1. Leghorn - Heavy receipt continued, but repair work has progressed so rapidly that situation is well in hand. A "cave-in" caused 2000 tons of flour to fall thru a basement with brick walls and roof crashing on top. No casualties and very small loss of flour. Re-opening of Leghorn-Rome rail line enabled shipment of much miscellaneous non-food-stuffs.

2. Ancona - This Section has been UNJUSTLY accused of causing ships to be diverted elsewhere because sufficient warehouse space was not available at Ancona. Warehouse Accommodation is ALWAYS based on estimates given this Section by various sub-commissions of their needs. Now that requirements have been re-estimated additions are being made to accommodate expected arrivals. This Section prides itself on having been able to accept any shipments offered, and hopes to be able to maintain this record.

3. Naples - Some increased activity but no important changes.

1. According to previously established procedure, the
Regulation Division notifies the various Subcommittees

outlined in a memorandum dated 11/11/64, subject: "Internal
Revenue Service and Bureau of Internal Revenue, and by the Bureau, copy
of which was sent to various subcommittees."

1. According to previously established procedure, the Legislation Division notifies the various sub-commissions of impending arrivals of incoming civil legislation. The sub-commission then is required to notify this division promptly of desired disposition.

2. Recent experience indicates that in the majority of cases it is necessary for this division to pursue the sub-commissioners diligently to obtain needed information regarding disposition. Frequently it appears that sub-commissions are uncertain of desired disposition. The time lag caused by the delay in reaching a decision creates a problem in this division due to the necessity of promptly issuing orders to staff & subcommittee officers where signs have either arrived or are about to arrive.

3. Frequently incomplete instructions are received. E.G. "Ship to England", giving no method of shipment, no name of consignee, and no street address. Instructions are also received which are impossible to follow, and which show a complete lack of understanding of the problem.

4. Further, despite general information that certain supplies are urgently needed, experiences indicate that frequently requests in warehouses for that supply to be an extended period.

5. It is hoped that direction of sub-commission will bring the other to the attention of the individuals involved in their own organizations. Detailed procedures were previously advised in administrative letter of Oct 10, subject: Disposition of Incoming Civil Legislation, signed by Col. J.H. Adams, copy of which was sent to various sub-commissions.

SUBJECT: Disposition of Imported Civil Supplies

TO : See Distribution

1. For the information of all concerned, the procedures and duties of the various interested parties as regard disposition of incoming imported civilian supplies are outlined hereunder:
2. It is the function of the Requisition Division to
 - a) Obtain all ship's manifests
 - b) Determine the requisition on which shipments apply
 - c) Notify the appropriate receiving Sub-Commission, the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) and the Price Section of the Commerce Sub-Commission of the expected arrival of specific commodities.
3. It is the function of each Sub-Commission immediately to notify the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) of the desired disposition of said supplies.
4. At the present time the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) exercises direct control over ACC Depot in Leghorn, (ACC Depots 12150, 12151, and 12152), Ancona (ACC Depots 1-8), and Naples (ACC Depots 676, 677, 696, 1256, and 1270).
5. Depots in other places (as well as other depots in Naples) are under control of Armies, Region, or other Sub-Commissions.
6. Upon receipt of instructions by the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) from an interested Sub-Commission cargo disposition orders are issued to the local ACC Port & Warehouse representatives (no matter under whose jurisdiction they may come). In the event the representatives do not come under the control of this Division, copies of said orders are sent to their higher headquarters. The Port and Warehouse representatives are responsible for supplies reaching the designated depots, their storage at the depot and their subsequent release.
7. When a Sub-Commission notifies the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) of desired disposition of incoming supplies they also state who has authority to release from the depot where stored.
8. In the event the depot is not one listed in para. 4 above, releases are arranged between the appropriate Sub-Commission and the organization controlling the depot.
9. In the event the depot is one listed in para. 4 above several plans for release are possible:

3. It is the function of each Sub-Commission immediately to notify the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) of the desired disposition of said supplies.

4. At the present time the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) exercises direct control over ACC Depots in Leghorn, (ACC Depots 12150, 12151, and 12152), Ancona (ACC Depots 1-8), and Naples (ACC Depots 576, 677, 686, 1256, and 1270).

