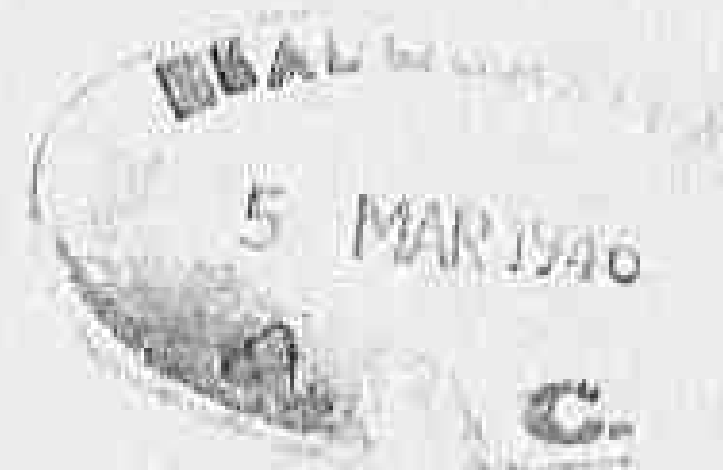

1. Information has been received from Transportation & Shipping Division that SS BRACKET SEND sailed from St. Johns, Newfoundland, on 19 January 1946 with 2,638 tons of cod fish, dried, on UNRRA account for Italy. No information is, however, at present forthcoming as to whether this fish is a part of the old UNRRA Italy Special Welfare Programme or a part of the new UNRRA Italy Programme.

2. Present procedure regarding diversions of UNRRA ships forming a part of the old programme is that UNRRA, AFHQ, decides these diversions and makes direct requests to WSA. Unless this authority is now transferred to the Bureau of Requirements and Distribution, UNRRA Italian Mission, numerous complications are bound to result, for it is very difficult to ascertain in due time whether an UNRRA cargo is against a requisition on account of the old programme, or a requisition on account of the new programme.

3. If responsibility for requesting diverting of UNRRA ships, no matter the programme, is vested in the Bureau of Requirements and Distribution (Sub-Bureau of Relief Supply), no unnecessary delay should occur in the future. Please, therefore, may such a transfer of responsibility be authorized at an early date.

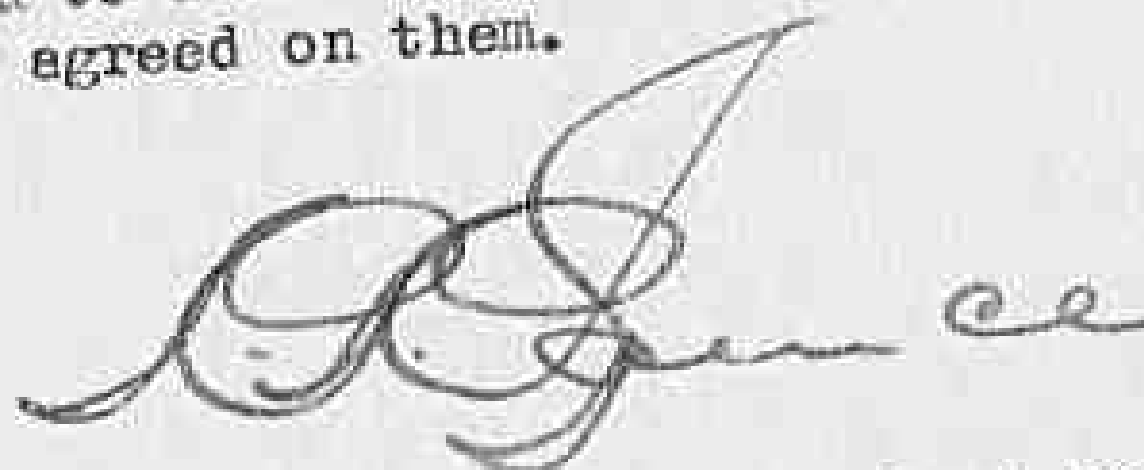

The following cable was forwarded to Allied Force Headquarters as of 2 January 1946:

"1. The following is a summary of steps being taken in transition of functions Economic Section alcom.

