SUBJECT : A.C. Requisition for Higher Echelon Tools and Equipment.

With reference to letter from Lt.Col.J.S.Franklin, R.C.A.S.C., Economics and Supply Division, AFHQ to Col.Butterworth, re., requisition for tools, a consolidated report and requisition is now submitted. This includes tools necessary to maintain the 1,700 vehicles which are due to arrive in the next two or three months and those for the 3,000 vehicles which have been asked for, North Western Italy.

1. BASIC Items suggested on this requisition are based on the results of a survey of buildings and equipment suitable for higher echelon, maintenance in Southern, Rome and Northern Area.

2. FINDINGS OF SURVEY TEAM

2088

(A) Vehicle Distribution

Southern Area H.Q. Naples

The approximate number of vehicles, American and British, at present employed in this Area is 600 but this number varies owing to several reasons, namely, seasonal requirements, crops, road construction etc., those vehicles being temporarily transferred from other regions.

Rome Area.

H.Q.Rome, Regions 4 and 5

The approximate number of British and American military vehicles in these Regions is 730. This number also varies as in the Southern Area.

Northern Area

Regions 8,9,11,12, Liguria, Piemonte

The number to date in these Regions of British and American military vehicles is 415. This number will be greatly increased by the 1,700 vehicles which are expected to arrive in the near future and again by the addition of 3,000 vehicles which have been requested for North Western Italy.

(B) Vehicle Maintenance

At present first and second Echelon Maintenance is being carried out by A.C. Regional Garages, Higher Echelon on Civilian Vehicles and occasionally on military vehicles by civilian garages.

Higher Echelon repairs on military vehicles are being done mainly by American Ordnance and R.E.M.E. Workshops.

A preventative maintenance programme which is a combination of American and British maintenance procedure has been instituted by Allied Commission. This programme includes an inspection on each vehicle every tenth day.

The Allied Commission at present does not have the necessary tools and equipment to perform all of their higher echelon maintenance.

3. RECOMMENDATIONS

(A) That the first and second echelon work on military vehicles be accomplished at the established Provincial Garages, with emergency major unit replacement and repair as directed by the Regional Transport Officer. This to be carried out in garages with adequate personnel and equipment. Some additional equipment and hand tools will be necessary at certain of these garages.

(B) It is recommended that heavy repair shops be established to which will be evacuated all repairs beyond the scope of the Provincial Garages.

(C) Since heavy repairs on A.C. military vehicles are at present being carried out by military workshops additional equipment will be required by Allied Commission to take over the entire maintenance of all their vehicles. It has been found that the existing civilian facilities are only adequate for the maintenance of civilian vehicles. The load on these civilian shops is becoming increasingly heavy owing to the supply of spare parts being almost exhausted and replacements not obtainable due to the fact that the factories are still in enemy hands.

Southern Area

(A) It is recommended that a third echelon shop or the British Area equivalent be established and equipped in Naples for the Southern Area.

(B) It is suggested that the U.T.C. Motor Pool Garage, 56-58 Brindisi Street be used for the purpose. This location consists of three buildings with a total of 30,000 sq. feet of floor space. The buildings are in good condition and very suitable for the purpose.

Rome Area

(A) It is recommended that a third and fifth echelon or Base shop be established in Rome.

(B) To carry out this plan it would be necessary to furnish the Allied Commission with the equipment for a third and fifth echelon or Base shop and also the initial stock of Major Assemblies for exchange purposes until such time as the Base shop had built up a supply.

(C) The shop recommended for Rome Area is the Fiat Garage, Via Porta Maggiore. This garage is well equipped but requires the additional equipments as recommended, has good workshop personnel, the buildings have been partly damaged but are now under repair.

(D) In Region 5 Allied Commission Garages were inspected and found to have adequate space and personnel capable of second echelon repair. All of these garages are urgently in need of hand tools and second echelon equipment.