5. Depots in other places (as well as other depots in Naples) are under control of Armies, Region, or other Sub-Commissions.

6. Upon receipt of instructions by the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) from an interested Sub-Commission cargo disposition orders are issued to the local ACC Port & Warehouse representatives (no matter under whose jurisdiction they may come). In the event the representatives do not come under the control of this Division, copies of said orders are sent to their higher headquarters. The Port and Warehouse representatives are responsible for supplies reaching the designated depots, their storage at the depot and their subsequent release.

7. When a Sub-Commission notifies the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) of desired disposition of incoming supplies they also state who has authority to release from the depot where stored.

8. In the event the depot is not one listed in para. 4 above, releases are arranged between the appropriate Sub-Commission and the organization controlling the depot.

9. In the event the depot is one listed in para. 4 above several plans for release are possible:

- a) The interested Sub-Commission may give to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) original instructions for forwarding. In this event, where it is necessary temporarily to hold stores in a depot, they are forwarded automatically when transportation is available without the necessity of further orders.

- b) The appropriate Sub-Commission may order stores be held subject to their order. The depot accepts written release orders from said Sub-Commission, a copy being sent by the Sub-Commission to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division).
- c) The appropriate Sub-Commission may order stores be held subject to the order of a named Region or Army. The Depot accepts written release orders from said Region or Army, a copy being sent by Region or Army to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division).
- d) Release instructions to the various depots are written on standard forms entitled "Shipping Order". These forms are available from the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) upon request.
10. In the event the appropriate Sub-Commission so desires the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) orders stores forwarded direct from port to a named consignee if and where conditions permit.
11. When requested by a Sub-Commission, the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) enters rail or water bills for shipment of supplies from its depots, or instructs Regional Depots to do so. Where rail bills are customarily entered by a Depot rather than by this H.Q., the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) instructs the Depot to enter the bill.
12. If a Sub-Commission requests stores be held subject to its orders and subsequently desires that said stores be held subject to the orders of a Region or Army, written instructions must be sent the depot with copy to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division).
13. The Accounting Section of the Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division notifies the interested Sub-Commission of the quantity of merchandise received in the first depot of receipt after ship discharge.
14. Any depot listed in para. 4 above advises consignee and the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) by signal of the Aetall (cargo, quantity, date shipped, car number or ship name) when stores are forwarded by rail or water. The Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division notifies the appropriate Sub-Commission and the Accounting Section.
15. When shipment is made from depot by motor truck consignee is notified by Loading Receipt given driver. In addition, a transfer Note is forwarded to the office authorizing the release, covering all shipments made by one depot to one consignee in one day. A copy of this transfer note is also forwarded to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) for the attention of the Accounting Section.

10. In the event the appropriate Sub-Commission so desires the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) orders stores forwarded direct from port to a named consignee if and where conditions permit.

11. When requested by a Sub-Commission, the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) enters rail or water bills for shipment of supplies from its Depots, or instructs Regional Depots to do so. Where rail bills are customarily entered by a Depot rather than by this R.C., the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) instructs the Depot to enter the bill.

12. If a Sub-Commission requests stores be held subject to its orders and subsequently desires that said stores be held subject to the orders of a Region or Army, written instructions must be sent the depot with copy to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division).

13. The Accounting Section of the Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division notifies the interested Sub-Commission of the quantity of merchandise received in the first depot of receipt after ship discharge.

14. Any depot listed in paragraph 11 above, advises consignee and the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) by signal of the detail (cargo, quantity, date shipped, car number or ship name) when stores are forwarded by rail or water. The Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division notifies the appropriate Sub-Commission and the Accounting Section.

15. When shipment is made from depot by motor truck consignee is notified by Loading Receipt given driver. In addition, a transfer Note is forwarded to the office authorizing the release, covering all shipments made by our depot to our consignee in one day. A copy of this transfer note is also forwarded to the Transportation Sub-Commission (Port, Shipment & Warehouse Division) for the attention of the Accounting Section.