"2. Target date for the transfer of personnel to UNRRA payroll has been taken as 31 January 1946. This will include the supply-connected functions which are concentrated in the present organization under the Supply Group of the Economic Section.

"3. In this transfer to UNRRA it is recognized that there will be a period of perhaps as long as two months starting immediately, during which both alcom and UNRRA will be involved in the importation of basic supplies to Italy. Since a part of Economic Section of alcom will be absorbed into UNRRA Italian Mission, it has been agreed here that integration of the procedures for handling these two supply programs is desirable and can be accomplished as follows: certain key personnel will, during the transition period (about a month before and after the formal turnover date) hold appointments in both alcom and UNRRA and do business from day to day, in whichever capacity is appropriate to the particular tasks involved. Thus, for example, Cleveland, will act simultaneously as acting Vice President Economic Section alcom and as a deputy Chief of Mission for requirements and distribution, UNRRA Italian Mission.

"4. It is in our intention to abolish the Labor Subcommittee on 21 January 1946 after which the remaining advisory functions of this Subcommittee will be performed by labor attaches of two embassies. Within a next month we will be in position to transfer to 2 embassies the foreign trade functions now being performed by Commerce Subcommittee. The setting up of a Ministry of Foreign Affairs makes it possible to move reasonably quickly the direction of a formal reopening of private commercial trade between Italy and other countries. The transfer of operating functions being performed by Commerce Subcommittee, however, depends on a revision of the directive in T.M 456 as modified and extended by T.M 640.

"5. Transfer of any functions of Finance Subcommittee to

"2. Target date for the transfer of personnel to UNRAA payroll has been taken as 31 January 1946. This will include the supply-connected functions which are concentrated in the present organization under the Supply Group of the Economic Section.

"3. In this transfer to UNRAA it is recognized that there will be a transition of perhaps as long as two months starting immediately, during which both alcom and UNRAA will be involved in the importation of basic supplies to Italy. Since a part of Economic Section of alcom will be absorbed into UNRAA Italian Mission, it has been agreed here that integration of the procedures for handling these two supply programs is desirable and can be accomplished as follows: certain key personnel will, during the transition period (about a month before and after the formal turnover date) hold appointments in both alcom and UNRAA and do business from day to day, in whichever capacity is appropriate to the particular tasks involved. Thus, for example, Cleveland, will act simultaneously as acting Vice President Economic Section alcom and as a deputy Chief of Mission for requirements and distribution, UNRAA Italian Mission.

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"5. Transfer of any functions of Finance Subcommittee to Embassies presumably must wait on reply to MAT 965.

"6. Advisory functions of the Industry and Utilities Subcommittee, comprising particularly the development of projects for reconstruction financing, can be done at any time. COM 353 approved the performance of this function by the American Embassy. There has been no action yet as far as British Embassy is concerned.

"7. Transfer of captured enemy material functions to
 MAF in line with MAT 965 part 2 para C is recommended to take
 effect as soon as possible. We are sending you separate cable
 on this.

"8. Until the directive contemplated by TAM 718 and
 MAT 965 has been received, we lack certain parts of the authority
 to take steps liquidating Economic functions of the authority
 in view of the decisions which have previously taken place, and
 the indication of dates involved which are included in COM 353.
 I believe it is necessary to make plans for this transition and
 to set in motion as many administrative steps as we have autho-
 rity to take. The liquidation of the northern regions and the
 transfer of supply responsibility of UNRRA automatically force
 on us a number of immediate personnel decisions. The preceding
 paragraphs indicate the framework within which these day to day
 decisions are being made."

3. Italian Government has transmitted copies of the plan to the UNRRA Italian Mission under cover of letter quoted below and to Allied Commission under cover of a second letter also quoted below.

4. Detailed breakdown by commodities giving weights and value is shown in accompanying tables. Breakdown by month of loading is also given in agreed program but not included in this cable.

5. Loadings of following principal items are concentrated in first six months: wheat, sugar, fats and oils, cotton, wool, cellulose for rayon and paper, tanning extracts, rubber, carbon black, special cellulose for tires, cords, lumber, semifinished steel, cast iron, copper wire bars, tin, ammonium nitrate.

