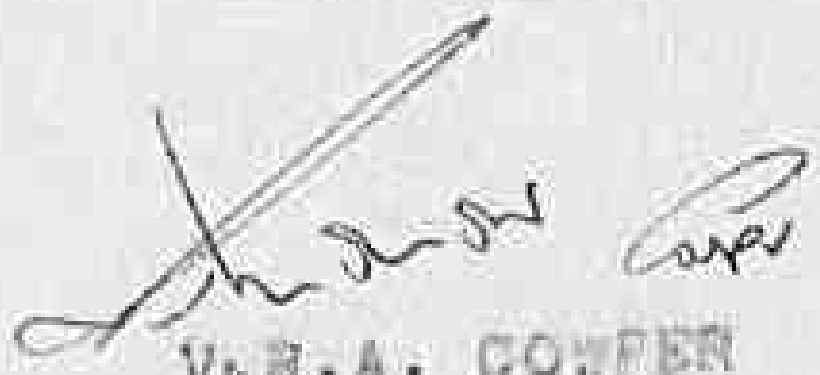

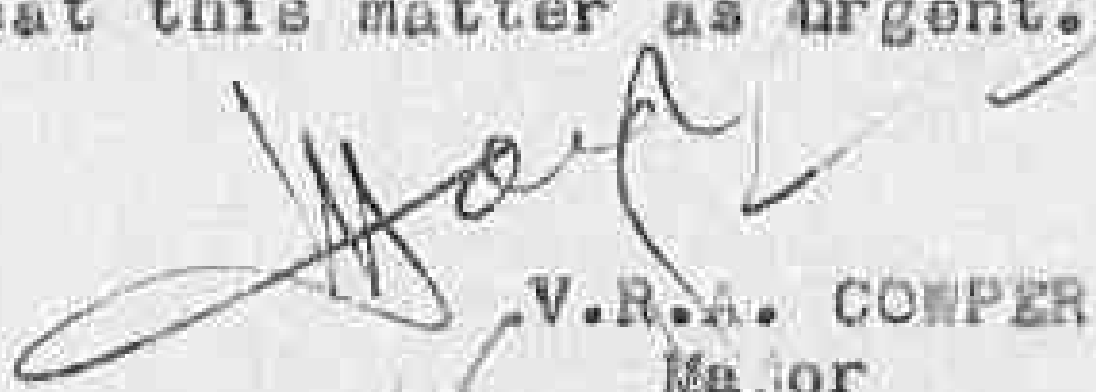

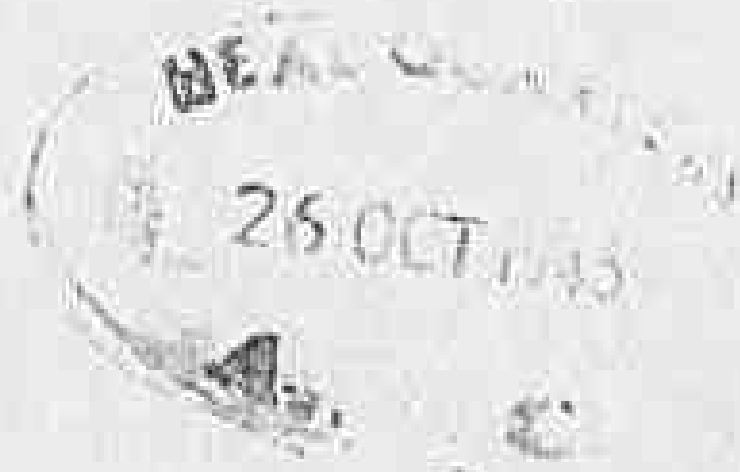

Provision of damage for the Allied Commission port depot is a matter for Allied Commission, who should ask the Italian Government to supply what is wanted. Extensive forest areas in the south of Italy were derequisitioned and turned back to the Italian Government in September, and they should have no difficulty in providing small quantities of timber in this connection. It is suggested that you should refer this matter to the Italian Government through the Agriculture Sub-Commission. ✓

1. Reference your ES/S.OB of 16 October 1945.
2. If macaroni has never been accepted by Federconsorzi, as agent of Italian Government, and is therefore not Italian Government property, arrangements could be made for it to be accepted on a "Receiving Report" Instructions could then be issued to Italian Government to sell the macaroni to the Republic of San Marino.
3. Enquiries are meanwhile being made as to the actual origin and present status of the macaroni.
4. The provision of imported food supplies for the Republic of San Marino is now a responsibility of the Italian Government. However, this matter has been taken up with the Ministry of Food recently (vide attached copies of letters to Ministry of Food) and a remainder will be sent.