1. In view of recent changes in the rationing situation, Supply Instructions Nos. 3, 3(i), 3(ii) and 3(iii) of 20th July, 1944 are hereby cancelled and replaced by Instructions Nos. 1(i), 1(ii) and 1(iii) dated 9th November, 1944 enclosed herewith.

2. Attention is drawn to the following points:-

(i) A fortnightly ration of 300 grammes of pasta is now authorised in addition to the normal bread ration of 200 grammes daily. (This is not yet applicable in the provinces of Pesaro and Ancona).

(ii) In consequence of the instructions of the new pasta ration, a corresponding reduction is made in the Supplementary Scale for heavy workers.

(iii) Guardia di Finanza, Public Security Agents, Firemen, Prison Guards and Guardia Forestale now have a scale of their own: viz Civilian Ration Scale No. X. They will therefore be deleted from para 1(a)(vi) of Supply Instruction No. 3(iv) of 20th July, 1944.

3. Existing Supply Instructions Nos. 3(iv) and 3(vi) to 3(x), inclusive, are not affected (except as stated in para 2(iii) above) and will remain in force. Instruction No. 3(v) is under review.

4. Supply Instruction No. 1(xi) dated 9th November, 1944 (covering Ration Scale No. X) is enclosed herewith.

5. A new Index, dated 9th November, 1944 is also issued herewith in substitution for the one originally issued dated 29th July, 1944.

2. It is reported that this maximum price schedule has had to be held over until the present date. This is largely due to the difficulty of getting information as to conditions in provinces and commands in a new area.
3. It is hoped that the present maximum price schedule will continue in force until 31 Dec 45. If G.O's have any recommendations they should forward same, through the usual channels, immediately.

RATIONING OF FOODSTUFFS

(General Circulation)

1. GENERAL

The following instructions are a complete schedule of civilian ration scales in the 8th Army area. No other scales are permitted.

2. ECONOMY IN USE OF EVACUATED FOODS

Provincial Commissioners and Civil Affairs Officers must spare no effort to induce the highest possible degree of self-sufficiency in their respective areas. Economy in the use of imported foodstuffs is essential and nothing in the following scales is intended to authorize the issue of tinned or dried foods when local resources can be made available.

3. SUPPLEMENTARY RATIONS

All pre-occupation ration scales, and particularly the heavy workers supplements are abolished. Heavy workers of certain classes receive supplementary rations in accordance with Supply Instructions Nos. 5(111) of 1st November, 1944, and 8(1v) of 26th July, 1944.

4. REFUGEES AND DEVASTATED AREAS

Refugees in the Eighth Army Area passing through AMG Camps receive transit rations from Army sources. Those in AMG Camps outside the Army boundaries receive rations from AMG/ACC sources in accordance with Civilian Ration Scale No. 1.

In principle, refugees living in an area will be rationed by the commune in the same way as its own people. Special cases may, however, occur in the forward area which do not fall into any of these classes. Persons, however, or in grave distress owing to wartime destruction may, as an emergency measure, be accorded rations of miscellaneous supplies on a scale equivalent to one half of that authorized in Civilian Ration Scale No. 1, subject to the following conditions:-

(a) Where it is desired to do this in local communal welfare or reception centres of a temporary nature, such issues may be authorized by the Provincial Commissioner for a period not exceeding ten days.

(b) If, however, general issue to the normal ration-card population of a "Hitler" village or devastated commune is considered necessary, prior application must be made to the Army HQ Eighth Army with full supporting data.

5. RATION CARDS

It is Army policy to issue new ration cards as soon as practicable after occupation. This will be done under provincial arrangements.

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3. SUPPLEMENTARY RATIONS

All pre-occupation ration scales, and particularly the heavy workers supplements are abolished. Heavy workers of certain classes receive supplementary rations in accordance with Supply Instructions Nos. 3(111) of 1st November, 1944, and 3(14) of 26th July, 1944.

4. REFUGEES AND DEVASTATED AREAS

Refugees in the Eighth Army Area passing through ARA Camps receive transit rations from Army sources. Those in ACC Camps outside the Army boundaries receive rations from ACC/ACC sources in accordance with Civilian Ration Scale No. 1.

