1. In view of the importance of ensuring the smooth flow of supplies forward into Northern Italy from the presently located stockpiles in the Ancona/Furli Area, following upon the occupation of the territory, it has been decided to appoint a representative of the Food sub-Commission, to be located in the Ancona/Furli Area. Major Cardley, at present located in Ancona, has been assigned for this purpose.

2. Apart from general liaison with Transportation sub-Commission representatives in the area and the forward regions, the Food sub-Commission officer will carry out the following tasks:

(a) He will be responsible for the control and forward movements of food supplies from Ancona/Furli/Cesena warehouses to provinces and regions of Northern Italy when the occupation of the latter takes place.

(b) Food supplies will be sent forward in the first instance in accordance with the following determining factors:

- (i) daily requirements of provinces in accordance with the scale of available supplies for the North as previously laid down.
- (ii) availability of transport.
- (iii) If transport is not available to carry forward full amounts laid down, supplies will be sent forward on a percentage basis in the following priority - flour, salt, milk, sugar, fats, soap, dried vegetables, meat.

(c) The Food sub-Commission representative will be prepared to receive requests from Regional Food Officers after the initial days of the occupation. These requests may be for the specific food items that are in the most urgent demand in the various regions, provided that total amounts requested are within the quota presently allocated to each region.

(d) He will be responsible for the continuation of the present programme

of the movement of grain from the Marche Region to Rome and neighbouring provinces.

(e) He will be responsible for the seeking and onward transmission of present grain surpluses in Forlì and Ravenna Provinces - this grain to be moved after the initial stocks of flour are exhausted.

(f) He will furnish a weekly report of movements of food supplies to Regions to M. A.C.

In addition, another 10,000 tons of weatherproof well served storage space is needed in Forli. There are excellent warehouse buildings in "The Sugar Refinery". They that could hold 4-5,000 tons is at present occupied by a British Military Cinema. Others, adjacent, are occupied by Indian service troops. Assistance from higher authority is needed to secure the use of these or other suitable buildings. The "Sugar Refinery" is only a short distance from the Consorzio Agrario, indicating the possible advantage of unified depot control.
5. Adequate stock piling for feeding of North West Italy will largely depend on securing the additional space detailed above.