1. We regret to say there's not a piece of damage to be picked up in and around Ancona. Contact was made with Mr. DALLI of the W.S.A. who admitted he also was in need of damage and had to send to Bari for some.
2. We've been to see Capt. Smith of Movements and he too claims they've ^{no} need of lumber. That they have had to stock items in the Port without any damage. The S.S.T.O. did have a small quantity but it was sent to Bari.
3. As to the quantity needed for our warehouses, it is hard to judge. Considering what we have on hand I'd say we could do very well with about 30,000 P.T. (approx. 40 Tons.).

1. The warehouse referred to - Via la Piana 4 - Ancona belonging to the Consorzio Agrario Provinciale and now occupied by the Welfare Service, would not in my opinion be suitable as a warehouse for the Federazione. It is small, holding approximately 3 to 4 hundred tons and is situated in an awkward spot for trucks. Four or five parked trucks would cause a traffic jam, something I'm certain the 'City Fathers' would not approve of. Also, it would take time to oust the present occupants and for the amount of tonnage space made available it would hardly be worth the trouble.

2. At the present time we have on hand enough closed space to warehouse an additional 15,000 tons. This includes a new warehouse recently acquired at Viale della Vittoria No 2 A and 2 B which holds about 700 tons. as time goes on more closed space is being acquired at the Tobacco Factory and in the Port, space that had been formerly used by R.A.S.O. and the Royal Navy all of which is in tip-top shape. In addition to this repairs are going on continually in various parts of the Tobacco Factory so that we may utilise every nook. Our intentions are to house everything possible for the coming winter.

3. It is my contention we can very well dispense with the warehouse located at Via la Piana 4.

Meeting to be held at 1100 hrs 24 Sept. to discuss any difficulties arising from the handover of Ancona Port in its entirety to the Italian Authorities.

In accordance with the agreements of the Allied and Italian Central Authorities and now the subsequent agreements accepted locally at Ancona by the Commandante del Porto and the Allied Port Authorities the following points are hereby established:

1. W.e.f. 0800 hrs 1 October 45 the Port of Ancona becomes a Category 'A' port, that is to say, the port is handed over to the Italian Authorities in its entirety.
2. The port will be entirely under the control of the Commandante del Porto who will run it in accordance with the existing Italian laws and regulation.
3. If at any time there is a military cargo to be handled either for export or import this shall be given the necessary priority to ensure that programmed dates are met. The Military authorities will give the earliest possible warning to Capitano del Porto that a military berth is required.
4. In the event of para 3 military responsibility will be limited to the reception on quay and clearance, or delivery to ship's side for loading of all military cargoes. The actual loading and discharge of ships will be in accordance with normal civil practice.
Checking and documentation in military ships not completed by 1 Oct will be finished by the Allied Authorities under their own system. Quay and craft clearance will be taken over forthwith at 0800 hrs 1 Oct. by Italian Authorities.
5. No Allied Military Police will be on duty in the Docks Area excepting in the case of a Military ship being on the berth or in cases of emergency when called upon by the Italian Authorities.
6. All huttings and warehousing in the Docks Area will be taken over by Commandante del Porto with the exception of the Nissen on Berth 12, the Romney on Berth 17 and accommodation still required for remaining, Transportation Docks personnel.
7. All dock passes are to be surrendered and application where necessary are to be made to 61 Area for new ones dated from 1 Oct. 45.
8. All lighting telephone and water installations already existing will be left until Italian technical staff can make the necessary substitution.
9. Lighterage, cargo handling gear and Tn equipment to be handed over is being arranged by Docks Sept.

(Your reference No. A/GAR/III/4426)

TO : High Commissioner for Food

1. Investigation has been made of the premises owned by the Consorzio Agrario Provinciale di Ancona at Via La Piana No 4 in Ancona, to which reference is made in your above mentioned letter.

2. It has indeed been found that the premises are occupied by the Welfare Service and efforts are being made to have them evacuated so that they can again be used by the Consorzio.

3. However, information received indicates that these premises will hold only some 500 or 600 tons of foodstuffs at most and that their use would not do much to alleviate the difficult situation in Ancona.

4. For your information, Allied Commission Warehouse Officers at Ancona have been in touch with the local Military authorities, who have promised a certain excellent warehouse space to be made available in the very near future when this space is no longer needed by the British Army.

2. The Consorzio Agrario Provinciale of Ancona has informed us that because of the present needs of the city it is not in the condition to enlarge the storehouses.

