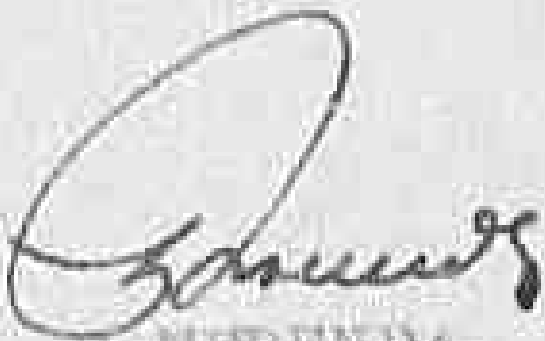

On entering 676 Whse the driver and guard were arrested. Stolen goods, confiscated, and the police informed.

When the criminals were being interrogated, they said never knew the stolen goods were there and implied very definitely that the persons concerned were those at 682 Whse.

The whole incident needs explaining in detail, for further unpleasant facts to emerge. Not with standing, it is quite obvious that proper measures have not been taken, to protect and ensure safe transportation of this merchandise, and does not increase confidence for the future.

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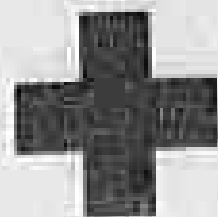

The windows of the premises, although high above the ground level, do not offer any guarantee due to the fact there are no doors. There also are large gridirons through which stolen goods may easily pass. *Reg Enzo has been requested to attend.*

Some windows are completely without gridirons and those that lead to the garden are protected by little barbed wire and completely unsurveyed.

The light is insufficient.

The little magazine, for broken stuff, leads to another *not* magazine which is blocked up by barbed wire and wooden boards. *used*

Some jute sack, warehoused in the office, are time to time taken by the British soldier for their personal use. *The bags went away.*

The laborer MOUTI Luigi (interpreter) is often called by the British soldiers. He leaves the warehouse with the rest of the laborers and, as I have often heard, for obvious reasons returns to the warehouse. *Soldiers now live outside where.*

It is reported that women, sometime, spend the night with the soldier, what they do can be imagined, what they bring when leaving the warehouse is not allowed to see. *Report is a report repeated cannot be accepted.*

The night guard, says that the little magazine, for the broken cases, is opened and it is not easy to see what they do inside. It is pointed out that the padlock key is not in our possession. *Stal Whacker now has it.*

This clears me of all responsibility in the event of irregularity and shortage of goods.

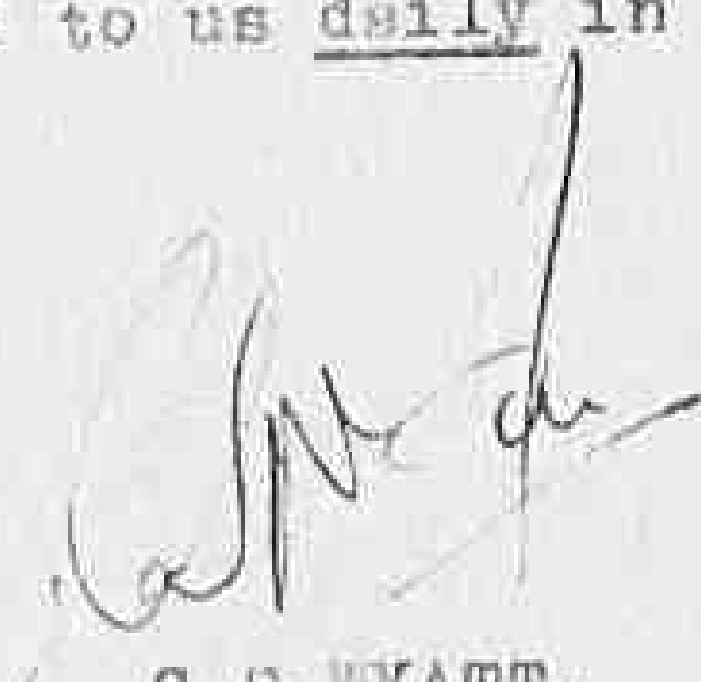

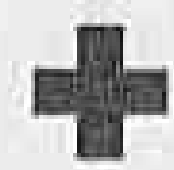

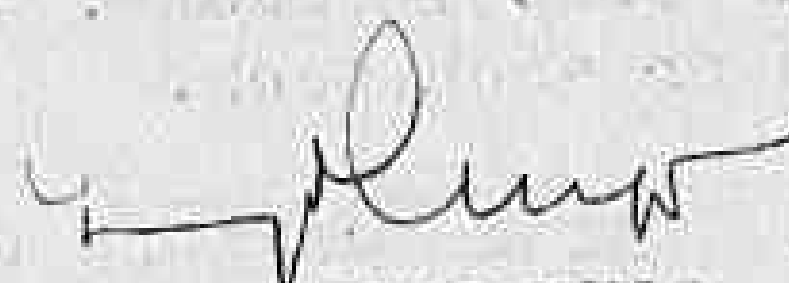

1. Reference your 1.32E/S of 15 January addressed to Transportation Sub-Commission, with copy to Finance Sub-Commission, we must point out that this Sub-Commission is not competent to fix charges for warehousing; such charges must be fixed by the technical branch responsible for warehousing. The Finance Sub-Commission will cooperate to the best of its ability in rendering accounts to UNRRA and the American Red Cross, but all the data for making out the bills must be supplied by the Transportation Sub-Commission who are the only agency competent to do this.

2. On completion of the negotiations in progress between Transportation Sub-Commission, Finance Sub-Commission and the Federazione dei Consorzi Agrari whereby it is hoped that the Federazione will take over the Naples and all other AC warehouses, settlement for UNRRA and Red Cross warehousing charges would presumably be effected direct between these organisations and the Federazione.

1. You have asked for the position re the above warehouse and stock to be defined so that you can make the necessary arrangements.

2. Capt. KLEIN, with seven soldiers, thirteen labourers and some assistance from Carabinieri, has previously been in charge of this warehouse.

3. By letter 20/111/79/1/11 Dec. 44 from The Director Transportation S.O. I received instructions to make arrangements forthwith to incorporate 682 warehouse in my organisation and to submit my recommendations. By interpretation of this is that 682 merely becomes one more warehouse under our charge.

4. The soldiers on duty at 682 have already been reduced to three in number by various causes.

5. The strike at 677 wasted several days of your time and mine.

6. My recommendations are:

(a) to take 682 into a "lock up" warehouse under Italian Military Guard and survey of my soldiers and your warehouse keeper.

(i). The Italian guard need not enter the warehouse except in case of fire, robbery, etc.

(ii). The keys will be held by you or your warehouse keeper, and a soldier will probably accompany him on surveys if one is not left in continuous attendance.

(iii). I will endeavour to have the window etc. blocked up.

(b). to have all the broken packages repacked into casks and contents checked and labelled.

NOTE: This work is proceeding under the survey.

(c). when (b) is complete, to take a full inventory of the whole stock.

NOTE: It has been suggested that the present A.R.C. books and forms should continue in use. For dispatches to and receipts from Red Cross warehouses this should be done, but for your own internal accounts you can, if you desire, use your own system.

(d). that your warehouse keeper and one soldier will attend all receipts into and deliveries from the warehouse.

(e). that loadings to and unloadings from rail be done at 576 and that you order the necessary motor lorries from U.T.C. - chargeable to the A.R.C.

(f). that receipts and dispatches be advised as laid down in our General Instructions and in short that the A.R.C. become a "customer" of these warehouses and that your services and facilities are at their disposal.