(E) It is recommended in addition to the lower echelon equipment that three of these garages be given some additional higher echelon

(B) It is recommended that heavy repair shops be evacuated beyond the scope of the Provincial Garages. will be evacuated all repairs beyond the scope of the Provincial Garages.

(C) Since heavy repairs on A.C. Military vehicles are at present being carried out by military workshops additional equipment will be required by Allied Commission to take over the entire maintenance of all their vehicles. It has been found that the existing civilian facilities are only adequate for the maintenance of civilian vehicles. The load on these civilian shops is becoming increasingly heavy owing to the supply of spare parts being almost exhausted and replacements not obtainable due to the fact that the factories are still in enemy hands.

Southern Area

(A) It is recommended that a third echelon shop or the British equivalent be established and equipped in Naples for the Southern Area.

(B) It is suggested that the U.T.C. Motor Pool Garage, 56-58 Brindisi Street be used for the purpose. This location consists of three buildings with a total of 30,000 sq. feet of floor space. The buildings are in good condition and very suitable for the purpose.

Rome Area

(A) It is recommended that a third and fifth echelon of Base shop be established in Rome.

(B) To carry out this plan it would be necessary to furnish the Allied Commission with the equipment for a third and fifth echelon or Base shop and also the initial stock of Major Assemblies for exchange purposes until such time as the Base shop had built up a supply.

(C) The shop recommended for Rome Area is the Fiat Garage, Via Porta Maggiore. This Garage is well equipped but requires the additional equipments as recommended, has good workshop personnel, the buildings have been partly damaged but are now under repair.

(D) In Region 5 Allied Commission Garages were inspected and found to have adequate space and personnel capable of second echelon repair. All of these garages are urgently in need of hand tools and second echelon equipment.

(E) It is recommended in addition to the lower echelon equipment that three of these garages be given some additional higher echelon equipment to enable them to perform "In vehicle overhaul".

(F) It is suggested that these shops be located at the Truck Pool Garages at Pescara, Ascoli and Macerata.

Northern Area

(A) Due to the concentration of Army units in this Area the existing facilities are being utilised by the Armies.

(B) The S.I.T.A. Garage in Florence is now being used for the repair of Allied Commission vehicles. This garage is small but reasonably well equipped and except for a few times, is capable of higher echelon maintenance on a very limited number of vehicles. The area of the building is approximately 10,000 sq.ft. and with no adjacent parking space for disabled vehicles.

(C) The Fiat Works at Florence, if it were available, for A.C. use, would be a very suitable building for the carrying out of future higher echelon maintenance in this Region.

(D) It is recommended that another Fourth Echelon Set, No.2 be requisitioned to maintain the 3,000 vehicles which have been asked for, for North Western Italy. .

4. RECOVERY

(A) At the present the only vehicles that Allied Commission have for recovery purposes are three 3 1/2 ton 6 x 6 G.M.C. trucks equipped with Second Echelon Set No.7 Barrel Hoist and Superstructure.

These vehicles are not capable of recovering the heavy trucks or lighter trucks when loaded. British and American Army shops are called upon for heavy duty wrecker service to supplement the existing A.C. equipment.

(B) It is recommended that at least four 6 x 6 - 4 ton Diamond T wreckers or Tractors Six-wheeled Brackdown be supplied. These to be located at the third and fourth echelon workshops.

Will you please speak to Col. Martino about A.C. Requisition 49-45 for Tools.

Point out to him that the Requisition covers only the Rome and Naples areas over which a survey was conducted by British and American Ordnance Officers.

Rather than put in piece meal requisitions on CCS it is suggested that AC revise 49-45 to take care of tools required to maintain the 1,700 vehicles which have already been called forward and are due to arrive in the next two or three months.

They should also consider tools necessary to maintain the 3,000 vehicles which we have asked for, for North Western Italy.

These requirements should be declared regardless of the fact that vehicles may be disposed of to the Italian Government, as it is unlikely that Italian workshop facilities will be able to cope with the maintenance of this fleet for some time to come.

Military Vehicles are at present being carried out by Military Workshops additional equipment will be required by Allied Commission to take over the entire maintenance of all of their vehicles. It has been found that the existing civilian facilities are only adequate for the maintenance of civilian vehicles. The load on these civilian shops is becoming increasingly heavy owing to the supply of spare parts being almost exhausted and not obtainable due to the fact that the factories are still in enemy hands. It is recommended that a 3rd. Echelon Shop or the British equivalent be established and equipped at Naples for the Southern Region. It is suggested that the U.T.C. Motor Pool Garage, 56-58 Brindisi Street be used for the purpose. This location consists of three buildings with a total of 30,000 sq.ft. of floorspace. The buildings are in good condition and very suitable for the purpose. It is recommended that a 3rd. and 5th Echelon or Base Shop be established in Rome. To carry out this plan it would be necessary to furnish the Allied Commission with the equipment for a 5th. Echelon or Base shop and also the initial stock of major assemblies for exchange purposes until such time as the Base Shop had built up a supply. It would also be necessary to furnish a 3rd. Echelon Set. No. 1 or the equivalent British but in the arrangements could be made for the transfer of the equipment at P.B.S.-M.M. Shop No. 3 the 3rd. Echelon Set No. 1 for Rome would not be required. As an alternative if the P.B.S. Shop does not become available the Fiat Garage, Via di Porta Maggiore is available for the establishment of both the 3rd and 5th Echelon Repairs. Recommendations for Northern Area will be submitted as soon as the survey is completed. For the period of time required for the establishment of these shops additional skilled military personnel should be made available for a long enough period to enlist and train civilians. <u>Recovery Vehicles.</u> At the present the only vehicles that Allied Commission have for recovery purposes are three 2 1/2 ton 6 x 6 G.M.C. Trucks equipped with 2nd. Echelon Set No. 7 Barrel Hoist and Super Structure.

SUBJECT : Survey of Allied Commission Maintenance facilities.

Major D.T.D. Brice and Capt. W.F. Shipton U.S. Ordnance have carried out a survey of the necessary equipment for maintenance of Allied Commission vehicles in Regions V and VIII. The following findings and recommendations are submitted.

Findings and Recommendations

A. Region VIII

1. Due to the concentration of army units in this Region the existing facilities are being utilized by the armies.
2. The S.I.T.A. Garage in Florence is now used for the repair of Allied Commission Vehicles. This Garage is well equipped except for a few items and is capable of higher echelon maintenance on a limited number of vehicles. The area of the building is approximately 10,000 sq. feet and with no adjacent parking space for disabled vehicles.
3. The Fiat works in Florence, if it were available for Allied Commission use, would be a very suitable building for the carrying out of future higher echelon maintenance in this Region.
4. In the Southern part of this Region the S.A.S.S. Garage in Siena is being used for maintenance. This Garage is fairly well equipped and has the space and personnel for carrying out a program of "In Vehicle Overhaul" over and above the replacement of major assemblies.
5. A small amount of additional equipment will be required to carry out this program.

B. Region V

1. Allied Commission Garages in this region were inspected and found to have adequate space and personnel capable of third Echelon repair. All of these garages are urgently in need of hand tools and second Echelon equipment.
2. It is recommended in addition to the lower Echelon equipment three of these Garages be given some additional higher echelon equipment to enable them to perform "In vehicle overhaul"
3. It is suggested that these shops be located at the Truck Pool Garages at Pescara, Ascoli and Macerata.

Majef D.T.D. Brice and Capt. W.F. Shipton U.S. Ordnance have carried out a survey of the necessary equipment for maintenance of Allied Commission vehicles in Regions V and VIII. The following findings and recommendations are submitted.

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C. Equipment.

It is recommended that the following equipment be requisitioned for use in maintenance of Allied Commission Vehicles in Regions V and VIII.

DELIVERY: Ship to Datto consigned as above. Shipment to be made as soon as possible if from Theatre stocks, otherwise, ship on or before 1 February 1945.

BASIS: (1) Items requested on this requisition are based on the result of a survey of buildings and equipment suitable for higher echelon maintenance in Rome and Naples areas.