3. The same Consorzio has proposed that the situation would be greatly helped if it could obtain the derequisition of its own storehouses in Ancona - Via Le Piane No. 4, presently occupied by the Welfare Service.

4. We beg the Ports and Warehouse Div. to courteously examine our request adopting measures in regard and keeping us informed.

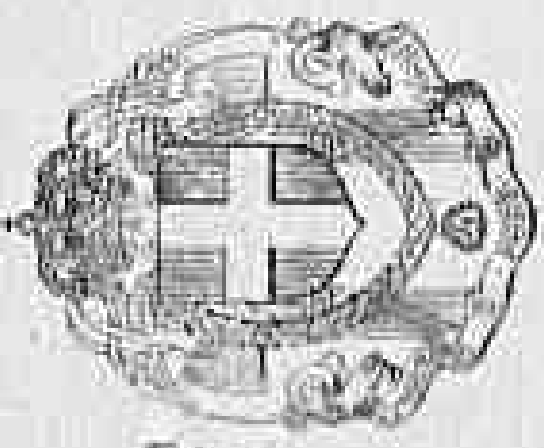

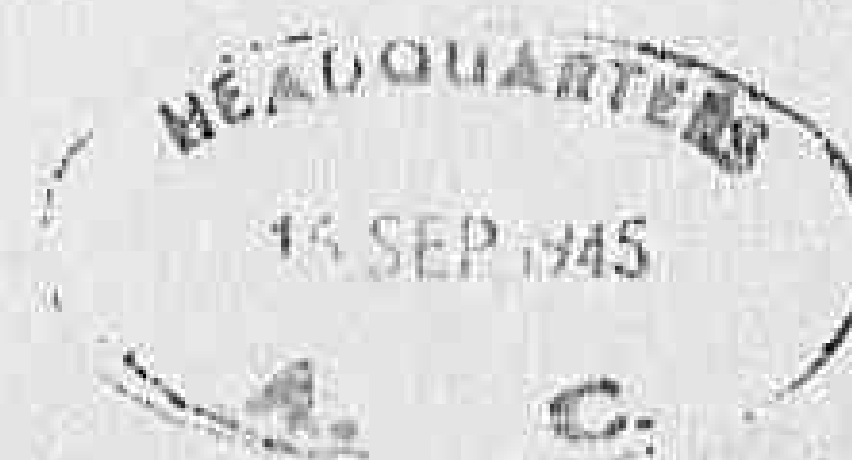

At 20.30 hours on Friday 24th of August 1945,
a telephone message was received at this Office
from 183 Provost Coy. to the effect that an
Italian driver from N° 7 Truck Pool was at
their Office and complained that he, together
with another driver, had been held up at
Torrette, the people concerned had directed
the drivers to Osimo - Filottrano area where
the 7 tons. of sugar which the two drivers were
taking to Forlì had been unloaded.

Upon receipt of this information, in company
with Sgt. Spencer of this Section, I went to
the H.Q. 183 Provost Coy. where I interviewed
GINEVRI Carlo who stated that about 15.30 hrs.
on Wed. 22nd. of August; 4 men in a Balilla
Car Reg. N° AN8802 had stopped them and one man
armed with a pistol had asked him if he was
going to Foell. He replied that he was.
This man then informed him that the load had
to be redirected and he would show him where
to take it.

He explained that the 2nd. truck driven by DRA-
GHETTI Umberto who was following him with the
remainder of the consignment, had likewise been
stopped and redirected to.

Two of the occupants of the Balilla car could
be identified by GINEVRI as being BELLONI
and SASSO both residing at Osimo.

An Italian civilian BELLONI Mario was present
in the Provost H.Q. and GINEVRI stated that
he was one of the persons on the Balilla car.
BELLONI when interviewed denied all knowledge

of the facts.

GINEVRI stated that on his arrival back at the Truck Pool about 18.30 hours he reported the matter to Pellicione Sante 202 Via Flaminia Borghetto who was the accountant on duty who told him to keep his mouth shut and everything would be alright.

I then accompanied GINEVRI to the farm, to where, he said, he had delivered the sugar, in Casa Nuova, the same being placed under some stars near a stack by three men and a girl. A search of this area was made but no trace of sugar could be found.

From the time the offence was committed to the time that the loss was discovered by the Federazione Italiana Consorzi Agrari, 48 hours had elapsed, during which period very heavy rain had fallen, obliterating all tracks or marks, where the truck had supposedly turned round in the farmyard.

At 0900 hours on Saturday 25th August 1945 I interviewed DRAGHETTI the driver of the second truck, who stated that when GINEVRI stopped in TORRETTE he DRAGHETTI, also had to stop, owing to the fact that he was driving close behind. A man approached him asked if he was going to Follì, to which DRAGHETTI replied in the affirmative. This man got into the driver's cab, pointed a pistol at him and told him to drive where he was directed. He was directed to PASSATEMPO by way of Osimo. From there, down a cart track teeming leading to some farm houses. About 300 yards down this track, he was told to cross a field to where some Canapa canes were growing.

The sugar was then unloaded and stacked among the canes by three men and the driver.

The farms in this area were visited and I ascertained that the vehicle was seen to unload the sugar, although the occupants of the farms denied that they knew at the time that it was sugar. I learned that BRANDONI GIULIO N° 35 Via Monte Faneso and CAMILETO Emilio N° 75 Via Montefanese, PASSATEMPO had been arrested by the Carabinieri and were in the Civil Prison Osimo.

Brandoni's farm is the farm, at which the sugar was unloaded.

On arrival at the Carabinieri Station I was made aware that 9 civilians had been arrested by the Carabinieri at PILOTTANO for being suspected in the transportation of the sugar from the places where it had been unloaded. The arrested persons being as follows:-

- 1) QUERZETTI Massimo in Cesare, aged 40 Pilottrano
- 2) GUARDALUPO Umberto di Giovanni, aged 21 Pilottrano
- 3) MAZZIERI Michele di Nazzareno, aged 27 Pilottrabo
- 4) BRANDONI Giulio di Antonio, aged 47 Passatempo
- 5) GIACCHETTI Ernesto, aged 46 Pilottrono

I then visited the home of SASSO Romolo at Osimo who on being questioned admitted unloading some sugar, but had been asked by a Judge Slav by the name of TRUMPECH residing in Osimo, saying that if

he wanted to earn some money to be at the cross roads on the Oslo mo. Passatempo road at 1700 hrs. where the vehicle would collect him. He went to the appointed place at the time arranged and was picked up together with another man who he did not know, and they went to unload the sugar SASSO was arrested and conveyed to the Civil Prison Ancona, together with the nine persons arrested by the Carabinieri pending interrogation.

On Monday 27th August 1945 the accountant of N° 7 Truck Pool was interviewed and related the following facts to me:

At about 13.00 hours on Wednesday 22nd August whilst he was having his lunch in a cafe at Torrette he was approached by a man who claimed to be a member of the Federconsorzi saying that he wanted the two trucks assigned to that organization to take some stores to Forlì would he arrange the necessary documents. He was questioned at length but denies all knowledge that he knew the man prior to the meeting in the cafe. He was then detained at the Civil Prison for further questioning.

All the other suspects were questioned but state that they do not know why they were arrested by the Carabinieri.

On Tuesday 28th August 1945 I went to the Offices of FICA where I interviewed the Chief Accountant and on being shown the two documents marked "A" and "B" informed me that the signature of Dott. Gagliardi had been forged and that the serial N° 612 was the serial for Monday the 20th August 1945. The third copy of the document had not been filed with the remainder of the copies. The document had been typed by the Olivetti long carriage typewriter all the staff were questioned and made to type a copy which was dictated by the Accountant to them, but all the staff spelt FEDERCONSORZI with an R and not Bedeconsorzi as on the forged document.

Owing to the fact that there are no Military personnel concerned into this case, the matter is being handed over to the Italian Civil Authorities.

1. At present Ancona inventories have reached an all time high, due to the heavy receipts of food, Red Cross supplies, and UNRRA supplies.

2. The type of warehouses used in Ancona leaves much to be desired. Better warehouses are not available.

3. Food Sub-Commission advises that in an effort to ameliorate this bad situation, they are arranging to allocate a several months' supply of foodstuffs to the neighboring provinces and regions, which will amount to perhaps 1500 tons.

4. It is an urgent necessity that this merchandise move from the warehouses in the immediate future. Every effort should be bent towards this end. Delay may cause spoilage and waste of supplies because of poor warehousing facilities at Ancona at present.

1. Allied Commission has been called upon to warehouse increasing quantities and tonnages of incoming civil supplies at Ancona. Present inventories are near an all time peak.

2. Allied Commission warehouse accommodation in Ancona has always left much to be desired. Despite cooperation from the Military authorities and the acquisition of several new depots, present accommodation is still inadequate. Depots are spread all over the area. Many are small. Great difficulty is found in unloading and loading the trucks because of limited entry into the depots.

3. It is requested that depots now used and previously used by the Military in and around Ancona be made available to the Allied Commission as the Military withdraws. Closed warehouse accommodation for at least an additional 20,000 tons is needed.