In principle, refugees living in an area will be rationed by the commune in the same way as its own people. Special cases may, however, occur in the forward area which do not fall into any of these classes. Persons, homeless, or in grave distress owing to wartime destruction may, as an EMERGENCY MEASURE, be accorded rations of miscellaneous supplies on a scale equivalent to one half of that authorized in Civilian Ration Scale No. 1, subject to the following conditions:-

(a) Where it is desired to do this in local communal welfare or reception centres of a temporary nature, such issues may be authorized by the Provincial Commissioner for a period not exceeding ten days.

(b) If, however, general issue to the normal ration-card population of a "hitler" village or devastated commune is considered necessary, prior application must be made to the HQ Eighth Army with full supporting data.

5. RATION CARDS

It is ARA policy to issue new ration cards as soon as practicable after occupation. This will be done under provincial arrangements.

6. INSPECTION AND CONTROL

The Provincial Supply Officer should seek the assistance of the Prov. S.O.A.I.C. in order to institute proper checks and controls over shops dealing in rationed goods. Unless early steps are taken to prevent it, both bakeries and mills will almost certainly enter the "black market". Bakeries must be inspected to compare the amount of bread being sold with the flour allotted to them and the number of authorized customers presenting themselves to purchase it. Vigilance should be exercised to prevent the use of forged ration cards or those belonging to deceased or absent persons. Similarly each mill must keep a proper register and may print only on the authorization of the prefect's Government or for persons producing proper milling tickets issued through the Communes.

7. DAILED SUPPLY

The same principles apply as in para 5 above for DRIED VEGETABLES. When so authorized, however, the daily ration will be 1.3 grammes per person.

Issues will be made to the undermentioned in accordance with the scales stated.

Calculate for 5% of the total population plus the requirements of all towns with a population of 50,000 or over on the scales authorized in paras 4 - 6 above.

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On advice of All Public Health authorities, issue may also be made by the PC to Nursing Mothers, Children 0 - 3 years, Schoolchildren (for mid-day meal), Welfare Centres, Invalids (on Medical Certificate) and Civilian Prisoners on the basis of .3 grams daily.

1. To date food has represented all but a small portion of imports for the civilian population. Food Sub-Committee has been responsible for the Warehousing and Forwarding of these supplies, as well as some of the other imports. Food Sub-Committee has developed an organization for this purpose.

2. In order to regularize the procedure and extend the same responsibilities to all imports (except medical supplies) the following directions are issued for the guidance of all concerned.

3. In order that supplies may not be diverted, but be allocated to the project or purpose for which originally intended and ordered, it is necessary that all incoming supplies be identified as carried on a particular order or requisition. The following are therefore functions of the Requisition Division:

- a. Obtaining and receiving all shipping documents and data.
- b. Determining the requisition on which shipments apply.

In order that supplies may not be diverted, but be allocated to the project or purpose for which originally intended and ordered, it is necessary that all incoming supplies be identified as carried on a particular order or requisition. The following are therefore functions of the Requisition Division:

- a. Obtaining and receiving all shipping documents and data.
- b. Determining the requisition on which shipments apply.
- c. Notifying appropriate sub-commission, Warehousing and Forwarding Division, and Prior Control of expected arrivals.

1. Complaints have been received about the poor condition of railed foodstuffs upon arrival. Most serious complaints are in reference to sacked foodstuffs.
2. The following practices should be closely observed:
 - a) Do not load open cars
 - b) Do not load cars that are not water proof unless repairs are first made (report rejected cars to the railroad as bad order cars to be repaired).
 - c) Sacks should be piled in criss cross fashion in uniform stacks. Cars will be loaded to their full length with approximately the same height of stack throughout. (Cars frequently have been observed where the center section between the doors is either partially or completely empty; this has two undesirable results: first stacks collapse causing damages, second it is difficult to be certain that the cargo has not pilfered).
 - d) A small space must be left between the stacks and each door. (Frequently cars have been loaded with sacks blocked tightly against the opposite door from which the cargo was loaded at the point of origin. When the cargo arrived at destination the opposite door was used for unloading and it has been impossible to open this door without great difficulty and without damaging the contents.)
 - e) All concerned have been notified in the past to place manifests in envelopes inside the cars tacked to the wall above the cargo. This manifest should contain the following information:
