1. Rome Coml Service: At the end of its trial period, the Civitavecchia - Fiumicino/Rome berge service delivered 4,000 tons of coal for Rome discharging at a rate of 300 tons per day, working five hatches and making direct delivery into rail cars.

- l. Coal Service Civitavecchia-Fiumicino/Rome. The Schooner \*Dinar has now been allotted to this service. She is now discharging at Civitavecchia and will load to full capacity of 300 tons of coal to be carried to Fiumicino. At Fiumicino the "Dina" will be lightened sufficiently to enable her to come up the conal to Rome.
  - 2. During the course of the week, the following ports were visited:

San Stephano - now ready to receive schooners of 2/300 tons.

<u>Piombino</u> - work inside port area progressing rapidly. Main railroad line to Fort not yet completed. A special reconnaissance was made with view to receiving boxed cars and assembling in Port area. Conditions are favorable and further investigations are being made.

Vierezgio - badly damaged. Many sunken craft. Two barges of 50/60 tons are in course of construction. Two barges of 5/600 tons are partly constructed but work has ceased.
