Further to this office letter 40-21/81/FOOD of 17 September 45. 2. Above-mentioned letter showed that whole cargo ex 5/5 James Monroe was assigned to Italian Government by this Sub-Commission, and that ship was to berth at Civitavecchia. Moreover, the Senior Statistician Assistant in the Supply Division had phoned this information, indicating expected date of urrival, to your Ministry at least 7 days earlier. 3. In spite of the long advance notice you had of this ships arrival, Federconsorzi had still not been given disposal instructions on 24 Sept. 45 for 893 tons of sugar and 1800 tons of milk. Consequently, delay in off-lawding the ship has been caused, and this in turn was delaying the arrival of S/S Basset from Naples, which had 3229 tons milk to discharge at Civitavecchia, at the special request of your Ministry. 4. Every effort is made here to give you the earliest possible advice of a ships arrival . It would therefore appear that such a delay, in issuing disposal instructions, as that described above, is quite unnecessary. This Sub-Commission cannot understand why it should be allowed to occur.