(2) Findings of Survey Team.

A. Vehicle Distribution.

Southern Region H.Q. Naples.

The approximate number of vehicles American and British at present employed in this Region is 600 but this number varies owing to several reasons, namely, seasonal requirements, crops, road construction etc., these vehicles being temporarily transferred from other regions.

Rome Area.

Region IV and V, H.Q. Rome and H.Q. Anzio.

The approximate number of American and British military vehicles in these Regions is 550. This number also varies as in the Southern Region.

Northern Area.

Regions VIII and IX H.Q. Florence and H.Q. Bologna.

Not yet surveyed.

B. Vehicle Maintenance.

At present 1st and 2nd Echelon Maintenance is being carried out by A.C. Regional Garages, Higher Echelon on Civilian Vehicles and occasionally on Military Vehicles, by civilian garages.

Higher Echelon on Military Vehicles is being done mainly by American Ordnance and E.E.M.E. Workshops.

A preventative maintenance program which is a combination of American and British Maintenance procedure has been instituted by Allied Commission. This program includes an inspection on each vehicle every tenth day.

The Allied Commission at present does not have the necessary tools and equipment to perform all of their Higher Echelon Maintenance.

(3) The report of the survey contains certain recommendations. These are set forth as follows:

That 1st and 2nd. Echelon work in Military Vehicles be accomplished at the established Provincial Garages, with emergency Major Unit replacement as directed by the Regional Civil Transport Officer. This to be carried out in Garage with adequate personnel and equipment. Some additional hand tools and equipment will be necessary at certain of these Garages.

It is recommended that Heavy Repair Shops be established to which will be evacuated all repairs beyond the scope of the Provincial Garages.

Since heavy repairs on U. S. Military Vehicles are at present being carried out by Military Workshops additional equipment will be required by Allied Commission to take over the entire maintenance of all of their vehicles.

It has been found that the existing civilian facilities are only adequate for the maintenance of civilian vehicles. The load on these civilian shops is becoming increasingly heavy owing to the supply of spare parts being almost exhausted and not obtainable due to the fact that the factories are still in enemy hands.

It is recommended that a 3rd. Echelon Shop or the British equivalent be established and equipped at Naples for the Southern Region.

It is suggested that the U.S.C. Motor Pool Garage, 56-58 Brindisi Street be used for the purpose. This location consists of three buildings with a total of 30,000 sq. ft. of floor space. The buildings are in good condition and very suitable for the purpose. 2044

It is recommended that a 3rd. and 5th Echelon or Base Shop be established in Rome. To carry out this plan it would be necessary to furnish the Allied Commission with the equipment for a 5th. Echelon or Base Shop and also an initial stock of major assemblies for exchange purposes until such time as the Base Shop had built up a supply.

It would also be necessary to furnish a 3rd. Echelon Set No. 1 or the equivalent British but if the arrangements could be made for the transfer of the equipment at P.B.S. - M.M. Shop No. 3 the 3rd. Echelon Set No. 1 for Rome would not be required.

As an alternative if the P.B.S. Shop does not become available the Fiat Garage, Via di Porta Maggiore is available for the establishment of both the 3rd and 5th Echelon Repairs.

Recommendations for Northern Area will be submitted as soon as the survey is completed. For the period of time required for the establishment of these shops additional skilled military personnel should be made available for a long enough period to enlist and train civilians.

Recovery Vehicles.

At the present the only vehicles that Allied Commission have for recovery purposes are three 2 1/2 ton GMC C.M.C. Trucks equipped with 2nd. Echelon Set No. 7 Barrel Hoist and Super Structure.

These are not capable of recovering the heavy trucks or lighter trucks when loaded. British in American Army shops are called upon for heavy duty wrecker service to supplement the existing A.C. equipment. It is recommended that at least three 6 x 6 four ton Diamond T. wreckers or tractors Six Wheeler Breckmen be supplied. These to be located at the 3rd. Echelon Workshops.