4. May this matter please be treated as urgent.

have made repeated applications for issue of four tyres,

The applications date back to May and I have verified
these facts.

The position is now reached where the car is off the
road owing to lack of tyres with the result that Port Clearance
is slowed down due to lack of supervision. As an instance
it can be quoted that one Warehouse is five miles from the
Control Point so that when a block is reported by the Port
Authorities a delay of two hours ensues whilst the Inspector
"hitch hikes" to the Warehouse. To this may be added the
sundry other uses of a car in controlling Port working.

It will be appreciated if these tyres can be issued
to the Federazione Italiana del Consorzi Agrari and it is
placed on record that, in my opinion, the lack of transportation
is causing complete chaos in the otherwise normal working of
this Port and is retarding the complete hand over to the
Civilian authorities.

1. At the time of the unloading of the S/S Merriman flour was being sent to Cesena directly from the Quay. According to Mr. Lorenzetti our chief clerk no notification of this car-load was sent our office and therefore nothing was known about this until Cesena acknowledged receipt. I might add at the time Morandi's checkers were not working for us, all checking being done by the Port.
After Cesena acknowledged receipt of 18 tons of flour on car N° IC360 (396 Sacks) our Office contacted the Dock Superintendent and verified the transaction.
Upon confirmation a Receiving Report from the S/S Merriman and a Transfer Note to Cesena was made out.

DEMUNTATION OF A THEFT.

Yesterday evening, at 18.50, an Allied camion No. 5603145 arrived to the quay Nos. 16-17 to load, together with some other camion making the same work, some sugar in order to carry it to our warehouse No. 1, in Flaminia road.

The controller of the Morandi & C. firm, who we have charged to receive the goods, made up a regular discharge of consignment, and our controller, charged to note all the numbers of the cars, to survey whether they arrive to the warehouse in two hours, noted also the number of that camion which were driven by an Allied soldier.

At 20.00 that camion had not yet arrived. Dr. Gagliardi Vittorio, who was making an inspection of the warehouse, was at once noticed about the remarkable delay of the car. He has been able to know:

1) that camion, when it went out from the precinct of the port has not asked for the Convoy note. We presume that the driver went out by a false paper;

2) the report center, which controls the transit of the cars, had not sent that car either to carry sugar, or any other goods;

We have at once referred to the Allied Portual Authorities and to the A.C. Porto & Warehous Division about that theft and what has been done.

If it will not be possible to get the total charge of the car, the loss of sugar will be 66 sacks for an amount of 90 quintals. 42.3

This is for your rule about the effects of insurance.

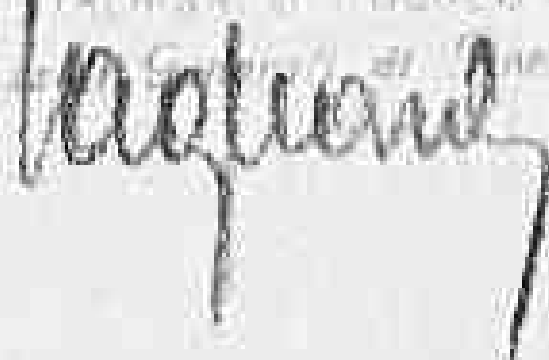

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of 16 June 1945, giving two reasons for the impracticability of the use of S.O.P. in Ancona Port.

2. The first reason, that Consorzio records are normally one to two days behind, will not be tolerated. Lt. Delmerico will take necessary steps with the Consorzio to rectify this condition. If assistance is needed from this Headquarters or from the Headquarters of the Federazione in Rome, it will willingly be given. For your information, similar systems are now in operation at other port warehouses and although the same objection was originally encountered, it was overcome by the use of additional qualified personnel.

3. Your second objection, the absence of clerical assistance in preparation of S.O.P. unless handed over to the Italians, also is received without approval. At least one EM/OR now on duty in Ancona should be assigned exclusively to work with you on Port Liaison problems. Selection of this individual should be agreed upon between you and Lt. Delmerico. He should have such assistance from Italians of the Federazione and ICE as is necessary.

4. It is not understood how or why the situation reference to S.O.P.'s is concerned with the confusion caused by the absence of efficient AC transportation, if you refer to lorries. If you refer to personal transportation, it is assumed that the two vehicles presently assigned in Ancona should be sufficient for this purpose. If your views are contrary, request such advice.

5. Finally, the S.O.P. system will be introduced in Ancona and every effort will be made to secure the assistance suggested above.
