Ci riferiamo alla conversazione oggi tenuta con

Mr. G. Lester.

La Società Silo e Depositi Napoletani, proprietarie dei Docks del Porto di Napoli, sorgenti sulla calata Massanella (già Carmine) ed oggi completamente distrutti da eventi bellici, il 19 Novembre dell'anno scorso presentava all'Ente del Porto di Napoli la proposta di edificare sull'area dei demoliti Docks, di cui la Società stessa è concessionaria, una copertura provvisoria avvalendosi all'uopo delle tettoie in lamiere ondulate (Romney huts) che essa sperava di ottenere dagli Alleati o direttamente o mediante l'interessamento della Federazione dei Consorzi Agrari.

Lo scopo della copertura provvisoria proposta era quello di poter realizzare in breve tempo (si sperava in due o tre mesi) un vasto ricovero per le merci su banchina in immediata comunicazione con il fronte di sbarco e servito da un adeguato impianto di binari ferroviari, così che le merci potessero passare direttamente dal piroscafo al deposito senza bisogno dell'attuale costoso e rischioso trasporto a mezzo camions dalle banchine di sbarco ai lontani depositi dell'entroterra, e potessero poi essere riempite per ferrovia senza le restrizioni ed i ritardi dipendenti dalla insufficienza dei raccordi ferroviari inseruenti i depositi attualmente in uso.

Infatti la copertura provvisoria proposta che si estendeva sopra un'area di 320 m. di lunghezza per m. 34 di larghezza avrebbe in breve tempo dato la banchina di un deposito coperto delle capacità di 70.000 mc. equivalente ad una capacità utile di immagazzinamento per oltre 40.000 tonn. di saccheria pe-

Ci riferiamo alla conversazione oggi tenuta con

Mr. G. Lester.

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La ragione per cui era stata dalla Società proposta allo Ente Portuale la copertura provvisoria in cambio della ricostruzione integrale e definitiva dell'antico edificio dei Docks consisteva in ciò che mentre la copertura provvisoria avrebbe potuto realizzarsi in alcuni mesi, la ricostruzione definitiva, data l'attuale estrema scarsità di materiali, avrebbe richiesto indubbiamente qualche anno per essere ultimata e durante questo tempo il Porto avrebbe continuato a restare privo di depositi, dei quali, per contro, vi è così urgente bisogno.

Naturalmente l'opera provvisoria progettata non escludeva il proposito di una ricostruzione definitiva dell'impianto dei Docks alla quale la Società si riprometteva di procedere non appena le condizioni del mercato dei materiali e delle grandi attrezzature di sollevamento lo avessero consentito e il costo della copertura provvisoria fosse stato ammortizzato.

La Commissione Alleata, dietro il vivo interessamento della Federazione dei Consorzi Agrari, metteva a disposizione verso la fine di Gennaio, il materiale metallico per la copertura, di cui si è proprio in questi giorni iniziato il trasporto a piè d'opera.

Senonchè quasi contemporaneamente alla notizia che il materiale era pronto, giungeva alla Società dall'Ente Portuale, con lettera del 5 corr. N° 421 a firma del R. Commissario Ammiraglio Vescia, la comunicazione che la proposta di copertura provvisoria non era stata accolta (dice si in base a contrario parere del Genio Civile) ingiungendosi in cambio alla Società di far luogo entro un prefisso termine allo inizio dei lavori per la ricostruzione definitiva.

L'Ente Portuale nella sua lettera soggiungeva che avrebbe permesso la costruzione di solo due delle venticinque campate della progettata copertura e, precisamente delle due campate alla testata del molo, concessione assurda perché mentre le due campate, data la ristrettezza dello spazio coperto risultante, non avrebbero portato alcun giovamento al movimento del Porto, avrebbero per contro costituito un dannoso ingombro per i lavori di ricostruzione definitiva che l'Ente ingiungeva di iniziare.

Si presenta pertanto la necessità di ottenere dalla Direzione Generale della Marina Mercantile, dalla quale dipende questo Ente Portuale :

1° o che sia revocato il rigetto della proposta di copertura provvisoria, fissandosi magari alla Società concessionaria un congruo termine massimo di sette o otto anni per procedere alla ricostruzione definitiva;

2º o che sia concessa alla Federazione dei Consorzi per un congruo numero di anni un'altra area portuale su cui impiantarne intanto le tettoie metalliche messe a disposizione dalla Commissione Alleata, onde sovvenire, nel più breve termine possibile, ai bisogni immediati del traffico portuale, mentre la Società sottoscritta procederà alle necessarie lente e difficile ricostruzione dei suoi impianti.