6. Program in Italy, accompanied by introductory notes and justifications, follows by telegram.

7. Letter from Italian Government to UNRRA Italian Mission, translated, reads as follows: "1. The Italian Government thanks the UNRRA mission most sincerely for the spirit of understanding shown in its appreciation of the essential needs of the Italian people and asks the mission to convey to the Headquarters of UNRRA its feelings of profound gratitude for the aid which the administration is about to give in 1946. 2. The Italian Government submits herewith a program of distribution drawn up in agreement with the Economic Section of Allied Commission and would appreciate it if the supplies to Italy in 1946 could follow this plan. 4. The present situation does not permit a precise evaluation of the economic development during the coming year, consequently, the distribution proposed in the program enclosed is firm for the first quarter only and should be consi-

dered as indicative for the later months. The Italian Government would like, if possible, a periodical revision of the program itself in accordance with the development of the country's economic activity, which will also depend on the conclusion of commercial agreements with other countries. 5. The program is drawn up, recognizing that the activities of UNRRA in 1946 will not be limited to assistance simply in feeding the populace, but will be directed also to give an initial impetus to recovery in the various other branches of the Country's economy. 6. This allocation by UNRRA represents for Italy an important contribution. However, the Italian Government once more feels it self duty bound to state that UNRRA's valuable aid will satisfy only the most elementary needs of Italian life and economy, whilst, to put the country on the road towards a higher standard of living and of economic efficiency, it is absolutely necessary to obtain credits to carry out the 'General Plan' of supplies drawn up by the government and already sent to the Allied authorities".

8. Letter from Italian Government to Allied Commission, translated, reads as follows: "1. the Italian renews its sincere thanks to the Allied Commission for the prompt steps it has taken to avoid an interruption in the early months of 1946 in the flow of materials essential to Italy, and present herewith a firm program showing the contribution which should be made by UNRRA in 1946 as part of the help which it wishes to give to Italy. 2. This program reflects the suggestions made by Allied Commission with whom it has been agreed. 3. The UNRRA contribution represents valuable aid generously given to Italy by the United Nations. However, it can serve only to maintain the standard of life and the Italian economy at their present modest level, from the point of view of both feeding and of productive capacity. The Italian Government therefore counts in the future on the valuable support of the Allied Commission in obtaining the finance necessary to cover the difference between the total need, set out in the 'General Plan' of the Italian Government and that part of the supplies which it is hoped will be undertaken by UNRRA. 4. Italy proposes to earn, as soon as possible, her place in the world economy and therefore intends to organize its foreign trade without delay, by means of procedure unencumbered by bureaucracy, which will permit the direct reestablishment of business relations. Manifestly this will be possible only when Italy has adequate foreign exchange at its disposal, but, so great is the need for imports such foreign funds can be obtained only through a maximum development of the export trade and the reclaiming of its former credit standing on foreign markets. 5. Italy cannot base its foreign trade solely on an agricultural economy; she must reactivate her industries which, for the most part undamaged by the war, possess modern and highly developed equipment, and specialized labor which has attained a high degree of technical skill. These and other factors will, beyond doubt, enable products to establish themselves on foreign markets. 6. The Italian Government, which has had so much proof of the spirit of understanding which animates the Allied Commission in its consideration of the problems of our country, trusts that such valuable collaboration will continue".

ITALIAN GOVERNMENT WAS FREE TO START PRIVATE TRADE WITH UK WHEN STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS AUTHORISING PERSON IN UK TO RESUME TRADE IN GOODS WITH ITALY WERE ISSUED ON 5th SEPTEMBER. 2. Italo/Swedish agreement provides for exchange of goods value approximately 50 million Swedish crowns in 6 months, renewable for further 6 months periods until revoked by either country with one month notice. Increase of quotas of goods may be mutually agreed.

3. Agreement signed but awaiting exchange of notes to implement it. ALCOM have stated no objection to immediate implementation providing there is no shipment of outstanding RCL allocations which are now only citric acid, tartaric acid and 1946 balance of lemon oil.

4. ALCOM cannot understand why no action can be taken on MOC 392 when allocations requested in MOC 364 were considered without question in accordance with usual practice. By action in para 3, ALCOM is in effect policing Sweden's adherence to combined board regulations. This is of course an untenable position.

5. In view of short time, said to be 3 weeks, before Swedish ports ice up consider that delay in referring matter to Sweden would impose regrettable restrictions of both countries.

5. Request that you immediately either (A) act on MOC 392 or (B) confirm that we can forthwith tell Italian Government that so far as ALCOM responsibility is concerned there is no objection to finalization of Italo Swedish agreement.

1. Subject is shortfall of wheat in Italy.
2. Owing to shortfall of actual wheat arrivals for period September through December 1945 total estimate wheat stocks on December 31 will be 210,000 tons. This is practically all indigenous and three quarters of it concentrated in four regions. These, Marche 57,000 tons Umbria 27,000 tons, Emilia 43,000 tons, Toscana 26,000 tons.
3. On present basis consumption, Toscana stocks will be exhausted by end of January, Emilia by mid March, Umbria by the end of July, Marche by the end of August. Thus it is only practicable to move limited quantities from Marche and Umbria to deficient areas, and this movement can only be effected within the limits of Italian transport facilities. Every effort being made to hasten provincial transfers but total amount which can and should be moved is small fraction of total requirements.
4. Total indigenous availabilities represents theoretical twenty one days stocks in hand, but owing to considerations quoted above, practical availabilities to keep ration going not considered to be 50% of foregoing stocks. Therefore, whole of south Italy, the islands and greater part of northern Italy now dependent on imported wheat and are existing on day to day basis for the bread and pasta ration. Examples of these deficient areas: inclusive of all known arrivals up to January 2, wheat supplies on present rationed basis will be exhausted by the end of the first week in January in Liguria, Lombardia, Lazio, Sicily, Campania.

(cont. MOC 422)

Pasta ration already in arrears in Puglia and Naples.

5. Recommendation has been made to Italian Government to suspend Pasta ration south Italy, Liguria, Veneto, Sicily and Sardinia. This in order to insure continuance at least of the Bread ration. Arrivals of six extra ships in addition to those presently signalled may avert this. Request urgently if diversion of these from other theaters possible.

6. Your figures phone conversation refers, cumulative December backlog by January 1 of 147,000 tons wheat plus 91,500 tons flour at American extraction rate agreed, but recommend Italian extraction rate of 90% be used. Cannot agree your figures of September through December loadings but will await cable to attempt reconciliation.

Of five wheat cargoes requested by UNRRA, two are destined for Italy as specified in UMLWA/SEPC 24. SUBJECT: Ships Document Section and Shipping Information

TO : Colonel Charles Walton, Chief, Supply Group.

1. The following will bring you up to date on our activities relative to the Ships Document Section in general and shipping documents in particular.
2. The Ships Document Section is in operation, but the Italian representation has not been formally established. At a meeting Saturday, all but IOB were agreeable to a proposal made by the Italian Minister of Reconstruction that a representative of the Interministerial Committee for Reconstruction be put in charge. Lt. Di Loreto is pursuing this matter with the Italian Government. In the meantime, the Italian interests have been informed that they are welcome to see all documents that we receive and they have been taking advantage of the opportunity afforded.
3. The newly created Ships Document Section has been absorbed into the Requisition Branch with resulting elimination of some duplication of effort within A.C. and speeding and more reliable routing of ships' documents throughout A.C.
4. A new notification form with information of interest to Allied and Italian authorities has been prepared to supersede two forms, previously used by the Ports and Warehouses Division of the Transportation Subcommittee and the Requisitions Branch. Responsibility for the new notification forms has been placed in the Ships Document Section and personnel of Requisition Branch have been freed for other duties.
5. The Ships' Documents Section is now routing expeditiously invoices, bills of lading and other documents to the Finance Subcommittee of A.C., and to Transportation Subcommittee, notices of ships' sailings and advance manifests.
6. Speed and accuracy of information about imports remain serious problems. The principal purpose that advanced shipping information is designed to achieve is the coordination of overseas with overland transportation in order to assure the most expeditious handling of commodities to ultimate consignees. Subordinate objectives are, accordingly, speedy port clearance, elimination

where possible of the necessity for port warehousing, and the minimizing of long overland hauls.