SUBJECT: Closing Report of Transportation Section

TO: Chief Liaison Officer
Naples Liaison Group, Allied Commission

Effective March 1, 1946, Liaison Office for Transportation is scheduled officially to be closed down. All essential activities are either turned back to the Italian Government or else will be absorbed by UNRRA. A major part of Naples port is now available for use of the Italian Merchant Marine, although for the time being the port is to continue as Category "C" under Allied Military control. Civil supplies under the UNRRA program will be handled by the same agencies as received imports consigned to the Allied Commission. Liaison representatives of agencies of the Italian Government attached to UNRRA. Therefore, while supplies may continue for a time under the old program, no difficulty is anticipated in their reception, warehousing or distribution.

PORTS

An additional section of Naples port was handed over to the Italian Government as of March 1, 1946, and a large transfer of surplus land and floating equipment is in process of completion by Allied Government. At a recent meeting of Allied shipping interests, it was agreed that overall control of the port would be transferred from US Military authorities to British Military authorities, and that division of the port into sections would be continued. Aside from mixed military and civil cargoes, which continue to be imported in British ships, little if any occasion should arise for Italian authorities to call upon Allied authorities for berthing facilities, transport or equipment. Whenever required, however, representatives of the Italian Government engaged upon official business may be admitted to military port sections.

WAREHOUSES

Proportion of UNRRA supplies in warehouses has amounted to about 70 percent of the total during the past three months, an increase over the preceding three month period. From now on, the proportion should gradually expand, as UNRRA imports should predominate and the supplies previously consigned to Allied Commission, which were transferred to the Italian Government, tend to become distributed. All warehouses in use in this area have been under management of agencies of the Italian Government since April 1, 1946. Warehouses in use and approximate tonnage stored therein are as follows:

It is estimated that warehouses are utilized to 70% to 80% of capacity at present, depending on the character of goods. UNRRA recently obtained a new warehouse with about 10,000 tons capacity. In addition, material has been secured for construction of dock warehousing in Romney Huts for about 30,000 tons. When this project is completed, it should be possible to release warehouses 376, 677, and 636, which are desired by owners for operation of canning and conserving industries.

No shortage of warehouse space should exist in the near future, and emphasis has been placed upon the desirability of immediate distribution insofar as is possible in an effort to speed up processes of rehabilitation and at the same time reduce requirements for warehousing to a minimum backlog.

ROAD

Both civilian and government owned trucks have been under the control of ENAC for a number of months. With increased allocations and restoration of immobilized vehicles, supply of transport is gradually approaching demand for essential purposes. Since last August, ENAC has undertaken task of port clearance of imported civil supplies. Requests for transport and establishment of priority are handled locally in accordance with directives of the Ministry of Transport in Rome. Issuance of tire permits and registration of vehicles is scheduled to commence on March 15, 1946, under control of Ispettorato Motorcivile appointed by the Ministry of Transport.

RAIL

Italian State Railways, under jurisdiction of the Ministry of Transport, has control over all passenger and freight traffic. Much progress has been made in restoring to use wagons damaged by war, but there is still a shortage of wagons for both military and civilian transport. Decreased deployment of military personnel since the first of the year has permitted expansion of civilian passenger traffic, but movement of freight is still greatly handicapped by military requirements for movement of supplies to permanent stockpiles in Italy and elsewhere. It is estimated that only about 50% of civil requirements currently are met. In February, it was extremely difficult to secure wagons for port clearance of perishable foodstuffs.

Bids for rail transport are made to local station where shipment originates. These bids are screened by Movements Division of the traffic office of the ISR who prepare a loading program based on allocations of wagons by Joint Control Board in Naples and in Rome. Emergency bids can be made for high priority shipments such as port clearance or to meet an urgent distribution from warehouses.





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2. The more recent stacks are living on wood damage and they are all protected with taraulins supplied by A. C.

3. However, owing both to the not quite impermeability of the taraulins and to the strong winds predominating in this season, which frequently throw the coverings into disorder, many wetnesses and infiltrations occur in the stacks, spoiling the outer packings of the packages, especially when same is constituted of pasteboard and consequently the contents too is seriously in danger.

4. We, therefore, must insist on our repeated information about the necessity for these stocks to be issued and distributed for consumption as soon as possible.

5. This measure is urgent above all for the Herring, Dry Cod fish, Canned Fish and Evaporated Milk, which are the most delicate and perishable commodities, especially when the cans in which they are contained are not made with rustless metal.

6. We point out that against the stocks on hand listed above, the following Delivery Orders are at present in our possession :