7. Advance information on monthly loading programs has been arriving too late. A cable requesting information on December loadings was sent 16 November and a follow-up on 3 December. Today, 8 December, the requested December loading program was received.

8. No response has yet been received to Mr. Crooks' request for call forward reports on shipments destined to Italy. Mr. Crooks will follow-up on his letter unless a reply is received in a few days.

9. Information on ship sailings is received from two sources - the so-called Darr cable from War Shipping Administration, Washington, and our own COM series. We are not on the distribution list for the Darr cable, but have been receiving the majority of them. Neither the Darr nor the COM cables give us adequate information.

10. A letter, RB-813.6, 8 December, has been prepared for Colonel Walton's signature and addressed to Mr. Regan, W.S.A., Rome. In it, we ask that we be included on the Darr distribution list and that the Darr cable include additional information. Mr. Regan has agreed to forward our request in the form of a joint request from his office and ours to Washington.

11. A MOC cable has been sent in which we request that in the future COM cables on ship sailings give needed additional information, in order that the consist of ships may be identified.

12. More detailed but less speedy advance notice of ship arrivals is received in the Air Manifests directed to War Shipping, Rome. Mr. Regan has, at our request, forwarded those manifests to us on the same day as he receives them. If the information on cables were expanded as we ask, the need for manifests by air would be greatly lessened. In any case, not all manifests sent by air are received by W.S.A., Rome, because of mishaps in flight and for other reasons.

13. Ships' documents are presently not received at any central point in Italy, but sent in Ports, in the Naples office of W.S.A., and elsewhere, as well as in W.S.A., Rome. W.S.A. and Requisition Branch have made a joint request, concurred in by W.S.A., Italy, to Washington that all ships' documents be channelled through W.S.A., Rome, which in turn will transmit them to Requisitions Branch, A.C. No reply has been received from this

request. In the meantime, Mr. Crooks has ordered all port officers to route all ships' documents to W.S.A., Rome, and some progress has been observed in this matter.

- 1) In the case of cables, many cables have gone out improperly classified as to file numbers.
- 2) Under other than Admin. Unit supervision the incorrect amount of copies of cables and letters have been made up.
- 3) The correct amount of copies can only be determined by the Admin. Officer to make certain that the document appears in the correct subject and other files.

In order to keep the Chief of Requisition Branch and other offices accurately informed at all times it is necessary for the Admin. Unit to have an accurate and up-to-the minute picture of all proceedings. It is therefore urgently requested that these practices be strictly adhered to.

SUBJECT: Outturn Reports

TO : War Shipping Administration
Rome
(Att: Mr. Stephen Zegan)

1. At your suggestion, I visited ISA agents at many of the ports in Northern Italy concerning outturn reports for bulk cargoes.
2. The agents at Leghorn, La Spezia, Genoa, Savona and Ancona all told me that it was impossible to get the various receiver groups for coal and grain to sign outturn reports based on the tonnage stated on manifests. In each case, they advised me that it would be necessary to have the proper Italian Government agency in Rome issue an order to all receiver's agents at the ports to sign outturn reports based on tonnages stated on ships' manifests.
3. Proper weighing facilities are not available at most ports. At Savona, for example, the weight is estimated by figuring the capacity of the bucket by the number of buckets discharged. Cargo is again weighed when it is loaded into the cars of the rope way for delivery to San Giusseppe and again weighed after being loaded into rail cars at San Giusseppe. The Director of this operation told me that the three weights never correspond. When I inspected the operation, there were at least 30 improvised fire pots burning coal, which the workmen used to keep warm. At San Giusseppe, the coal is usually backpiled awaiting rail cars. Naturally there is pilferage all along the line, yet the receivers at Savona insist upon using the weight loaded into the cars at San Giusseppe which is 18 km. from Savona, the port of discharge.
4. At Genoa, the weight is based upon loaded rail cars, but frequently coal is backpiled and remains on the quay for several days.
5. In the case of bulk grain, at ports where there is no elevator, the grain is bagged in the hold and weighed by the car, weighed by the bucket, or bagged and weighed by portable bagging machines. In each case, the Federazione Consorzi Agrari has held

out for the loaded weight in the rail cars or in their warehouses. All wastage and pilferage after the grain has been discharged is, therefore, for the account of the ocean carrier until it is safely in rail cars or warehouse. This includes even that grain delivered by lighters.

6. The agents agree, that since all these cargoes are covered by weight certificates issued by bonded weighers, the only fair outturn weight can be determined by using the weight appearing on the manifest, except in cases where the cargo has suffered damage.

The September requisition corresponds to the monthly allocation given to the military by the Combined Coal Committee before the end of the war. 40 requirements were for 37,000 tons. It was accordingly requested that part of the October program be pre-shipped during the last weeks of September (Y3-S).

5. Shipping for the September program has been arranged for. Coal ships have been leaving the U.S. regularly starting September 10.
6. All requirements assume a certain production from Italian mines being available. (Ref. MCC Airframe 57 and 77). Latest information indicates that 40,000 metric tons of coal which were expected to be supplied from the area coal mines will not be available. (U.S. Embassy, Rome - 2022, 25 July, 1945). The Italian import requirements may well have to be increased by 40,000 tons per month.
7. At least 1000 tons of anthracite per month are essential for the manufacture of solderberg paste for electrodes. More, if available, would be used for household heating in Northern Italy.
8. Pending actual allocation by type of the U.S. share, the average price of \$7.00 per metric ton is being used.

U.S. financing for Table II is assumed to be \$251,333 monthly, representing the amount remaining after the costs of Tables V (\$523,000) are deducted from the proper U.S. share for all POL. (\$586,000).

5. FE has been assured by accredited representative of the Army-Navy Petroleum Board that sufficient supplies will be made available in Italy by October 1 to meet the requirements shown under "September loadings" above. (Letter of August 25, 1945 to Army-Navy Petroleum Board from Chief, FE. Petroleum Division, and reply thereto dated 1 September 1945). In the meantime, FE requisitions are being submitted to reimburse the U.S. Military for furnishing 50% of the total requirements shown in Tables II and V. This is sufficient to cover the amounts shown for September and October loadings. If, before the end of October, negotiations have not been successfully concluded whereby the British will assume an equal share of these requirements, it will be necessary to finance the November and December loadings from Italian Government funds.

Notes to Table III. Food

NOTES: 1. The 4th quarter food supply program basically conforms to requirements stated in MOC Airgram 96. The items supplied by the U.S. will be identical for each month of the last quarter except that wheat and dried vegetables will be supplied in reduced quantities for November and December.

(A) Wheat. In accordance with MOC 273 25% of the wheat shipments programmed will be bagged to avoid bagging in the holds of ships upon arrival prior to discharge. All shipments of wheat requirements prior to MOC Airgram 96 (August 11, 1945) indicated that 104,000 tons per month would satisfy basic needs. A series of cables including MOC Airgram 47 questioned this position and MOC Airgram 96 dated August 11, 1945 raised the requirement to 114,000. On August 27 Congressman Porter asked the Secretary of Agriculture that his investigation of the situation suggested a need for 200,000 tons of wheat per month and in MOC Airgram 101 dated August 31, 1945 the 20 official requirement figure was adjusted to 150,000 tons per month. MOC Airgram 102 also requested that monthly installments of wheat be as large as possible at the beginning of the period to encourage producers to release their stocks, etc. Accordingly, the U.S. is programming 150,000 tons for October (including 5,000 tons of flour) and 100,000 tons for each of the last two months of the quarter. A deficit of 50,000 tons per month for November and December thus results and will have to be obtained from other sources.

(3) Flour. MOC 273 contained a stated requirement of 7,000 tons of flour for each of the last months of this calendar year. The U.S. is referring this item as its responsibility and reducing the wheat requirement by an equal number of tons.

(C) Sugar. The 7,57 metric tons of sugar programmed to be furnished from U.S. sources has not been notified by the supply authorities as having been firmly allocated to date. In addition the matter of obtaining the deficit 5,200 tons from other sources is being explored.

(D) Fats. Fatable fats and oils in the amount of 3,693 tons per month for the 4th quarter have been programmed on the basis of requirements stated in MOC Airgram 103 and is exclusive of industrial requirements.

(E) Dried Fish. Although dried salted fish represent an important protein item, lack of U.S. funds dictated the necessity of programming fish to be furnished from "other sources".

(F) Coffee. Coffee, which was included in September since it was residual stock of the military program has been retained for the successive months. It will, however, have to be supplied from "other sources". Consideration will be given to obtaining Brazilian coffee to meet the small stated monthly requirement.

(4) Quar. The 7,57 metric tons of sugar programmed to be furnished by U.S. sources has not been notified by the supply authorities as having been firmly allocated to date. In addition the matter of obtaining the deficit 3,200 tons from other sources is being explored.

(5) Fats. Edible fats and oils in the amount of 2,533 tons per month for the 4th quarter have been programmed on the basis of requirements stated in MCO Airman 103 and is exclusive of industrial requirements.

(6) Dried Fish. Although dried fish represents an important protein item, lack of U.S. funds dictated the necessity of programming fish to be furnished from "other sources".

(7) Coffee. Coffee, which was included in September since it was residual stock of the military program has been retained for the successive months. It will, however, have to be supplied from "other sources". Consideration will be given to obtaining Brazilian coffee to meet the small stated monthly requirement of 233 tons.

- (3) WHEAT. The total mill requirement as stated in 1000 Airgram 105 is projected to be supplied from U.S. sources.
- (4) WHEAT. Although the total dried vegetable needs for October as reflected in 1000 Airgram 105 are being accepted by the U.S., it is only possible, however, to plan to ship from the U.S. 10,210 tons for each November and December thereby creating a total deficit of 2,40 tons. A time consideration is presently being given to making up this deficit from "other sources."
2. The only food items listed in the most recent comprehensive statement of requirements for the 4th quarter (1000 Airgram 105) which are not included in this revised project are powdered eggs (2,322 tons monthly) and dehydrated potatoes (752 tons monthly). It was necessary to exclude these items because of their excessive unit cost in light of the United States surplus for this period.
3. Unit prices of the food items in the 4th quarter are in several cases different from the unit prices used for the September project. This results from price fluctuations and also from the substitution of different quality items for the 4th quarter as a direct result available to be shipped in September.

I predetti nostri rappresentanti avevano più volte proposto che questa merce fosse assegnata al consumo della città di Napoli non ritenendola atta ad un lungo trasporto. Sta di fatto che le cassette in legno costituenti l'imballaggio di questa partita, data la lunga esposizione alle intemperie, si sono talmente deteriorate, in conseguenza del parziale inacidimento del legno, da presentare ben poca resistenza ai maneggi. Ne consegue che per quanto i Magazzini abbiano avuto cura d'inviare all'imbarco tutte casse integre, nell'operazione d'imbarco, che viene eseguita col sistema delle braghe, anziché, come sarebbe desiderabile, con reti e con piani elevatori di legname, molte di queste cassette, sotto la pressione delle corde della braga, si sconnettono malamente o addirittura si sfasciano. Le riserve della nave su questa partita di merce, per quanto assai esagerate, possono in parte giustificarsi:

- 2) - la partita di eringhe salate in barili e in cassette è di arrivo recente a Napoli e tutti i colli escono dai depositi in perfette condizioni. Si tratta però di imballaggio assai debole e che deve essere trattato con cura. Anche per questo genere l'uso delle braghe è certamente dannoso. La nave ha fatto a proposito di questa partita esageratissime riserve che se anche solo in parte vere devono dipendere esclusivamente da cattivo stivaggio o da non accurato maneggio nelle operazioni di imbarco;
